## PREFACE.

THE success which has attended the publication of the two previous volumes of the CHELTENHAM ANNUAIRE, has stimulated the Editor to still greater exertion, in order to render his work worthy the liberal patronage which it has received: and in compliance with the recommendation of numerous friends he has determined upon discontinuing for the future the Literary and Scientific Essays which heretofore occupied so large a portion of the work, and appropriating the space thus obtained to such useful information as usually forms the principal value of publications of the kind; by this arrangement rendering the CHELTENHAM ANNUAIRE so complete in all its details as, for general purposes, to render superfluous any other Almanack. The present volume will, accordingly, be found to contain much new information of a description calculated for the purposes of general and local

reference. The various Lists and Tables, selected or composed, being those which appeared likely to furnish information on points most frequently the subjects of enquiry. The **Directory** has been carefully revised throughout, and to render this division of the work yet more complete a **Street Guide** has been, for the first time, introduced; while the Registration of the qualified Electors of the Borough has been also added, in order to supply as full and accurate a return of the present inhabitants of Cheltenham as possible.

## ECLIPSES.

There will be Two ECLIPSES this year.

1.—March 15th, a total eclipse of the Sun. At Greenwich, where a partial eclipse will be visible, it will begin at 3h. 23m. 54s. P.M., and end at 4h. 4m. 24s. Greatest magnitude only three-fifths of a digit on the Sun's S.E. border. This eclipse will, in England, be greatest at *Beachy Head*; but even there it will not exceed a digit.

At Paris this eclipse will begin at 3h. 22m. P.M., and end 4h. 28m., Paris mean time. Digits eclipsed, one and four-fifths.

2.—September 7th, an annular eclipse of the Sun; but it will not be visible to us, as the Sun will be below our horizon during the whole time of the eclipse.

NOTES OF THE MONTH.

The fine old English customs incident to Christmastide usually extend far into this month, and among the upper and middle classes, the frequent gatherings of friends and families around the blazing hearth, give great zest to the holiday evenings, and afford abundant occupation to the good housewife.

The public amusements of January in Cheltenham are confined to the Winter Subscription Balls, which take place at the Assembly Rooms every Monday evening, commencing at nine, and terminating at twelve o'clock. The Master of the Ceremonies' Ball is fixed for the 28th, the last Monday in the month.

Lord Segrave's fox hounds hunt the neighbourhood during the whole of the month, and the Cheltenham stag hounds are out as often as the weather and the arrangements of the sporting circles will admit of.

The Literary and Philosophical Society have public lectures every Tuesday evening, and frequently oftener, throughout this month.

At the Pump Rooms and Spas all is still silent—the water drinkers being few and far between.

The prevailing winds in the month of January, taking the average of the five years from 1833 to 1837 inclusive, as a criterion, are S.E. and S.W., the latter generally predominating.

The mean of the thermometer during January, taking the average mean of the five years ending 1837 as a criterion, is 39.08. The mean of the year 1838 was 30.26, and the range 35.

The January mean of the barometer, taking the same period as the average, is 29.753. The mean of 1838 was 29.633, and the range of the same year 1.02.

The quantity of rain which fell in January, 1838, was 0.635 inches. The mean of the previous five years gives 2.527 as the average of the month, but as this includes the very wet January of 1834 it is considerably more than would be the result had the January of any other year been taken into the estimate.

## NOTES OF THE MONTH.

The Spas are but little frequented, most of those who drink the waters preferring to do so at their own homes—the promenades and walks presenting few inducements to fasting exercise. Occasionally, it is true, a fine morning will determine a few early risers on "a walk to the Wells," just to see if anything be stirring there. About the 10th of the month, a small band of four instruments generally commences its performances at the Montpellier Pump Room, which is the first "hint" of the departure of winter.

The public amusements of the month are confined to the weekly balls at the Assembly Rooms, unless it should so chance that some sanguine "manager" should speculate upon the revival of "a taste for the drama," and open the theatre.

