THE DECLARATION OF THE POLL AT CHELTENHAM IN THE GENERAL ELECTION WAS CONSPICUOUS FOR THE LITTLE INTEREST SHOWN BY THE PUBLIC. TEN MINUTES BEFORE THE RESULT WAS DECLARED THERE WAS NOT A DOZEN PEOPLE OUTSIDE THE TOWN HALL, AND THERE WAS SCARCELY A HUNDRED PRESENT WHEN THE TOWN CLERK DECLARED THE RESULT. AS IS NOW WELL KNOWN, SIR JAS. T. AGG-GARDNER SECURED THE CONVINCING AND HANDSOME MAJORITY OF 3,283.

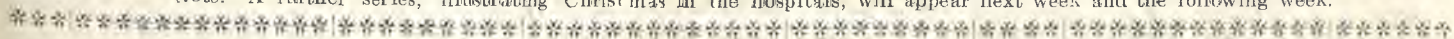


**CHRISTMAS IN A CHELTHENHAM V.A.D. HOSPITAL.**

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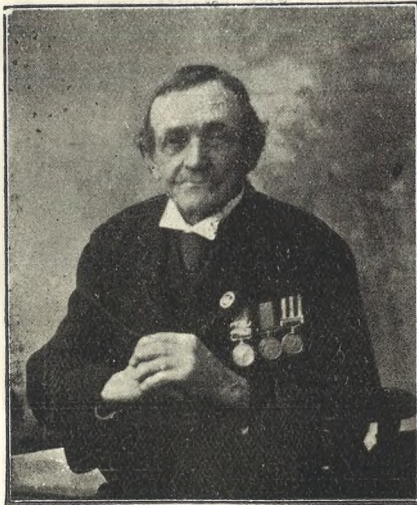

**A Winchcombe V.C.**

PTE. WILLIAM EDGAR HOLMES, 2nd Battalion Grenadier Guards, who was awarded the Victoria Cross "for most conspicuous bravery and devotion to duty at Cattenieres on October 9, 1918. He carried in two men under the most intense fire, and while he was attending to a third case he was severely wounded. In spite of this he continued to carry wounded, and was shortly afterwards again wounded with fatal results. By his self-sacrifice he was the means of saving the lives of several of his comrades. He was the son of Mr. and Mrs. Holmes, of Didbrook, near Winchcombe. Fuller details concerning this gallant soldier will be found in the main sheet of to-day's "Chronicle."



**Mr. William Preston,**

Of Swindon, near Cheltenham, who died on Saturday, December 28, aged 87 years. He was formerly a private of the 2nd Rifle Brigade and was the oldest and last local member of "Lord Roberts' Roll of Crimean Veterans." He fought at Alma and Sebastopol, and afterwards in the Mutiny.

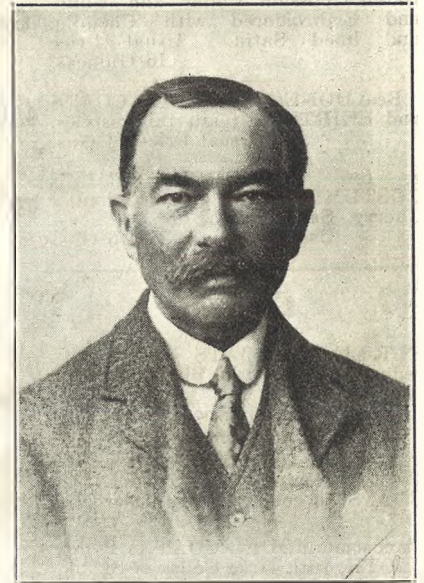

# ENGLAND'S ROLL OF HONOUR.



PTE. SIDNEY A. THOMAS, 10th Hussars, accidentally drowned at Oplader, Germany, while attempting to save his horse, on Dec. 15, 1918, aged 22 years. Youngest son of Mr. and Mrs. A. J. Thomas, 7 Westbourne-terrace, St. Paul's, Cheltenham. He had seen two years' service in France. He was a St. Paul's Church chorister.



SERGT. H. T. DARTNALL, R.A.M.C., died at Valenciennes on Dec. 19 from accidental injuries, aged 27 years. Second son of Mr. and Mrs. Dartnall, Winstonian-road, Cheltenham.



SERGT. A. W. (BERT) STEPHENS, 10th Gloucester Regiment, killed in action on Oct. 23, 1918. He had seen four years' service in France. Youngest son of Mr. H. Stephens, Hayden Hill, near Cheltenham.



CPL. WM. HENRY THOS. FOWLER, A.C. Corps (formerly 1/5th Gloucesters), awarded the M.M. on Nov. 10 for gallant service. He had also been awarded the Croix de Guerre. He had served since Aug., 1914, and was wounded severely in Dec., 1917. Youngest son of P.C. W. Fowler, Southwood House, Cheltenham.



