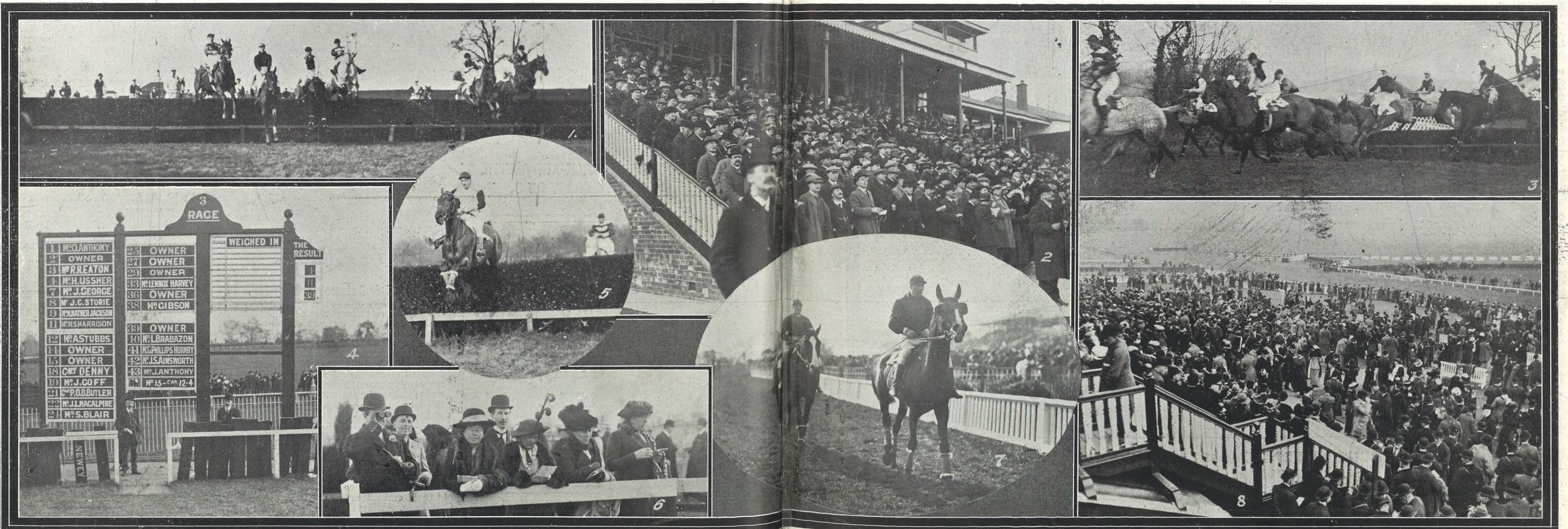

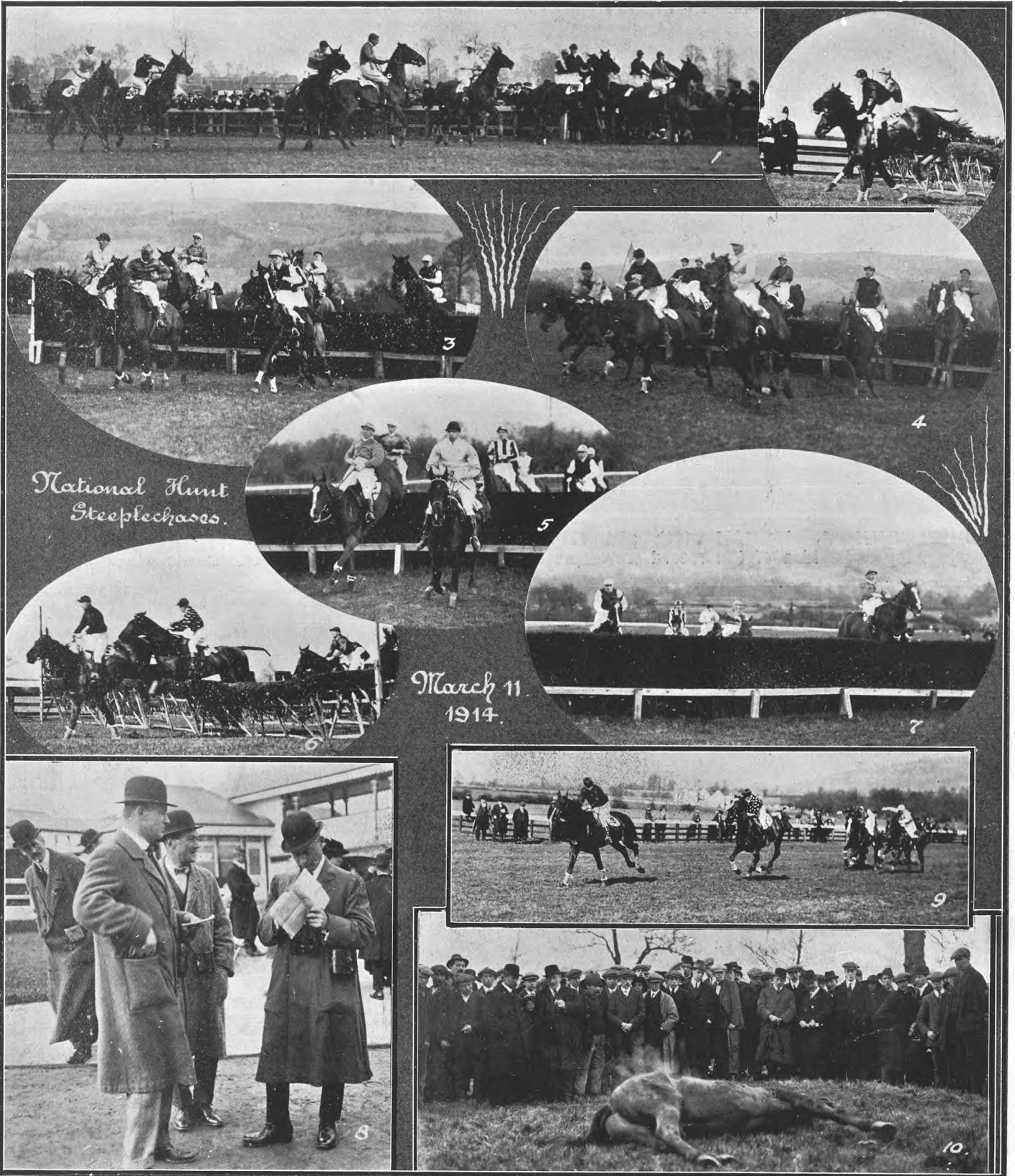

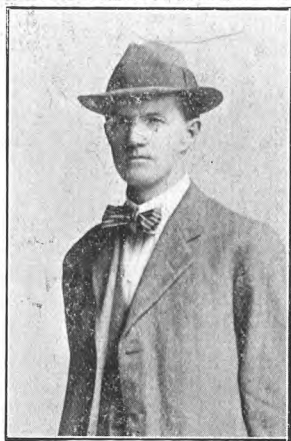

- 10.—Crowd round Mr. Blundell's Sidney, who broke his back at open ditch in National Hunt Race, and was destroyed.

