CHELTENHAM

*HELTENHAM is a fashionable watering place, a municipal and parliamentary borough, market and union town, the head of a petty sessional division and county court district, having bankruptcy jurisdiction; it has a district registry of the High Court of Justice and is the head quarters of the county police. For ecclesiastical purposes it is in the rural deanery and archdeaconry of Cheltenham and diocese of Gloucester. It is 94 miles by road from London, 109 by the Great Western railway via Oxford and 121 via Swindon. The Great Western railway has three stations here that in St. James' square, which is the principal station, being near the centre of the town, which is o miles eastnorth-east from Gloucester by road and 71 by rail, 9 south from Tewkesbury, 15 west from Stow-on-the-Wold, 13 north-east from Stroud by road and 19 by rail, and 22 south from Worcester. The London, Midland & Scottish Railway Company has a passenger station here, in the Queen's road (Lansdown), about 13 miles from the centre of High street, and a goods station in the Tewkesbury road, about half a mile from the former. The Banbury and Cheltenham Direct railway, via Kingham, completed in 1886, is about 48 miles in length; it connects two of the principal sections of the Great Western railway and unites London and the Midland, Northern and Eastern counties by a shorter and more direct route from Cheltenham and the West of England. The Cheltenham and Honeybourne branch, opened in 1906, is about 21 miles in length, and connects Cheltenham and South Wales with Birmingham and Wolverhampton. The Cheltenham station on this line, called Malvern Road, was opened in 1908, and is one

minute's train run and about half a mile by road from St. James' station. The Great Western railway affords direct communication with the South Western counties. via Andoversford and Cirencester. There is also a Race Course station which is open on race days only.

The Cheltenham and District Light Railway, completed in 1901, by a company, is on the overhead electric trolley system, and runs from Gloucester road (near the Lansdown station of the Midland railway) to Cleeve Hill, Prestbury, Southam, Charlton Kings and Leckhampton, passing through some of the chief thoroughfares of the town.

The town was unrepresented until the passing of the Reform Act, 1832 (2 and 3 Wm. IV. c. 45), under which enactment it became entitled to one member; under the Boundary Act, 1868, a portion of the parish of Leckhampton was included in the parliamentary borough, and by the Redistribution of Seats Act, 1885 (48 and 49 Vict. c. 23), so much of the parish of Charlton Kings as lies to the north of the Cheltenham and Banbury railway was added. The borough was again extended, Nov. o. 1893, by further additions from the parishes of Leckhampton and Charlton Kings. Under the Representation of the People Act, 1918, Cheltenham still returns one member. Until 1876 the town was governed by thirty commissioners appointed under the Cheltenham Improvement Act, 1852; but under the Royal Charter of Incorporation, obtained in September, 1876, the borough has now a corporation, consisting of a mayor, deputy mayor, six aldermen and 18 councillors; the municipal borough is divided into six wards, and is co-extensive with the parish.

The town derives its name from the small river Chelt, which rises at Dowdeswell in the vicinity, and, in its course to the Severn, runs through the town, which is beautifully situated on an extensive plain, sheltered on the north and east by the Cotswold Hills, and consists of numerous fine streets, the principal of which, High street, is more than 11 miles in length,

and contains many handsome modern buildings, interspersed with houses of more ancient date. The streets and buildings are spacious and elegant, and the Promenade, leading from the High street to Montpellier, is the most fashionable thoroughfare in the town; it extends for more than a quarter of a mile in a straight line and has a splendid avenue of fine spreading trees, with shops and terraces on either side. A pleasing feature of the town is the number of trees lining the thoroughfares, there being no less than 16 miles of tree-planted roads and streets in the borough, which is called the "Garden Town." The waterworks for the supply of water for domestic purposes, situated on the slopes of the Cotswolds, in the Dowdeswell valley, afford upwards of 1,000,000 gallons a day, and in addition a supply, of unlimited quantity and high quality, is obtained from the Severn at Tewkesbury. The town is lighted by electricity from works, erected in 1894, in the Arle road, the property of the corporation. Gas is supplied by a company established in 1819, from works in the Gloucester road. Extensive schemes of street improvements have been carried out in recent years by the corporation, who own the Pittville Spa and Gardens, and the Montpellier Spa, gardens, mineral wells and baths.

In 1913-16 extensive works were constructed for the disposal of the town sewage by filtration, at a cost of upwards of \$\,\text{40,000}\; the works are capable of treating 1,000,000 gallons daily, dry weather flow; new filters were added in 1926 at a cost of £15,000.

Pittville park, formally opened 25 April, 1894, includes the Pittville gardens and a lake, rowing course and recreation ground at Marle hill; the property comprises 15 acres, purchased at a cost of £2,354, but the total outlay, including excavation, bridges, boathouse and boats, was about £6,000; the length of the lake is 1.650 feet, and of the boating course 4,400 feet; the maximum width is 455 feet, and there is a total water area of 21 acres; the boat-house is of wood, in

the style of a Swiss chalet: on the south side of the lake is an island, and at another point a waterfall, and there is now a numerous flock of water-fowl, and the lake has also been stocked with fish; the park is agreeably diversified with clumps of trees, evergreens, and flowering shrubs, and has been profusely planted with hardy flowers, so as to make it a wild garden on an extensive scale.

The fountain on the Promenade, inaugurated on Monday, Oct. 30, 1893, is a graceful work in the Italian style, and includes a group in Portland stone, representing Neptune drawn by sea-horses.

The South African War Memorial, also on the Promenade, was unveiled in 1907 and includes the figure of a soldier in bronze.

In 1914 a statue in bronze, sculptured by Lady Scott, was unveiled on the Promenade as a memorial to the late Edward Adrian Wilson B.A., M.B., F.Z.S. born in Cheltenham 1872, chief of the scientific staff, artist and zoologist of the British Antarctic Expedition, 1910-1913. He reached the South Pole January 17, 1912, and died with Capt. Scott on the great ice barrier, March, 1912.

In 1914 a stone statue of King Edward VII. surmounting a drinking fountain, was erected at Mont-pellier, given by the late Alderman J. W. Drew and Mrs. Drew.


A massive obclisk on a base of three steps was erected in 1920-21, opposite the municipal offices, as a memorial to the 1,266 men from Cheltenham who fell in the Great War, 1914-18: the cost of erection, about £1,800 was raised by public subscription: the unveiling ceremony was performed by Maj.-Gen. Sir Robert Fanshawe K.C.B., D.S.O. on October 1st, 1921.

