## LONGEVITY IN A GLOUCESTERSHIRE FAMILY.

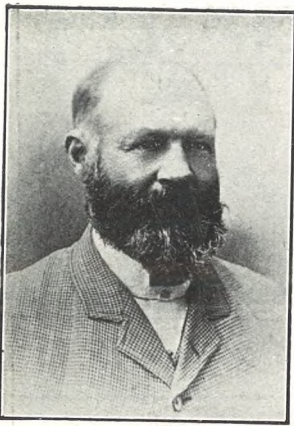

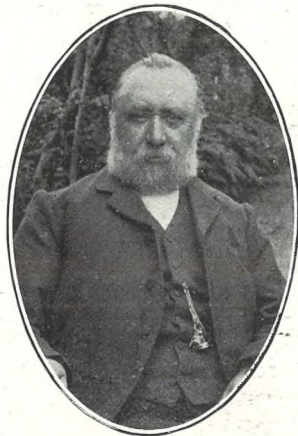

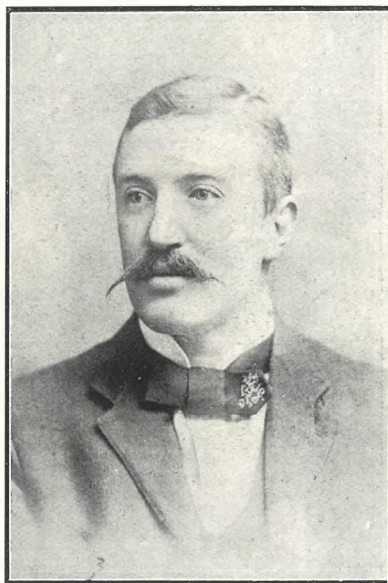

Of the 2nd Leinster Regiment, husband of Mrs. Godwin, of 3 Malvern-street, Cheltenham, who was wounded in the battle of Lille on Sunday, Oct. 18, and is now in Glasgow Hospital.



