SOUVENIR FOR THE PRINCE.

REMARKABLE SHIELD MADE BY WELSH R.E.

A remarkable shield has been made by the 38th (Welsh) Divisional Signal Company of the Royal Engineers. It is made from wood used in tridging the Ancre, Selle, Sambre, and Canal du Nord by the Divisional Royal Engineers. On it are mounted 52 German shoulder-straps, each representing a regiment defeated by this division between August 22 and November 11, 1918.

The places where the principal battles were fought are marked on the scroll; there are 28 "honours," the list including River Ancre, Lesbœufs, Ginchy, Delville Wood, High Wood, Mametz Wood, Pozieres. Morval, Manancourt, and Malincourt.