Naunton Park, situated to the south-east of the town, and opened in 1894, comprises about 8 acres and is laid out as a recreation ground. There is also a recreation ground in Whaddon lane.

Cheltenham has acquired its present important position from the celebrity of the mineral springs with which its soil is so abundantly charged: the waters, which are more or less saline, were accidentally discovered in the year 1716, and their medicinal virtues gradually becoming known, his Majesty George III. visited the place in 1788, an event which at once led to the establishment of the spas: the original Old Wells were established about 1738, Montpellier spa in •1818, and the Pittville spa, with its gardens and lake, in 1830.

The latter was purchased by the corporation in 1889 and has saline springs surrounded by beautiful gardens and grounds, with walks and drives planted with trees six miles in extent. The gardens were enlarged in 1901 by the corporation to the extent of $3\frac{1}{2}$ acres; and new recreation grounds close by were presented to the town in 1888 by J. T. Agg-Gardner esq. M.P. for the borough (ktd. 1916). The Pump room occupies an elevated position in the principal garden, and is a substantial building in the Grecian style, in imitation of a temple at Athens, designed by the leta Mr. Forbes, architects in Athens, designed by the late Mr. Forbes, architect; it is 92 feet long by 43 feet, surrounded by a colonnade 13 feet wide, the roof of which is supported by fluted columns 22 feet high. Upon the façade stand three figures representing Æsculapius, Hygeia and Hippocrates. The main building is roofed with a splendid dome 70 feet high, round the interior of which is a spacious gallery, while outside is a protected gallery from which magnificent views of the gardens and lake and of the town and neighbourhood are obtained. The cost of laying out this estate is said to have amounted to nearly half a million sterling.

The wells of the Pittville Spa are three in number, all characterised by containing relatively large quantities of carbonic acid, partially combined and free. In 1847 an analysis was made by Messrs. Abel and Rowney upon water drawn from the main well, 90 feet deep, and situated under the pump room, and a comparision of this analysis with that made by Professor T. E. Thorpe,

of the Royal College of Science, South Kensington, in 1893, upon water taken from the Pittville wells, Nos. 1 and 3, shows that the waters have experienced no sensible alteration in composition during the last 50 years. The following statement of the amounts of the principal constituents, expressed to the nearest grain per gallon, as deduced from the two analyses, brings out this result very clearly:


Pittville well No. 2 Professor Thorpe finds to be less rich in saline constituents than Nos. I and 3, and though bearing a general resemblance to these, it has a relatively larger content of sodium sulphate, viz. 148 grains per gallon, and a proportionately lower amount of sodium chloride, viz. about 311 grains per gallon. He further states that Pittville well No. I contains about 662 grains per gallon of saline matter, and No. 2 about 644 grains, by far the largest constituent in each case being common salt; both contain notable quantities of bromides and iodides, but the amount of lithia in either is so minute that it can only be detected by the spectroscope: these wells also contain a certain proportion of ferrous carbonate, but not sufficient, in his opinion, to allow them to be regarded as chalybeate. Professor Thorpe also reported to the Town Council on the Chadnor Villa well, the Cottage well in Christ Church road, and the Lansdown well. The water of the first two of these is magnesia saline; the Chadnor Villa well contains per gallon about 313 grains of saline matter, 118 grains being magnesium sulphate (Epsom salts), and 61 grains sodium sulphate (Glauber's salts); of sodium chloride and of bromides and iodides there is very little, and only minute quantities of ferrous carbonate and lithia. The Cottage well is reported to contain about 390 grains of saline

matter per gallon, about one-third consisting of Epsom salts, and rather more than \(\frac{1}{4}\) Glauber's salts, together with gypsum, chalk and common salt; only minute quantities could be traced of ferrous carbonate and lithium, and bromides and iodides were found to be altogether absent. Of the Lansdown well, the Professor says that it contains about 625 grains per gallon of saline matter, more than \frac{1}{2} being common salt and about 1/4 Glauber's salts; the amount of iron, lithia, and of bromides and iodides was exceedingly small. From these results, it clearly appears that none of the Cheltenham springs can be regarded as chalybeate.

The parish church of St. Mary is a cruciform building of stone, in the Early English, Decorated and Perpendicular styles, consisting of chancel, clerestoried nave, aisles, transepts, north porch and a central tower with octagonal spire, containing a clock and a fine peal of 12 bells: in 1912 the spire was restored and the bells rehung at a cost of £1,200, when two new bells were given by Alderman Winterbotham J.P.: on the east side of the north transept is a handsome circular window 45 feet in circumference, divided by radiating mullions into 33 compartments: the original canopied piscina, considered one of the largest and most perfect of its kind in England, is of Decorated character, and forms a square recess, flanked by buttresses, with an arch on the east and north sides: in the chancel are brasses with effigies to Sir William Greville kt. Justice of the Common Pleas, 1513, his wife, three sons and eight daughters: there is also a mural monument to the wife of John English D.D. 1643, and a tablet to various members of the De la Bere family, 1783-1810: in the chancel is a monument of alabaster and marble to the Rev. Edward Walker D.C.L. perpetual curate from 1857, and first rector of this church, who died in 1872, and there is also a large and fine brass to the Very Rev. Francis Close D.D. rector here, 1826-56, and dean of Carlisle, 1856-82. The stained east window was erected in 1880 at the cost of the Freemasons of Cheltenham: there are memorial windows to Daniel James Humphris,

the Welch family of Arle, and several others, the three larger ones at the west end being of a most elaborate and costly character, one being the gift of the parishioners, another the gift of the Baron de Ferrieres and the third that of W. H. Gwinnett esq. J.P. in memory of his parents: the south transept retains a piscina and aumbry: in the churchyard are two stone coffins. The church was restored in 1877 under the direction of the late Mr. Ewan Christian, of Whitehall place, and reseated in 1878 at a cost of £4,700: the vestry to the north of the chancel and a porch to the south aisle were added in 1893: an oak reredos was erected in 1917 in memory of Alderman W. Nash Skillicorne, formerly mayor of Cheltenham and churchwarden of the parish church: there are 670 sittings. The register commences with the year 1558. The living is a rectory, with St. Matthew's annexed, net yearly value £620, without residence; it is in the gift of Simeon's trustees, and has been held since 1915 by the Rev. Henry Albert Wilson M.A. of Corpus Christi College, Cambridge, hon. canon of Gloucester and rural dean of Cheltenham: the endowment is £150 yearly, and the remaining income arises from fees, Easter offerings and the pew rents of St. Matthew's.

