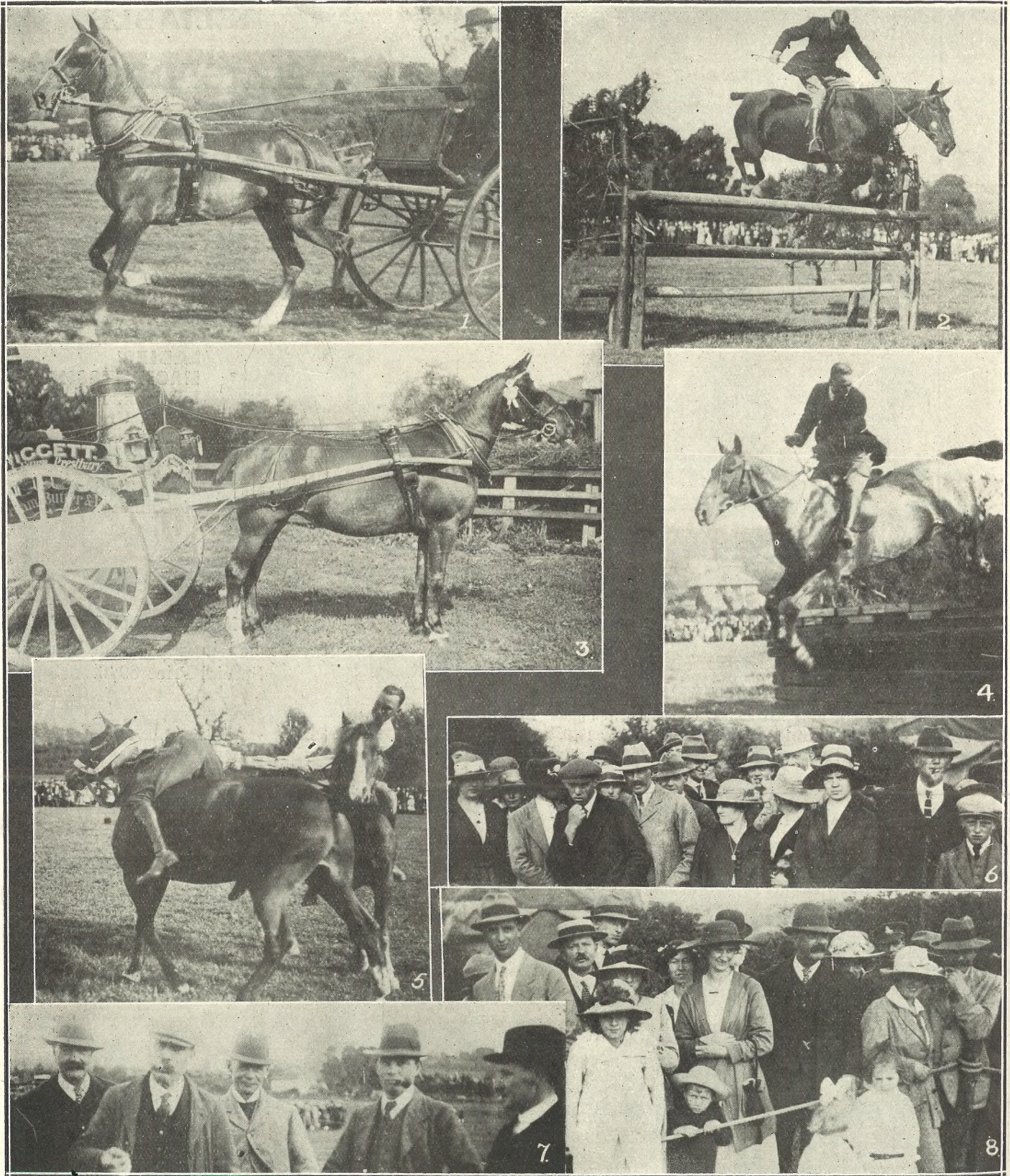

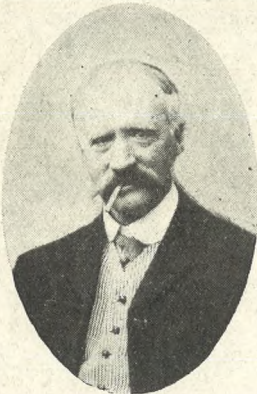

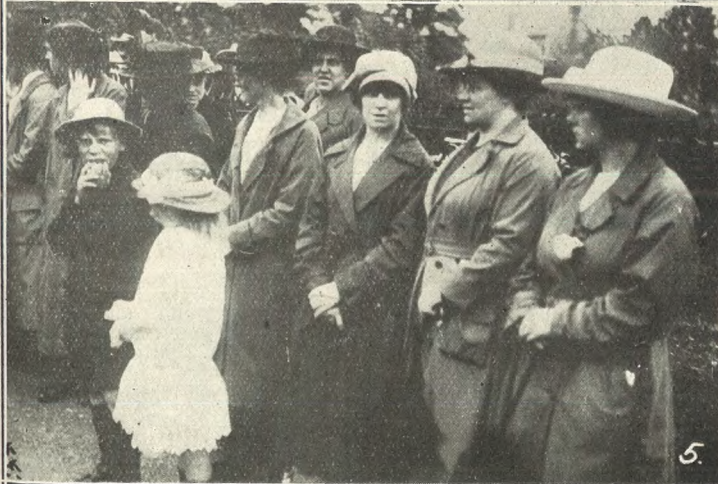

**NEW ONE-MILE TROTTING
"RECORD."**

Mr. Walter Winans performed a notable feat at the meeting at Parsloe Park, Barking, Essex, of the National Trotting Horse Association on Monday. He entered his horse Harmony to try to beat the one-mile wagon "record" of 2min. 52secs. for British-bred horses, which was held by his horse Discord, and succeeded in lowering it to 2min. 50 2-5sec.

Then Mr. Winans reduced Discord's "record" of 2min. 52sec. for one mile to speed wagon by covering the distance in 2min. 49sec., and finally won the world's two-mile "record" in 6min. 44sec. for driving a pair of trotters, with Harmony and Discord.