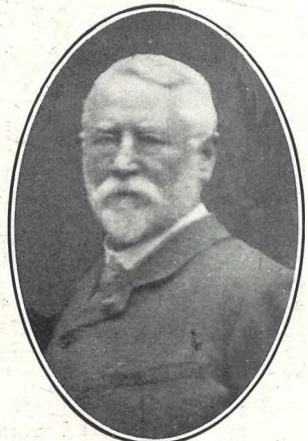
SEC-LIEUT. H. E. HIPPISELY,

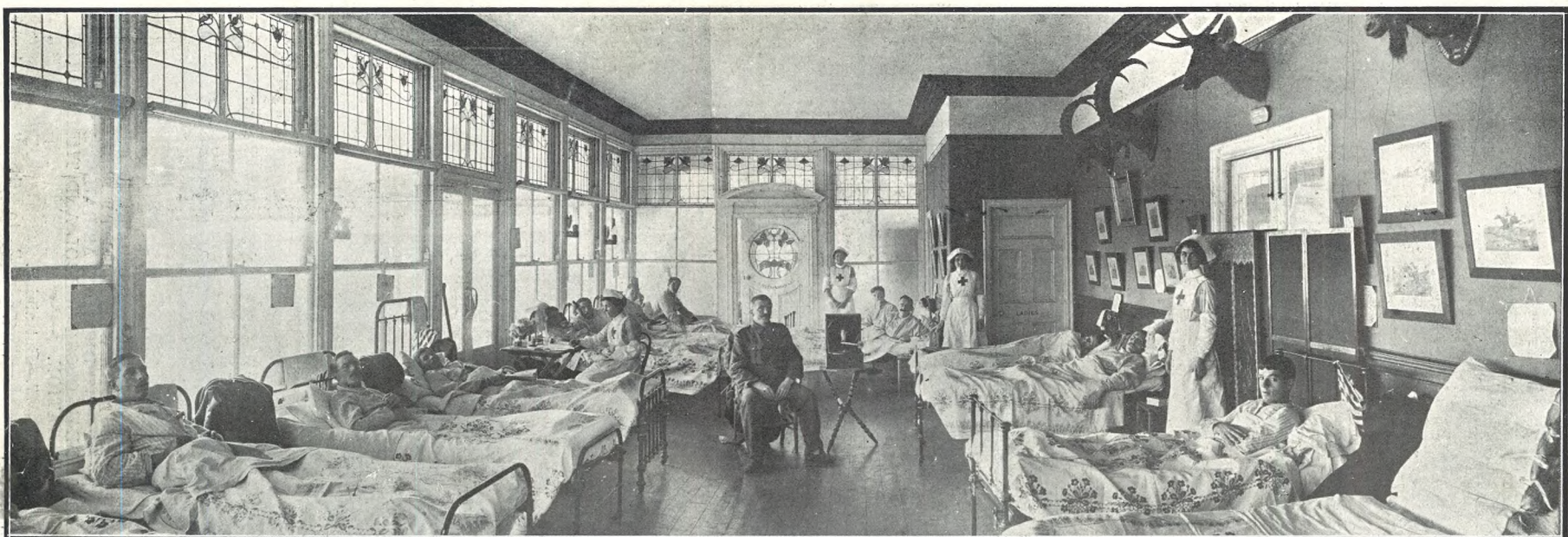


### NATIONAL RESERVES LEAVE CHELTENHAM.

THE HANDSOME AND COMMODIOUS RANGE OF STANDS ON THE CHEL TENHAM RACE COURSE, WHICH HAD BEEN OFFERED TO THE AUTHORITIES AS A HOSPITAL FOR WOUNDED SOLDIERS, WAS ACCEPTED BY THEM, AND ABOUT 70 ENGLISH AND BELGIAN SOLDIERS ARE NOW COMFORTABLY INSTALLED THERE. THEY ARE IN CHARGE OF THE SOUTHAM DETACHMENT OF THE GLOUCESTERSHIRE RED CROSS SOCIETY, WITH MISS RATCLIFF AS COMMANDANT. BEDS ARE PROVIDED FOR A GREAT MANY MORE, AND WILL BE FILLED IN DUE COURSE. **Lieut. Francis Lennox Holmes,**  
1st Battalion South Staffordshire Regt., younger son of the late Major-General P. R. Holmes, R.M.L.I., and of Mrs. B. G. Harrison, Evesham House, Cheltenham, killed in action in France, Oct. 23, aged 27 years.



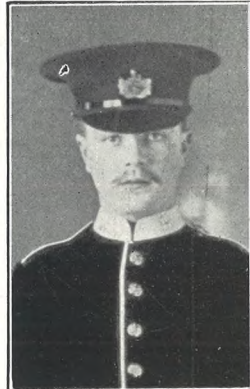
**Capt. Frank Brandt, R.N.,**  
Son of Mr. F. Brandt, of Cheltenham, and who was in command of H.M.S. Monmouth, sunk in action off the coast of Chili, South America, attacking a greatly superior force in a gallant attempt to help the Good Hope, which was on fire and sinking.



**Lieut. C. A. S. Carleton,**  
2nd Battalion Welsh Regiment, who was wounded in action and is now in a French hospital. He has been mentioned in despatches. He is the popular Gloucester City and County Rugby footballer, and has played for the Army v. Navy.



**PRIVATE WILLIAM CRATCHLEY,**  
1st Gloucester Regiment, killed in action in France, Oct. 24. He was a well-known Stroud footballer, and brother of Walter Cratchley, known as "Whack", Harrington, who played for Stroud and Cinderford.



**PRIVATE CHARLES CRATCHLEY,**  
1st Gloucester Regiment, wounded twice on Oct. 21 in France, and now in the Royal Hospital, Manchester. He is a son of Mr. and Mrs. C. Cratchley, of 2 Belmont-terrace, Portland-square, Cheltenham.



**PRIVATE R. LEWIS,**  
1st Gloucester Regiment, wounded by two bullets in shoulder and elbow at battle of the Aisne. He is one of the four soldier sons of Mrs. H. Nind, Stonehouse Farm, Tewkesbury.



