VI.—Dec. 26, a partial Eclipse of the Moon. Invisible in this country.

HOUSE DUTIES.

The Duties on Windows having been repealed in the Session of 1850, a House Duty is now substituted of 9d. in the pound on houses worth £20 and upwards per annum in rent. But dwelling-houses with shop annexed on the basement floor; or houses occupied by any person duly licensed for the sale of ale, wine, and other liquors; or houses which are *bona fide* farm-houses occupied by a tenant or farm servant, are to pay 6d. in the pound. In the valuation of houses belonging to market-gardens and nursery grounds, the gardens and grounds are not to be estimated.

The Public Commissioners hold their meetings at the Fleece Hotel, the first Friday in every month, at eleven o'clock in the forenoon, for the purpose of taking cognizance of all matters connected with the local government of the town—plenary powers being vested in them for that purpose by an Act of Parliament, passed in the year 1821 (2nd Geo. IV.) : by which Act they are also empowered to frame such bye-laws and rules as to them shall appear necessary for the peace, security, and general interest of the town. The appointment and direction of the Police and Fire Establishments,* the paving and lighting the streets and highways, the regulation and superintendence of the flies and public conveyances, are, therefore, comprehended within their peculiar province. Since the establishment, in 1840, of the Rural Police, the Commissioners have, "however, ceded to that power the duty and responsibility of "watch and ward," and have disbanded the police force formerly employed by them, and subject, of course, to their jurisdiction.

DIVISION OF THE TOWN INTO WARDS.

The Parish of Cheltenham having lately been divided into Five Wards, for the purpose of the Election of Poor Law Guardians, we here give the limits and boundaries of each, as set forth in the official order of the Poor Law Commissioners, by whose direction and authority the division in question has been made. The first Election of Guardians, under this new arrangement, took place in March, 1850, when the number of Guardians were increased from ten to fifteen.

THE EAST WARD

shall comprise all rateable property situated north of the High Street in the said parish, and included within the following boundaries ; that is to say, bounded on the south by a line running from the point where Pittville Street meets High Street, eastward along High Street to the boundary of the said parish ; bounded on the west by a line running from the point where Pittville Street meets High Street, northward along Pittville Street, thence along Portland Street, and thence along the Cleeve and Evesham road to the boundary of the said parish ; and further bounded by a line running along the boundary of the parish from the eastern extremity of the above defined southern boundary line to the northern extremity of the above defined western boundary line.

THE NORTH WARD

shall comprise all rateable property situated north of High Street aforesaid, and included within the following boundaries : that is to say, bounded on the south by a line running from the point where Pittville Street meets High Street, westward along High Street, and thence along the Tewkesbury road to the boundary of the said parish ; and bounded on the east by the western boundary line of the East Ward ; and further bounded by a line running along the boundary of the said parish from the western extremity of the above defined southern boundary line to the northern extremity of the above defined eastern boundary line.

THE WEST WARD

shall comprise all rateable property situated south of High Street aforesaid, and included within the following boundaries ; that is to say, bounded on the north by a line running from the point where St. George's place meets High Street, westward along High Street ; thence along the Tewkesbury road to the boundary of the parish ; and bounded on the east by a line running from the point where St. George's Place meets High Street, southward along St. George's Place, thence along St. George's Parade, thence along Bays Hill road to the point where that road meets Queen's Parade, thence eastward along Queen's Parade to the point where the same meets Old Well Lane, thence Southward along Old Well Lane to the point where the same meets Lansdown or new Gloucester road, thence south westward along the Lansdown or new Gloucester road, thence

along Old Gloucester road to the boundary of the said parish, and further bounded by a line running along the boundary of the said parish from the western extremity of the above defined eastern boundary line.

THE MIDDLE WARD

shall comprise all rateable property situated south of High Street aforesaid, and included within the following boundaries: that is to say, bounded on the north by a line running from the point where Rodney Terrace meets High Street, westward along High Street to a point where the same meets St. George's Place, and bounded on the west by the eastern boundary line of the West Ward, and bounded on the east by a line running from the point where Rodney Terrace meets High Street, southward along Rodney Terrace, thence along Trafalgar Lane to the point where Trafalgar Lane meets Montpellier Spa Buildings road, thence eastward along the Montpellier Spa Buildings road to the point where the same meets Montpellier Parade, thence southward along Montpellier Parade to the point where the same meets Montpellier Terrace, thence westward along Montpellier Terrace to the point where the same meets Suffolk Parade, thence southward along Suffolk Parade, thence along Great Norwood Street to the boundary of the parish; and further bounded by a line running along the boundary of the said parish from the south-western extremity of the above defined western boundary line to the southern extremity of the above defined eastern boundary line.

