

II.—March 8, a partial Eclipse of the Moon. Visible at Greenwich. Commences 11h. 25m, p.m. March 9—Middle 0h. 55m. a.m. Ends 2h. 25m. a.m.

III.—August 18, a total Eclipse of the Sun. Visible only in the Southern parts of Australia, Africa, and the Indian Ocean.

IV.—September 2, a partial Eclipse of the Moon. Visible only in the Indian and South Pacific Oceans.





The Public Commissioners hold their meetings at the Fleece Hotel, the first Friday in every month, at 11 o'clock in the forenoon, for the purpose of taking cognizance of all matters connected with the local government of the townplenary powers being vested in them for that purpose by an Act of Parliament, passed in the year 1821 (2nd Geo. IV.). by which Act they are also empowered to frame such byelaws and rules as to them shall appear necessary for the peace, security, and general interest of the town. The appointment and direction of the Police and Fire Establishments,* the paving and lighting the streets and highways, the regulation and superintendence of the flys and public conveyances, are, therefore, comprehended within their peculiar province. Since the establishment, in 1840, of the Rural Police, the Commissioners have, however, ceded to that newly constituted power the duty and responsibility of "watch and ward," and have disbanded the police force formerly employed by them, and subject, of course, to their jurisdiction.

Letters may be posted after the Closing of the Rox, on payment of a fee of One Penny each, for the first half-hour; and Two Pence from the expiration of that time until the despatch of the Mail, or for those Mails despatched during the night until 10 30 p.m.; after which no Letters can be received.

BRANCH RECEIVING HOUSES.

Montpellier Exchange Tewkesbury Road St. Paul's Street Portland Square Corpus Street Northwick Terrace.

Bags are made up and despatched from the Receiving Houses to the chief Office in Clarence Street three times daily, viz., 11 30 a.m., 7 30 p.m., and 8 30 p.m. Letters may be posted until Five Minutes before each despatch.

REGISTERED LETTERS .- Letters may be registered on payment of a fee of Six Pence, in addition to the ordinary rates of postage on Inland and Colonial, as well as Foreign Letters, except for France and Countries passing through France, and Prussia and Countries passing through Prussia. Those for France and passing through France are chargeable with double the Foreign rate to the place to which the Letter is addressed, in addition to the British rate and Registration fee. Those for Prussia and passing through Prussia are liable to a Prussian fee of Threepence in addition to the ordinary rates of Postage and British Registration fee. Letters intended to be Registered must be presented at the Office at least half an hour before the Box is closed for the particular Mail by which they are to be forwarded. The postage on Registered Letters passing between places in the United Kingdom must be paid by Stamps; but the Registration fee must always be paid in Money.

Money Orders.—Money Orders are issued and paid (at the General Office only) from 9 a.m. to 6 p.m. These Orders must be presented for payment before the end of the second Calendar Month after that in which they were issued, otherwise new orders will be necessary, for which a second commission will be charged. Orders not presented for payment before the end of the twelfth Calendar Month after that in which they were issued, are, by a recent Act of Parliament, null and void.

ANY LETTER OR PACKET sent by Post between places within the United Kingdom, must not exceed two feet in length, and if it exceed four ounces in weight, the postage must be pre-paid in money or stamps.

The following are exceptions to the above restrictions:—Parliamentary Petitions, or Addresses to her Majesty; Petitions to either House of Parliament forwarded to any Member of such

House; Printed Votes or Proceedings of Parliament; Letters or Packets to or from Public Departments or Public Officers on her Majesty's Service; Letters, &c., to or from places Abroad.

PRINTED BOOKS, Magazines, Reviews, and Pamphlets (whether British, Colonial, or Foreign), may be transmitted by Post within the United Kingdom, at the following reduced rates of Postage, riz.—For each Packet not exceeding 1lb. in weight, Sixpence; above 1lb., and not exceeding 2lb., One Shilling, and so on in proportion; Sixpence being charged for every additional pound, provided, however, that the following conditions be carefully observed:

 Every such Packet must be sent without a Cover, or in a Cover open at the ends.

2.—It must contain a Single Volume only (whether Printed Book, Magazine, Review, or Pamphlet); the several sheets thereof, when there are more than one, being

sewed or bound together.

