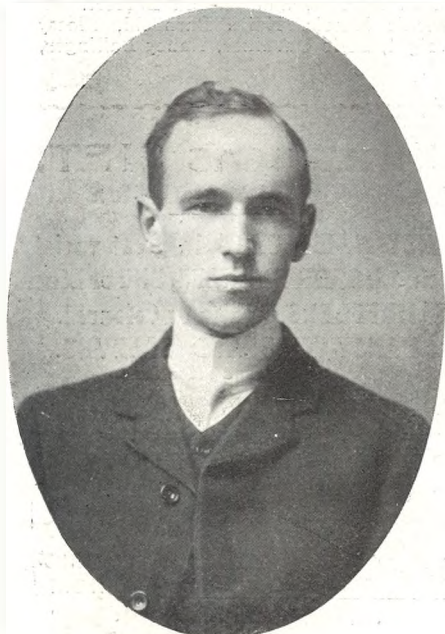

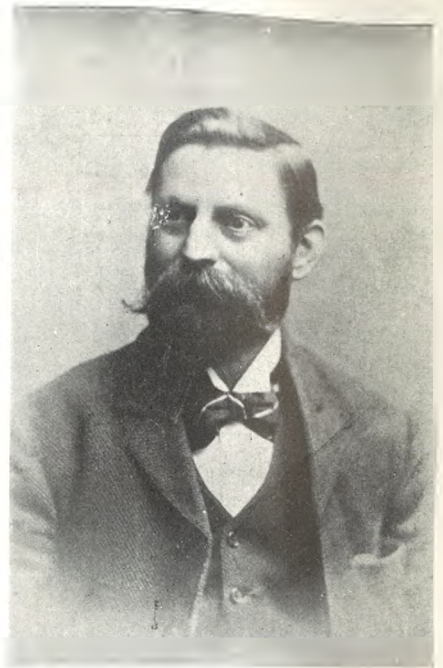

DEDICATION OF A REREDOS.

The little church at Walton Cardiff, which is under the cure of the vicar of Tewkesbury Abbey, has been further enriched with a carved-oak reredos, the work and the gift of Miss Jessie Steward, of Northway. In our notes on the harvest festival some time back reference was made to the beautiful carving on the pulpit and to the credence table which that lady had presented to the church, and this last gift is a most welcome addition to the adornment of the pleasing little edifice.

It is of suitable dimensions for the small communion table, and throws up the stained-glass window at its back, which was before hardly as effective as it might have been. The reredos has two side panels mounted by a finial, each panel representing a dove looking down on a crown swathed in palm leaves, typifying the Holy Ghost and the crown of victory. The base carving of corn and grapes has also a symbolical meaning. The dedication of the reredos took place on Sunday afternoon, when the Rev. Canon Wardell-Yerburgh prefaced his sermon by a remark that they were very grateful to the

**SERG. GRIST, OF STROUD.**

Sergt. S. H. Grist, of C Co. of the 5th Gloucestershire Regt., is one of the most efficient shots in the country. At Bisley this year he won the "Hop Bitters Challenge Trophy," which occupied the place of honour at the Company dinner on Thursday night, and which is valued at £1,000. His score of 170 points in the competition for this trophy was a record one, being only five points below the possible. On the left of the picture is the "Imperial Tobacco Company's Cup," of the value of 50 guineas, and in the centre the "Donegal Gold Challenge Cup," valued at £500, both of which the popular sergeant won at the 1907 Bisley meeting. For several years Sergt. Grist has been in the King's Hundred. Last year he occupied fourth position, being only two points below the winner. At the last Bisley meeting he represented England in the shoot for the Mackinnon Cup and also in the International Match. He is the eldest son of Mr. Matthew Grist, J.P., C.C., of St. Chloe's House, Amberley, who is naturally proud of his son's successes, which are far too many to record here, but which are indicated by the badges shown in the picture.



