March 6—An Annular Eclipse of the Sun, partially visible in England, commencing at 7h. 16m. a.m. and ending at 0h. 16m. p.m.

March 20—A Partial Eclipse of the Moon, invisible in England, commencing at 6h. 5m. a.m. and ending at 11h. 32m. a.m.

August 29—A Total Eclipse of the Sun, but invisible in England, commencing at 10h. 53m. a.m. and ending at 3h. 32m. p.m.

Sept. 13—A Partial Eclipse of the Moon, invisible in England, commencing at 9h. 43m. p.m. and ending Sept. 14 at 3h. 9m. a.m.

CARRIAGES.

For every carriage with four wheels, drawn by two or more horses or mules, £3 10s.; if drawn by one horse or mule, £2. For every carriage with four wheels, each being of less diameter than thirty inches, and drawn by two or more ponies or mules, neither exceeding thirteen hands in height, £1 15s.; where the same shall be drawn by one such pony or mule only, £1. For every carriage with less than four wheels, if drawn by two or more horses or mules, £2; if drawn by one horse or mule, 15s.; and where the same shall be drawn by one pony or mule only, not exceeding thirteen hands in height, 10s.; and where such carriage shall be kept and used only for the purpose of being let for hire, one-half of the above-mentioned duties respectively. For every carriage used by any common carrier, and used only occasionally for conveying passengers for hire, where such carriage shall have four wheels, £2 6s. 8d.; and where the same shall have less than four wheels, £1 6s. 8d.

Exemptions.—Carriages used solely in the affairs of trade or husbandry, and whereon the name and address of the owner shall be legibly painted; provided such carriage shall not be used for any purpose of pleasure, except for conveying the owners thereof or his family to or from any place of divine worship.

HORSES.

For every race horse, £3 17s. For every horse, and for every mule, exceeding respectively the height of thirteen hands, kept for the purpose of riding, or drawing any carriage chargeable with duty, £1 1s. For every such horse or mule, not chargeable as above, 10s. 6d. For every pony or mule, not exceeding the height of thirteen hands, kept for the purpose of riding, or drawing any carriage chargeable with duty, 10s. 6d.; and for every such pony or mule kept for any other purpose, 5s. 3d.

Exemptions.—Horses used for the purposes of husbandry, or for drawing any carriage not chargeable with duty, or for carrying burdens in the course of trade. Horses used in the trade or business of a market gardener. Ponies or mules not exceeding thirteen hands in height, and used solely in any underground mine. Horses used in her Majesty's service by officers or private soldiers.

DOGS.

For every dog, of whatever description or denomination the same may be, 12s. No person to be chargeable to any greater amount than £39 12s. for any number of hounds, or £9 for any number of greyhounds, kept by him in one year.

Exemptions.—Any dog which, at the time of returning the list of dogs, shall be under the age of six calendar months; dogs kept solely for the care of sheep or cattle; provided no such dog shall be a greyhound, hound, pointer, setting-dog, spaniel, lurcher, or terrier.

HOUSE DUTIES.

The Duties on Windows having been repealed in the Session of 1850, a House Duty is now substituted of 9d. in the pound on houses worth £20 and upwards per annum in rent. But dwelling-houses with shop annexed on the basement floor; or houses occupied by any person duly licensed for the sale of ale, wine, and other liquors; or houses which are *bonâ fide* farm-houses occupied by a tenant or farm servant, are to pay 6d. in the pound. In the valuation of houses belonging to market-gardens and nursery grounds, the gardens and grounds are not to be estimated.

DUTIES OF SUCCESSION AND LEGACIES.

Of the Value of £20 or upwards, out of Personal Estate, or charged upon Real Estate, or on £100, if in direct succession, &c.; and upon every share of Residue;

To a child or parent, or any lineal descendant or ancestor of the deceased, £1 per cent. To a brother or sister, or their descendants, £3 per cent. To an uncle or aunt, or their descendants, £5 per cent. To a great uncle or great aunt, or their descendants, £6 per cent. To any other relation, or any stranger in blood, £10 per cent. Legacy to husband or wife exempt.

The last Act passed for imposing a Tax upon Incomes and Property, fixed the amount thereof at Fourpence in the Pound, a deduction of £60 being allowed on all Incomes from £100 to £200.

Premiums paid for Assurance on a Person's Life or on the Life of a Wife, or for a Deferred Annuity to a Widow, are also free from this Tax.

The Transfer Days are now Tuesdays, Wednesdays, Thursdays, and Fridays. Dividends are due at the following dates after an interval of three days, or, if a Sunday intervenes, of four days.