3.—No writing or marks must be upon the Cover, or its contents, other than the address of the sender and the person to whom it may be sent, except under the following restrictions, viz.—Any such writing or marks on any leaf of the Book (Magazine, Review, or Pamphlet), or on the binding thereof, must be on one and the self-same page of the Book, or corresponding portion of the binding.

4.—The Postage must be pre-paid in full, by affixing outside

the Packet or its Cover the proper Stamps.

If any of the above conditions are violated, the Packet will be charged as a Letter.

ARTICLES WHICH MAY NOT BE SENT BY POST.—Letters or Packets containing any of the following inclosures, cannot be forwarded through the Post Office, viz., any Glass or Glass Bottle. any Razor, Scissors, Knife, Fork, or other sharp or pointed Instrument; any Leeches, Game, Fish, Flesh, Fruit, Vegetable, or other perishable substance; any Bladder, or other vessel containing liquid; or any Article, Matter, or Thing whatsoever, which might, by pressure or otherwise, be rendered injurious to the Officers of the Post Office, or to the contents of the Mail Bags.

UNPAID LETTERS.—Under the 3rd and 4th Vict., cap. 96, and 10th and 11th Vict., cap. 85, all persons sending Letters by the Post unpaid, which from any cause whatever cannot be delivered to the Parties to whom they are addressed, are liable to pay the Postage charged thereon, which, under the 1st Vict., cap. 36, may be recoverd with costs, by summary process before a Magistrate. On such Letters being returned, the senders will be compelled to pay the Postage charged on them.

NEWSPAPERS.

On Newspapers passing between places in the United Kingdom, any Writing or Marks are allowed, provided that a Postage of a Penny be pre-paid, by means of a Stamp conspicuously affixed outside the Cover or Folded Newspaper; and in those cases where

the Newspaper may be liable to a Postage, irrespective of the Writing or Marks (as when Posted and Delivered in the same town), the Penny Stamp will cover the Writing and Postage also. This privilege is confined to Writing or Marks on the Newspaper itself. Newspapers with any Writing or Marks, and not pre-paid as above; or if pre-paid and containing any enclosure, or with any Writing or Marks on the Cover other than the address, are liable to the full rate of Postage, chargeable on Un-paid Letters of the same weight.

TO THE COLONIES AND FOREIGN COUNTRIES, British Newspapers sent without Covers, or in Covers open at the sides, and posted within seven days after date of publication, may be forwarded by her Majesty's Packets as follows:

FREE OF POSTAGE.—To the British Colonies and Possessions, France and Algeria, Belgium, Spain, Hamburgh, Cuxhaven, Lubech, Bremen, Oldenburgh, Denmark, Greece, Brazil, Buenos Ayres, Monte Video, New Grenada, Peru, Venezuela, Escuador, Bolivia, Hayti, or St. Domingo, (Malta, Ionian Islands, Hong Kong, Ceylon, and India via Southampton,) Prussia and Countries passing through Prussia (via Belgium, Holland, or Hamburgh.)

ONE PENNY EACH.—To Holland, Hanover, Brunswick, and Greece, by French Packets.

Two Pence Each.—To Portugal, Madeira, Azores, Canaries, Cuba and Foreign West Indies (except St. Domingo), United States, (Egypt, Syria, China, and the Phillipines, via Southampton), all Countries passing through France (Spain, Greece, and Ionian Islands excepted), and all Countries (Greece excepted), forwarded by French Railway, via Marseilles.

THREE PENCE EACH.—Malta, Ionian Islands, Egypt, Syria, India, China, and the Phillipines, by British Packet, via Marseilles.

FOUR PENCE EACH.—To Chili, and Java, Sumatra, the Moluccas, Borneo, New South Wales, &c., via Southampton.

FIVE PENCE EACH.—To Java, Sumatra, the Moluccas, Borneo, New South Wales, &c., by British Packets, via Marseilles.

Newspapers to the Colonies or Foreign Countries, containing any enclosure, or with any writing or mark, or reference or information, whether upon them, or upon the covers, other than the Address of the party to whom they are forwarded, are chargeable with treble the duty of Letter postage.


