

## ST MARY'S CHELTENHAM PARISH RECORDS TRANSCRIPTION PROJECT 1558-1804

## Locations

Numerous locations are included in the records. To aid the researcher, most locations, where they have been recognised, have been given the modern spelling. For example, Alstone (*Allstone, Alstone, Aston*, etc.) has many different forms but has been rendered as 'Alstone'. Where the modern equivalent has not been identified, the original spelling is retained in *italics*, e.g. "*Haskombe*". Some possible identifications are given below.
