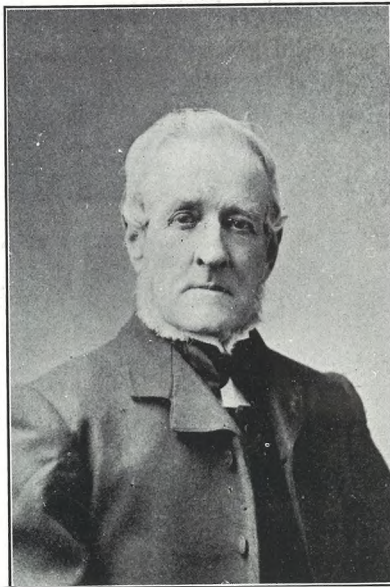

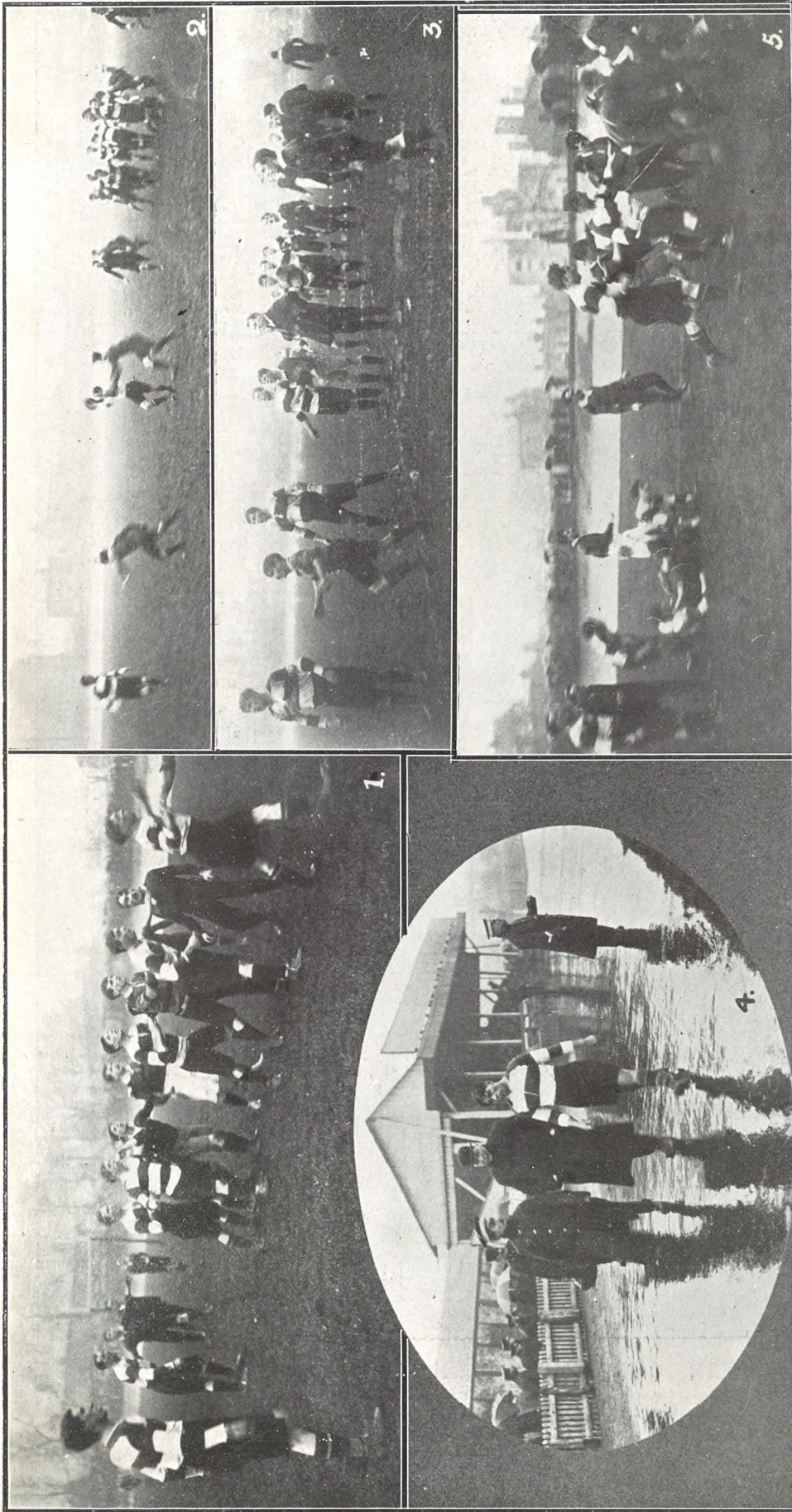

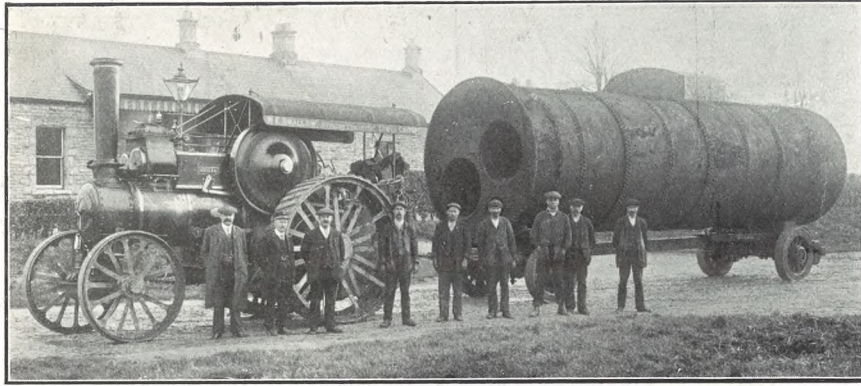

## SERIOUS FIRE IN CHELTENHAM.

SUFFRAGETTES ARRESTED AND CHARGED WITH ARSON.

On Sunday morning, December 21st, about five o'clock, a fire was observed to break out at Alstone Lawn, an empty mansion standing in the Gloucester-road, Cheltenham, surrounded by some acres of its own grounds. The Fire Brigade was promptly called, and the place was almost miraculously saved, the fire having well got hold. Two unknown Suffragettes were arrested the same morning, and were remanded at the police-court on Monday. Their boots and stockings, which were soaked in paraffin, were taken from them, and they absolutely refused to put others on. Our photo shows them being taken from the police-station to Worcester Gaol by Inspector Whyton and Detective Towell, the foremost of whom is carrying the shoes and stockings. They refused to put up their hair, and they went barefoot to Worcester.

