PRIVATE W. C. SHAW,
1st Royal Dragoons. Has received the Distinguished Conduct Medal for gallantry near
St. Pieter in rescuing a wounded comrade under heavy fire. He is a son of Mr. and Mrs. George Shaw, 7 Slaney-street, Gloucester.



PRIVATE A. W. SUMMERS, 3rd Gloucester Regiment, killed by the bursting of a shell, Jan. 25th, aged 20 years. He is the son of Mr. and Mrs. Summers, of the White Lion Inn, Lightpill, Stroud, and was well known as a local footballer.



PRIVATE WILLIAM BEARD, 1st Gloucester Regiment, invalided to his home at Churchdown from Sunderland Hospital, suffering from shock caused by a shell at La Bassee. This shell killed and wounded a large number of the Gloucesters. He was previously a G.W.R. signalman at Penyaraia.

Ist Gloucester Regiment, killed








