





DOG SHOWS FORBIDDEN.

NEW POWERS OF THE POLICE.

NEW POWERS OF THE POLICE.

New regulations just made under the Defence of the Realm Acts make it unlawful to hold dog shows. If any person takes part in "the control, management, or organisation" of a dog show he will be guilty of an offence against the regulations.

Section 3 of the Dogs Act, 1906, which gives the police power to detain stray dogs, is modified. The Act provided that where any dog was seized while wearing a collar with the name and address of the owner on it, or where the owner of the dog was known, the police should serve a notice on the owner that the dog would be "liable to be sold or destroyed if not claimed within seven clear days." The new regulation provides that the expiration of three clear days from the time of seizure, unless in the meantime the owner of the dog has claimed the dog and produced his licence." A notice by the police to this effect is to be deemed to comply with the Dogs Act.

Persons who take possession of a stray dog must hand the dog to a police-constable, and the dog will then be treated as a stray dog under the terms of the Act.

\* Thirty dog owrers were fined in Bristol on \* Wednesday, making 100 in three weeks, for not taking out dog licenses.

During the war, Norway has lost merchant ships of an aggregate tonnage of 740,000, which is about one-third of her entire merrchant fleet.

\* Messrs. James Cottle, Ltd., proprietors of a Chester restaurant, fined £5 for wasting bread, said that it was left over by customers often dining tomers after dining.

Twenty-two Dutch ships have been ordered to get ready to fetch 100,000 tons of grain from the United States consigned to the Netherlands Government.

"If the women of this country had not done their work in munition factories, hos pitals, and many other ways, we should have before now." said the Bishop of Willesden on Saturday.