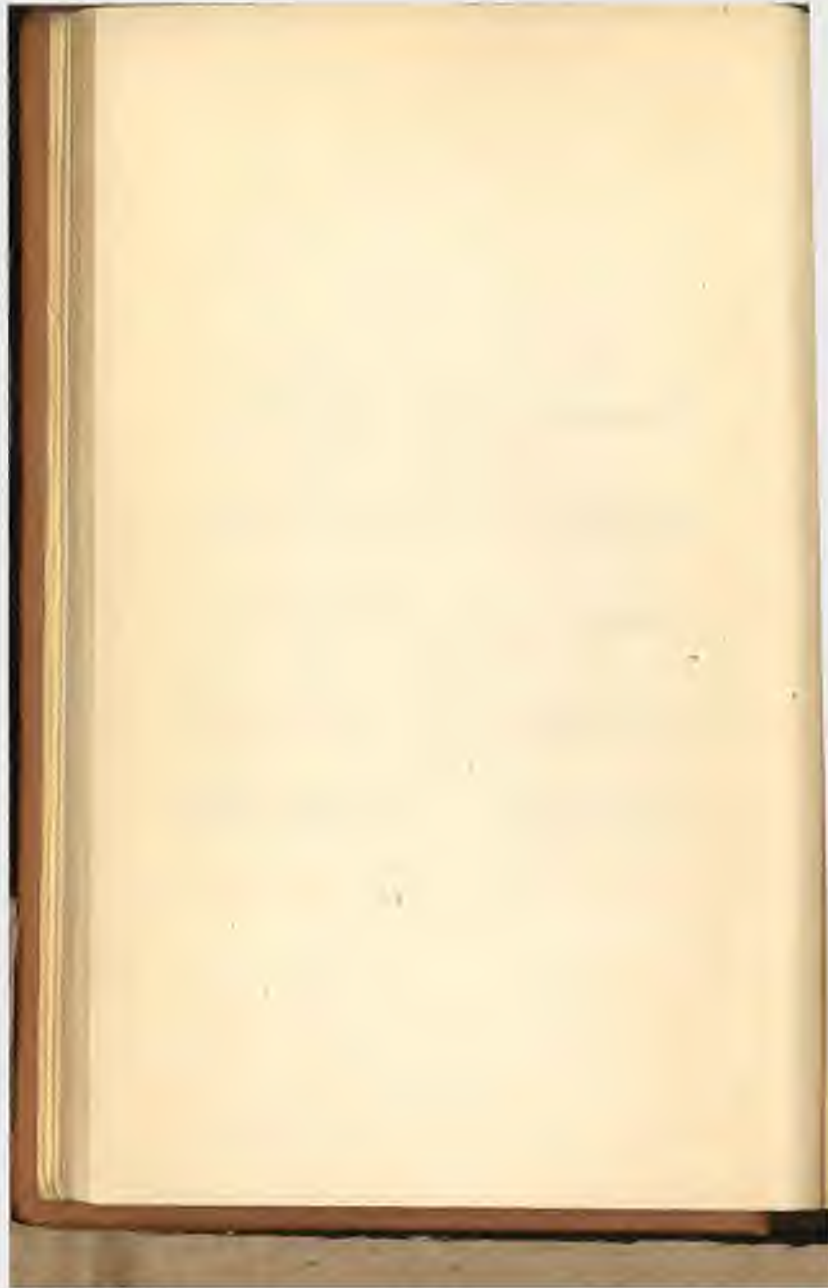

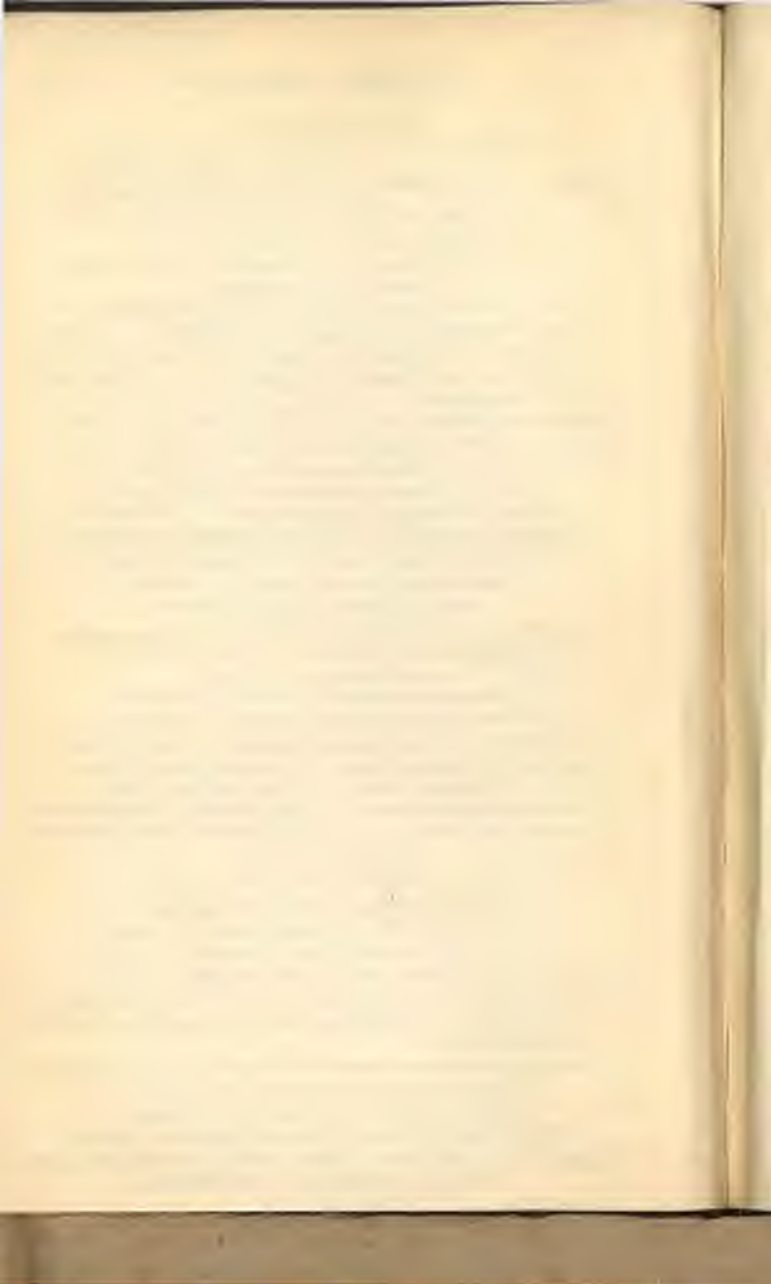

The Directory is strictly confined to Streets inhabited either wholly or in part by the Resident Gentry—those occupied by persons engaged in trade, or by the labouring classes generally, being passed over, for the obvious reason that any attempt to furnish a correct list of their inhabitants would be as impossible as unnecessary in a work expressly designed for the use of the upper circles of society, or persons extensively engaged in trades and callings having constant intercourse therewith.

