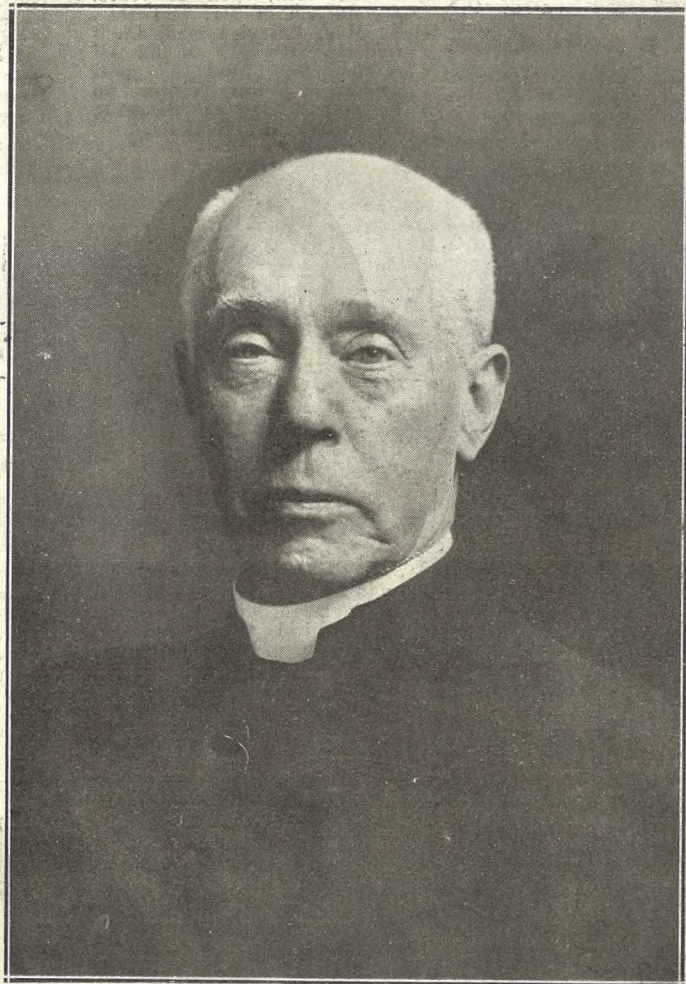

# ENGLAND'S ROLL OF HONOUR.



LIEUT. E. L. THOMAS, Welsh Regt., killed in action in France Sept. 18, aged 21 years. Second son of the late Mr. J. A. Thomas, of Arundel House, Cheltenham.



PTE. REGT. H. MAY, D.C.L.I., killed in action on August 30th, aged 19 years. Second son of Mr. and Mrs. A. May, Fairview-road, Cheltenham. He was an old All Saints' boy, and a good athlete. Before joining up he was at Messrs. Singer's, High-street, Cheltenham.



PTE. B. BARNFIELD, Berks Regt. (att. Y.L.I.), reported missing May 27th, now known to be a prisoner of war of war in a German hospital suffering from dysentery. Only son of Mr. and Mrs. W. Barnfield, 1 Short-street, Leckhampton, Cheltenham.



R.F.M. JACK CLAPHAM, Rifle Brigade, died of wounds in a military hospital in London Sept. 18th. He was previously wounded July 5th, 1917. Before joining up he was employed at Bailey and Son's Tan-yard. He leaves a widow at 29 Victoria-street, St. Paul's, Cheltenham.



PTE. ARTHUR V. MOXEY, Dorset Regt., died of wounds Sept. 19. Second son of Mr. and Mrs. Moxey, 62 Queen-street, Cheltenham. He was formerly a waiter at Moored Park Pension, Cheltenham.



PTE. H. J. GODSELL, Canadian Force, wounded in left arm on Aug. 27, and now in hospital at Manchester. Only son of Mr. and Mrs. A. C. Godsell, Underwood, Bath-parade, Cheltenham.



PTE. EDWARD BETTERIDGE, London Regt., killed in action between Aug. 24 and 28 after serving for four years. His home was at Lower Slaughter, where he was a general favourite.



PTE. ERNEST GRIFFIN, Cyclist Corps, killed in action on Sept. 7th in a dugout by a shell, aged 19 years. Youngest son of Mr. and Mrs. T. Griffin, of Lower Slaughter, Gloucestershire.



CARRIER SERGT. J. C. (CHARLIE) CHICK, R.E., mentioned in despatches for gallantry and devotion to duty. He was in business in Charlton Kings when he joined up in January, 1915, and before the war served ten years in the Gloucestershire Yeomanry as a corporal.



