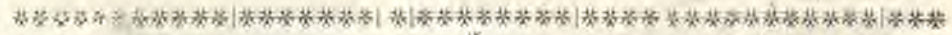

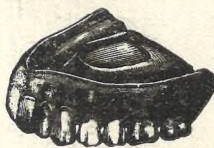

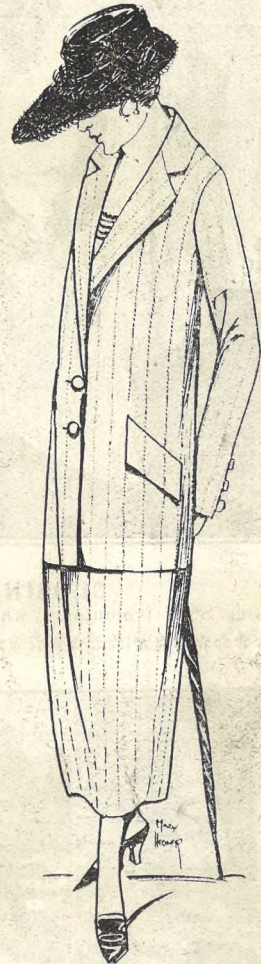

RETURNED PRISONERS-OF-WAR PILGRIMAGE TO MRS. SHAW'S GRAVE.

A number of Cheltenham and district returned prisoners of war from Germany, Turkey, and Austria met together on Wednesday, January 29th, and marched in column to Cheltenham Cemetery, where they deposited a number of wreaths on the grave of the late Mrs. Elphinstone Shaw. Mrs. Shaw, it will be remembered, was the lady who instituted the sending of parcels of food to all Cheltenham and district prisoners of war, and she kept up the organisation and work until the day of her death.

- 1.—The head of procession arriving at grave. The scene was very wintery with snow on the ground.
- 2.—Each man saluted the grave as he passed at the conclusion of the ceremony.
- 3.—The cross over grave, with laurel wreath and other floral tributes.
- 4.—Chaplain Wilcox (a Turkish ex-prisoner of war) speaking to his comrades at the graveside.

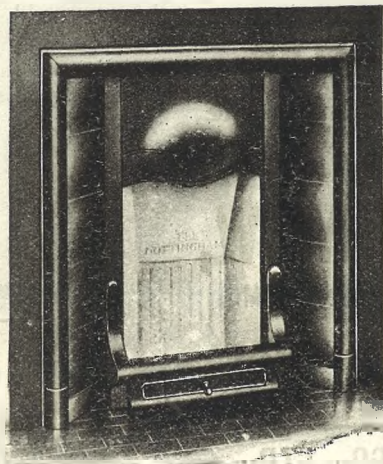

his gun to the last in the great German
push in March, 1918. Only son and sole

buried at Gloucester Cemetery.

M.G. Corps, died of wounds in France on
November 12, 1918, aged 22 years. He was

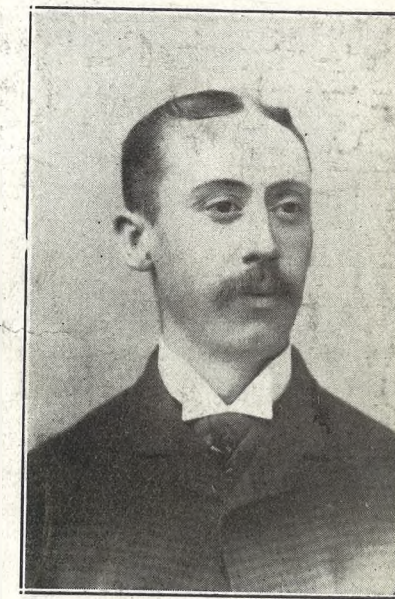

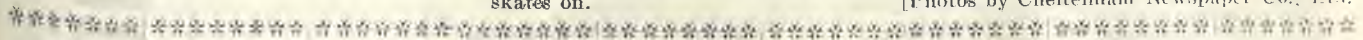

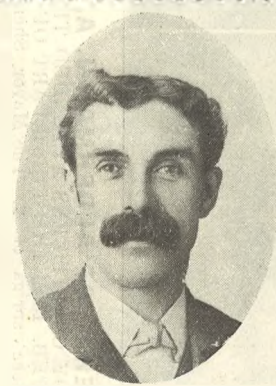

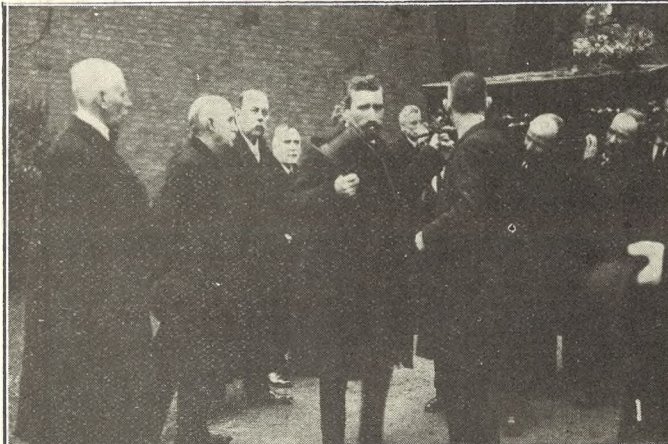