PTE. F. W. BUTLER, 14th Royal Warwick Regiment, wounded and missing since Sept. 27, now reported killed in action in France, after four years' service. Husband of Mrs. R. Butler, Fairview, and youngest son of Mr. and Mrs. G. Butler, Oriol House, Bath-road, Cheltenham.



SAPPER A. E. NEWCOMBE, R.E., died at Priory Hospital, Cheltenham, on Dec. 24, 1918, from malarial fever. He served four years with the Salonika Forces, and took part in the evacuation of Suvla Bay in 1915. He was employed at the Gloucester Dairy before joining the Army.



PTE. A. TAYLOR, Royal Warwick Regiment, killed in action on Oct. 24, 1918, aged 19 years. Son of Mr. and Mrs. G. Taylor, of Alderton. He was formerly employed by Mr. Mead, of Dumbleton.



PTE. FRED J. TARRY, Died from pneumonia in Bulgaria on Dec. 14, 1918. He volunteered and joined up on the same date in 1914. Husband of Mrs. A. J. Tarry, Shipton Oliffe, Andoversford, whom he had not seen for two years and four months.



PTE. R. W. ROBERTS, Field Amb., R.A.M.C., who has been awarded a Certificate for gallant conduct and devotion to duty with the 5th Division from 18th to 30th Sept., 1918. Son of Mrs. Roberts, 1 Weethley-cottages, Bafford, Charlton Kings.

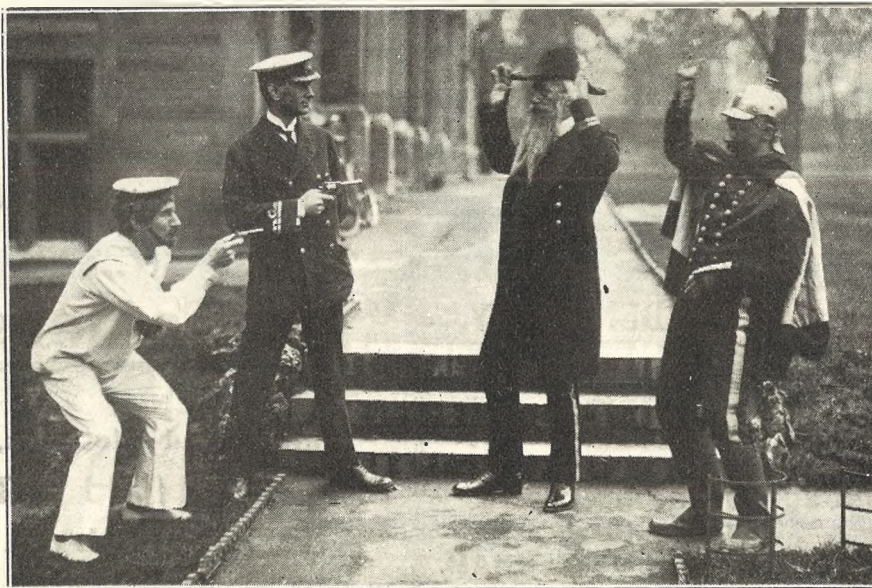

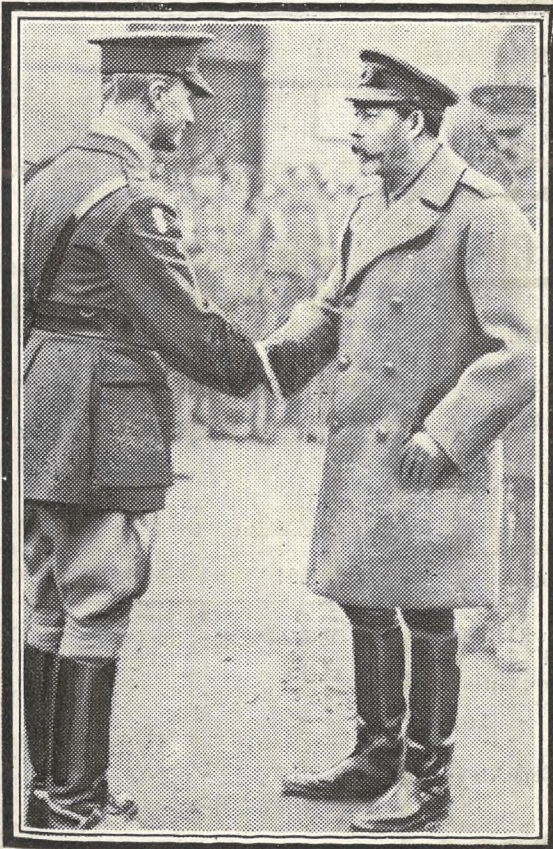

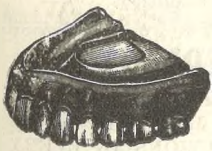


**A PROPOSED WAR MEMORIAL FOR CHELTENHAM.**