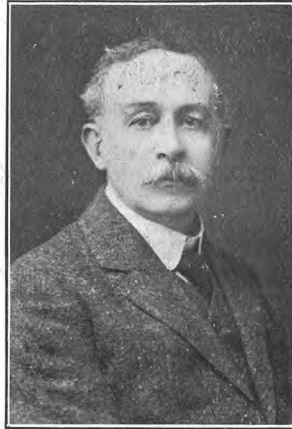

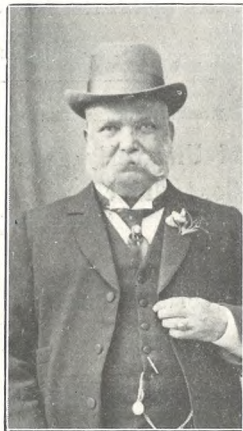

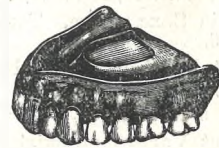

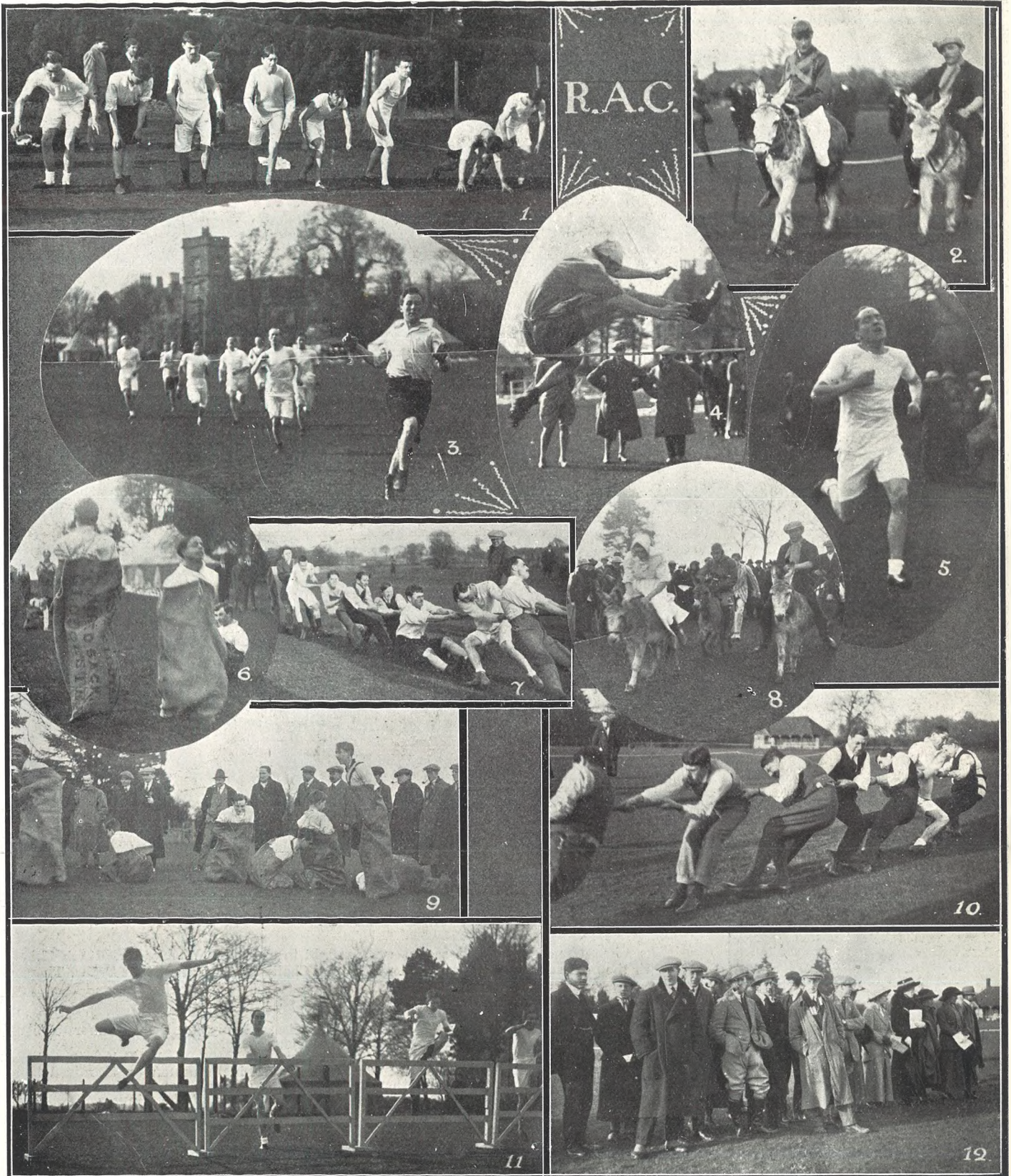
