**MAJOR J. F. SUMPTION,**  
Of the Canadians, died of wounds on October 22nd, aged 38 years. Second son of Mr. G. J. Sumption, who was 37 years postmaster of Prestbury, and brother of the present postmaster. He was a member of the Montreal firm of Sumption and Hughes.



**SEC.-LIEUT. VICTOR C. WITHAM,**  
East Lancashire Regt., who who has been awarded the Military Cross for conspicuous gallantry in the Near East. Though his home is at Suvla (Fiji), he comes of a Cheltenham stock, and is a grand nephew of Mr. T. Whittard, J.P.



**PTE. H. STANLEY,**  
Gloucestershire Regiment, wounded in both legs in action July 22nd, 1916, and after lying in Brook War Hospital, Woolwich, is now convalescent at Shortlands, Kent. Brother of Mrs. F. Priest, of Claremont, Swan-road, Kingsholm, Gloucester, where he made his home.



**CORPL. C. DICKINS,**  
Warwickshire Regt., wounded in action, and now in 1st London General Hospital. Son of Mr. Chas. Dickins, the well-known tobacconist, Cuba, Villa, London-road, Cheltenham. He transferred from 1/5th Gloucesters to Cyclist Corps, and afterwards attached to R. Warwicks.



**PTE. RICHARD LONSDALE,**  
South Wales Borderers, died of wounds received in action on July 26th, 1916, aged 27 years. Nephew of Mr. Edwin Teale, Vauxhall Inn, Tewkesbury-road, Cheltenham.



**PTE. ENOS DAY,**  
Grenadier Guards, wounded in action on Sept. 15th, and now in Royal Gwent Hospital, Newport, Mon. He is late of Chedworth, and son of Mr. John Day, of Holcombe, Painswick, Stroud.



**PTE. JACK KENCH,**  
Worcester Regt., wounded in shoulder in action on August 24th, 1916, and now in Red Cross Hospital at Kidderminster. Son of Mr. and Mrs. J. Kench, 14 Victoria-place, Fairview, Cheltenham.



**PTE. WALTER PARTRIDGE,**  
Coldstream Guards, who was wounded in Sept., 1914, at Mons, in September, 1915, at Loos, and again in September of the present year. Son of Mr. and Mrs. Partridge, of Riga House, Swindon-road, Cheltenham.



**PTE. F. MANSELL,**  
Gloucestershire Regt., wounded in left leg August 30th in action, and now in the West Kent General Hospital, Maidstone. Late hairdresser, of 1 Railway-buildings, Norwood-road, Cheltenham.



**BOMB. G. T. S. NEWMAN,**  
Medium Trench Mortar Battery, 11th Division, killed in action 9th October, aged 22 years. Eldest son of Mr. and Mrs. G. Newman, Sandhurst-road, near Gloucester.



**PTE. ALBERT POWELL,**  
Gloucestershire Regt., wounded on Oct. 14th. Now in Wharncliffe Military Hospital, Sheffield. He is one of three sons serving with the colours of Mr. and Mrs. W. Powell, of Ham, Charlton Kings.



**DRIVER C. MORGAN,**  
R.F.A., wounded on Sept. 25th, 1916, in action, and now in Manchester hospital. Son of Mr. and Mrs. Morgan, 8 Berkeley-avenue, Winchcombe-street, Cheltenham. He enlisted at the outbreak of war.