St. Matthew's church, in Clarence street, a chapel of ease to the parish church, erected in 1878-9, from designs by Mr. Ewan Christian, architect, at a cost of about £25,000, and consecrated by the bishop of the diocese April 17th, 1879, is an edifice of local stone, with Bath stone dressings, in the Gothic style of the 13th century, consisting of apsidal chancel with aisles, clerestoried nave, aisles, transepts, north porch and a tower with spire at the north-west angle: the reredo sis panelled and adorned with marble and mosaic work, with the Tables of Commandments in lead letters: the pulpit is of stone, with alabaster and marble mosaic inlays, bordered with boldly carved foliage: the font, of Caen stone, was the gift of J. Middleton esq.: there are sittings for upwards of 1,400 persons, of which 500 are free.

Christ Church is an ecclesiastical parish, formed in 1865: the church, at Lansdown, erected in 1840, from the designs of Mr. Jerrard, architect, of Cheltenham, and re-consecrated in 1888 by the Bishop of Gloucester and Bristol, is a structure of freestone, in the Early English style, consisting of chancel, clerestoried nave of eight bays, transepts, north and south porches and an embattled western tower, 174 feet in height, with four pinnacles and containing a clock and one bell: in 1893 the dome and walls of the apse were painted in fresco by Mr. W. B. Richmond R.A., F.S.A. and I. Eadie-Reid: a reredos has also been erected and the walls lined with jasper and marble from designs by Mr. H. A. Prothero, architect, of Cheltenham: in 1922 a bronze tablet, erected just inside the main entrance to the church by public subscription, was unveiled by Lt.-Gen. M. W. Willoughby c.s.i. in memory of the men of the 10th Batt. Gloucestershire Regiment who fell in the Great War, 1914-18: the church was restored internally in 1887-97, at a cost of £8,000, and redecorated in 1925, and affords about 1,600 sittings. The register dates from the year 1865. The living is a perpetual curacy, net yearly value £600, derived from pew rents; it is in the gift of Simeon's trustees, and has been held since 1919 by the Rev. Francis Hanmer Webb-Peploe M.A. of Pembroke College, Cambridge.

Holy Trinity is an ecclesiastical parish, formed in 1898: the church, in Portland street, erected in 1823, at a cost of £10,000, and designed by the late Mr. Underwood, architect, is a building of stone in the Gothic style, consisting of nave, aisles, and a western tower with eight pinnacles and containing one bell: there are many tablets: the church was reseated in 1877 and affords 810 sittings. The register dates from the year 1821. The living is a perpetual curacy, net yearly value, derived from pew rents and endowment, £300; it is in the gift of Simeon's trustees, and has been held since 1925 by the Rev. William Grist M.A. of Christ's College, Cambridge. There are also a Mission Hall, erected in 1880, and an infants' school, built in

1893. The boys' and girls' school was renovated and almost rebuilt in 1908.

St. James' is an ecclesiastical parish, formed in 1916 from Christ Church, St. Stephen, SS. Philip and James, Leckhampton and St. Luke's parishes: the church, in Suffolk square, erected by subscription, and consecrated October 6th, 1830, is a building of stone, in the Late Perpendicular style, consisting only of nave with apse, and a western turret containing one small bell: the church was internally restored in 1876-82, and affords 1,200 sittings. The register dates from the year 1876. The living is a perpetual curacy, net yearly value £400; it is in the gift of the rector of Cheltenham, and has been held since 1917 by the Rev. George William Boothroyd M.A. of University College, Durham.

St. John's is an ecclesiastical parish, formed in 1866: the church, in Berkeley street, the second of the modern churches erected in Cheltenham, was consecrated in 1829: originally a plain brick building, accommodating about 800 persons, it was enlarged and partly rebuilt in the early seventies. It is a building of stone, in the Gothic style, consisting of apsidal chancel, nave, aisles and an incomplete tower, containing a clock and one bell: the church has sittings for about 1,050 persons of which more than 300 are free. The register dates from the year 1866, the building having previously been merely a proprietary chapel. The living is a perpetual curacy, net yearly value £520; it is in the gift of Simeon's trustess, and has been held since 1916 by the Rev. Cyril Henry Lancaster M.A., Hon. C.F. of St. Edmund Hall, Oxford.

St. Luke's is an ecclesiastical parish, formed in 1855: the church, situated on the corner of College road and St. Luke's road, is an edifice of stone, in the Early English style, consisting of chancel, enlarged in 1866, clerestoried nave of ten bays, aisles, transepts, south porch and a western tower with spire containing a clock and one bell: the windows in the chancel and in the choir aisle are stained: there is a beautifully carved

stone reredos and an oak screen between the chancel and vestry: the chancel was restored in 1889-91, at a cost of £2,000, defrayed by T. W. Potter esq. of East Court: the church affords 1,100 sittings. The register dates from the year 1854. The living is a perpetual curacy, net yearly value 4400; it is in the gift of the rector of Cheltenham, and has been held since 1916 by the Rev. Charles Cousens Petch M.A., F.R.G.S. of Durham University

Emmanuel, formerly a conventional district, was constituted an ecclesiastical parish in 1922. The church, situated in Naunton terrace, seats 400 persons. The living is a vicarage, net yearly value, £389; it is in the gift of the Crown and Bishop of Gloucester alternately, and has been held since 1922 by the Rev. Herbert Daniel Peel, of London University.

St. Mark's is an ecclesiastical parish, formed in 1860: the church, situated in the Church road, and consecrated in 1862, is a building of stone, in the Gothic style, consisting of chancel, clerestoried nave of six bays, aisles, transepts, south porch and a western tower, with spire 150 feet high, and containing a clock and 5 bells: there are four stained windows in the chancel: there is a carved oak screen leading to the vestry, erected as a memorial to the men of the parish who lost their lives in the Great War, 1914-18: the names are inscribed on two of the panels: the church was enlarged in 1888 and affords 840 sittings, of which about 300 are free. The register dates from the year 1862. The living is a perpetual curacy, net yearly value £270; it is in the gift of the Governors of Wrekin College, and has been held since 1913 by the Rev. Harry Hill Merryweather M.A., B.D. of Wadham College, Oxford.

St. Paul's is an ecclesiastical parish, formed in 1846: the church, in St. Paul's road, erected in 1831, is an edifice of brick, with stone front, in the Classic style, designed by Mr. Forbes, the architect of Pittville Spa, and consists of chancel, nave, aisles, west porch and a low western tower containing one bell: it was renovated

in 1904 and has over 1,000 sittings, all of which are free. The register dates from the year 1830. The living is a perpetual curacy, net yearly value £300, with residence; it is in the gift of the rector of Cheltenham, and has been held since 1904 by the Rev. Thomas Henry Cave-Moyle M.A. of Lincoln College, Oxford, and chaplain of Cheltenham Poor Law Institution.


