The work is being carried out by Messrs. R. L. Boulton and Sons, the well-known sculptors, Bath-road, Cheltenham.

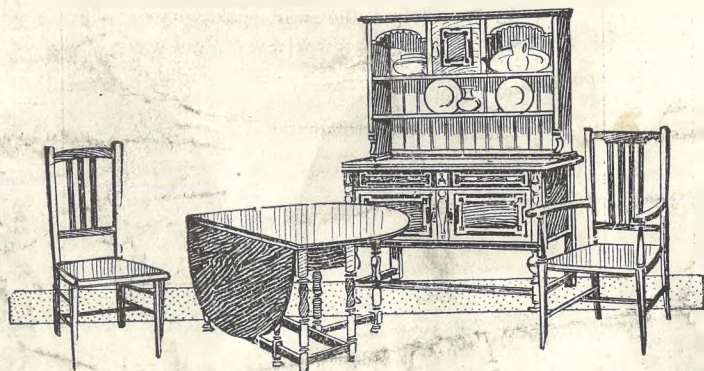

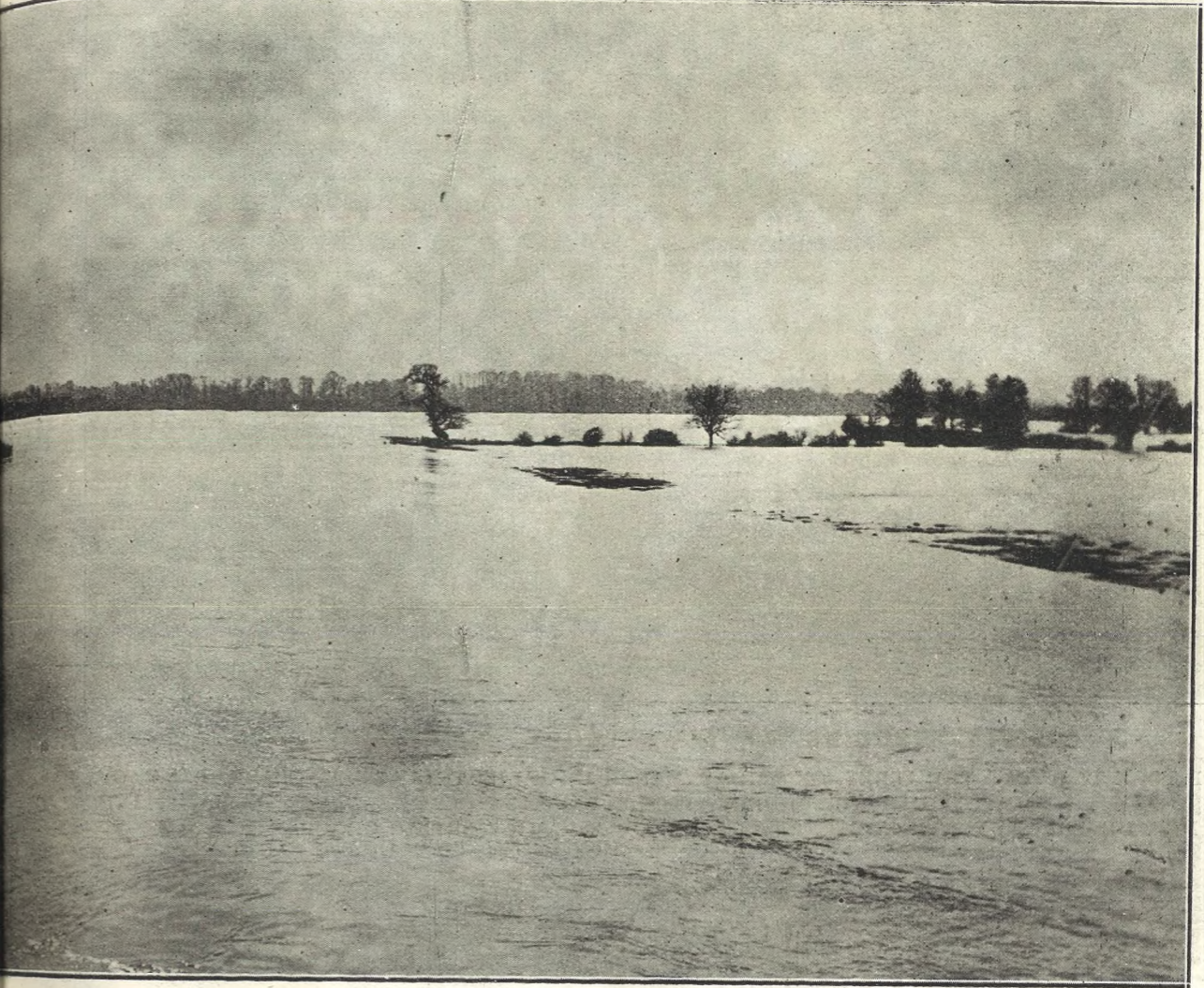