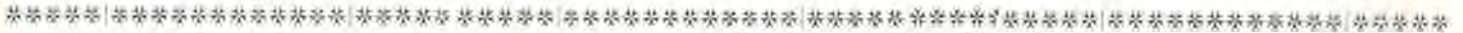

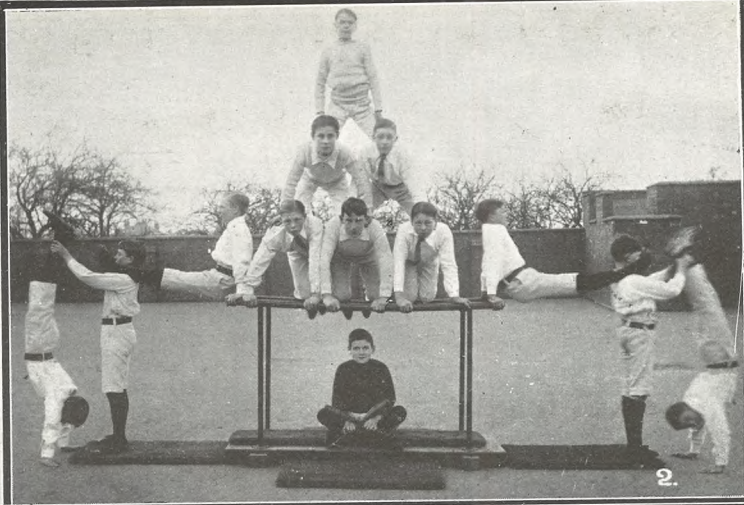

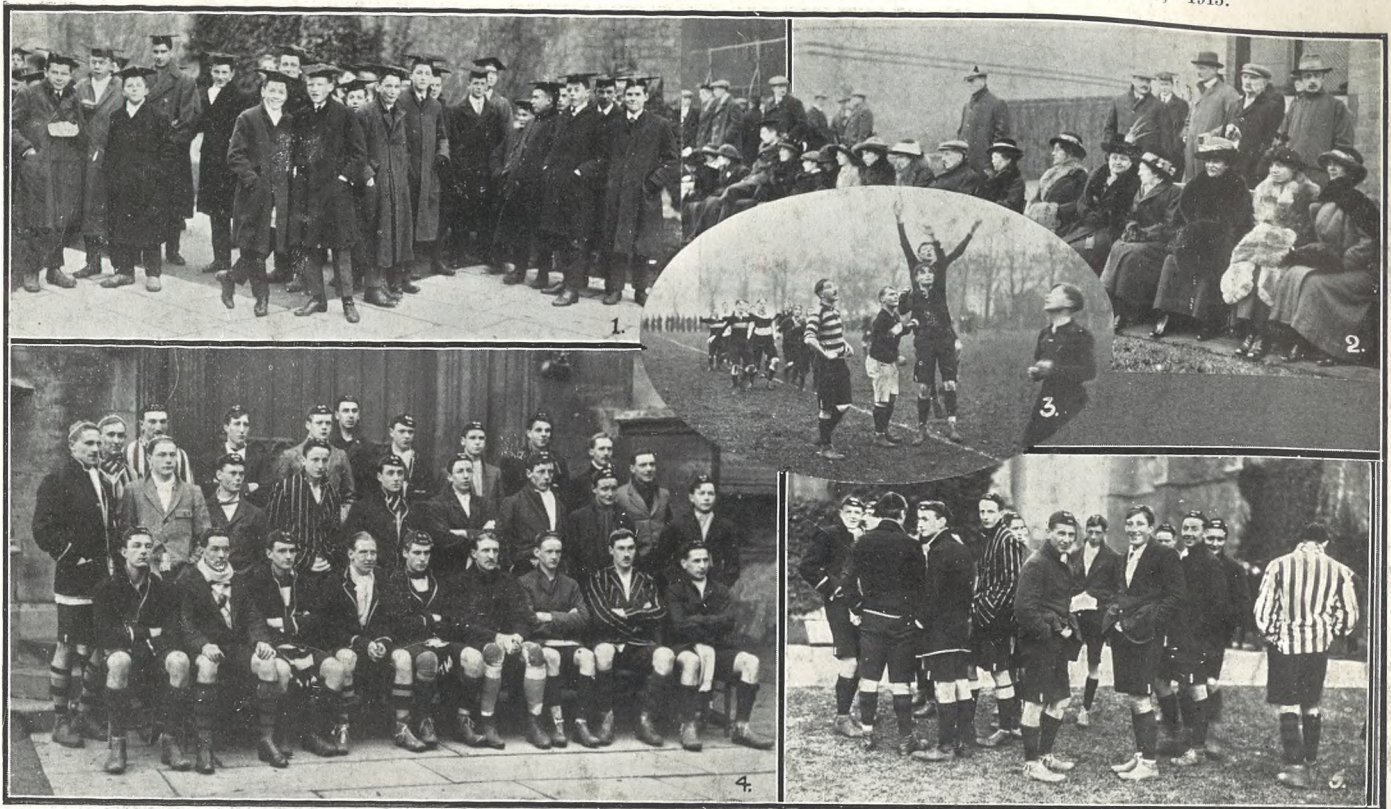
