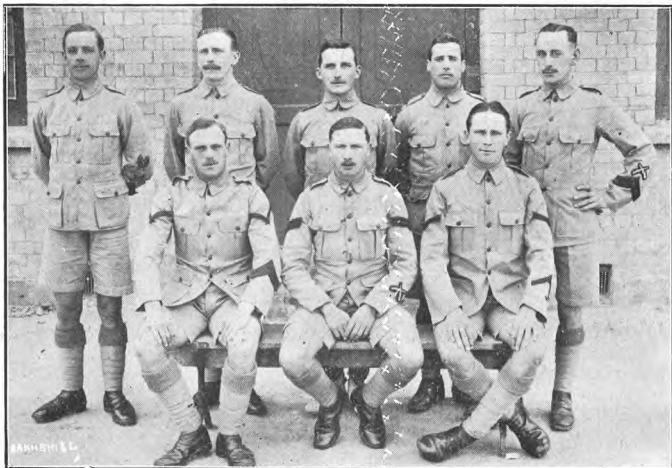

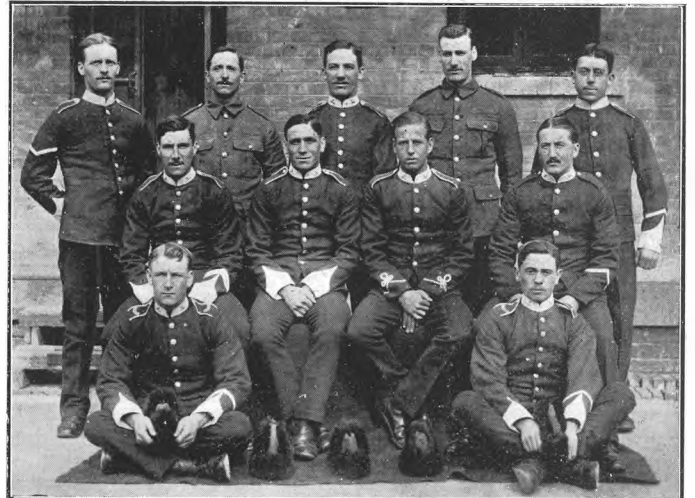


**GLOUCESTERSHIRE MEN IN INDIA.**