The sports of the field afford occupation to those whose steeds and courage dare venture to hold with the stag hounds, which are generally out whenever the ground will warrant the hope and prospect of a chase, a result not always to be depended upon, as the "Nimrods" and "Cravens" of the field well know, in February.

The prevalent winds appear to be S. and S.W. The average of the five years ending 1837, shows the latter wind to predominate in the proportion of two to one over the winds from any other point of the compass.

The mean of the therm. in Feb. may be taken at 41.92, according to the average of the five years selected for calculation and comparison. The mean of Feb. 1838 was 33.4. The extreme range 24.5.

The mean of the barometer will be 29.596. The mean of Feb. 1838 was 29.322; the range 1.77:

The quantity of rain may be estimated at 3.318 inches, that being the average of five years calculated from Mr. Moss's tables. The rain which fell in Cheltenham, in Feb. 1838 was 3.18 inches.

## NOTES OF THE MONTH.

Symptoms of approaching Spring usually begin to manifest themselves this month at the Spas—many water drinkers making their appearance at the Pump Rooms whenever the mornings happen to prove sufficiently inviting for early exercise.

On the first of this month the Welshmen, resident in Cheltenham, and their friends, usually dine together, in honour of the Patron Saint of the Principality; and in the evening of the same day there is always a Concert of Welsh music at the Rotunda.

The public Balls at the Assembly Rooms continue every Monday evening—the Monday in Passion week excepted.

Lord Segrave's Fox Hounds arrive in Cheltenham about the first of March, and continue to draw the covers of the neighbourhood to the end, when they return to Berkeley Castle. The Spring Steeple Chases usually take place about the latter end of this month.

The Literary and Philosophical Lectures continue as heretofore at the Institution. The Annual Meeting of the Society takes place on the second Tuesday in the month, for the election of Officers and Committee for the year ensuing.

The Board of Guardians for the Cheltenham Union are elected on the 25th, or within a few days of that date.

The prevailing winds of this month are south-west and north-east, the former greatly predominating.

The mean of the Thermometer in Cheltenham, in March, according to the average of the five years ending 1837, is 41.43. The mean of this month, in 1838, was 42.46, the range 29.5.

The mean of the Barometer, taking the same average, 29.657. The mean of 1838 was 29.614—the range 1.42.

The quantity of rain which falls this month, calculating according to the average of the five years, is 2.376 inches. The amount of rain in 1835 was 1.125 inches.

## NOTES OF THE MONTH.

April in Cheltenham is peculiarly a month of preparation for the approaching season. The utmost activity generally prevails at the different summer establishments, and the Pump Rooms and Spas, are special objects of attention, undergoing the processes of renovation to fit them for the reception of strangers, now rapidly thronging into the town.

The Pump Rooms are much resorted to by invalids during the whole of this month, and on fine mornings the walks and promenades are frequently enlivened with a fair array of residents and visitors, some seeking health in exercise merely, others in the sanative waters of the spas.

The winter balls terminate with that which takes place on the first of the month, being Easter Monday.

The spring floral and horticultural exhibition of the Zoological and Botanical Society, and of the Pittville Association, are held at their respective establishments, about the latter end of the month, and are the gay forerunners of the merry summertide, already manifesting its approach in the gardens and hedgerows of the neighbourhood.

The Literary and Philosophical Society continues its weekly lectures throughout the whole of the month.

The annual election of Parish Officers, Churchwardens, Overseers, &c. &c., takes place at St. Mary's Church, on Easter Tuesday. A list of the present parochial authorities will be found at page 41 of the present *Annuaire*.

The prevailing winds are N.W. and S.W., the latter considerably predominating.

The mean of the thermometer in Cheltenham in April may be taken as 45.952, and of the barometer, at 29.703. In 1838 the mean of the former was 44.69; the range 34.5; and of the latter, 29.574; the range 1.12.