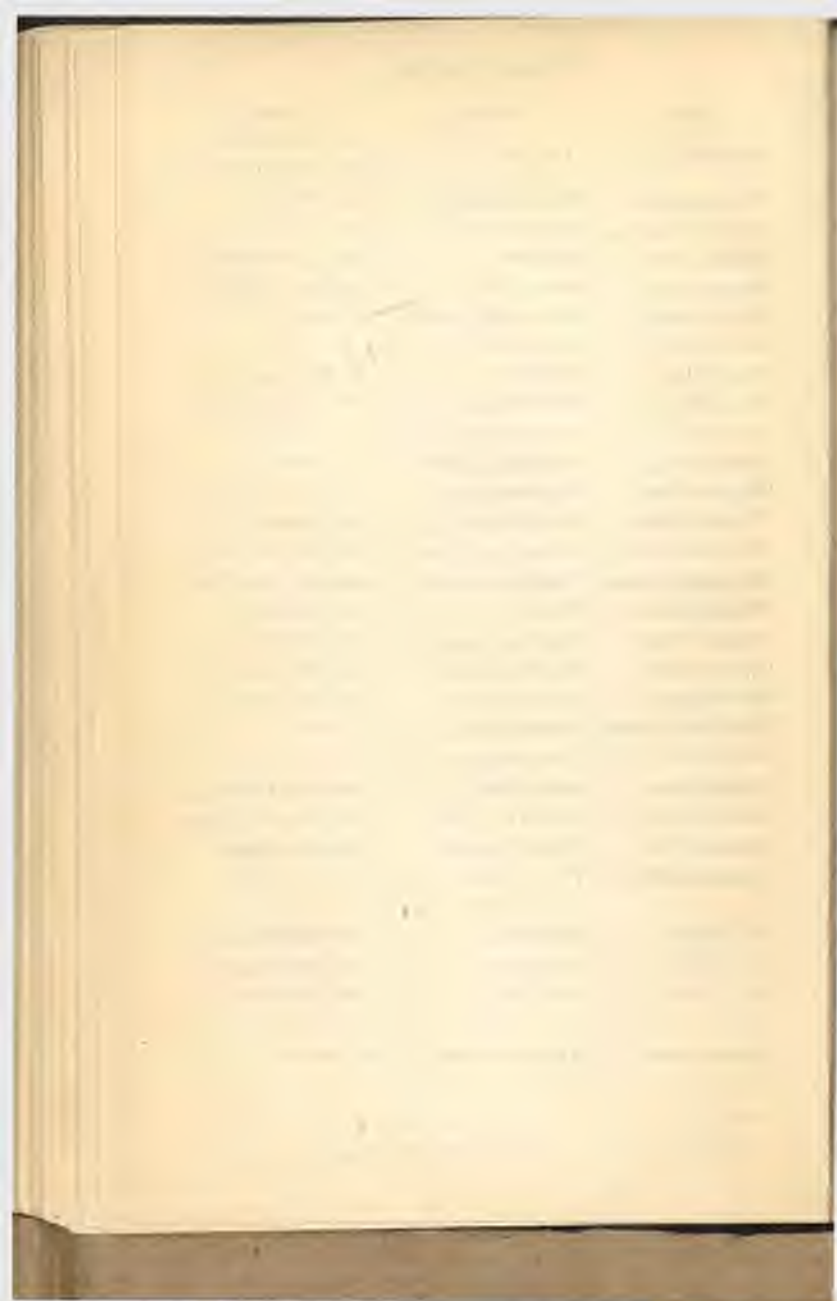

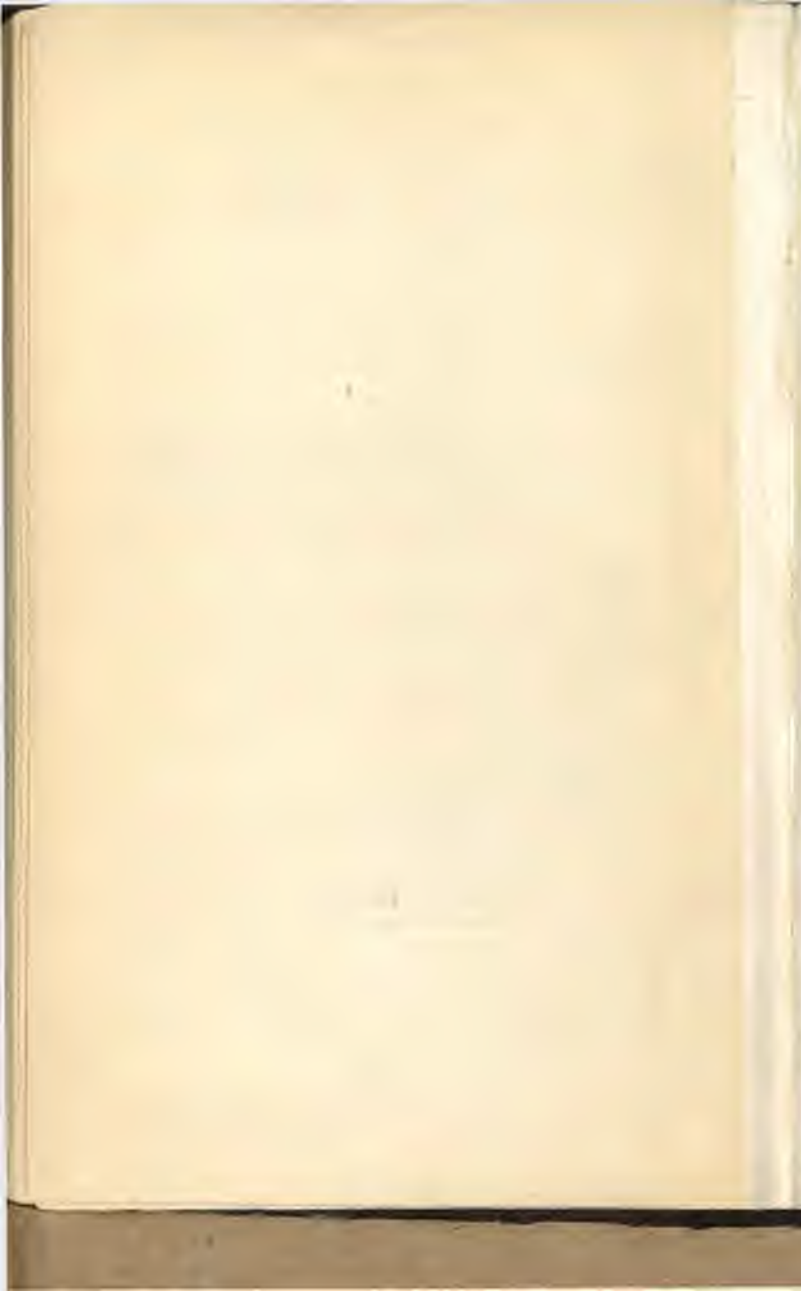

The first Thirty Commissioners were named in the Act of Parliament, but two retired out of each Ward annually, by rotation, which order is now observed. Of the following list, the first two in each Ward retire on the 20th of November, 1867; the second two on the 20th of November, 1868; and the third two on the 20th of November, 1869—their places being then supplied by others elected by the Ratepayers. The outgoing Commissioners are all eligible for re-election. The qualification for a Commissioner is the possession of property to the amount of £1,000, or being rated to the Poor Rate at £40. Commissioners must have their residence within five miles of the Borough.

LIMITATION OF SIZE AND WEIGHT.—Any Letter or Packet sent by Post between places within the United Kingdom must not exceed *two feet* in length. The weight is unlimited.

INLAND BOOK POST.—Book Packets containing any number of Books, Pamphlets, Maps, or Prints, and any quantity of Paper, Vellum, or Parchment (to the exclusion of Letters whether sealed or open), may be forwarded by Post within the United Kingdom at the rate of a 1d. for every 4 ozs, but must not exceed two feet in length, and twelve inches, in width.

PRINTED BOOKS, Magazines, Reviews, and Pamphlets (whether British, Colonial, or Foreign), may be transmitted by Post to Malta, Gibraltar, British West Indies, Cape of Good Hope, Nova Scotia, Canada, Bermuda, Newfoundland, Prince Edward Island, Gold Coast, 4ozs. for 3d; New South Wales, New Zealand, India, Ceylon, Hong Kong, and Mauritius, 4ozs. for 4d. (*See pages 11 and 12 Postal Guide*).

NEWSPAPERS, with impressed stamp, if posted within fifteen days after publication, or without limit as to time when having a postage label affixed to the direction, are conveyed free of all other charge to any part of the United Kingdom, but their weight must not exceed 4 ozs. Above that weight an additional penny stamp is required.