St. Peter's is an ecclesiastical parish, formed in 1845: the church, in the Tewkesbury road, erected in 1848 and consecrated March 23rd, 1849, is a building of stone, in a modern adaptation of the Norman style, consisting of apsidal chancel, nave, transepts, north porch and a round central tower, 90 feet high, rising from an octagonal lower stage, and finished with a conical roof and vane: at the north-west angle of the nave is a square turret containing one bell: the font is, in form, a copy of that in Lincoln Cathedral, and consists of a square bowl resting on a central pier, with four shafts at the angles: the roof was restored in 1912 at a cost of £500: there are 550 sittings. The register dates from the year 1849. The living is a perpetual curacy, net yearly value £400; it is in the gift of five trustees, and has been held since 1916 by the Rev. Albert Edward Clease M.A., L.Th. of Durham University. In the churchyard near the main road is a cross of local stone, with a bronze laurel wreath and mounted on an octagonal base, erected in memory of the 140 men of the parish who lost their lives in the Great War, 1914-18.

SS. Philip and James', Leckhampton, is an ecclesiastical parish formed May 14th, 1869: the church, in the Park district, is an edifice in the Late Perpendicular style, consisting of chancel, clerestoried nave of five bays, aisles, side chapel, south-west porch and a western tower containing a clock and one bell: the side chapel was constructed as a memorial to the 39 men connected with this parish who lost their lives in the Great War, 1914-18, whose names are inscribed on two panels of carved oak: there are sittings for 800 persons, one-third of which are free. The register dates from the year 1863. The living is a perpetual curacy, net yearly value

£380; it is in the gift of the Bishop of Gloucester, and has been held since 1912 by the Rev. Richard Arthur Hay Hay M.A. of Worcester College, Oxford.

St. Stephen's is an ecclesiastical parish, formed in 1884 from that of Christ Church: the church, in St. Stephen's road, consecrated in December, 1883, is a building in the Early English style, erected at a cost of £12,000 from designs by Messrs. Middleton and Son, of Cheltenham, and consists of chancel, clerestoried nave of six bays, aisles, transepts, north and south porches and an incomplete tower at the north-west angle: the pulpit is of Caen stone, Cornish granite and alabaster: in the south transept is a Lady chapel, constructed in 1919 as a memorial to the men connected with the parish who fell in the Great War, 1914-18: the fabric is by L. W. Barnard F.R.I.B.A. of Cheltenham, and the windows and paintings by J. Eadie-Reid: there are 650 sittings, of which 300 are free. The register dates from the year 1884. The living is a perpetual curacy, net yearly value £500; it is in the gift of the Bishop of Gloucester, and has been held since 1917 by the Rev. Robert Leighton Hodson M.A. of St. Edmund Hall, Oxford.

All Saints, PITTVILLE, is an ecclesiastical parish, formed in 1869: the church, near to Pittville circus, is an edifice of stone, in the Early French Gothic style, from designs by the late Mr. John Middleton, and consist of chancel, with aisles, clerestoried nave of five bays, aisles, transepts, south porch and an incomplete tower at the south-west angle, with a clock and one bell: the pulpit and reredos are of alabaster and freestone: nearly the whole of the windows are stained, and represent in an elaborate scheme figures of the saints of the Old Testament, and pious men of various ages in the Christian church: a rood screen of iron resting on a wall of alabaster was erected in 1893 from designs by Mr. H. A. Prothero, architect, of Cheltenham, and a side chapel has been added, and the west end of the church decorated with frescoes by Sir William B. Richmond K.C.B.,



A.R.A.: in 1909 a decorated canopy was placed above the altar: there are 850 sittings, of which 450 are free. The register dates from the year 1868. The living is a perpetual curacy, net yearly value £600, with residence; it is in the gift of the Bishop of Gloucester, and has been held since 1911 by the Rev. Philip Marmaduke Cramer Johnstone M.A. of Keble College, Oxford, hon. canon of Gloucester and surrogate. A Calvary was erected in the churchyard to the memory of the men of the parish who fell in the Great War, 1914-18.

Cheltenham is included within the Roman Catholic diocese of Clifton.

The Roman Catholic church in St. James's square, dedicated to St. Gregory the Great, was completed and opened in 1857, and consecrated November 6th, 1877, is an edifice of stone, in the Early Decorated style, from designs by Mr. Charles F. Hansom, architect, of Clifton, and consists of chancel, clerestoried nave, aisles, chapels, transepts, north and west porches and a tower, with rich parapet, and pinnacles 30 feet high, and a spire reaching a height of 202 feet: the sanctuary is partitioned from the nave by an ornamental brass railing: other ornamental railings partition off the Lady altar, St. Benedict's altar and the baptistery, a representation of the Calvary: the stone pulpit and the Stations of the Cross, 14 in number, are also exquisitely carved: in the tympanum of the west door stands a figure of St. Gregory, vested, and on either side are carved historical panels: all the windows are filled with stained glass: the old organ was renovated and reconstructed in 1925.

The Roman Catholic Convent of St. Gregory and Sisters of Charity of St. Paul the Apostle is in St. Paul's road, and has a chapel in the Gothic style.

St. Andrew's Presbyterian Church of England, Fauconberg road, built in 1885, is an edifice of stone in the Early English style, and has a tower at the northwest angle, with spire: there are 520 sittings.

All Saints' Church house is in Grosvenor street, and has 70 sittings.

Bethel chapel, Knapp road, built in 1820, has sittings for 650 persons.

The Society of Friends' meeting room is in Portland street.

The Congregational chapel, in Winchcomb street, erected in 1827, is a building of stone in the Decorated style, and will seat 1,000 persons.

The chapel of the Countess of Huntingdon's Connexion, in North place, erected in 1816, has 600 sittings.

Ebenezer Primitive Methodist chapel, King street, built in 1840, will seat 300 persons.

The United Methodist or Royal Well church, in St. George's road, will seat 600 persons.

The Unitarian chapel, Chapel walk, erected in 1832. has 250 sittings.

The Plymouth Brethren meet in the Regent hall, Regent street.

The Christadelphians have a meeting room at the Rotunda, Montpellier.

There are four Baptist chapels:—Cambray chapel, built in 1855, is of brick, with stone front, and has 1,100 sittings: Salem chapel, Clarence parade, is a building of stone, erected in 1844, and seating 1,300; Naunton Parade chapel, built in 1870, will seat 200; Gas Green Baptist chapel, Russell street, built in 1864, has 200 sittings.