The average of rain is 1.989 inches. The fall in 1838 was 1.305 inches.

## NOTES OF THE MONTH.

The Cheltenham "season" commences on the first of May, though it is not until the arrival of the full summer band at the Montpellier Spa that the gaiety and animation incident thereto attract much attention. This event generally takes place about the second Monday in the month, and within a day or two the evening musical promenades also begin, the band performing from this date thrice, and sometimes even oftener, in each week, from seven to nine o'clock, as well as regularly every morning, from eight to ten o'clock. May is always considered one of the best months for taking the waters, and there is in consequence usually a large attendance at the different Pump Rooms, both of residents and visitors.

On the 24th, there is always a fete or gala of some description at the Montpellier Spa, in honour of the Queen's birth-day.

The second floral and horticultural exhibitions of the Cheltenham and Pittville Societies take place towards the latter end of the month. The former is now identified with the Gloucestershire Zoological and Botanical Society, and its flower shows will, consequently, henceforth be held under the especial auspices of that Society.

The session of the Literary and Philosophical Institution concludes on the second Tuesday.

The prevailing winds are S.W. and N.E., the former predominating in the proportion of two to one.

The mean of the thermometer may be estimated at 54.272; of the barometer, 29.774.

The mean temperature of 1838 was 51.97; the range, 35.5. The mean of the barometer, 29.64, and the range 1.88.

The quantity of rain which falls in May is 1.514 inches, taking the average of five years. In 1838 it was 2.73 inches.

NOTES OF THE MONTH.

Cheltenham in June is frequently not so full of Company as in May, owing to many of those who arrive in the latter month, having completed their courses of the waters, taking their departure again, with renovated health, for their respective homes; in addition to which numbers of the resident families leave for the coast, or on summer excursions to the Lakes, or the mountain lands of Wales or Scotland.

The morning performances of the full military Band continue at the Montpellier Spa, as also the musical Promenades. The latter are removed towards the end of the month from the Pump Room Walk into the Gardens opposite, where, during the long evenings of summer, and when the weather is sufficiently warm, they are held in preference.

The Rotunda Balls commence either the last week in June, or the first week in July, depending upon circumstances, and continue as a fixed appointment for Thursday evenings through the season.

There will, most probably, be occasional fetes at most of the public establishments this month, and a grand Gala at the Montpellier, in celebration of her Majesty's coronation on the 28th.

The prevalent winds of June are south-west and south, the former being nearly as three to one in comparison with the winds of either of the other points of the compass, the south excepted.

The mean temperature is 59.148, and the mean of the Barometer 29.696. In June, 1838, the mean of the Thermometer was 58, and the range 28. The mean of the Barometer 29.594, and the range 0.75.

The average rain is 2.52 inches—the rain of last June was, however, 3.61.

NOTES OF THE MONTH.

Of late years, owing to the protraction of the London season so far into the summer, the influx of metropolitan fashionables into Cheltenham, has rarely taken place, at least not to any considerable extent, until about the middle of July. About this time, however, the waning gaieties of the Court disperses over the country the aristocracy of the land, and causes a great increase in the number of our visitors. The established amusements peculiar to this favourite resort are all in full operation, and afford ceaseless opportunities of delightful pastime and healthy exercise. The attendance of water drinkers at the various Spas, and promenaders on the walks, impart an air of great cheerfulness and animation to the mornings—heightened and enhanced by the performances of the bands, which takes place regularly from eight to ten o'clock. And in the evenings the Musical Promenades at the Montpellier attract to the Gardens and Walks of that establishment all the rank, beauty and fashion of the place, presenting such scenes of gaiety and delight as are quite unrivalled.

The Summer Balls take place every Thursday evening, commencing at half-past eight o'clock, and terminating at half-past eleven.

There are usually Floral and Horticultural Exhibitions, Morning Concerts and Evening Galas, with a variety of other fetes and entertainments in this month, for the times and particulars of which the advertisements of the day must be consulted.

