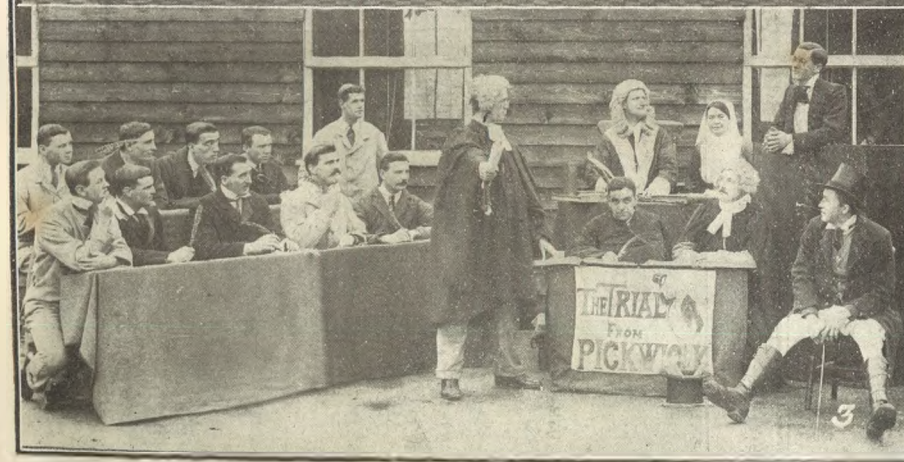
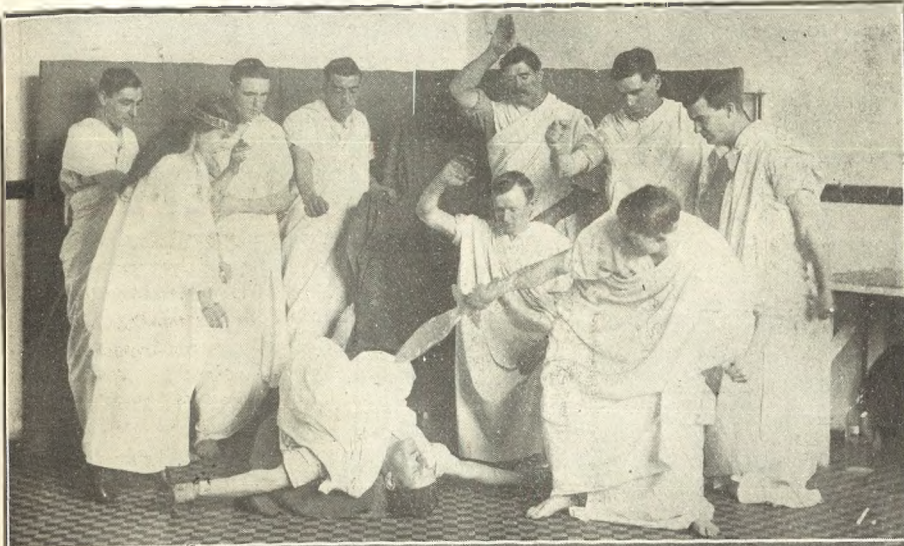
## CHRISTMAS IN NEW COURT V.A.D. HOSPITAL, CHELTENHAM.