PTE. REGT. WOODWARD, Gloucester Regiment, reported missing since March 21. His mother heard from him on Sept. 25th that he is a prisoner in Germany. The post-card was sent on July 28th, on which he says he is "at last allowed to write." Son of Mrs. Woodward, 2 Westmon Villa, Hambrook-street, Charlton King.

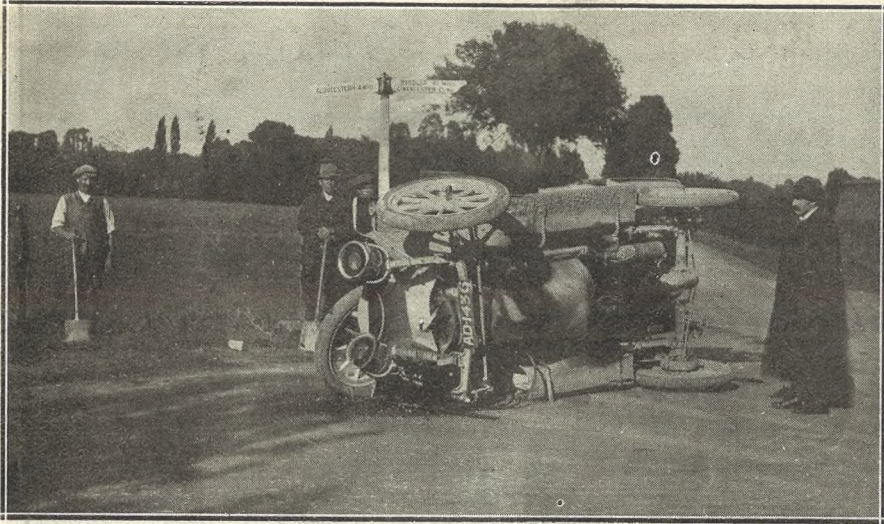


ABLE-SEAMAN PERCIVAL THOS. FILDES, R.N. Division, killed in action on Sept. 4, aged 26 years. Only child of Mrs. E. Fildes, The Laurels, Prestbury. He was for 11 years in the employ of Messrs. Fisher and Son, ironmongers, before joining the Navy.



PTE. ALBERT HAROLD JACOBS, Killed in action on Sept. 24th on the Western front, aged 19 years. Only son of Mr. A. Jacobs, house furnisher, formerly of Killarney, London-road, Cheltenham, and now of 5 Clevedon-road, Gloucester. He was formerly deputy organist at St. Luke's and Salem Churches, Cheltenham.

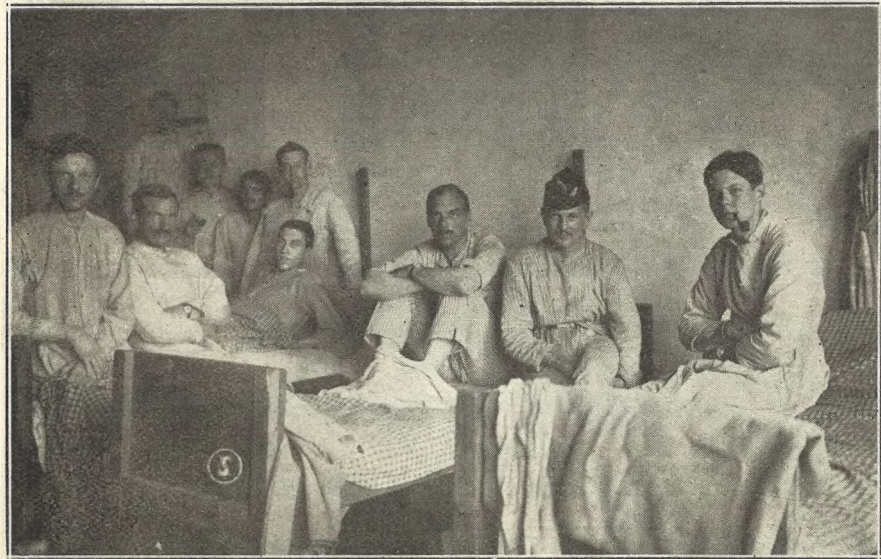




**MOTOR ACCIDENT AT BROCKWORTH.**

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**SCHOOL OF AERONAUTICS' RUGBY FOOTBALL TEAM.**

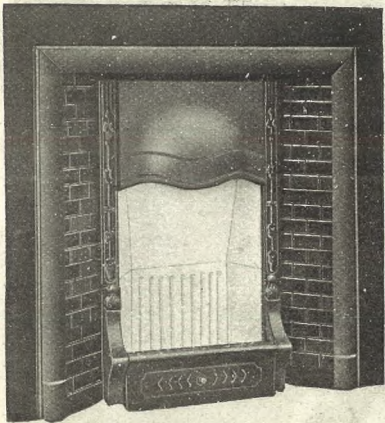

Div.), killed in action Aug. 26,  
1918, aged 19 years and eight  
months. Only son of Mr. and  
Mrs. Ernest J. Hill, of 151  
Bristol-road, Gloucester.