The Walker Memorial (Undenominational) church, Whaddon lane, erected in 1884, is an iron building seating 250 persons.

The Wesleyan chapels are :—Great Norwood street, a building of stone, erected in 1845 and restored in 1889, with 650 sittings; St. George's Street, an edifice of brick with stone facings, built in 1839, and seating 900

persons; Swindon Road chapel, erected in 1842, with 150 sittings; and Gloucester Road chapel, a structure of brick, erected in 1801, and affording 150 sittings.

The Salvation Army Barracks are in Bath road and Granville street.


St. Mary's cemetery, formed in 1883, and entirely under the control of the authorities of the parish church, has one mortuary chapel, but is now available only to persons having vaults there which are not yet filled up.

The new cemetery, in Cemetery road, at the foot of the Cotswold Hills, formed in 1864, at a cost of £11,000, and since enlarged, has two mortuary chapels; it is under the control of the Town Council.

Thursday is the market day. The market, on the Gloucester road, was constructed by the Corporation, at a cost of upwards of £8,000. The corn market is held at the Lamb Hotel yard, in High street. There is a sale every day during main fruit season and on Tuesdays and Thursdays throughout the year of fruit, vegetables, poultry and general dairy produce, which is conducted by the Gloucestershire Fruit and Vegetable Co-operative Marketing Society Limited.

There are statute fairs on the first and second Thursdays after Michaelmas Day, which are held in various places.

The Town Hall, in Imperial square, is a handsome building of stone in the Renaissance style, erected from designs by Mr. F. W. Waller, and completed in 1903 at a cost of £45,000. It contains a fine hall for concerts, balls &c. and is fitted with adjustable stage and orchestra: including galleries, the hall will seat 1,500 persons, in addition to the stage and orchestra, which holds about 450 persons. The floor is specially laid down for dancing. There are also supplementary rooms available for use in connection with the large hall or as separate suites, one of which seats 500 and



the other 250. The Town Hall also contains a central spa, where the waters from the principal medicinal springs can be obtained.

In 1916 five large houses in a central position on the Promenade were converted into municipal offices, comprising the council chamber, committee rooms, offices of the town clerk and all other corporation departments.

The Rotunda, Montpellier, is used for entertainments, balls, concerts &c. and will seat 400 persons.

The Cheltenham Theatre and Opera House (1925), in Regent street, erected in 1891, is an edifice of brick and stone in the so-called Queen Anne style; the auditorium is planned to seat comfortably 1,400 persons. The stage has a depth of about 45 feet and a width of 70 feet (including the scene dock on either side), and is 45 feet high; the actual opening is about 24 feet wide and 30 feet high.

The Coliseum Theatre, Albion street, with accommodation for 1,200 persons, was erected in 1913.

The Palace Picture Theatre (formerly the Victoria rooms) is situated in High street; there are other cinema halls in North street and Suffolk parade.

The New Club (established 1872), on the Promenade, is a building of stone and contains well appointed rooms on the lines of the best London clubs.

The Young Men's Christian Association have a club house situated on the Promenade; it contains spacious rooms and a large cafe which is open to the public.

The Public Library, in Clarence street, immediately opposite St. Matthew's church, is a building in the Italian style with Elizabethan details, erected from designs by Knight and Chatters, architects, at a cost of £15,000, the foundation stone being laid on the 20th June, 1887. The reference library is particularly rich in art works and local books; it is worked on the open access principle. The building is 144 feet in

length, and in the centre is a portico with Ionic columns and a pediment, the tympanum being enriched with the arms of the borough. The library contains 45,000 volumes, including lending and reference departments, and there is a spacious news room.

The Art Gallery and Museum are attached to the Public Library: the former was opened in October, 1899, and the Museum added in June, 1907. The Baron De Ferrieres presented forty-two representative pictures of the Dutch and Belgian Schools, together with £1,000 towards the cost of the building; and loan collections from the Victoria and Albert Museum, South Kensington, are on view, also pictures by modern artists, purchased out of the Leslie Young bequest, including examples by Harry Moore, Hugh Riviere, J. L. Pickering, Fred Roe, R. Wheelwright, Briton Riviere, L. Burleigh Bruhl and Moffat Lindner. The Museum contains a local geological collection, print room, decorative art room with cases of Greek and Roman bronzes. pottery and ancient glass, and a Chinese porcelain room: it is open daily from 10 a.m. to 5 p.m. and on Wednesdays and Saturdays from 10 a.m. to 8 p.m.; admission free.

Charities: -- Walwyn's, of £50, was left in 1627 by J. Walwyn, of Swindon. The Poor's Grounds afford a yearly sum of £54 IIs. 3d. which is distributed among the poor. Townsend's, of £15 yearly, for apprenticing a poor boy. Townsend's charity of f20 yearly, left in 1683 by George Townsend esq. of Wormington, is for Lady Capel's school. Stansby's, of £29 yearly, left in 1704 by Rev. W. Stansby, of Badgworth, is for apprenticing. Capel's, of £15 yearly, left in 1719 by the Rt. Hon. Dorothy Lady Capel, is derived from the estate of Perry Court, near Faversham, Kent, and now applied to the support of the parish school. Urquhart's, left in 1850 by J. H. Urquhart, of Sevenoaks, Kent, and consisting of the interest of £1,000 in £31 per Cent. Reduced Bank Annuities, is distributed annually to the poor at Christmas. Ashmead's, of £86 4s. left in 1742 by John Ashmead, of Cheltenham, is distributed annually to the poor of Bethel Baptist chapel. Pate's,

left in 1578 by Richard Pate, of Minsterworth, and Recorder of Gloucester in 1556, has now (1919) a gross income of upwards of £2,000, three-fourths of which sum is applied, under a scheme approved by an Order in Council in 1881, in maintaining the Cheltenham Grammar schools and certain almshouses in Albion street, the residue being applied to its own purposes by Corpus Christi College, Oxford. Under a scheme sealed by the Board of Education, 1910, a new governing body was formed for the administration of the foundation. The charity estate comprises some valuable portions of the town, besides houses in Gloucester, land at Swindon and a farm at the Leigh: the almshouses are for six inmates, born in the town, and over sixty years of age; each inmate has two rooms and 8s. a week, supplemented by other payments at fixed periods. The election of almspeople rests with the churchwardens of the parish church. The Septimus Redhead bequest of about £500 per annum is distributed to hospitals and institutions; the Walker Memorial Fund provides annuities to ten indigent women. There are twelve cottage homes for aged people in Naunton Park, the gift of the late J. A. and Mrs. Hay. There are also ten almshouses on the St. Mark's Housing Estate, erected by the Charity Organization Society under a bequest and called The Jessie Mary Chambers Almshouses, but they have no local connection.