THE SOUTH WARD

shall comprise all rateable property situated on the south of High Street aforesaid, and included within the following boundaries: that is to say, bounded on the north by a line running from the point where Rodney Terrace meets High Street, eastward along High Street to the boundary of the said parish; and bounded on the west by the eastern boundary line of the Middle Ward, and further bounded by a line running along the boundary of the said parish from the eastern extremity of the above defined northern boundary line to the southern extremity of the above defined western boundary line.

Regulations of the Cheltenham Winter Balls, 1851-52.

1.—That the Annual Series of Subscription Balls and Card Assemblies for the ensuing Winter, at the Assembly Rooms, commence on Monday, Nov. 10, and take place weekly, up to Feb. 23, 1852, inclusive; the last Ball being, as usual, on Easter Monday, April 12.

2.—That the Balls commence at Nine and conclude at One o'clock. Ladies are particularly requested to give attention to this Regulation, that the Master of the Ceremonies may be enabled, by their punctual attendance, to commence the Balls at the appointed time.

3.—That no Clerk in this Town or neighbourhood, (except the sons of gentlemen who are themselves eligible to be Subscribers to the Balls); no Person engaged in retail trade or other public business, no theatrical, or other public performer by profession be admitted; and the Lessee of the Assembly Rooms is hereby instructed not to receive Subscriptions from, or to issue tickets to such parties to whom the above restriction applies.

4.—That the Regulations relating to Dancing and all points of Etiquette, at the Balls, be left to the Master of the Ceremonies for the time being; and that the same authority as was exercised by all preceding Masters of the Ceremonies be used by him: and it is incumbent upon the Subscribers (inasmuch as they must be desirous of promoting good order and decorum in these assemblies) to conform to those Regulations and support the Master of the Ceremonies in the execution of his office.

5.—That the Master of the Ceremonies shall not be held accountable to any individual whatever, who may dispute or object to the established Regulations; but in case of any misunderstanding arising from this or other matters connected with the Balls, a reference may be made to the Committee; such reference, however, upon no account to be made at the time to any individual Member of it, but to be submitted to the Committee, in writing, on the morning following any such misunderstanding, for their consideration and decision.

6.—That the Rooms be opened for a Card Assembly every night of the Subscription Balls, at Eight o'clock.

7.—That after a Card Table has been once formed, no person be permitted to cut in, unless invited to do so by the party already assembled.

8.—That the Committee do, at all times, give their support to the Master of the Ceremonies for the due performance of the established Regulations; and that they assist him, as far as possible, in introducing Strangers to Partners, in order to promote the pleasures of the Ball Room.

9.—That no resolution passed at any meeting of this Committee be rescinded, unless at a meeting called for that purpose, of which due notice by circular has been given, and at which at least five members are present.

each, provided they are posted at the window, and that the Fee as well as the Postage be paid by attaching the requisite stamps. For those Mails despatched "during the night," letters bearing an additional stamp may be posted till 10.30 p.m.

ON THE SUNDAY Foreign Letters may be paid, postage stamps may be obtained, and Letters may be registered till 10 a.m., when the Office is closed for the remainder of the day.

BRANCH RECEIVING HOUSES.—Montpellier Avenue, Tewkesbury Road, St. Paul's Street North, Portland Square, Corpus Street, and Northwick Terrace. Letters are despatched to the chief Office in Clarence Street three times daily, *viz.*, 11.25 a.m., 7.25 p.m., and 8.25 p.m.

REGISTERED LETTERS.—Letters intended to be registered must be presented at the office at least *half-an-hour* before the closing of the box for the mail by which they are to be forwarded. The fee on Inland Letters is *sixpence*, which, together with the postage, must be paid in advance. All letters containing money or other articles of value should be registered.