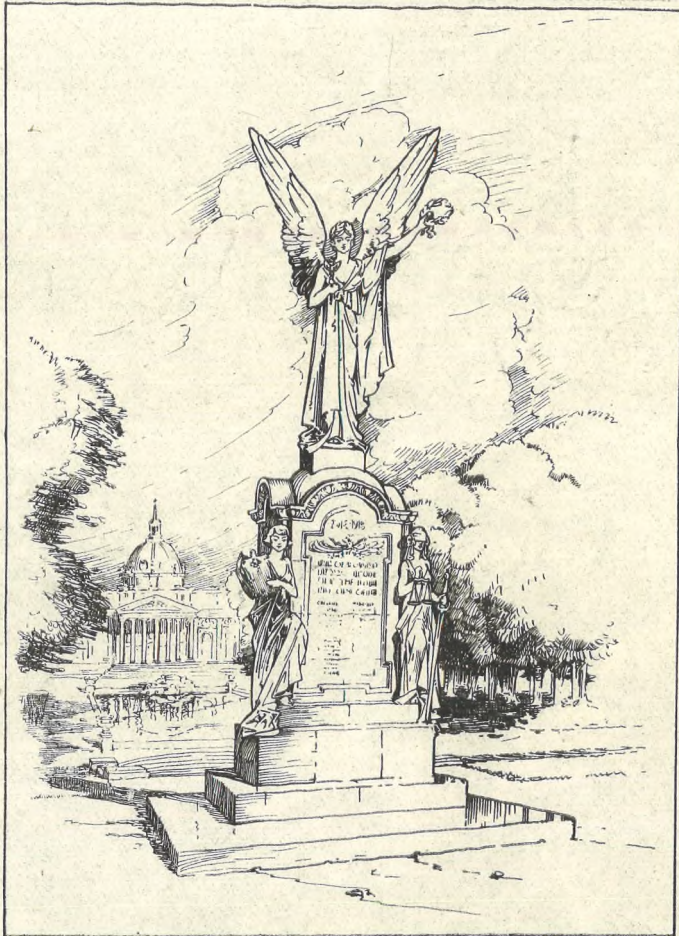

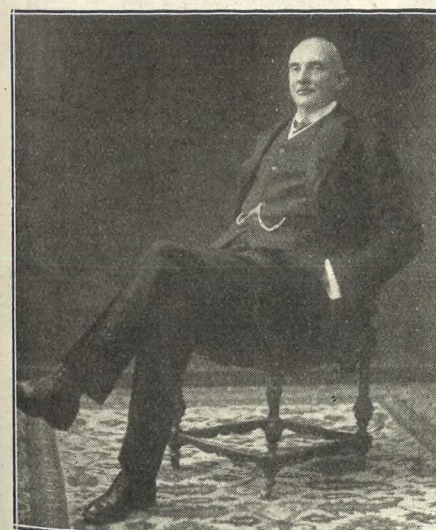

