IV.—Nov. 20, a total Eclipse of the Sun. Invisible at Greenwich.

ASSESSED TAXES.

CARRIAGES.

For every carriage with four wheels, drawn by two or more horses or mules, £3 10s.; if drawn by one horse or mule, £2. For every carriage with four wheels, each being of less diameter than thirty inches, and drawn by two or more ponies or mules, neither exceeding thirteen hands in height, £1 15s.; where the same shall be drawn by one such pony or mule only, £1. For every carriage with less than four wheels, if drawn by two or more horses or mules, £2; if drawn by one horse or mule, 15s.; and where the same shall be drawn by one pony or mule only, not exceeding thirteen hands in height, 10s.; and where such carriage shall be kept and used only for the purpose of being let for hire, one-half of the above-mentioned duties respectively. For every carriage used by any common carrier, and used only occasionally for conveying passengers for hire, where such carriage shall have four wheels, £2 6s. 8d.; and where the same shall have less than four wheels, £1 6s. 8d.

Exemptions.—Carriages used solely in the affairs of trade or husbandry, and whereon the name and address of the owner shall be legibly painted; provided such carriage shall not be used for any purpose of pleasure, except for conveying the owners thereof or his family to or from any place of divine worship.

HORSES.

For every race horse, £3 17s. For every horse, and for every mule, exceeding respectively the height of thirteen hands, kept for the purpose of riding, or drawing any carriage chargeable with duty, £1 1s. For every such horse or mule, not chargeable as above, 10s. 6d. For every pony or mule, not exceeding the height of thirteen hands, kept for the purpose of riding, or drawing any carriage chargeable with duty, 10s. 6d.; and for every such pony or mule kept for any other purpose, 5s. 3d.

Exemptions.—Horses used for the purposes of husbandry, or for drawing any carriage not chargeable with duty, or for carrying burdens in the course of trade. Horses used in the trade or business of a market gardener. Ponies or mules not exceeding thirteen hands in height, and used solely in any underground mine. Horses used in her Majesty's service by officers or private soldiers.

DOGS.

For every dog, of whatever description or denomination the same may be, 12s. No person to be chargeable to any greater amount than £39 12s. for any number of hounds, or £9 for any number of greyhounds, kept by him in one year.

Exemptions.—Any dog which, at the time of returning the list of dogs, shall be under the age of six calendar months; dogs kept solely for the care of sheep or cattle; provided no such dog shall be a greyhound, hound pointer, setting-dog, spaniel, lurcher, or terrier.

ASSESSED TAXES.

HOUSE DUTIES.

The Duties on Windows having been repealed in the Session of 1850, a House Duty is now substituted of 9d. in the pound on houses worth £20 and upwards per annum in rent. But dwelling-houses with shop annexed on the basement floor; or houses occupied by any person duly licensed for the sale of ale, wine, and other liquors; or houses which are *bonâ fide* farm-houses occupied by a tenant or farm servant, are to pay 6d. in the pound. In the valuation of houses belonging to market-gardens and nursery grounds, the gardens and grounds are not to be estimated.

INCOME AND PROPERTY TAX.

By an Act of 6 Victoria, an assessment of 7d. in the pound was charged in England on profits arising from property, professions, trades, and offices; and dividends received by persons resident therein, payable out of the revenue of Foreign States; and by an Act passed in the Session of 1853, the assessment is continued and applied to the whole of the United Kingdom, until the 6th of April, 1855; at the same rate till April 5, 1856, then till April 5, 1857, at 6d. in the pound; and then till April 5, 1860, at 5d. in the pound on all incomes amounting to £100 a year; and on occupiers of farms the half of the above sums on the annual value. All persons whose incomes are between £100 and £150 a-year, to pay only 5d. in the pound for the whole term; and persons insuring their lives are allowed to deduct the amount so paid from the return of their incomes.

DUTIES ON SUCCESSION AND LEGACIES.

Of the Value of £20 or upwards, out of Personal Estate, or charged upon Real Estate, or on £100, if in direct succession, &c.; and upon every share of Residue;

To a child or parent, or any lineal descendant or ancestor of the deceased, £1 per cent. To a brother or sister, or their descendants, £3 per cent. To an uncle or aunt, or their descendants, £5 per cent. To a great uncle or great aunt, or their descendants, £6 per cent. To any other relation, or any stranger in blood, £10 per cent. Legacy to husband or wife exempt.