The prevailing winds of July are south-west and west.

## NOTES OF THE MONTH.

The Cheltenham Season is at its zenith in August. The town is full of company, and the constant succession and diversity of the amusements which present themselves engaging the attention and diverting the thoughts of the visitors, keep the place quite alive. The promenades and walks are constantly thronged with strangers, and the rides and drives with groups of fair equestrian, and gay and dashing equipages.

The Gardens of the various Spas are much resorted to during the day, and afford delightful sources of recreation to those who take pleasure in contemplating the floral beauties of creation. The Zoological Gardens in the Park are also, at this season of the year, peculiarly deserving attention, for besides the "animal" wonders which they contain, the walks and landscape undulations of the scene render them objects of peculiar admiration. They are open to visitors every day, except Sundays, from 10 A.M. to dusk.

The public amusements of August are a continuation of those particularized in the notes of the previous month. In addition to which there are also occasional entertainments, such as Concerts, Public Breakfasts, &c.; and from the success which attended the celebration, on the 8th of August last year, of the Centenary of the establishment of the Spas, it is highly probable that a repetition of the amusements, which then took place, will be repeated through future years.

The winds most prevalent in August blow from the W. and S.W.

The mean of the Thermometer may be taken at 59.85, and that of the Barometer at 29.722. Last August the Thermometer mean was 59.564, the Barometer 29.644, and the range of the former 29.5, and of the latter 1.03.

The average rain is 2.826 inches. In 1838 the quantity was 2.215 inches.

NOTES OF THE MONTH.

September, like its precursor, is a month of uniform gaiety in Cheltenham. The same rapid succession of elegant amusements takes place, upon which the constant changes in the company who frequent them, confer all the charms of attractive novelty.

Towards the middle of the month the musical promenades, which down to this period have been uniformly held in the evenings, occasionally take place in the afternoons, and at the close the latter arrangement wholly prevails—the Band performing from half-past two to half-past four, instead of from seven to nine o'clock as heretofore.

The Literary and Philosophical Society generally commences its "session" this month—celebrating the anniversary of the opening of the present institution by a public meeting and dinner.

The last Floral and Horticultural exhibitions of the Cheltenham and Pittville societies take place about the latter end of the month.

The Spas are much resorted to during the whole of this month, the approach of Autumn being generally considered, next to Spring, the best time of the year for drinking the waters.

The prevailing winds of September are those which blow from the S., S.E., and S.W. The latter two being in nearly equal proportions.

The mean of the Thermometer is 55.504, and of the Barometer 29.685. The mean of the former in 1838 was 55.476—the range 27.5; and of the latter 29.701, the range being 1.3.

The average of rain that falls in Cheltenham in September, 3.108 inches; in 1838, the quantity was 3.67 inches.

## NOTES OF THE MONTH.

Indications of a closing season begin to manifest themselves early in this month. The "arrivals" cease to bear the same disproportion to the "departures" which they bore in August and September—the latter now, indeed, being the more numerous of the two. It is not, however, until about the middle of the month that any sensible diminution becomes apparent in the number of those who frequent the Spas in the mornings or the Promenades in the afternoons—particularly should the weather of the first half of October prove fine. The Rotunda Balls are even better attended than in the earlier part of the season.

The afternoon musical promenades, in the Montpellier Gardens, conclude sometime between the 20th and 25th of the month, and about the same time the morning performances of the full military band at the Spa reach their termination—a movement generally considered as the closing act of the summer season.

The Philosophical Society resumes its scientific lectures at the Institution in the Promenade early in the month.

The Cheltenham Stag Hounds take the field for the first time this month, meeting twice a-week, and always within a short distance of the town.—Lord Segrave's pack are also cub hunting in the neighbourhood.

The prevailing winds of this month are S., S.E., and S.W.; the first and second blowing equally, though the last greatly predominates over either of the others.