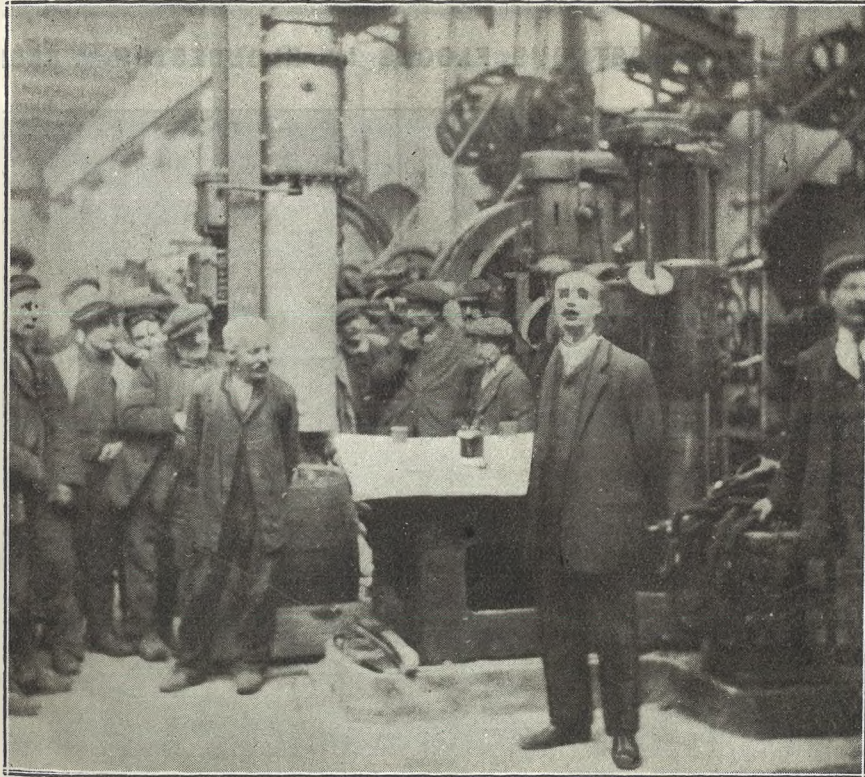

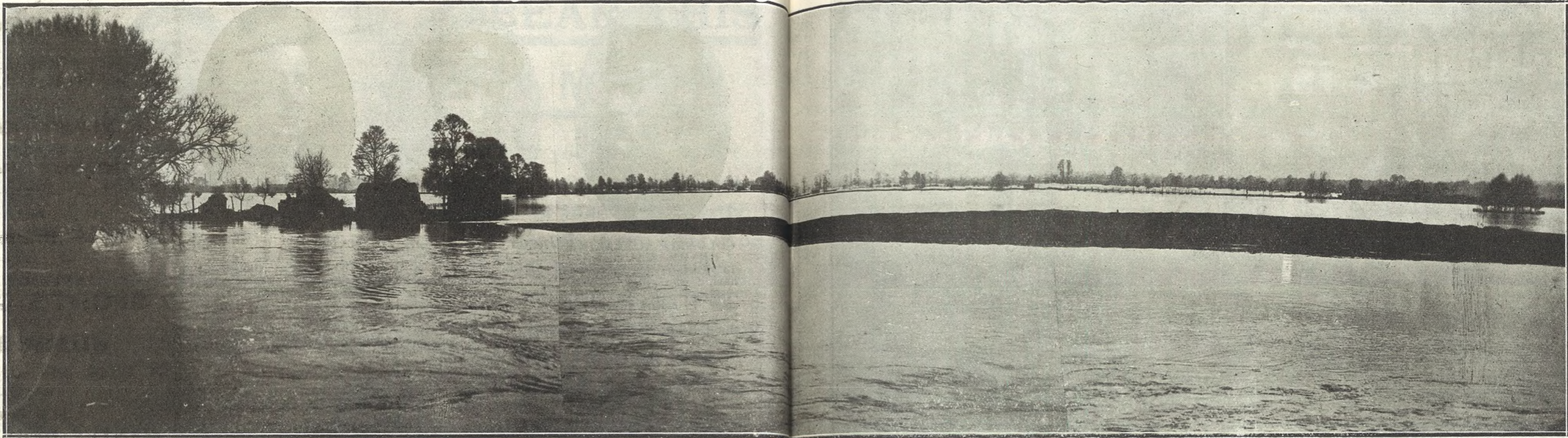

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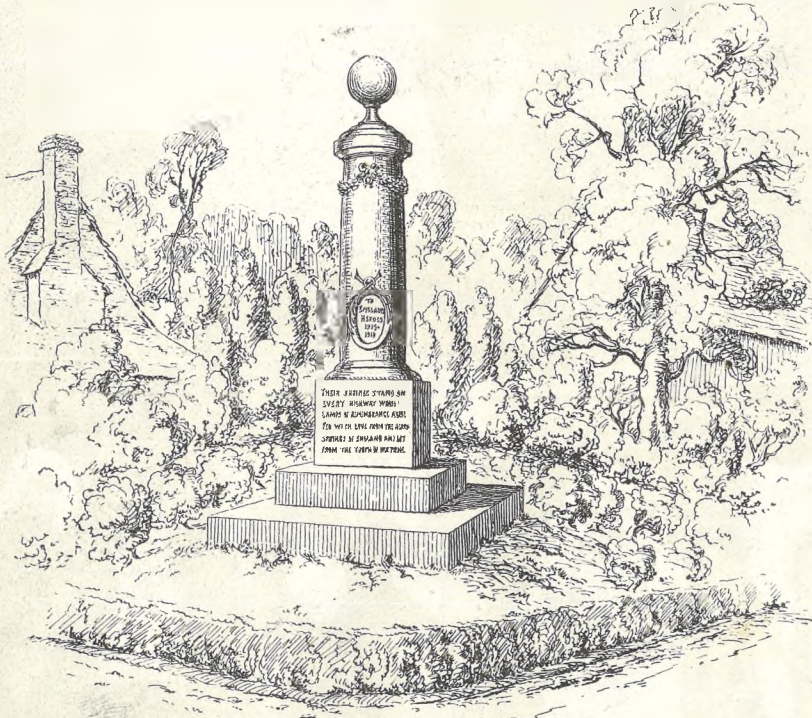
