

Where value exceeds £100 and not £300, £1 for each £50 or fraction of £50. Where value exceeds £300 and not £1,000, £1 5s. for each £50 or fraction of £50. Where value exceeds £1,000, £3 for each £100 or fraction of £100.

The value of estate of person dying domiciled in United Kingdom may be ascertained by deduction of debts, due to persons resident in United Kingdom, and funeral expenses.

The legacy and succession duties at one per cent. are not payable on assets covered by the stamp on the affidavit inventory or account.

On affidavit of value or inventory where gross value of personal estate in United Kingdom, or abroad, of person dying on or after 1st June, 1881, does not exceed £300.

A fixed duty of 30s. which satisfies legacy and succession duties on property to which the affidavit or inventory relates.

The stamp duty of 5s, per cent. paid on deed of voluntary settlement of property included in an account will be returned, on production of deed, to person delivering the account.

Heavy penalties are imposed for not paying probate and account duties within prescribed time,

From 5th April, 1888, to 5th April, 1889, the Income Tax will be as follows:—Schedules A, 6d.; B, 6d.; C, D, and E, 6d. in the pound. Persons, whose total incomes from every source whatsoever are less than £150 per annum are entitled to total exemption from Income Tax. Incomes of £150 and less than £400 per annum are taxed at the rate of $2\frac{1}{4}$ d. in the pound, allowing an abatement of £120.

Exemptions of Premiums from Income Tax.—Premiums paid by a person for an Assurance on his own life or on the life of his wife, or for a deferred Annuity to his widow, are declared free from Income Tax, provided such Premiums do not exceed one-sixth of his returnable income.

HOUSE DUTIES.

The Duties on Windows having been repealed in the Session of 1850, a House Duty is now substituted of 9d. in the pound on houses worth £20 and upwards per annum in rent. But dwelling-houses with shop annexed on the basement floor; or houses occupied by any person duly licensed for the sale of ale, wine, and other liquors; or houses which are bond fide farmhouses occupied by a tenant or farm servant, are to pay 6d. in the pound. Houses belonging to market-gardens and nursery grounds, the gardens and grounds are not to be estimated.



M. and W referring to the North, Central, East, South, Middle, and West Wards: those thoroughfares in which two or more initials are employed being Streets along which the line of severance travels down the centre-as High Street, Portland Street, Rodney Terrace, &c

The Directory is strictly confined to Streets inhabited either wholly or in part by the Resident Gentry-those occupied by persons engaged in trade, or by the labouring classes generally, being passed over, for the obvious reason that any attempt to furnish a correct list of their inhabitants would be as impossible as unnecessary in a work expressly designed for the use of the upper circles of society, or persons extensively engaged in trades and callings having constant intercourse therewith.

The fee is twopence, which, together with the postage, must be paid in advance. All letters containing money or other articles of value must be registered. By payment of an extra fee of 4d., letters can be registered up to closing of the letter box. Postal Orders are issued and paid at the General Post Office up to 9 p.m. week days, and at the Receiving Houses till 8:30 p.m.

Money Order and Savings' Bank Business is transacted at the General Office, and at 73, High Street (until 8 p.m. at this office only on Fridays and Saturdays), Keynsham Street, Townsend Place, Montpellier, Tivoli, Great Norwood Street, St. Mark's, Pittville, and Moorend Receiving Offices, from 9 a.m. to 6 p.m.; and Telegrams may be sent from Montpellier, Pittville, and St. Mark's. The Public must furnish in writing the full particulars of every Order required.

No letter may exceed the dimensions of one foot six inches in length, nine inches in width, and six inches in depth.

INLAND BOOK POST.—Book Packets containing any number of Books, Pamphlets, Maps, or Prints, and any quantity of Paper, Vellum, or Parchment (to the exclusion of Letters whether sealed or open), may be forwarded by Post within the United Kingdom at the rate of a ½d. for every 2 ozs., but must not exceed 5 lbs. in weight. Size the same as for Letters.

NEWSPAPERS, BOOKS, AND OTHER PUBLICATIONS TO THE COLONIES OR FOREIGN COUNTRIES, must have a postage stamp or stamps affixed, according to the rates set out in the Post Office Guide.

LETTERS FOR WARM CLIMATES NOT TO BE SEALED WITH WAX.—The practice of Sealing Letters for the East and West Indies, and other warm climates, with Wax is attended with much inconvenience, and frequently with serious injury to the Letters, in consequence of the melting of the wax, and adhesion of the Letters to each other.

ARTICLES WHICH MAY NOT BE SENT BY POST.—Letters or Packets containing any of the following inclosures, cannot be forwarded through the Post Office, viz., any Glass or Glass Bottle' any Razor, Scissors, Knife, Fork, or other sharp or pointed Instrument; any Leeches, Game, Fish, Flesh, Fruit, Vegetable, or other perishable substance; any Bladder, or other vessel containing

liquid; or any Article, Matter, or Thing whatsoever, which might by pressure or otherwise, be rendered injurious to the Officers of the Post Office, or to the contents of the Mail Bags. They can however be sent by Parcel Post, if properly packed.

Letters containing Coin, Jewellery, or Watches, cannot, even if Registered, be sent to any foreign country comprised in the Postal Injon.

INLAND PARCEL POST.

Parcels not exceeding 11lbs. in weight are now received at any Post Office for transmission between places in the United Kingdom.

In order that a Packet may go by Parcel Post, it must be tendered for transmission as a Parcel, and should bear the words "Parcel Post," which should be clearly written in the left-hand top corner.

Every Post Office is open to the Public for Parcel Post business on week-days during the same hours as for general postal business. No Parcel Post business, as a rule, is transacted in England or Ireland on Sundays, Christmas Days, and Good Fridays; nor in Scotland on Sundays and Sacramental Fast Days. There is however one Delivery of Parcels on Christmas Day and Good Friday.

The following are the principal conditions and regulations-

The size allowed for an Inland Postal Parcel will be—
Greatest length 3 ft. 6 in.
Greatest length and girth combined 6 ft. 0 in.

For example-

A Parcel measuring 3ft. 6 in. in its longest dimension may measure as much as 2 ft. 6 in. in girth. i.e.—round its thickest part; or a shorter Parcel may be thicker, thus, if it measure no more than 3 ft. in length, it may measure as much as 3 ft. in girth. i.e.—round its thickest part.

The most convenient mode of measuring will be by means of a tape 6 feet long, having the length of 3 ft, 6 in, marked thereon.

No Parcel will be accepted which weighs more than 11 lbs., or is not sufficiently paid. The postage must, in all cases, be paid in advance, and by ordinary postage stamps, which must be affixed by the sender before tendering a Parcel for transmission by Parcel Post at a Post Office.

POSTING OF PARCELS.—Parcels must not be posted in a letter box, but must be taken into a Post Office and handed over the counter. Care must be taken that every Parcel bears a clear address. If a Parcel be posted in a letter box it will not be forwarded by Parcel Post, but will be treated as a letter, or as a book packet if it can pass under Book Post regulations.

INSURANCE AND COMPENSATION.

The Postmaster General will (not in consequence of any legal liability, but voluntarily, and as an act of grace), subject to the rules hereinafter mentioned, give compensation for the loss and damage of inland parcels according to the following scale, viz. :-