The Thermometer mean of five years is 50.395, and the Barometer 29.771. Last October the Thermometer mean was 50.428, and the Barometer 29.70; the range of the former being 29.5, and of the latter 1.35.

The average rain may be estimated at 2.937 inches. In Oct. 1838 the quantity did not, however, exceed 1.915 inches.

## .NOTES OF THE MONTH.

The month of November opens with a strangely altered aspect that presented by the preceding six months. The morning and evening Promenades, those brilliant and fascinating scenes of life in Cheltenham, have been discontinued—the pleasant Balls of the Rotunda are over—and the appearances of coming winter are evident in the leaf-strewn walks, and the bared branches of the lofty elms with which the town and neighbourhood abound. The full Band of Summer has been succeeded by a smaller company of four performers, who continue playing every morning in the Montpellier Pump Room at the usual hours throughout the month.

The Winter Balls at the Assembly Rooms commence early in the month, and continue every Monday evening the winter through.

Lord Segrave's Fox Hounds arrive at the Cheltenham Kennel on the 1st of November, and hunt the neighbourhood four or five times a week. The Stag Hounds are also out occasionally.

By the end of November all the visitors have taken their departure—the resident families have returned from their summer tours, and the town and its inhabitants have settled down for the winter.

The winds generally most prevalent this month are those of the S. E. and S. W.

The mean temperature, according to past results, will be 43.916; the mean of the Barometer 29.645. In November, 1838, the former was 40.06; the latter 29.555. The range of the Thermometer being 29.5, and of the Barometer 1.89.

The results of five years rain give 2.848 inches as the average of November, though last year the quantity which fell was 5.58 inches.

## NOTES OF THE MONTH.

And now "concluding-winter comes to close the scene." The face of nature looks bleak and cheerless—without there is little to attract attention, less to afford pleasure. The Pump Rooms and Spas, those haunts of summer gaieties, are deserted; and even the notes of the winter band are silenced. Within doors there are, indeed, "brave doings," as Christmas, with its joyous hospitalities, draws nigh. The greetings of the family circle—the rout—the ball—the evening party—night after night engage the time and attention of the wealthier portion of our inhabitants, and convert the dullest and the darkest month of all the year into a season of cheerful festivity and bright rejoicing. The Winter Balls are the only public assemblies of December, and the sports of the field are confined to the meetings of the stag hounds—Lord Segrave's pack hunting the Berkeley country this month.

The Literary and Philosophical Society hold their weekly meetings every Tuesday evening through the greater part of this month—generally, however, suspending their lectures for a fortnight at Christmas.

The prevailing winds of December are W. and S.W., the latter greatly predominating. The S. and N.E. winds also prevail very generally.

The Thermometer mean, still calculating upon the five years ending 1837, may be stated as 41.514; and the Barometer 29.759.

The average rain of the month, estimated by the results of the years 1833 to 1837 inclusive, is 2.125 inches.

**Frederick Augustus, DUKE OF SUSSEX**, uncle to her Majesty, born 27 January 1773; married at Rome 4 April, and at London, 5 Dec. 1793, Lady Augusta Murray, daughter of the Earl of Dunmore, who died 1830. This marriage being contrary to the 12 Geo. III., was declared void in 1794.

**Adolphus Frederick, DUKE OF CAMBRIDGE**, uncle to her Majesty, born 24 Feb. 1774; married 7 May, 1818. Issue, George William and Augusta Caroline.

The Public Commissioners hold their meetings at the Fleece Inn the first Friday in every month, at 11 o'clock in the forenoon, for the purpose of taking cognizance of all matters connected with the local government of the Town, plenary powers being vested in them for that purpose by an Act of Parliament passed in the year 1821 (2nd Geo. IV.) ; by which Act they are also empowered to frame such bye-laws and rules as to them shall appear necessary for the peace, security, and general interests of the town. The appointment and direction of the Police and Fire Establishments,\* the paving and lighting the streets and highways, the regulation and superintendence of the flies and public conveyances, are therefore comprehended within their peculiar province. The constitution and authority of this important body will probably undergo many alterations during the year 1839, as application is about to be made to Parliament for a new act to alter and amend the powers and provisions of that under which the Commissioners at present act.