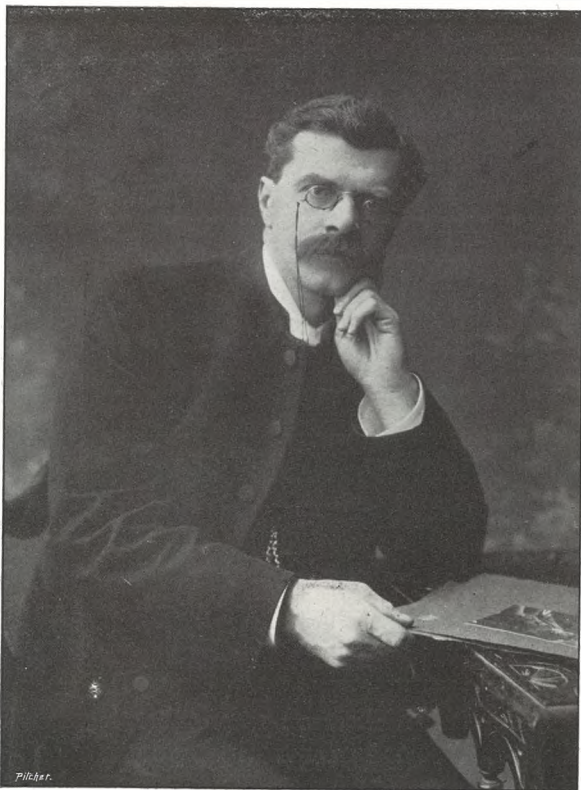
**COL.-SERGT.-INST. IRELAND,**

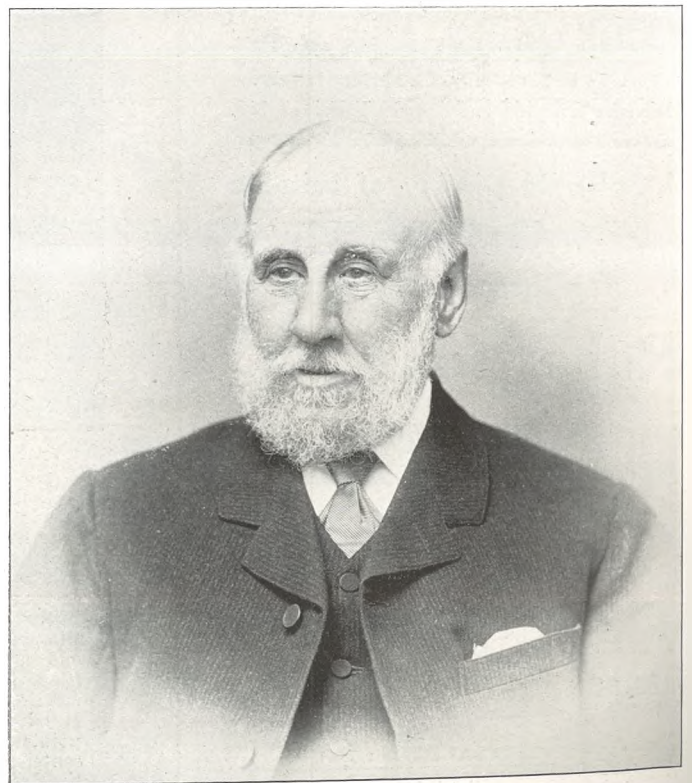
**COL.-SERGT.-INST. CHAPMAN,**

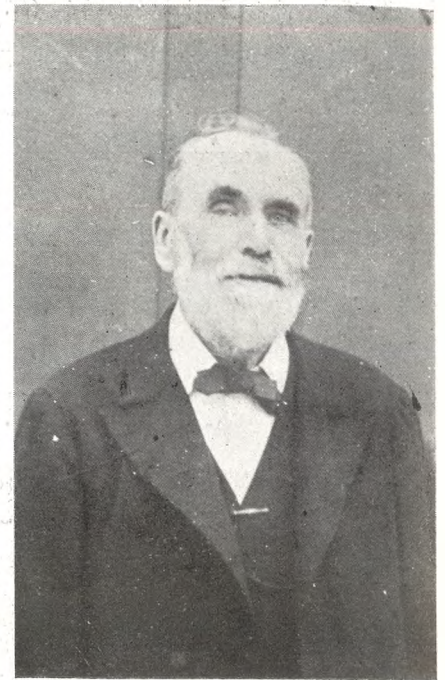

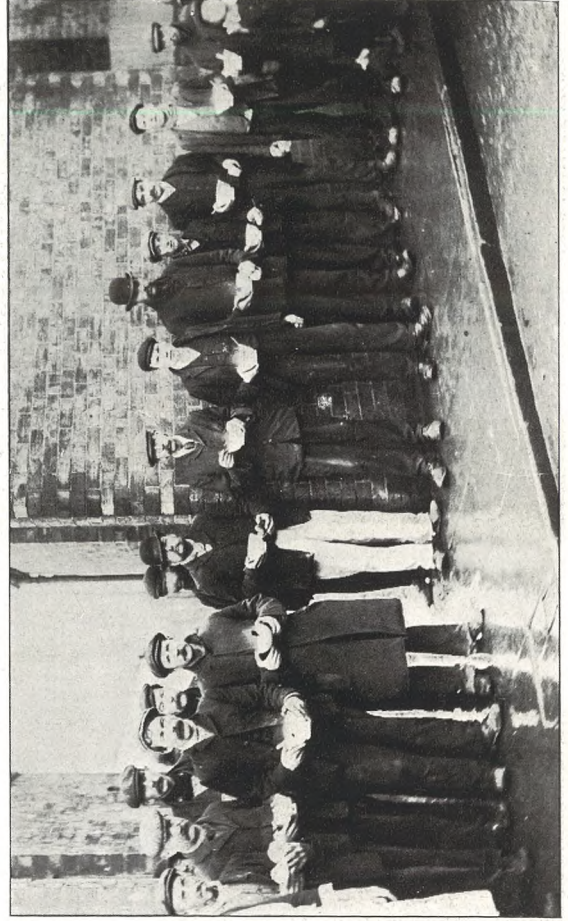

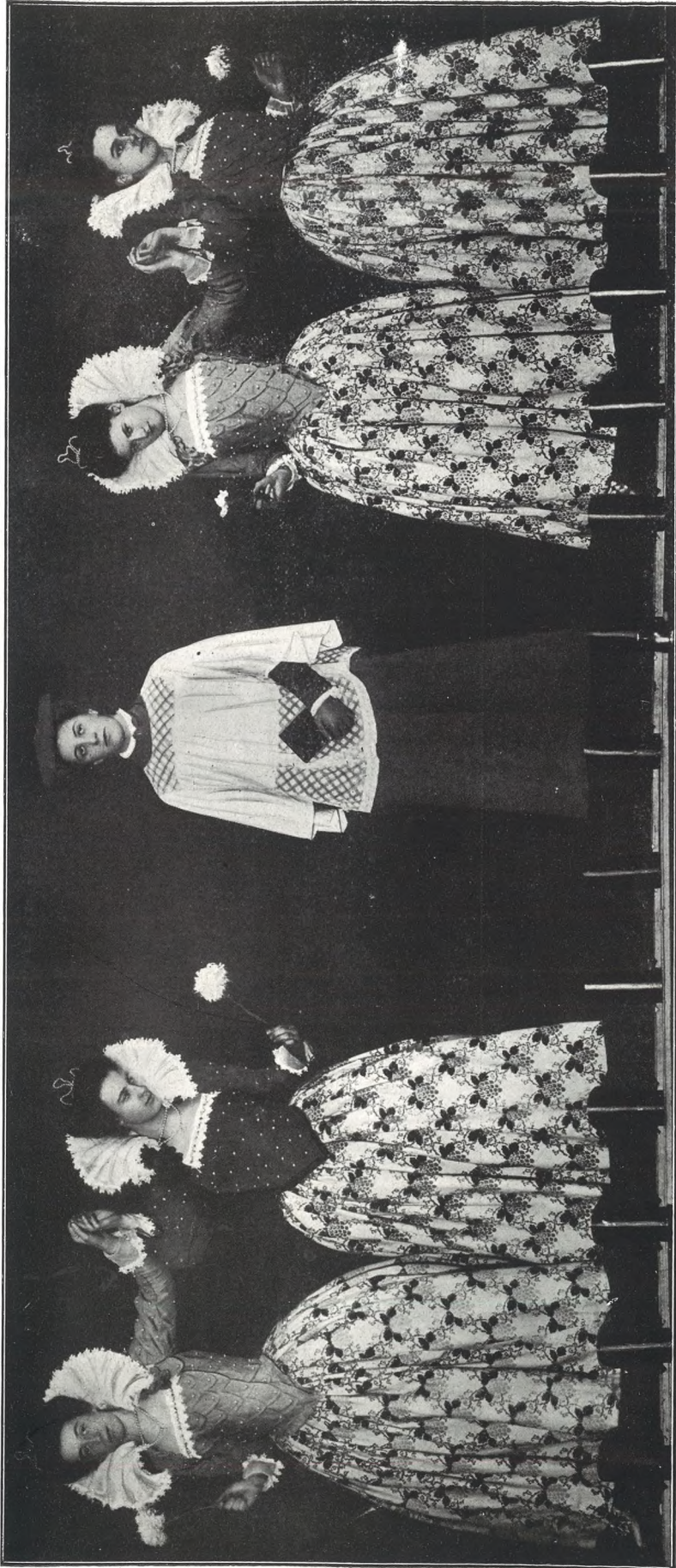

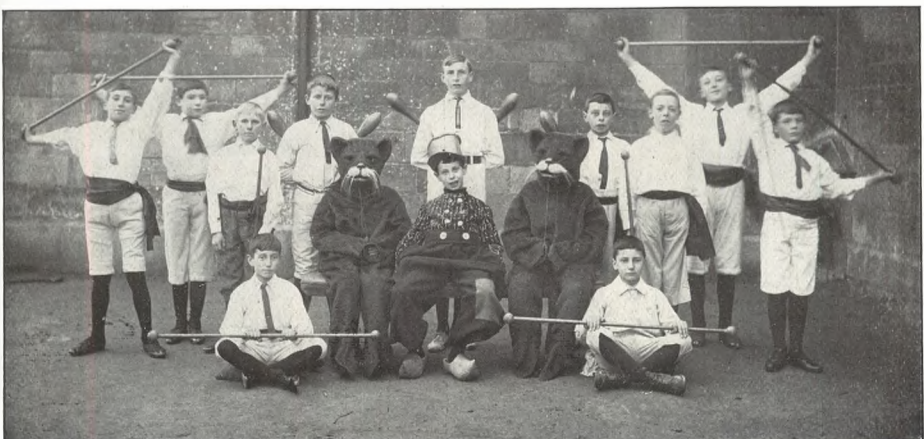

**The New High School for Girls in Denmark Road, Gloucester.**

This school, which is to be opened on Thursday, January 14th, by Lord Stanley of Alderley, is now practically completed. It will not only prove a conspicuous addition to the public buildings of which the city can boast, but will, from a scholastic point of view, be one of the best equipped and well organised institutions of the kind in the country. As a public secondary school for girls it will provide educational facilities for the City of Gloucester and for fifty-nine parishes in the county which constitute a