The General Hospital, in Sandford road, established in 1830, is a noble edifice of stone, in the Classic style, erected at a cost of nearly £0,000, from designs of the late Mr. D. J. Humphris, architect: a new wing was added in 1878 at a cost of £6,132: the west wing was extended in 1909 at a cost of £3,000, and orthopædic and electro-therapeutic departments were opened in 1922: it is entirely supported by voluntary contributions, and contains 118 beds; the number of in-patients admitted during the year 1921 was 1,491, and of outpatients, 3,468. The Female Orphan Asylum was founded by Queen Charlotte in 1806, and is under the patronage of H.M. Queen Alexandra. The Delancey

Hospital, Leckhampton, was founded by the late Miss Delancey, who bequeathed £5,000 for this purpose, but through some informality only £3,750 eventually became available: the Rev. J. H. L. Gabell gave £1,000 towards the site and £5,365 for the buildings and furniture, and f1,000 Consols as an endowment fund. The Eye, Ear and Throat Hospital, North place, established in 1889, is for the gratuitous relief of really indigent persons suffering from diseases of the eye, ear and throat; it is managed by the committee of the General Hospital with which it is now amalgamated. The St. John Ambulance Brigade and the British Red Cross Society have an ambulance station at 335 High street, opened September 25th, 1920, for a day and night service of any distance for accidents and removals: at this station is a shield, constructed as a memorial to six men of the "Glos. VII." (Cheltenham) Corps who fell on active service in the Great War, 1914-18. There are other minor charities and benevolent institutions in the town.

Thirlestaine House, in the Bath road, the property and residence of Thomas FitzRoy Phillipps Fenwick esq. M.A. grandson of the late Sir Thomas Phillipps bart. is a classic structure of the Ionic order, originally built by a Mr. Scott for his own residence, at a cost of foo,000; the two wings were added by Lord Northwick at a cost of £8,000 each, and the central portico is a copy of part of the temple of Ilissus at Athens. Sir Thomas Phillipps transferred here from his mansion at Middle Hill, Worcestershire, his extensive library and fine collection of pictures, comprising some hundreds of paintings; the collection now includes examples of many eminent masters, about 40 paintings by John Glover, a fine collection of original drawings by the old masters, and paintings by Catlin, depicting the manners of the North American Indians. Among other objects of interest here are a splendid collection of illuminated MSS. and various Babylonian curiosities, one of which is a cylinder giving an account of some of the acts of Nebuchadnezzar.

The Cheltenham racecourse is at Prestbury Park; there are five meetings a year in normal times.

The Cheltenham Polo Club have their ground at Prestbury.

A large part of the town is held by copyhold tenure. with which many ancient customs are connected. Rt. Hon. Sir James Tynte Agg-Gardner M.P., J.P. is lord of the manor, and courts leet are held in May and November at the manor office in Essex Place. George F. Ticehurst esq. is steward. Previous to the Norman accession the manor belonged to Edward the Confessor, and in 1199 it was granted to Henry de Bohun, Earl of Hereford, who exchanged it with King John for other lands; it was next given to the Abbey of Fescampe in Normandy; and subsequently to the nunnery of Sion, in Middlesex, on the dissolution of which, in 1532, it reverted to the Crown.

The area of the civil parish and borough is 4,726 acres; rateable value £342,252. The population in 1911 was 48,942 (including 449 inmates and 23 officials in the Poor Law Institution and 78 inmates and 57 officials and their families in the General Hospital), and in 1921, 48,430.

The population of the ecclesiastical parishes in 1921 was:—St. Mary (parish church), 5,510 (including the Church of England Training College for Women); All Saints, Pittville, 3,762; Christ Church, 3,513; Holy Trinity, 2,563; St. John, 3,474; St. Luke, 6,672 (including 131 inmates and officials in the General Hospital); St. Mark, 3,369 (including 250 in the Dean Close Memorial School); St. Paul, 6,404 (including 275 inmates and officials in the Poor Law Institution, and 136 in the Church of England Training College for Men); St. Peter, 3,965; St. Stephen, 1,373.

The number of electors on the parliamentary register in November, 1924, was 25,454.

CHELTENHAM COLLEGE, in the Bath road, founded in 1841, was built from the designs of Mr. Wilson, architect, of Bath, and opened at Midsummer, 1843; it was incorporated by Act of Parliament in 1894. The buildings are in the Late Perpendicular style, and consist of class, drawing, lecture and music and natural science rooms, museum, gymnasium, library, workshops, fives courts and baths; the library (formerly the chapel) is a building of ashlar, in the Perpendicular style, from designs by Mr. D. J. Humphris, architect, of Cheltenham, and contains several memorial windows to Old Cheltonians who fell in the Crimean War (1854-5), and the Indian Mutiny (1857-8); there is also a collection of portraits in oil of former principals of the college and other paintings. The new chapel was built as a memorial of the college jubilee in 1891; it is a beautiful building, Perpendicular in style, with a fine stone vaulted roof; the boys' seats and masters' stalls are of oak: it contains numerous memorials to Old Cheltonians, among them the stone reredos which commemorates the 54 Old Cheltonians who fell in the South African War; other memorials are the ante-chapel, the pulpit, the organ and the south and west doors; Old Cheltonians who have been killed or died on active service are also commemorated by brasses: the cloister connecting the chapel to the college was completed at Easter, 1921, in memory of 675 Old Cheltonians who fell in the Great War, 1914-18. Attached to the college are the following scholarships and prizes: 18 scholarships from f20 to f100 each, awarded every year in the summer term, half being given for proficiency mainly in classics and half for proficiency mainly in mathematics; the Dobson scholarship, founded in memory of the late Rev. W. Dobson, for 15 years principal of the college; one of £20, tenable for three years on the same terms as the Southwood scholarships, by boys in the modern side going up to Woolwich; the James Wyllie scholarships, founded in memory of John William Shaw Wyllie c.s.I., these are two in number, each of 50 guineas and tenable for three years; two Wightwick scholarships, founded under the will of Mrs. Dorothea Wightwick,

