

PREFACE.

There are few tasks of more difficult accomplishment than to give a COMPLETE AND CORRECT DIRECTORY of the Town of Cheltenham: from the great influx of strangers, and consequent frequent changes of Residence amongst its Inhabitants,—the continual additions and improvements constantly being made in different parts of the Town, it is impossible for a work of this kind to be for any length of time, in every instance, correct. Yet I have devoted my humble efforts to produce a CHEAP LOCAL DIRECTORY, which I trust, may be acceptable, and, I hope, generally useful. My design has been to embody in a brief form, all that is really useful and interesting. I desire not to be regarded as a rival, but as a servant to the Public, anxious to supply direct information to ALL. The desire to zender the present work worthy of the patronage of the Public, has left me no time to consider what arguments I shall employ to entreat the reader's indulgence should he meet with inaccuracies. But from the facts above referred to, I hope to be favoured with a lenient consideration of the disadvantages under which it is published.

It is my intention to publish a new edition NEXT YEAR, with considerable additions and improvements, when it will be my study, regardless of time or expence, to leave nothing undone that may render it worthy of general acceptance. In order to attain this desideratum, I respectfully solicit that any information respecting inaccuracies in the present work,—changes of Ministers, Public Officers,—or relating to any matters of Local importance may be forwarded to me, which will be thankfully received, and inserted in a book kept for the purpose.