LANCE-CPL. W. BERRY,  
R.E., killed in action Sept. 7.  
Only son of Mr. W. Berry  
and the late Mrs. Berry, of  
Vine Cottage, St. Paul's-  
street. Before joining up in  
April, 1916, he was employed  
as a platelayer on the G.W.R.  
at Newport, Mon.



PTE. PERCY FROWEN,  
Royal West Kents, killed in  
action on Aug. 23. Husband  
of Mrs. Percy Frowen, Brock  
Holland, near Lydney. (She  
was formerly Miss K. Mor-  
gan, of Cheltenham).



PTE. A. J. B. GOULDING,  
Gloucester Regt., who died in

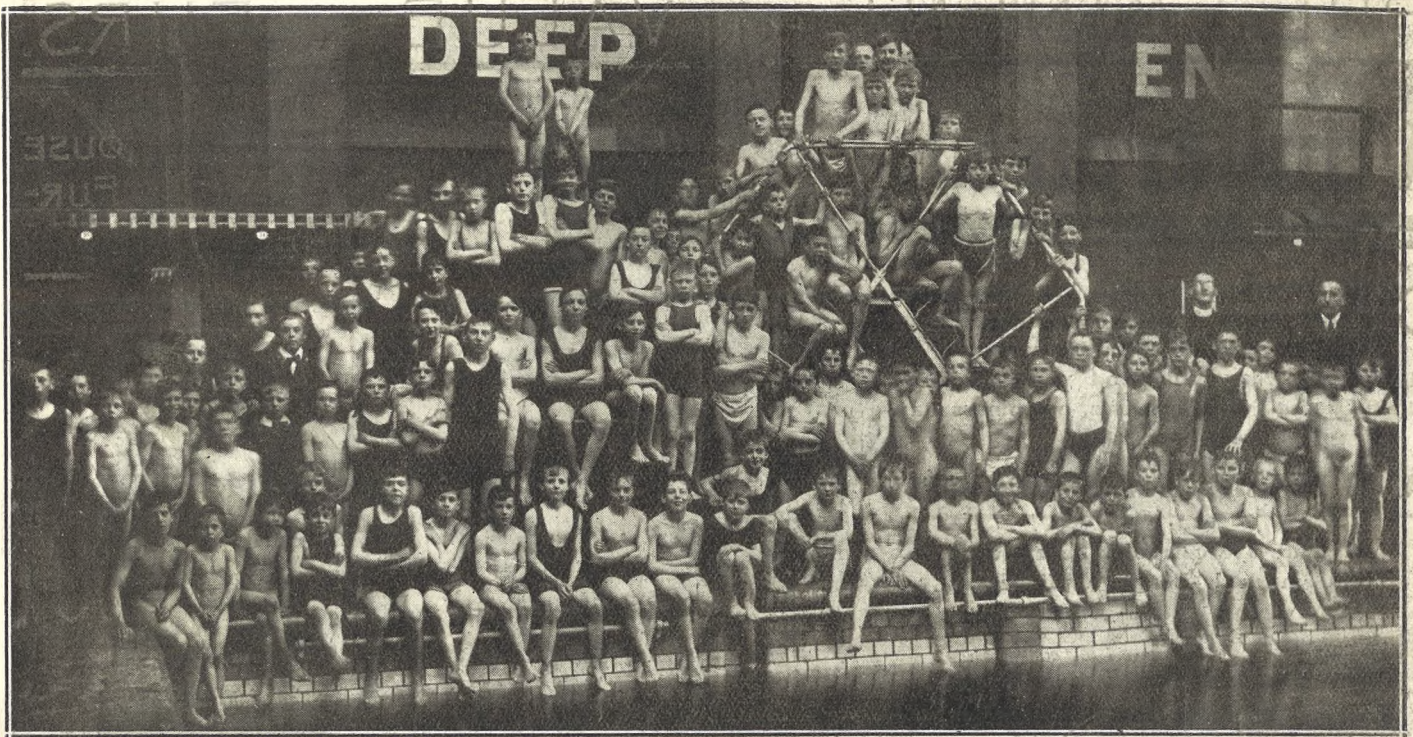
