Inland Book Post.

Books, MSS., Music, &c., in parcels not exceeding two feet either way, and left open, for inspection, at both ends, may be posted to any part of Great Britain at the following rates :—Under four ounces in weight, one penny; under eight ounces, twopence; under sixteen ounces, fourpence; under one pound and a half, sixpence, and twopence extra for every additional half pound or portion of a half pound.

Postage of Newspapers.

Newspapers addressed to any part of Great Britain, may have the Government impressed stamp or an ordinary postage stamp affixed to the paper or wrapper.

Newspapers sent Abroad.

Newspapers directed in foreign countries and the colonies should not have the impressed Government stamp. But it is necessary to fix upon the paper or wrapper postage stamps according to the rate charged in each case for newspaper postage. For instance :—

Generally speaking the newspaper postage to the British Colonies and possessions is One Penny, if under four ounces. It is also One Penny to the undermentioned places among many others :—Africa (West Coast of), Alexandria, Austria, Baden, Belgium, Brazil, Cape of Good Hope, France, Malta, New South Wales, New Zealand, Pacific (any place in), Panama, Papal States, Prussia, Russia, and the West Indies.
