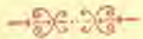

Preface.

THE Publisher issues the present Volume of "The Cheltenham Shilling Directory" conscious that no trouble or expense has been spared to make it reliable.

CHELTENHAM has been properly described by one of the principals of its great Colleges as "An Imperial Town," sending out from its Training Colleges Schoolmasters and Schoolmistresses. Its other great Educational Centres provide for the Army, Navy, and Civil Service, whilst the Educational influence of the Ladies' College is unbounded. This leads to enormous correspondence to all parts of the world, and work at the Post Office. It seems that on an average no less than nine and a half millions of letters (which term in official parlance includes postcards, newspapers, circulars, &c.) are delivered in Cheltenham in the course of the year, whilst upwards of ten millions are posted. Cheltenham was the first town in England to have pillar-boxes; and what will equally surprise some people is that the provision is less than half a century old. It is stated that a Captain Carter and a clergyman named Charlton were touring in Brussels, and noticed a pillar-box in the course of erection there. When the gentlemen got back to Cheltenham, which was their home, they brought the matter before the local postal authorities, with the result that soon after a dozen of such boxes were erected. There is nothing like facts and figures to convince those who are for ever saying "There is no money in Cheltenham." Wealthy Cheltenham! This is another title to which the Garden Town can justly lay claim. The published list of wills proved during the year amply proves it, if there were any doubt of its justice. The 35 estates sworn for probate—and the list does not include the names of all the deceased testators—aggregated the

enormous amount of £1,206,733, nearly doubling the previous year's record so far as could be publicly ascertained. Of course, this abnormal amount was swollen by the big estate of the late General A. W. H. Meyrick, reaching £343,962. Cheltenham also topped the county lists of bequests for charitable and religious purposes, as three pious donors left between them £23,000 altogether. Last year the amount was greater, namely, £70,000, but in that total Mr. J. C. Hay's splendid dispositions, over which his widow exercised her power of appointment, were counted. The county wills reached a total of £479,484, as against £601,535 in the corresponding period.

The number of New Villas and Houses that appear in this Directory for the first time, show that the wealth and fashion of the town is decidedly on the increase, whilst the London experts in objects of art and vertu who attend our occasional sales maintain there is no town of its size which contains so much wealth, and exclaim, like Blucher when he visited London after Waterloo, "Mine got, what a town for to sack."

The town stands on an elevated plateau ascending towards the N. and N.E., descending gently towards the Severn and the West. From thirty years observation the climate has been proved to be fairly bracing and very healthy, it is entirely free from flooded lands, which throw up damps and fogs, with their consequent evils. The fall of the land to the Severn is 40 feet to the straight mile. The following list of elevations are taken from the Ordinance Survey Map:—Hill House, Leckhampton, 490·0; Battledown (the Reservoir), 450·0; Montrose, Battledown, 350·0; Bafford House, Charlton Kings, 299·0; Railway Bridge, Bath-road, 260·0; Prestbury Church, 285·0; College Gymnasium, Park House, 244·0; Bayshill, 238·2; Roschill, Clevee-road, 232·0; Lansdown-terrace, 225·0; Montpellier Spa, 222·7; Cheltenham College, 222·0; Christ Church, 214·5; Vestable, Heath Lodge, Pittville Circus, 213·0; road round Pittville Circus, 205·0; Queen's Hotel, 201·5.

The general tendency of rates is to rise in amount, notwithstanding the increased grants from the State made to local authorities. In giving a return of the rates levied in towns classed as watering places for the year ending Lady-day next, the Rates for two successive years work out as follows:—

Low rates are no proof of a town's prosperity. Well we remember that after the census of 1881 it was resolved to boom the town on low rates: this was to cause the people to flock here in crowds. The present sewage works were put off; the floods in the Chelt were let go their own way: no public work of any kind was taken in hand that could be put off; the working men and mechanics walked about the streets with nothing to do (quite three-fourths of them); meetings of the unemployed took place under the town clock, and there were broken windows; soup kitchens were started to feed the wives of the men; the shopkeepers had no customers on Saturday night; and so it went on. The policy was a sound one; the low rates would fill the town. Well, 1891 arrived, and the census was taken again, and to our surprise, instead of a natural increase of two thousand, we had a decrease of one thousand, making a difference of three thousand in ten years. As the rates went down so did the population. Those that were in went out like a rat that leaves a sinking ship; whilst those that were out would not come in, like the rook who will not build in a rotten tree. It was found that starving the rates had left us seven hundred and ninety void houses—four hundred more than now, with all the building that has been going on. The people would not look at a town where the Corporation were standing still. The policy called "forward" now carried out by the Corporation was forced upon them after.