contributing area, whilst pupils residing outside that area will be admitted at slightly enhanced fees. The school is built to accommodate 350 scholars; at the present time the number on the books at Bearland House, where the Girls' High School now has its home, is 260. Noteworthy features in the newly-erected building are the exceptional facilities for the training of students in the domestic arts. A new department will be opened to girls over 16 years for practical instruction in cookery, dressmaking, hygiene, the care of children, and housekeeping in all its branches, and on the second floor are two well-fitted kitchens, larder, store-room, hall, and room set apart entirely for dress-making and needlework. On the first floor is a dark room for photography, a fully-equipped laboratory for teaching practical and theoretical chemistry and physics and botany, a spacious Art room, senior and junior libraries and reading-rooms, with well-fitted shelves and chairs and tables for readers on wet days and in recreation times. On the ground floor is a large assembly hall. A girl may remain in the Girls' High School from the age of eight years until the age of eighteen years.

The foundation of her musical education was laid at Bastion House School, Gloucester, where the successes gained at various examinations led her to continue her studies under Miss Marie Roberts, of London, a lady not unknown to Cheltenham. It speaks of Dr. A. H. Brewer's estimate of her ability that in this (her second) appearance as a soprano soloist at the recitals he entrusted to her the interpretation of one of his own compositions. Last year Miss May Roberts sang at one of the Corporation concerts in Cheltenham Town-hall.

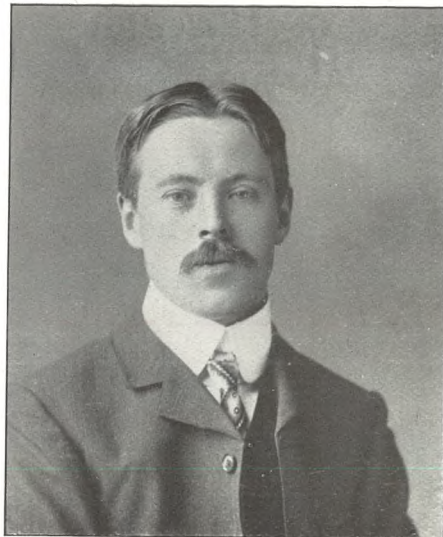

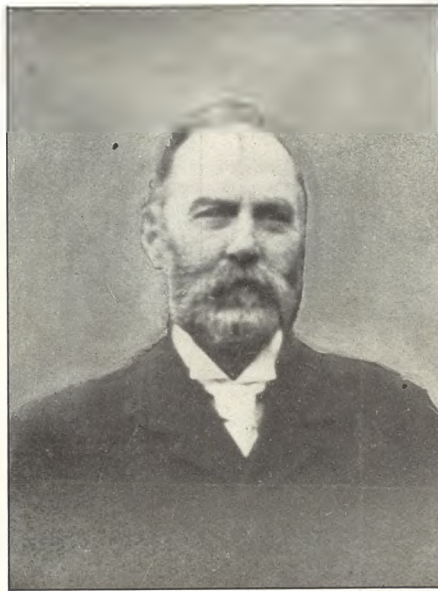