LETTERS FOR WARM CLIMATES NOT TO BE SEALED WITH WAX.—The practice of Sealing Letters for the East and West Indies, and other warm climates, with Wax is attended with much inconvenience, and frequently with serious injury to the Letters, in consequence of the melting of the wax, and adhesion of the Letters to each other.

ARTICLES WHICH MAY NOT BE SENT BY POST.—Letters or Packets containing any of the following inclosures, cannot be forwarded through the Post Office, *viz.*, any Glass or Glass Bottle, any Razor, Scissors, Knife, Fork, or other sharp or pointed Instrument; any Leeches, Game, Fish, Flesh, Fruit, Vegetable, or other perishable substance; any Bladder, or other vessel containing liquid; or any Article, Matter, or Thing whatsoever, which might, by pressure or otherwise, be rendered injurious to the Officers of the Post Office, or to the contents of the Mail Bags.

FRENCH POSTAGE.—A new postal treaty has been entered into with France, the principal effect of which will be the reduction of the postage upon pre-paid letters weighing not more than $\frac{1}{2}$ oz. (a weight which includes the great majority) to 4d., instead of 8d. or 10d., as heretofore. This reduced postage of 4d. will carry the letter from any part of the United Kingdom to any part of France or Algeria. If the letter be posted unpaid, the charge will be double. Under the provisions of this treaty the postage of letters passing through England or France will also in many cases be reduced. On all these points detailed information will be issued.

BELGIUM—The Postage reduced to 3d. $\frac{1}{2}$ oz. instead of 4d. $\frac{1}{2}$ oz., as heretofore, and 4d. *via* France per $\frac{1}{2}$ oz.

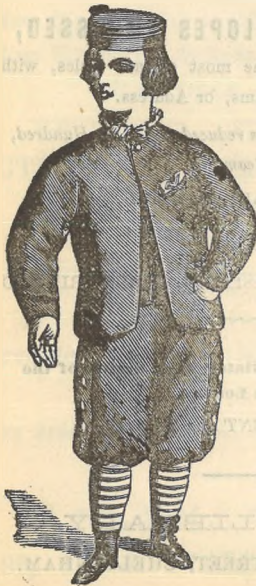