The Public Commissioners hold their meetings at the Public Office, the first Friday in every month, at 11 o'clock in the Forenoon, for the purpose of taking cognizance of all matters connected with the local government of the town—plenary powers being vested in them for that purpose by an Act of Parliament, passed in the year 1852 (15th Victoria); by which Act they are also empowered to frame such bye-laws and rules as to them shall appear necessary for the health, security, and general internal economy of the town. The appointment and direction of the fire establishment, the paving, cleansing, and lighting the streets and highways, the regulation and superintendence of the flies and public conveyances, are all comprehended within their peculiar province.

WARD DIVISIONS.

The following are the Limits and Boundaries of the Five Wards into which the Parish of Cheltenham has, by order of the Poor-Law Commissioners, been divided:—

THE EAST WARD

shall comprise all rateable property situated north of the High Street in the said parish, and included within the following boundaries: that is to say, bounded on the south by a line running from the point where Pittville Street meets High Street, eastward along High Street to the boundary of the said parish; bounded on the west by a line running from the point where Pittville Street meets High Street, northward along Pittville Street, thence along Portland Street, and thence along the Cleeve and Evesham road to the boundary of the said parish; and further bounded by a line running along the boundary of the parish from the eastern extremity of the above defined southern boundary line to the northern extremity of the above defined western boundary line.

THE NORTH WARD

shall comprise all rateable property situated north of High Street aforesaid, and included within the following boundaries: that is to say, bounded on the south by a line running from the point where Pittville Street meets High Street, westward along High Street, and thence along the Tewkesbury road to the boundary of the said parish; and bounded on the east by the western boundary line of the East Ward; and further bounded by a line running along the boundary of the said parish from the western extremity of the above defined southern boundary line to the northern extremity of the above defined eastern boundary line.

THE WEST WARD

shall comprise all rateable property situated south of High Street aforesaid, and included within the following boundaries: that is to say, bounded on the north by a line running from the point where St. George's Place meets High Street, westward along High Street; thence along the Tewkesbury road to the boundary of the parish; and bounded on the east by a line running from the point where St. George's Place meets High Street, southward along St. George's Place, thence along St. George's Parade, thence along Bays Hill road to the point where that road meets Queen's Parade, thence

eastward along Queen's Parade to the point where the same meets Old Well Lane, thence Southward along Old Well Lane to the point where the same meets Lansdown or new Gloucester road, thence south westward along the Lansdown or new Gloucester road, thence along old Gloucester road to the boundary of the said parish, and further bounded by a line running along the boundary of the said parish from the western extremity of the above defined eastern boundary line.

THE MIDDLE WARD

shall comprise all rateable property situated south of High Street aforesaid, and included within the following boundaries : that is to say, bounded on the north by a line running from the point where Rodney Terrace meets High Street, westward along High Street to a point where the same meets St. George's Place, and bounded on the west by the eastern boundary line of the West Ward, and bounded on the east by a line running from the point where Rodney Terrace meets High Street, southward along Rodney Terrace, hence along Trafalgar Lane to the point where Trafalgar Lane meets Montpellier Spa Buildings road, thence eastward along the Montpellier Spa Buildings road to the point where the same meets Montpellier Parade, thence southward along Montpellier Parade to the point where the same meets Montpellier Terrace, thence westward along Montpellier Terrace to the point where the same meets Suffolk Parade, thence southward along Suffolk Parade, thence along Great Norwood Street to the boundary of the parish ; and further bounded by a line running along the boundary of the said parish from the south-western extremity of the above defined western boundary line to the southern extremity of the above defined eastern boundary line.

THE SOUTH WARD

shall comprise all rateable property situated on the south of High Street aforesaid, and included within the following boundaries : that is to say, bounded on the north by a line running from the point where Rodney Terrace meets High Street, eastward along High Street to the boundary of the said parish ; and bounded on the west by the eastern boundary line of the Middle Ward, and further bounded by a line running along the boundary of the said parish from the eastern extremity of the above defined northern boundary line to the southern extremity of the above defined western boundary line.