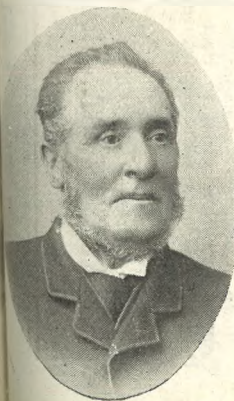

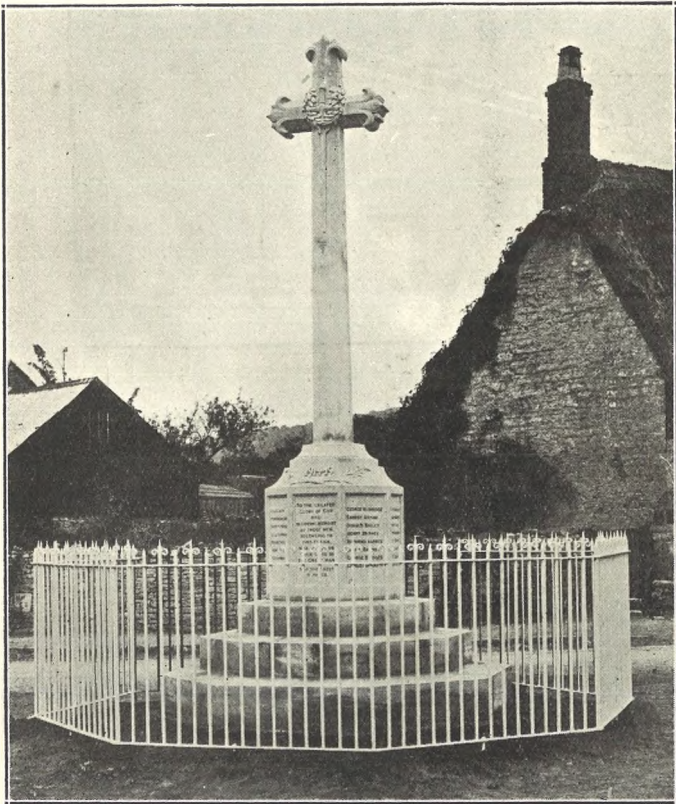

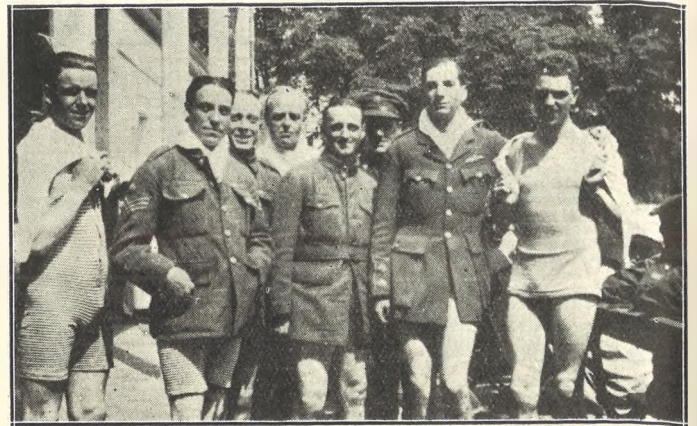