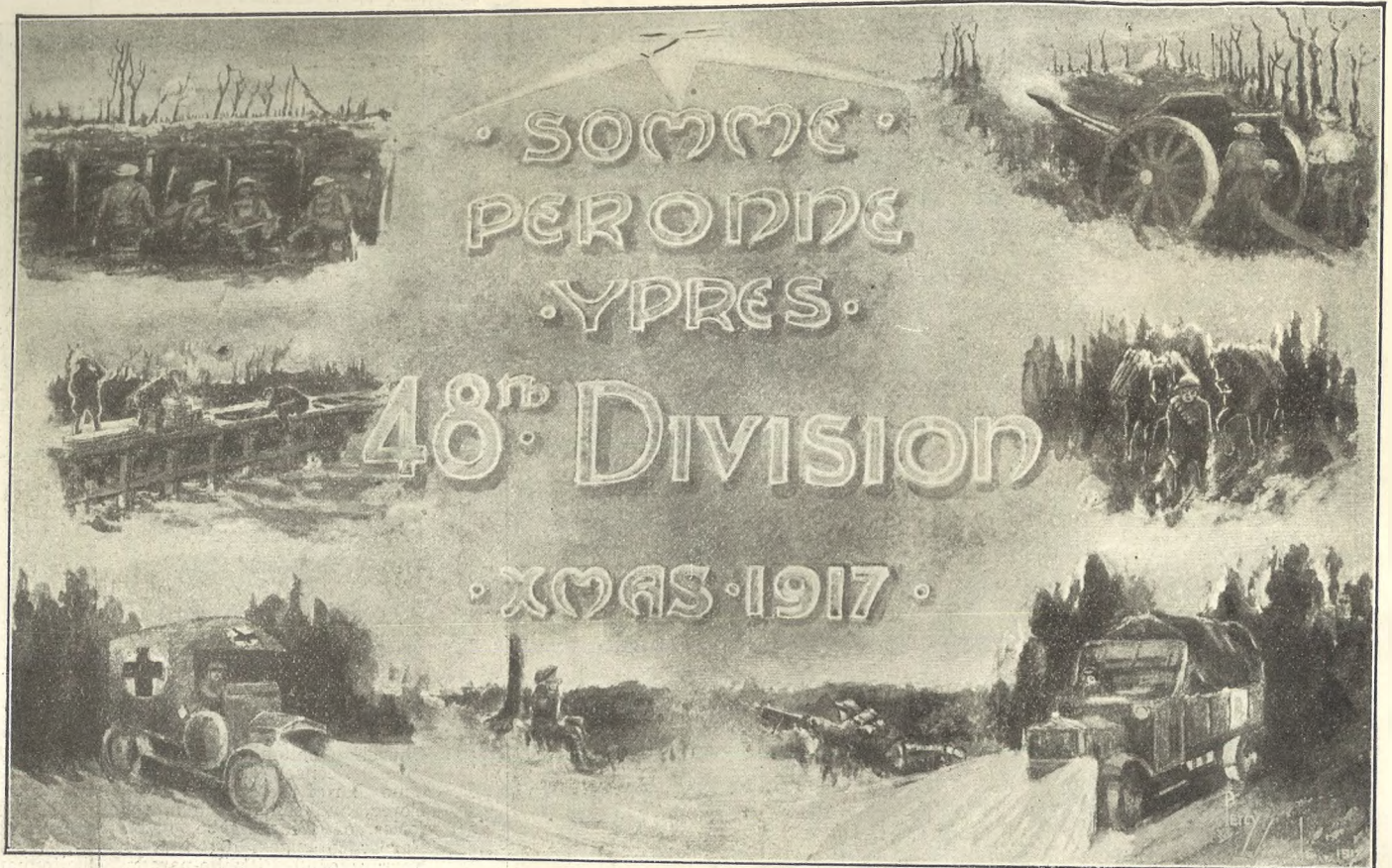


**A Gloucestershire Golden Wedding.**

- 4.—Cadet E. J. Neate, R.F.C., who has just failed medically to gain his commission as a pilot.