value about £75 each, tenable for four years at Pembroke College, Oxford, and open to pupils of Cheltenham college in default of founders' kin; six Walker theological prizes, value from £5 to £1, founded by the late J. Walker esq. for proficiency in the knowledge of holy scripture and of the prayer book; one annual Southwood scholarship, founded by Old Cheltonians in memory of the late Rev. Thomas Allen Southwood M.A. (for 36 years head master of the military and civil department), of the value of £27 for three years, for boys preparing for the army; the Feeney scholarship, in memory of Frederick Feeney (O.C.), of £40 per annum, tenable for three years at Oxford, Cambridge or Birmingham Universities; the Henry Laming scholarship, annually, of the value of £100, tenable for two, three or four years at Queen's College, Oxford, awarded for efficiency in two modern languages, of which, at present, one must be Russian; one annual James of Hereford scholarship, founded by the Rt. Hon. Lord James G.C.v.o. of Hereford, value £35, one each year, tenable for three years, preference to be given to a candidate from or educated in Herefordshire, or the son of parents resident within that county (candidates must not be already in the school); Charles Stuart Lee memorial nomination, founded by Col. W. A. Lee, late I.M.S. in memory of his son, C. S. Lee (2nd lieut, R.E. who fell in France, December 30th, 1915), value £45 yearly, in favour of a son of an officer fallen in the European war, of British nationality, preferably of the R.E. or R.A.; Old Cheltonian, founded by the Cheltonian Society, two each year, value £20, tenable for three years, open only to sons of members of the Cheltonian Society; Francis Wyllie, founded by Miss Wyllie, in memory of her brother, Francis Robert Shaw Wyllie, of the Indian Civil Service, one triennially, value £20, tenable for three years by a boy of British parentage, being the son of an officer of the army or of the Indian Civil Service; Harvey, Wolstenholme and Girardot, founded by their parents severally in memory of Lieut. Kenneth Watson Harvey, Royal Field Artillery, Lieut. George Mellor Wolstenholme M.C. York-

shire Regiment, and 2nd Lieut. Paul Chancourt Girardot, Oxfordshire and Bucks Light Infantry, who were killed in the Great War, value £40 or more each, awarded each in turn triennially and tenable for three years: in the case of the Harvey scholarship preference is given to the son of an officer of the army; Royal Army Medical Corps, endowment scholarship (value about (50), awarded annually, confined to sons of R.A.M.C. officers, preference being given to sons of officers killed in action during the late war; Roosevelt scholarships (and two annual prizes, value fro), founded 1923 by the Rt. Hon. Viscount Lee of Fareham P.C., G.C.S.I. G.B.E., K.C.B., F.S.A. (O.C.), president of the college council from 1917, to perpetuate the memory and inculcate the ideals, in particular those of civic duty and public service, of Theodore Roosevelt, president of U.S.A. from 1901-09, one each year, value £40, tenable at either Oxford or Cambridge for three years; Tancred scholarships, awarded in 1925, and subsequently as the Tancred charity trustees may decide, value £80 per annum, "for the son of a necessitous gentleman." Clergy nominations: A limited number of sons of clergy of the Church of England, or of Ireland, or of the Episcopal Church of Scotland, are admitted as boarders at a reduction of £30 per annum, on the nomination of the head master, to whom application should be made for the conditions; Leslie Young nominations: Some terminal grants of not less than f_5 are made in favour of boys in the junior school whose parents or guardians shall have satisfied the head master of their inability to afford the full fees; these grants are renewable at the head master's discretion for so long as the holders continue to be in the junior school and preference is given to orphans or sons of wigows, and to local rather than outside candidates; War Memorial grants: Any son of an Old Cheltonian who fell in the Great War is eligible for these, and the amount granted depends entirely on the financial circumstances of the individual case; direct application should be made to the head master for these grants, which are intended by the trustees of the Memorial fund to ensure, for the son of

any Cheltonian who fell in action, the full course of education at the college; three reading prizes of £2 each, in connection with the Walker prizes, for the best reader of the sunday lessons in the college chapel; two Iredell prizes, value £4 and £2, founded by the late Capt. Tames Shrubb Iredell, for modern history; the three Hornby prizes of £5 each, founded by Henry Hugh Hornby esq., two for boys of the military side for French and German respectively, and one for boys of the classical department for French: Greek testament prize of £5; silver medals, given annually by the council, for excellence in classical knowledge, and in the military side for mathematics; English literature prizes of £4 and £2, founded by the late Very Rev. T. W. Jex-Blake D.D. principal of the college 1868-74, and Dean of Wells; geographical prizes of £4 and £2, also founded by the Very Rev. Dr. Jex-Blake; mathematical medal, given annually by the council to the best mathematician in the classical department; the Jex-Blake scholarships, founded by the "Jex-Blake Memorial Committee," one of £25, tenable for two years at Oxford or Cambridge, open to boys in the classical department, and one of £25, tenable for two years, on the same terms as the Southwood scholarships, by boys in the modern department going up to Woolwich; two Schacht German prizes, of £3 each; composition prizes, for the best English poem and essay, and the best compositions in Latin and Greek, both prose and verse, and in French and German prose; Bingen Memorial prize: One annual prize, founded by his parents in memory of C. A. M. Bingen, lieutenant Royal Sussex Regiment, killed in action in France, February 10th, 1916, value £2, for proficiency in geography, open to boys below the sixth form; George H. Cohen prize or prizes, founded by his family in memory of George Herbert Cohen, lieutenant Liverpool Regiment, killed in action near La Bassee, May 17th, 1915, value fio, for proficiency in the Russian language; Francis Cade Memorial prize, founded in memory of the late Francis J. Cade esq. formerly head master of the junior school, prize awarded for classics on the result of the

Christmas examination, value about \$12 10s. open to the junior school only; Hannam-Clark reading prize for the reading aloud of English literature, prepared and unprepared, open to boys in Divisions III. and IV. awarded annually in March; Hannam-Clark music prize for general progress and promise in music, two prizes in the senior school and one in the junior, awarded annually in July; these prizes have been founded by Theodore Hannam-Clark (O.C.); a Stewart prize. founded by Old Cheltonians in memory of Lieut.-Col. John Donald Hamill Stewart C.M.G. 11th Hussars, an annual prize for science, value (6, for boys in the military department; a classical translation prize, given annually for the best translation of certain set passages in Latin and Greek into English; the Abbott mathematical prizes, founded in memory of L. C. Abbott. senior prefect, captain of XI. and captain XV. 1865-67, each of the value of f_2 , and one on the classical side for work done in the summer holiday, and one on the military side for the best work in the November Woolwich examination; the Ian Marsden prize, founded by the Rev. E. McL. and Mrs. Marsden in memory of their son, Edward Ian Ransford Marsden (O.C.), of the annual value of two guineas, for the encouragement of the study of science by boys not on the military and engineering side; and the Briggs prizes, two in number, of at least £2 2s. each, awarded in the junior department for geography, and founded by old Cheltonians in memory of Miss Mary Jane Briggs, of Cheltenham. Since 1889 the college has maintained a school mission at Nunhead, in South London. There are now (1925) about 700 boys, including 550 boarders in II houses. The college is controlled by a council of 9 life and 10 ordinary members; Viscount Lee of Fareham P.C., G.C.S.I., G.B.E., K.C.B., F.S.A. president; James Eyre M.A. bursar.