ON THE SUNDAY Foreign Letters may be paid, postage stamps may be obtained, and Letters may be registered till 10 a.m., when the Office is closed for the remainder of the day.

BRANCH RECEIVING HOUSES.—Montpellier Avenue, Tewkesbury Road, St. Paul's Street North, Portland Square, Corpus Street, and Northwick Terrace. Letters are despatched to the chief Office in Clarence Street three times daily, *viz.*, 11.10 a.m., 7.25 p.m., and 8.40 p.m.

REGISTERED LETTERS.—Letters intended to be registered must be presented at the office at least *half-an-hour* before the closing of the box for the mail by which they are to be forwarded. The fee on Inland Letters is *sixpence*, which, together with the postage, must be paid in advance. All letters containing money or other articles of value should be registered.

MONEY ORDERS.—Money Orders are issued and paid (at the General Office only) from 9 a.m to 6 p.m. To prevent errors, the Public are requested to furnish in writing the full particulars of every order required.

PRE-PAID RATES OF POSTAGE.—Letters *not exceeding* $\frac{1}{2}$ oz. one penny, 1 oz. two pence, 2 ozs. four pence, and so on, two rates being added for every ounce. Inland Letters posted unpaid are charged double the pre-paid rates. Letters *insufficiently* paid are charged on delivery double the difference between the amount paid and the proper rate.

LIMITATION OF SIZE AND WEIGHT.—Any Letter or Packet sent by Post between places within the United Kingdom must not exceed *two feet* in length. The weight is unlimited, but if it *exceed four ounces* the postage *must be pre-paid*.

INLAND BOOK POST.—Book Packets containing any number of separate Books, Maps, or Prints, and any quantity of Paper, Vellum, or Parchment (to the exclusion of Letters whether sealed or open), may be forwarded by Post within the United Kingdom at the rate of 6d. a pound.

PRINTED BOOKS, Magazines, Reviews, and Pamphlets (whether British, Colonial, or Foreign), may be transmitted by Post to Nova Scotia, Canada, Bermuda, Newfoundland, Prince Edward Island, Heligoland, Cape Town, Gold Coast, Ceylon, St. Helena, New South Wales, India, New Zealand, British West Indies, Malta, Gibraltar, Mauritius, and Hong Kong, at the rate of 6d. for 8 ozs. Each packet must contain one volume only.

NEWSPAPERS.

On Newspapers passing between places in the United Kingdom, any Writing or Marks are allowed, provided that a Postage of a Penny be pre-paid, by means of a Stamp conspicuously affixed outside the Cover or Folded Newspaper; and in those cases where the Newspaper may be liable to a Postage, irrespective of the

Writing or Marks (as when Posted and Delivered in the same town), the Penny Stamp will cover the Writing and Postage also. This privilege is confined to Writing or Marks on the Newspaper itself. Newspapers with any Writing or Marks and not pre-paid as above; or if pre-paid and containing any enclosure, or with any Writing or Marks on the Cover other than the address, are liable to the full rate of Postage, chargeable on Un-paid Letters of the same weight.

NEWSPAPERS TO THE COLONIES OR FOREIGN COUNTRIES must be posted within *seven days* after the day of publication. [For rates of postage, see page 36]. Newspapers containing any inclosure, or with any writing or mark, whether upon them, or upon the Covers, other than the address of the party to whom they are forwarded, are chargeable with treble the duty of Letter postage.

LETTERS FOR WARM CLIMATES NOT TO BE SEALED WITH WAX.—The practice of Sealing Letters for the East and West Indies, and other warm climates, with Wax is attended with much inconvenience, and frequently with serious injury to the Letters, in consequence of the melting of the wax, and adhesion of the Letters to each other.

ARTICLES WHICH MAY NOT BE SENT BY POST.—Letters or Packets containing any of the following inclosures, cannot be forwarded through the Post Office, *viz.*, any Glass or Glass Bottle, any Razor, Scissors, Knife, Fork, or other sharp or pointed Instrument; any Leeches, Game, Fish, Flesh, Fruit, Vegetable, or other perishable substance; any Bladder, or other vessel containing liquid; or any Article, Matter, or Thing whatsoever, which might, by pressure or otherwise, be rendered injurious to the Officers of the Post Office, or to the contents of the Mail Bags.