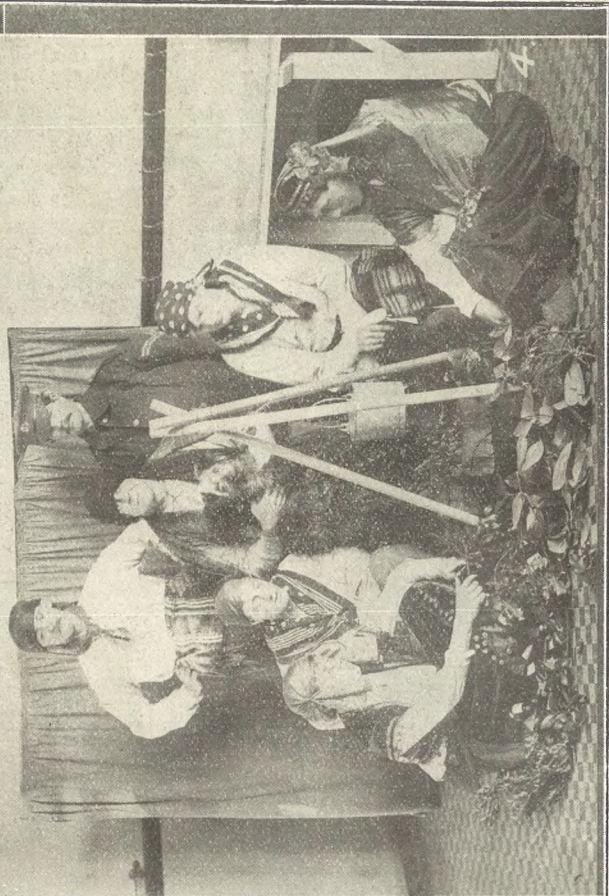




**FANCY-DRESS BALL AT G.W.R. HOSPITAL, GLOUCESTER.**

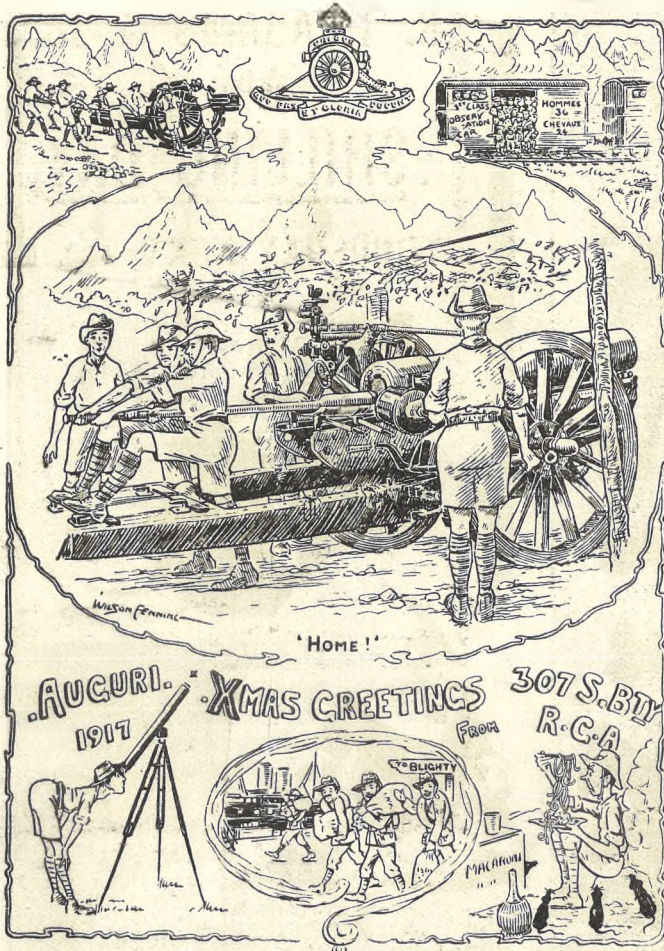

Tuesday night's "London Gazette" contained an unusual phrase descriptive of the service of an officer. It is recorded that Captain (temporary Major) John William Seigne, D.S.O., R.M.L.I., "is promoted to the rank of major by brevet for brilliant service."

One hundred and seventy three persons and 32 houses have been buried by an avalanche in Niigata (Japan). Up to the present 102 bodies have been recovered.

At a meeting of the Ongar Farmers' Union, reference was made to the destruction of crops by wood pigeons. It was stated that these birds could be seen flying over the fields in thousands, and that unless they were killed off considerable damage would be done. It was resolved to organise a pigeon shoot for each Tuesday.