MONEY ORDERS.—Money Orders are issued and paid (at the General Office only) from 9 a.m. to 6 p.m. These Orders must be presented for payment before the end of the second Calendar Month after that in which they were issued, otherwise new orders will be necessary, for which a second commission will be charged. Orders not presented for payment before the end of the twelfth Calendar Month after that in which they were issued, are, by a recent Act of Parliament, null and void.

PRE-PAID RATES OF POSTAGE.—Letters *not exceeding* $\frac{1}{2}$ oz. one penny, 1 oz. two pence, 2 ozs. four pence, and so on, two rates being added for every ounce. Inland Letters posted unpaid are charged double the pre-paid rates. Letters *insufficiently* paid are charged on delivery double the difference between the amount paid and the proper rate.

LIMITATION OF SIZE AND WEIGHT.—Any Letter or Packet sent by Post between places within the United Kingdom must not exceed *two feet* in length. The weight is unlimited, but if it *exceed four ounces* the postage *must be pre-paid*.

The following are exceptions to the above restrictions:—Parliamentary Petitions, or Addresses to her Majesty; Petitions to either House of Parliament forwarded to any Member of such House; Printed Votes or Proceedings of Parliament; Letters or Packets to or from Public Departments or Public Officers on her Majesty's Service; Letters, &c., to or from places Abroad.

PRINTED BOOKS, Magazines, Reviews, and Pamphlets (whether British, Colonial, or Foreign), may be transmitted by Post within the United Kingdom, at the rate of 6d. a pound, on the following conditions:—

- 1.—Every such Packet must be sent without a Cover, or in a Cover open at the ends.
- 2.—It must contain a Single Volume only.

- 3.—No writing or marks must be upon the Cover, or its contents, other than the address of the sender and the person to whom it may be sent, except under the following restrictions, viz.—Any such writing or marks on any leaf of the Book (Magazine, Review, or Pamphlet), or on the binding thereof, must be on one and the self-same page of the Book, or corresponding portion of the binding.
- 4.—The Postage must be pre-paid in full, by affixing outside the Packet or its Cover the proper Stamps.

BOOKS, &c. may also be forwarded by Packet, under the same conditions, (except that there must be no writing either inside or on the cover), to Nova Scotia, Canada, Bermuda, Newfoundland, British West Indies, Malta, Gibraltar, the Ionian Islands, and Hong Kong, *via* Southampton, at 6d. for 8 ozs., or double the above rates.

If any of the above conditions are violated, the Packet will be charged as a letter.

ARTICLES WHICH MAY NOT BE SENT BY POST.—Letters or Packets containing any of the following inclosures, cannot be forwarded through the Post Office, *viz.*, any Glass or Glass Bottle, any Razor, Scissors, Knife, Fork, or other sharp or pointed Instrument; any Leeches, Game, Fish, Flesh, Fruit, Vegetable, or other perishable substance; any Bladder, or other vessel containing liquid; or any Article, Matter, or Thing whatsoever, which might, by pressure or otherwise, be rendered injurious to the Officers of the Post Office, or to the contents of the Mail Bags.

LETTERS FOR WARM CLIMATES NOT TO BE SEALED WITH WAX.—The practice of Sealing Letters for the East and West Indies, and other warm climates, with Wax is attended with much inconvenience, and frequently with serious injury to the Letters, in consequence of the melting of the wax, and adhesion of the Letters to each other.

NEWSPAPERS.

On Newspapers passing between places in the United Kingdom, any Writing or Marks are allowed, provided that a Postage of a Penny be pre-paid, by means of a Stamp conspicuously affixed outside the Cover or Folded Newspaper; and in those cases where the Newspaper may be liable to a Postage, irrespective of the Writing or Marks (as when Posted and Delivered in the same town), the Penny Stamp will cover the Writing and Postage also. This privilege is confined to Writing or Marks on the Newspaper itself. Newspapers with any Writing or Marks and not pre-paid as above; or if pre-paid and containing any enclosure, or with any Writing or Marks on the Cover other than the address, are liable to the full rate of Postage, chargeable on Un-paid Letters of the same weight.

NEWSPAPERS TO THE COLONIES OR FOREIGN COUNTRIES must be posted within *seven days* after the day of publication. [For rates of postage, see page 36]. Newspapers containing any inclosure, or with any writing or mark, whether upon them, or upon the Covers, other than the address of the party to whom they are forwarded, are chargeable with *trèble* the duty of Letter postage.