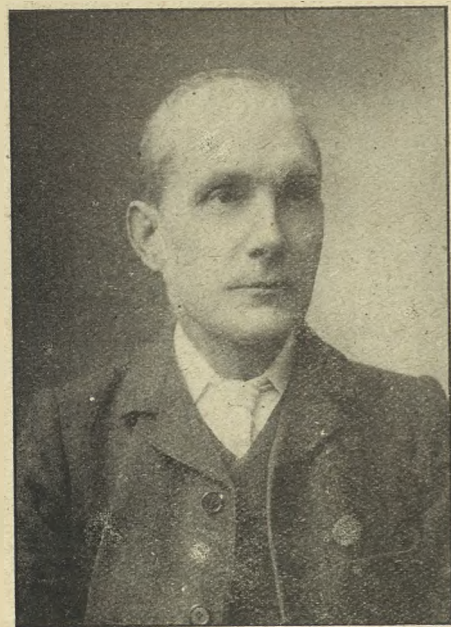

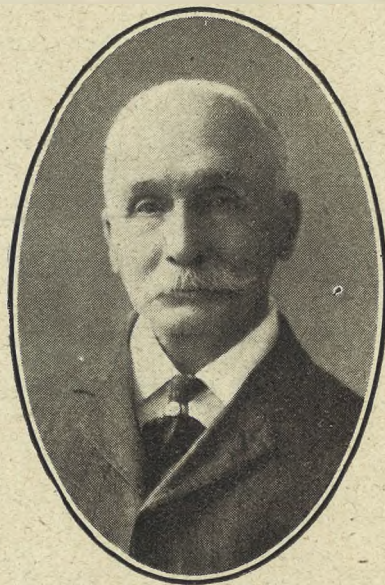

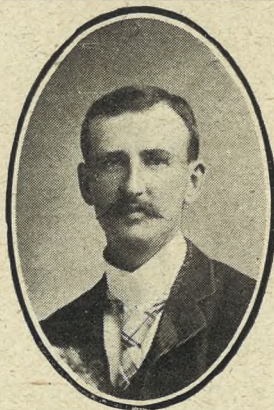
**The New Silver War Badge**

