



Probates of Wills, and Letters of Administration.

Where value exceeds £100 and not £500, £1 for each £50 or fraction of £50. Where value exceeds £500 and not £1,000, £1 5s. for each £50 or fraction of £50. Where value exceeds £1,000, £3 for each £100 or fraction of £100.

The value of estate of person dying domiciled in United Kingdom may be ascertained by deduction of debts, due to persons resident in United Kingdom, and funeral expenses.

The legacy and succession duties at one per cent, are not payable on assets covered by the stamp on the affidavit inventory or account.

On affidavit of value or inventory where gross value of personal estate in United Kingdom, or abroad, of person dying on or after 1st June, 1881, does not exceed £300.

A fixed duty of 30s, which satisfies legacy and succession duties on property to which the affidavit or inventory relates.

The stamp duty of 5s. per cent. paid on deed of voluntary settlement of property included in an account will be returned, on production of deed, to person delivering the account.

Heavy penalties are imposed for not paying probate and account duties within prescribed time.

36 ' PROPERTY AND INCOME TAX.

From 6th April, 1883, to 5th April, 1884, the Income Tax will be as follows:—Schedules A, 5d.; B, $2\frac{1}{2}$ d.; C, D, and E, 5d. in the pound. Persons, whose total income from every source whatsoever are less than £150 per annum are entitled to total exemption from Income Tax. Incomes of £150 and less than £400 per annum are subject to a duty of £2 10s.

Exemptions of Premiums from Income Tax.—Premiums paid by a person for an Assurance on his own life or on the life of his wife, or for a deferred Annuity to his widow, are declared free from Income Tax, provided such Premiums do not exceed one-sixth of his returnable income.

HOUSE DUTIES.

The Duties on Windows having been repealed in the Session of 1850, a House Duty is now substituted of 9d. in the pound on houses worth £20 and upwards per annum in rent. But dwelling-houses with shop annexed on the basement floor; or houses occupied by any person duly licensed for the sale of ale, wine, and other liquors; or houses which are bond fide farm-houses occupied by a tenant or farm servant, are to pay 6d. in the pound. In the valuation of houses belonging to market-gardens and nursery grounds, the gardens and grounds are not to be estimated.

DUTIES OF SUCCESSION AND LEGACIES.

Of the Value of £20 or upwards, out of Personal Estate, or charged upon Real Estate, or on £100, if in direct succession,

&c.; and upon every share of Residue;

To a brother or sister, or their descendants, £3 per cent. To an uncle or aunt, or their descendants, £5 per cent. To a great uncle or great aunt, or their descendants, £6 per cent. To any other relation, or any stranger in blood, £10 per cent. Legacies to husband, wife, or children, or lineal descendant of the deceased, are not chargeable with duty.

A letter exceeding the weight of 12 oz. is liable to a postage of 1d. for every ounce, beginning with the first ounce. A letter, for example, weighing between 14 and 15 ounces must be prepaid fifteen-pence.

A letter posted unpaid is chargeable on delivery with double postage; and a letter posted insufficiently prepaid is chargeable with double the deficiency. On re-directed letters the charge for re-direction is the same whether prepaid or collected on delivery.

No letter may exceed the dimensions of one foot six inches in length, nine inches in width, and six inches in depth.

INLAND BOOK POST.—Book Packets containing any number of Books, Pamphlets, Maps, or Prints, and any quantity of Paper, Vellum, or Parchment (to the exclusion of Letters whether sealed or open), may be forwarded by Post within the United Kingdom at the rate of a \(\frac{1}{2}\)d. for every 2 ozs., but must not exceed 5 lbs. in weight. Size the same as for Letters.

NEWSPAPERS, BOOKS, AND OTHER PUBLICATIONS TO THE COLONIES OR FOREIGN COUNTRIES, must have a postage stamp or stamps affixed, according to the rates set out in the British Postal Guide.

LETTERS FOR WARM CLIMATES NOT TO BE SEALED WITH WAX.—The practice of Scaling Letters for the East and West Indies, and other warm climates, with Wax is attended with much inconvenience, and frequently with serious injury to the Letters, in consequence of the melting of the wax, and adhesion of the Letters to each other.

ARTICLES WHICH MAY NOT BE SENT BY POST.—Letters or Packets containing any of the following inclosures, cannot be forwarded through the Post Office, viz., any Glass or Glass Bottle, any Razor, Scissors, Kl.ifc, Icrk, or other sharp or pointed Instrument; any Leeches, Game, Fish, Flesh, Fruit, Vegetable, or other perishable substance; any Bladder, or other vessel containing liquid; or any Article, Matter, or Thing whatsoever, which might, by pressure or otherwise, be rendered injurious to the Officers of the Post Office, or to the contents of the Mail Bags.

Letters containing Coin, Jewellery, or Watches, cannot, even if Registered, be sent to any foreign country comprised in the Postal Union.

INLAND PARCELS POST.

Parcels not exceeding 7lbs. in weight are now received at any Post Office for transmission between places in the United Kingdom.

In order that a Packet may go by Parcels Post, it must be tendered for transmission as a Parcel, and should bear the words "Parcels Post," which should be clearly written in the left-hand top corner.

Every Post Office will be open to the Public for Parcels Post business on week-days during the same hours as for general postal business. No Parcels Post business will, as a rule, be transacted in England or Ireland on Sundays, Christmas Days, and Good Fridays; nor in Scotland on Sundays and Sacramental Fast Days.

The following are the principal conditions and regulations-

For example-

A Parcel measuring 3ft. 6 in. in its longest dimension may measure as much as 2ft. 6 in. in girth. i.e.—round its thickest part; or a shorter Parcel may be thicker, thus, if it measure no more than 3ft. in length, it may measure as much as 3ft. in girth. ie.—round its thickest part.

The most convenient mode of measuring will be by means of a tape 6 feet long, having the length of 3 ft. 6 in. marked thereon. So much of the tape as is not used in measuring the length will be the measure of the maximum girth permissible. Such a tape, if provided by Stationers, might conveniently be marked in one color up to 3 ft. 6 in., and the remaining portion in another color.

No Parcel will be accepted which weighs more than 7 lbs., or is not sufficiently paid. The postage must, in all cases, be paid in advance, and by ordinary postage stamps, which must be affixed by the sender before tendering a Parcel for transmission by Parcels Post at a Post Office.

Posting of Parcels.—Parcels must not be posted in a letter box, but must be taken into a Post Office and handed over the counter. Care must be taken that every Parcel bears a clear address. If a Parcel be posted in a letter box it will not be forwarded by Parcels Post, but will be treated as a letter, or as a book packet if it can pass under Book Post regulations. The address of a Parcel must be clearly written, either on the outer wrapper or on a separate address label securely fastened to the Parcel; and the necessary stamp or stamps, to pre-pay the postage, must in all cases be placed (as in the case of letters) close above the address.