CHELTENHAM LADIES' COLLEGE was founded in 1853 and opened in 1854 at Cambray house: in 1873 the work was transferred to new buildings erected at Bayshill, to which large additions have since been made. The extensive range of educational buildings, which front St. George's road, contain over 100 rooms, comprising (besides the halls of the different divisions) class and lecture rooms, a library containing about 12,000

volumes, a museum, music rooms, art studios, observatory, and chemical, physical and biological laboratories; there is also the Princess hall, which is used for lectures. concerts and various educational and social gatherings. The College comprises the Kindergarten and Preparatory School, Division III. (Lower school), Division II. (Middle school), Division I. (Upper school), classes working for the degrees of the University of London, the entrance and scholarship examinations of the Universities of Oxford and Cambridge and other examinations; there are also post school classes in literary training, music, art and home science: by-students are admitted for the study of any particular subject or subjects. Boarders and day pupils altogether average about 875; of these 775 are regular pupils, the remainder being by-students and kindergarten children. There are 14 boarding houses for the accommodation of pupils; of these Downside is a junior house for pupils of from 8 to 12, and St. Hilda's college is a house for seniors; there is also a home science house. The College has a large playing field of 15 acres, on which is a fine swimming bath. The tuition fees vary, according to the position of the pupil in the College, from 5 guineas to 14 guineas per term, while fees for board are 26, 30 or 36 guineas per term. Entrance scholarships and house exhibitions, and scholarships and exhibitions for pupils in the College, are offered annually, and there are various scholarships to the universities.

The clerk of the peace of the county is also the clerk of the County Council The administrative business of the entire County (which, if this Act had not been passed, would have been transacted by the justices) is now transacted by the County Council.

Cheltenham Technical School, The Lypiatts, Lansdown road; the school includes departments for arts & commerce, science & engineering & domestic science; the school of commerce is divided into senior & junior departments: the junior school is intended for students from 14 to 16 years of age & the senior school for students of 16 years of age & upwards; Ernest Ivamy M.A., F.R.Hist.S. principal, assisted by a qualified staff

St. Hilda's College, in Western road, Bayshill, founded in 1877 & incorporated in 1895, was erected at a cost of upwards of £9,000, & is intended for the reception of senior students (over 17 years of age) of the Cheltenham Ladies' College: it is associated with St. Hilda's Hall at Oxford, & contains rooms for 53 students. The governing body consists of a court; Lt.-Col. J. Frederick Tarrant, sec. Miss C. M. Cooke, principal

The Grammar School for Boys, in High street, a Secondary school under the Board of Education, was founded in 1576 by Richard Pate, of Minsterworth. New buildings, erected on the original site, were completed in 1889 at a cost of about £10,000, in the Elizabethan style, & include a large hall. 16 class rooms, four of which were added in 1920, art room, chemical laboratory, lecture room, physical laboratory & a carpenters' shop; attached is a playing field of about 7 acres. Foundation scholarships, exempting from tuition fees, are held in the school: valuable scholarships are awarded to boys' proceeding to the Universities: the Townsend scholarship, of the annual value of about £100, tenable at Pembroke College, Oxford, for four years, & the Dades-Overton scholarship, of the value of about £30 a year for three years, & the Leslie Young scholarship of £35, are tenable by boys proceeding from the school to the Universities. Aid is also available in certain cases from the Arthur Owen fund. Valuable prizes are given by Corpus Christi College, Oxford,

The Trustees of the Foundation are the President & Fellows of Corpus Christi College, Oxford. The school is controlled by a body of governors: W. G. Gurney esq. J.P., LL.B. chairman

Head Master, R. R. Dobson M.A., M.Sc. of Christ's College, Cambridge, assisted by a competent staff

Pate's Grammar School for Girls, St. Margaret's road, for about 400 day scholars, occupies a position at the corner of North place & St. Margaret's road, & the grounds are about an acre in extent; the building includes a large hall, twelve class rooms, dining & cloak rooms, teachers' rooms, chemical laboratory &c.; also a home science department; the governing body is the same as for the Grammar School for Boys; junior school, 1 St. Margaret's terrace, St. Margaret's road; Miss A. Evening School of Commerce, Science & Technology, St. Margaret's road, erected from designs by Messrs. Chatters & Smithson, architects, at a cost of over £20,000, & completed in 1905; the buildings include a suite of chemical & physical laboratories, biological & technological rooms, motor car engineering shop & a plumbers' shop; evening classes are conducted in commercial, technological & science subjects; Ernest Ivamy M.A., F.R. Hist.S. principal, assisted by a qualified staff

The Dean Close Memorial School at Lansdown, founded in 1885, is a public school for the training of boys in the evangelical principals of the Church of England, & has 280 boarder pupils. The buildings are of red brick & comprise a chapel, head master's house, dining hall, class rooms & school room, a swimming bath, gymnasium & science rooms, added in 1889; Percy Bolton M.A. King's College, Cambridge, head master, assisted by a well qualified staff

The Training College for School Masters, on the Swindon road, is a building in the Early Pointed style, erected in 1849 from designs by Mr. S. W. Daukes, architect, of Cheltenham, at a cost of about £12,000, the site for which & £500 was given by Miss Jane Cook, of Cheltenham: a reading room & a well-fitted chemical laboratory, built at a cost of £2,500, were opened in January, 1894, and in 1900 the college was enlarged at a cost of about £6,000; there are 121 students; Rev. William Ernest Beck M.A.Durham, principal, assisted by a qualified staff CHELT.

- St. Mary's Training College for Teachers, St. George's place, is a structure of red brick with stone dressings, in the Gothic style, erected in 1869 from designs by Mr. J. T. Monk M.A. principal, is assisted by a highly qualified staff, & students in this college are trained to teach in elementary. central & continuation schools in all parts of the kingdom, as well as in the colonies & dependencies