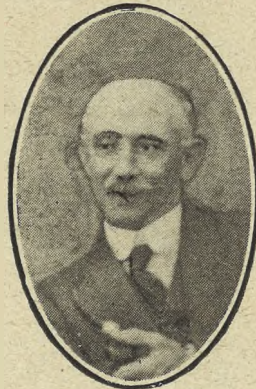

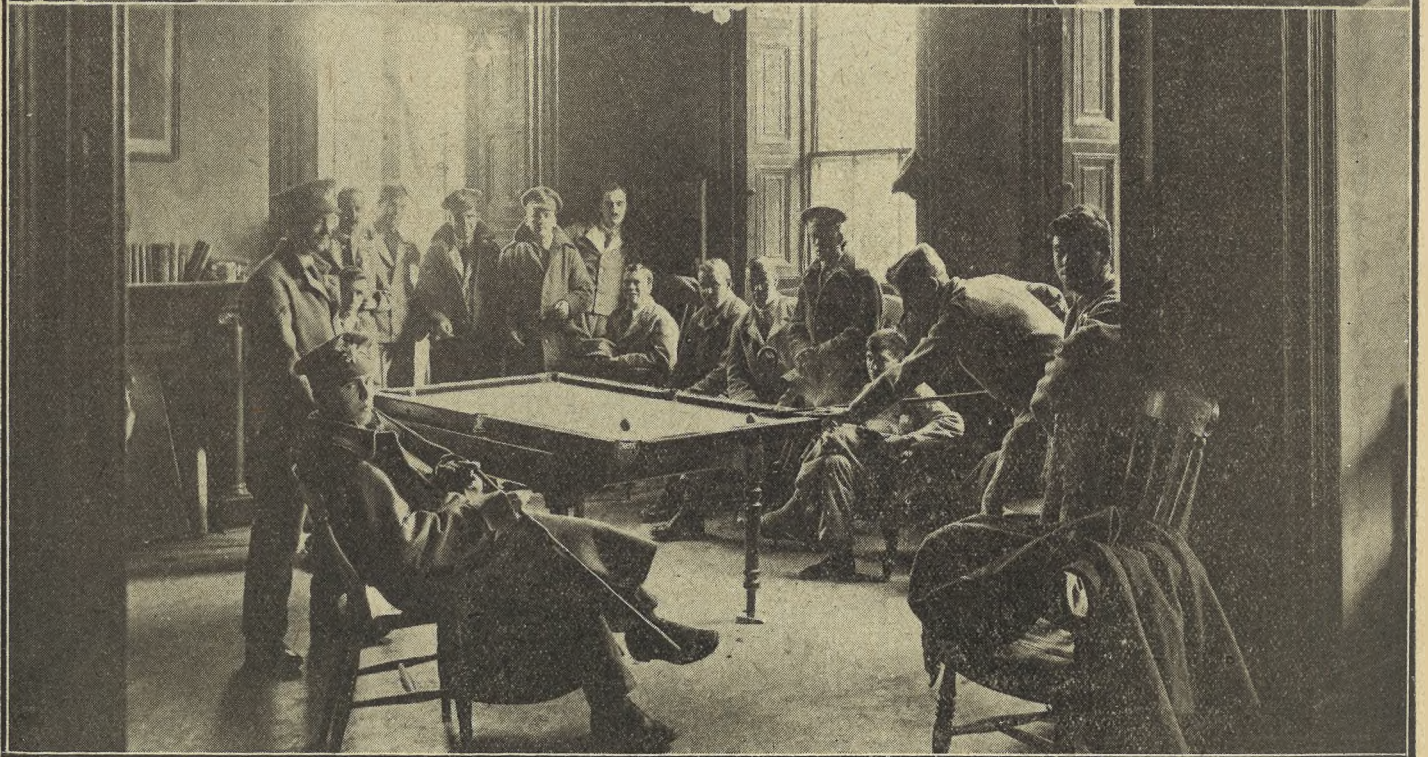

### ROMANTIC WEDDING IN CHELTENHAM.

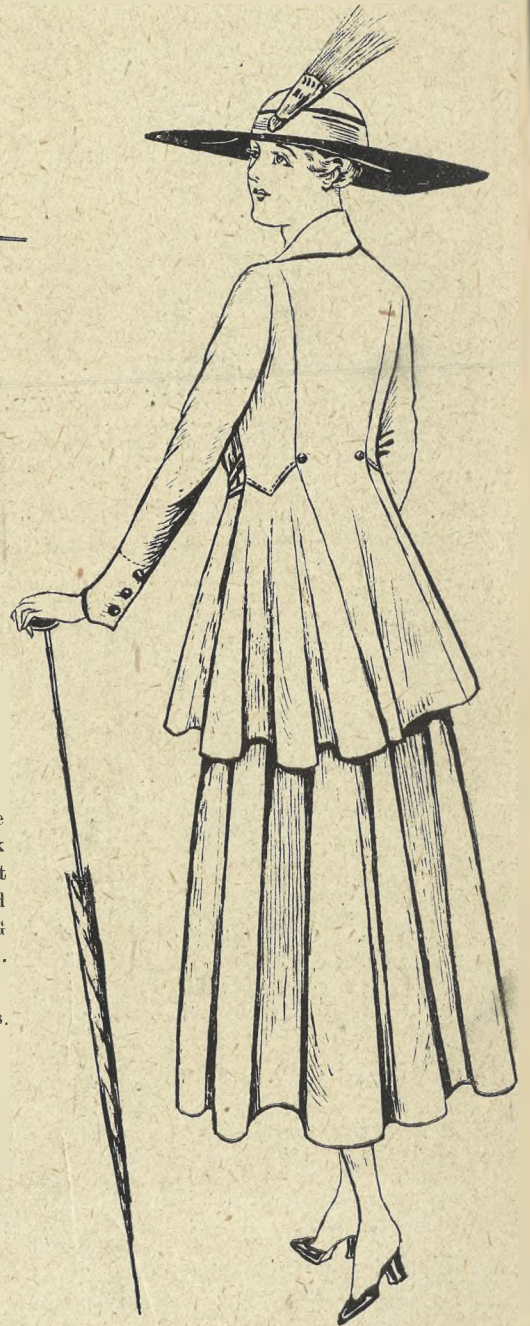