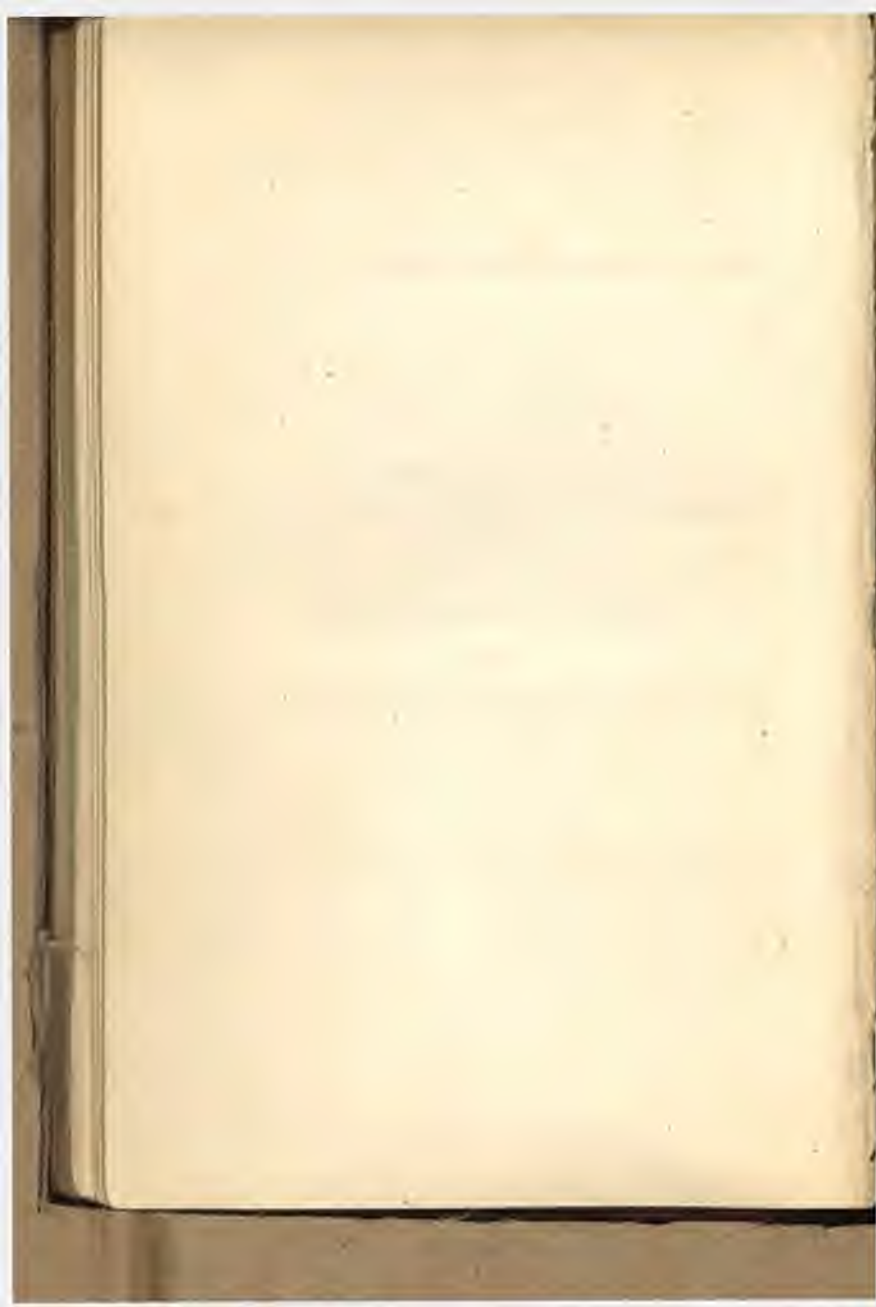