**RE-OPENING OF ASHTON-UNDER-HILL CHURCH.**

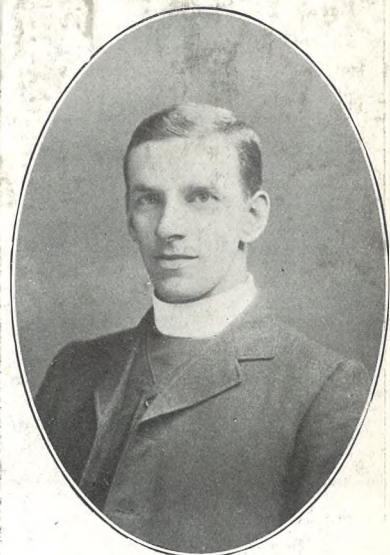

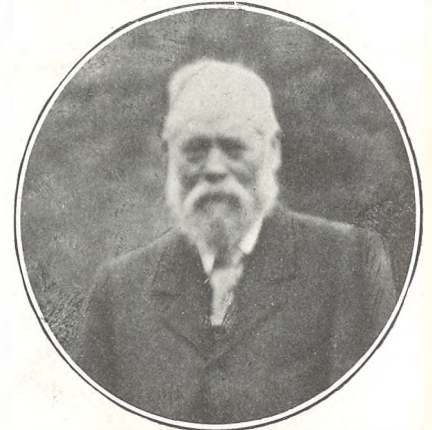
