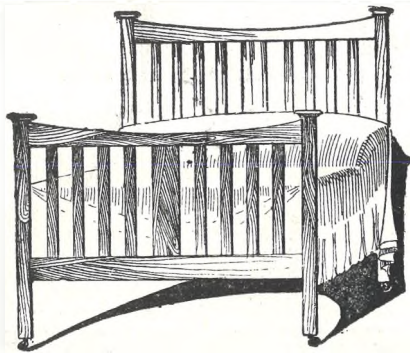
**MR. JOHNSON,**

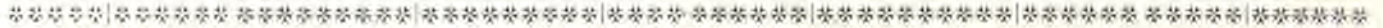

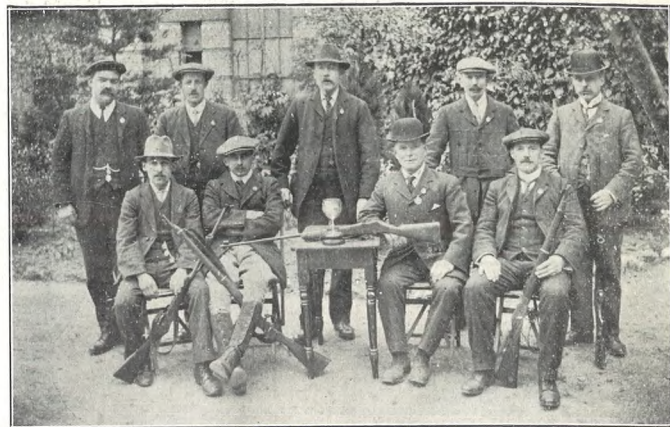

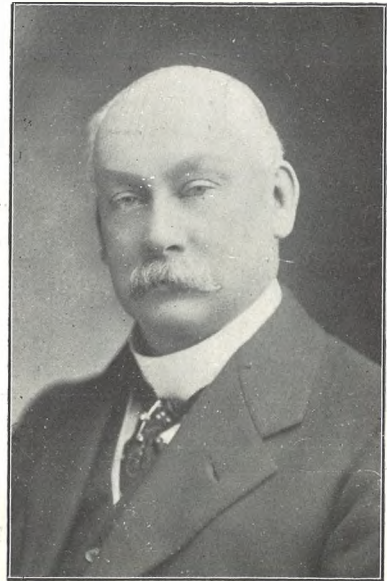

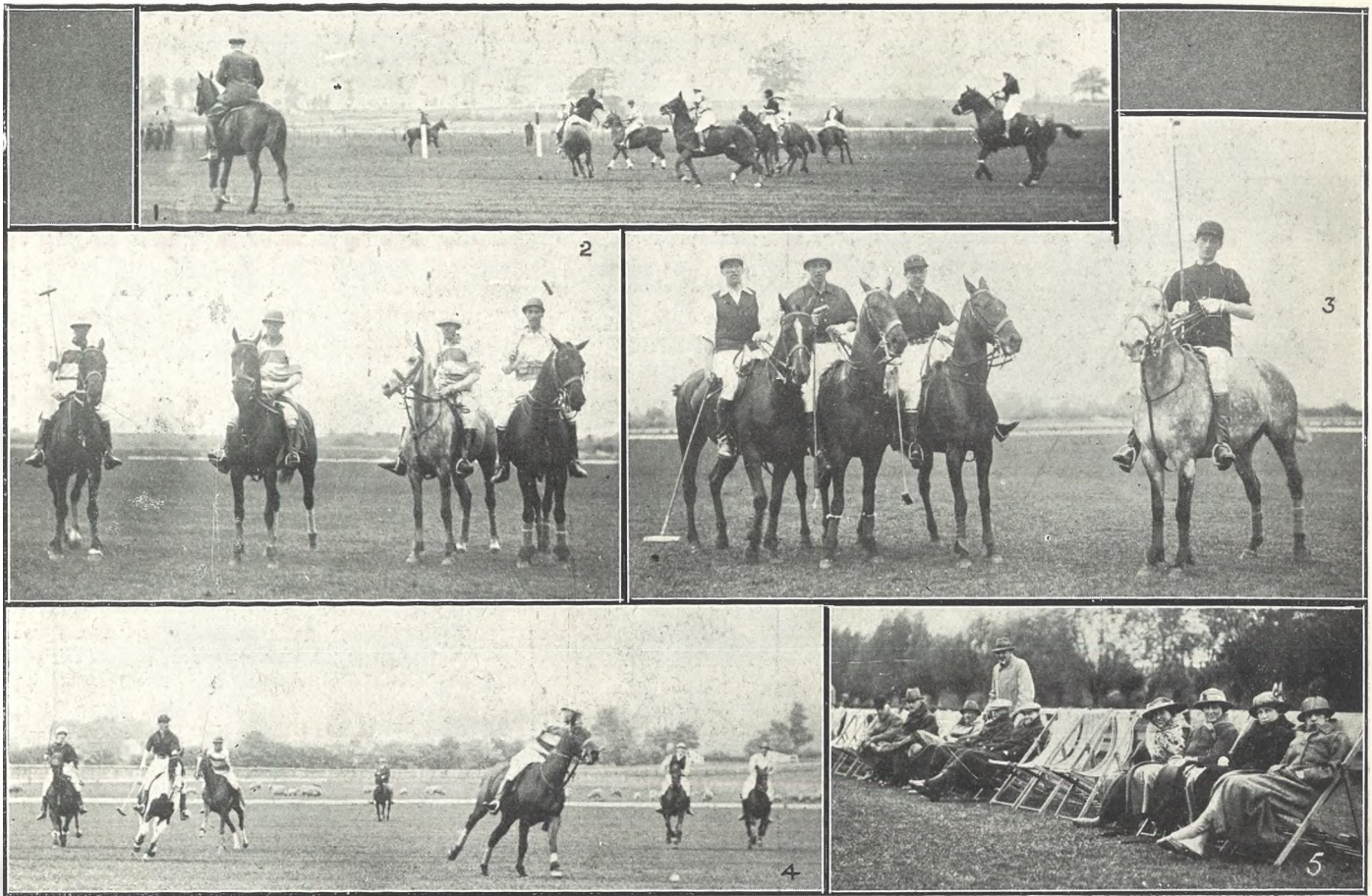

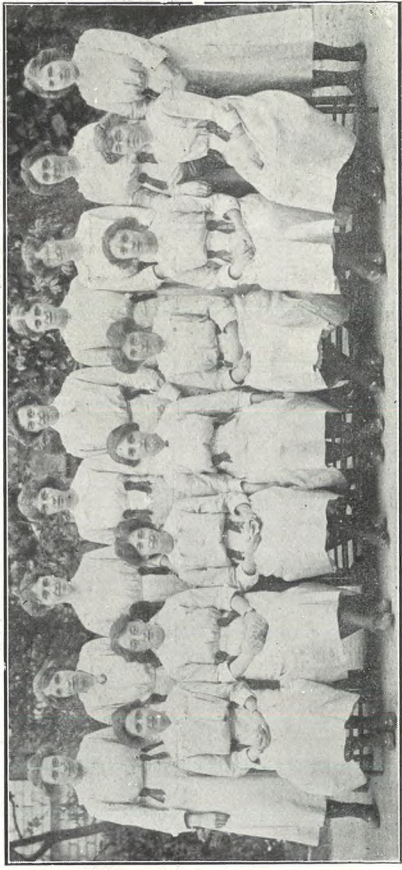