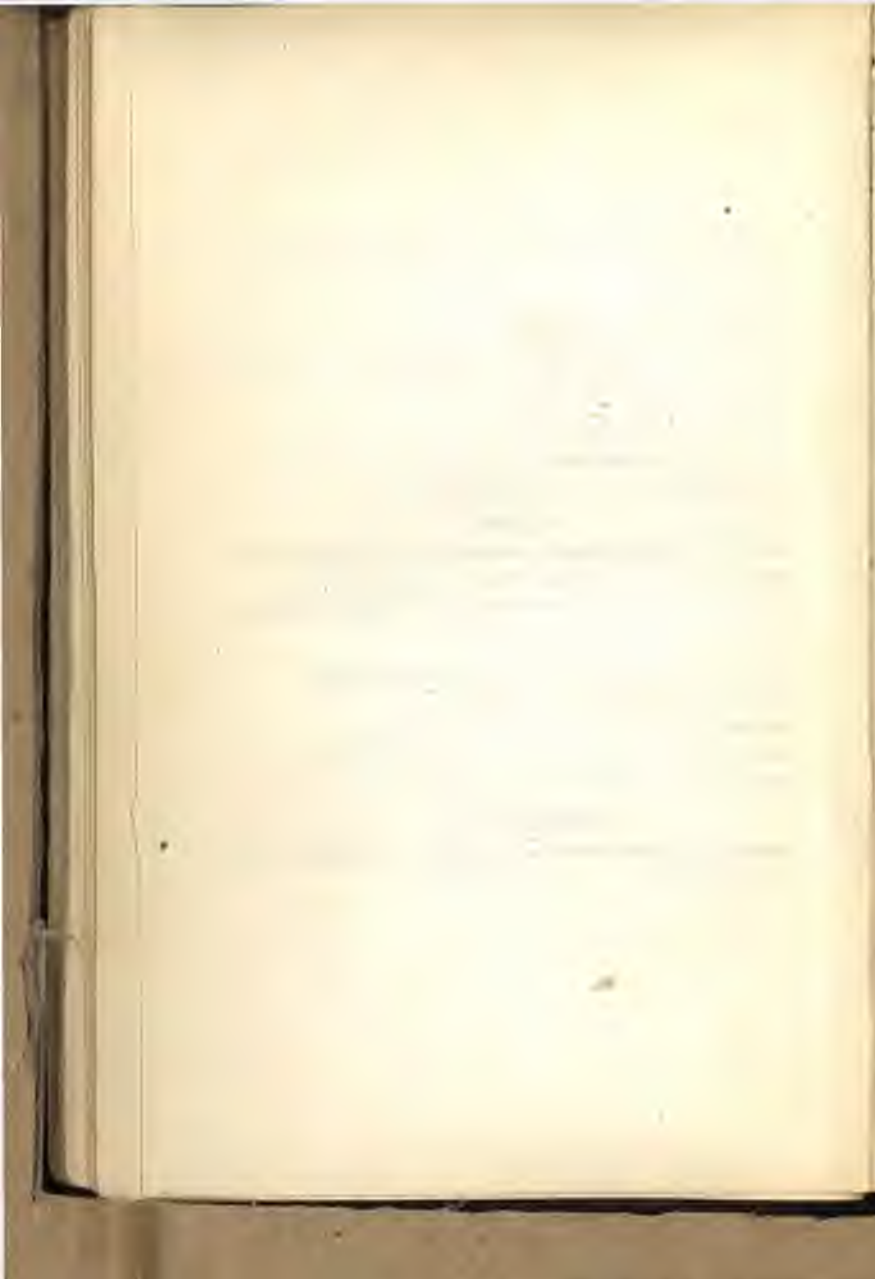