John Miles Sumner (31), who admitted 173 cases of housebreaking, was sentenced at Liverpool on Saturday to 10 years' penal servitude for housebreaking, to be followed by 10 years' preventive detention.



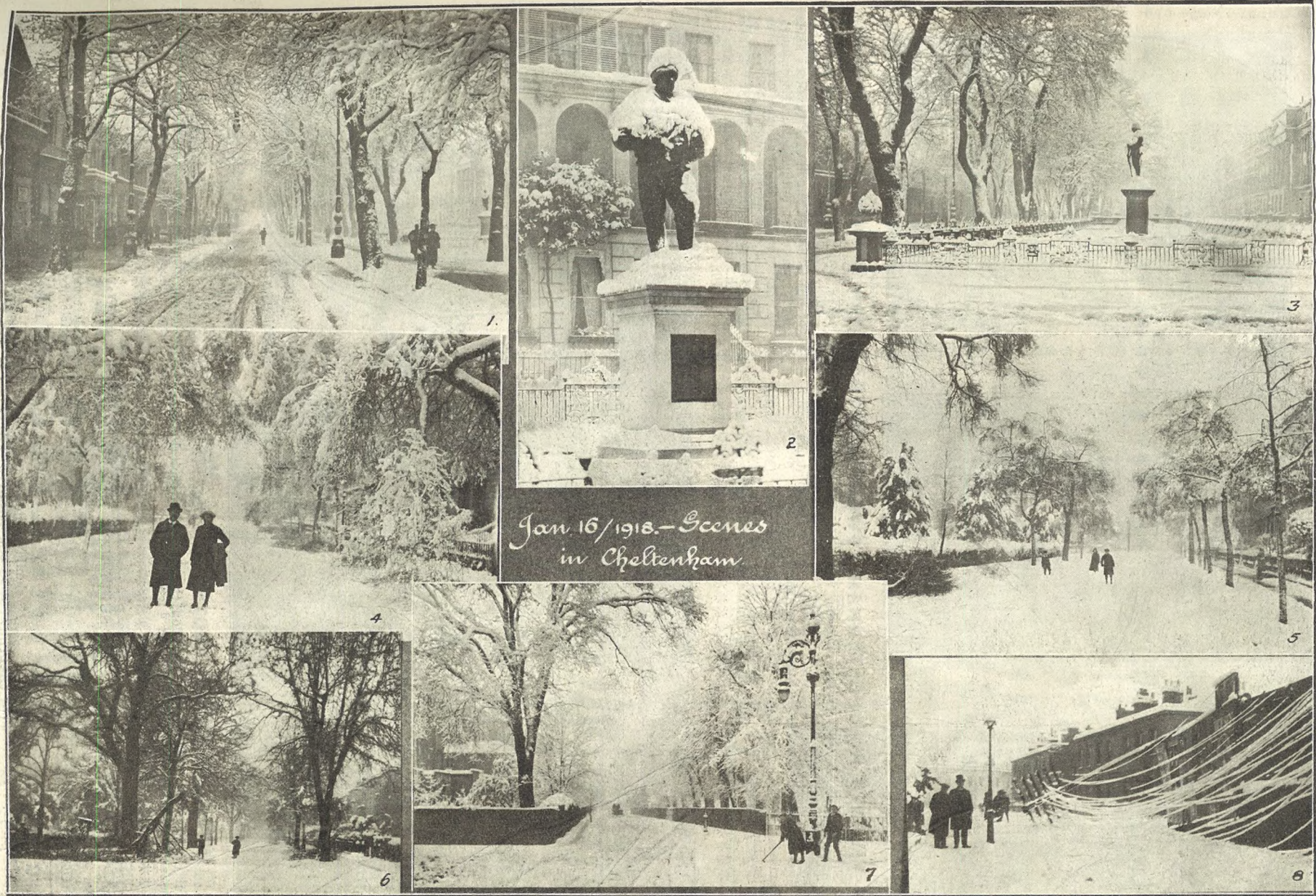


**GREAT SNOWSTORM IN CHELTENHAM.**

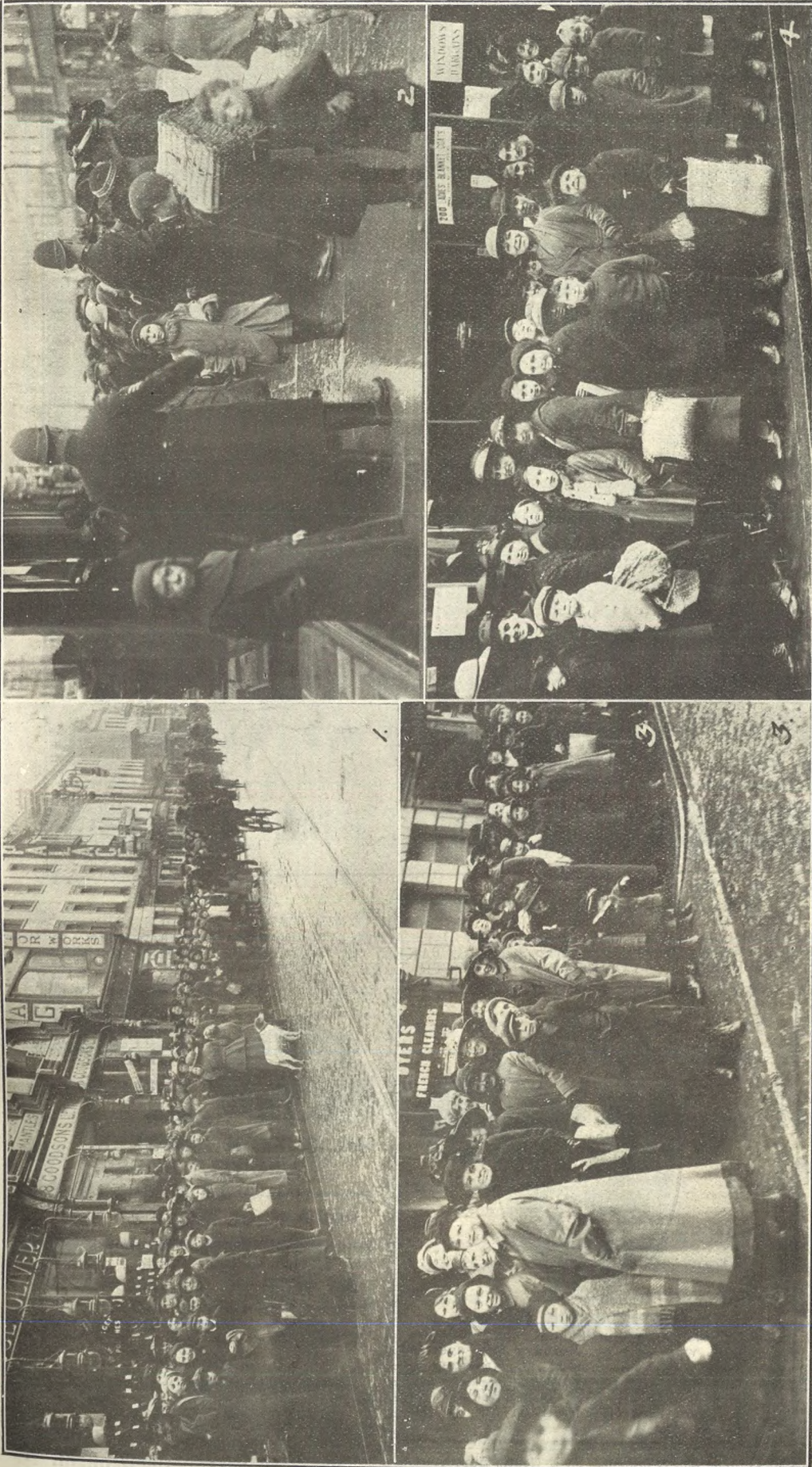