**PRIVATE G. H. RANDELL,**  
1st Wilts Reserve, of Cricklade-street, Cirencester, who was killed in action on Oct. 13, aged 26 years. He leaves a widow and four children.

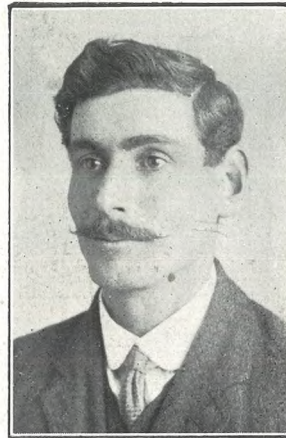
**PRIVATE S. HANSON,**

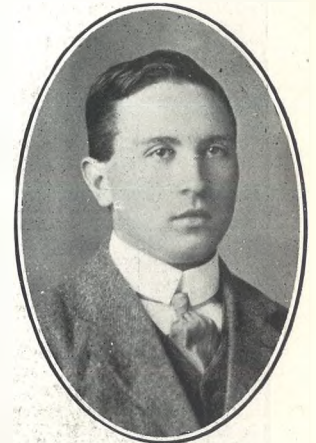
**PRIVATE E. J. PARRY,**

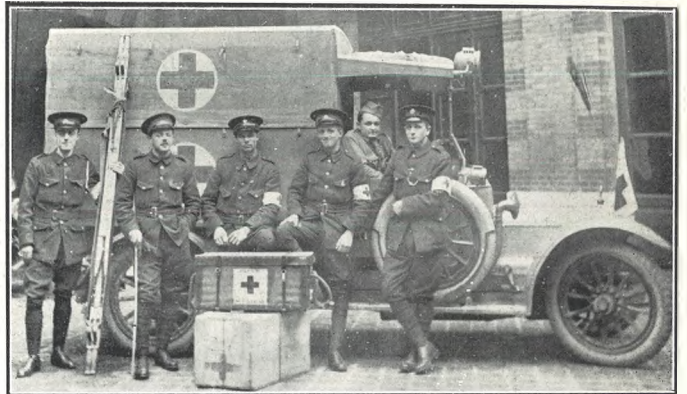

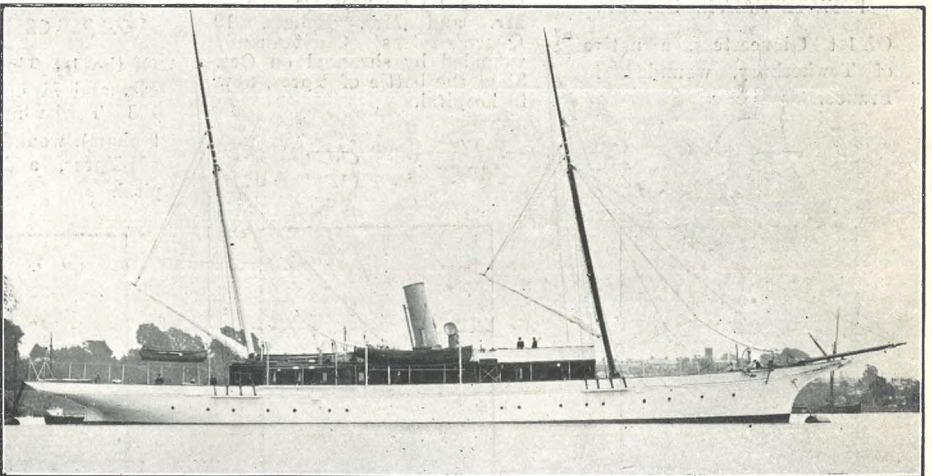

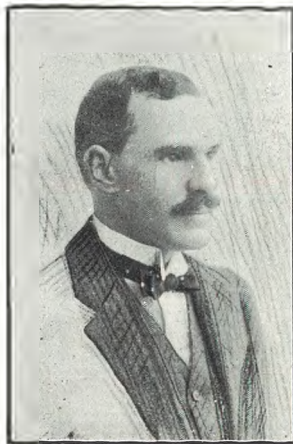