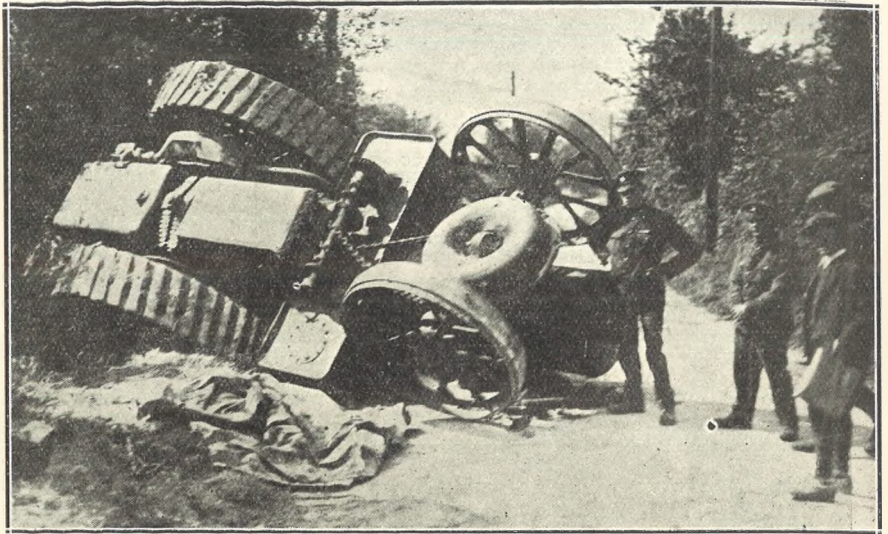

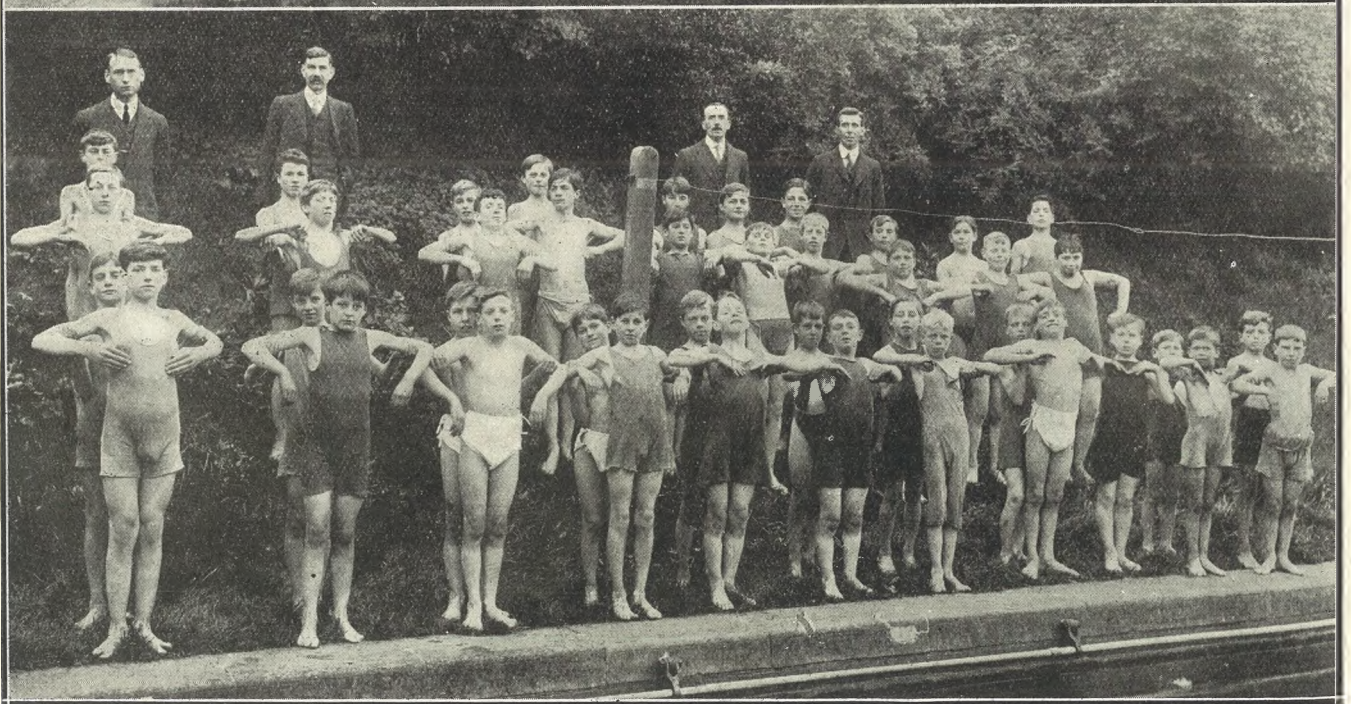

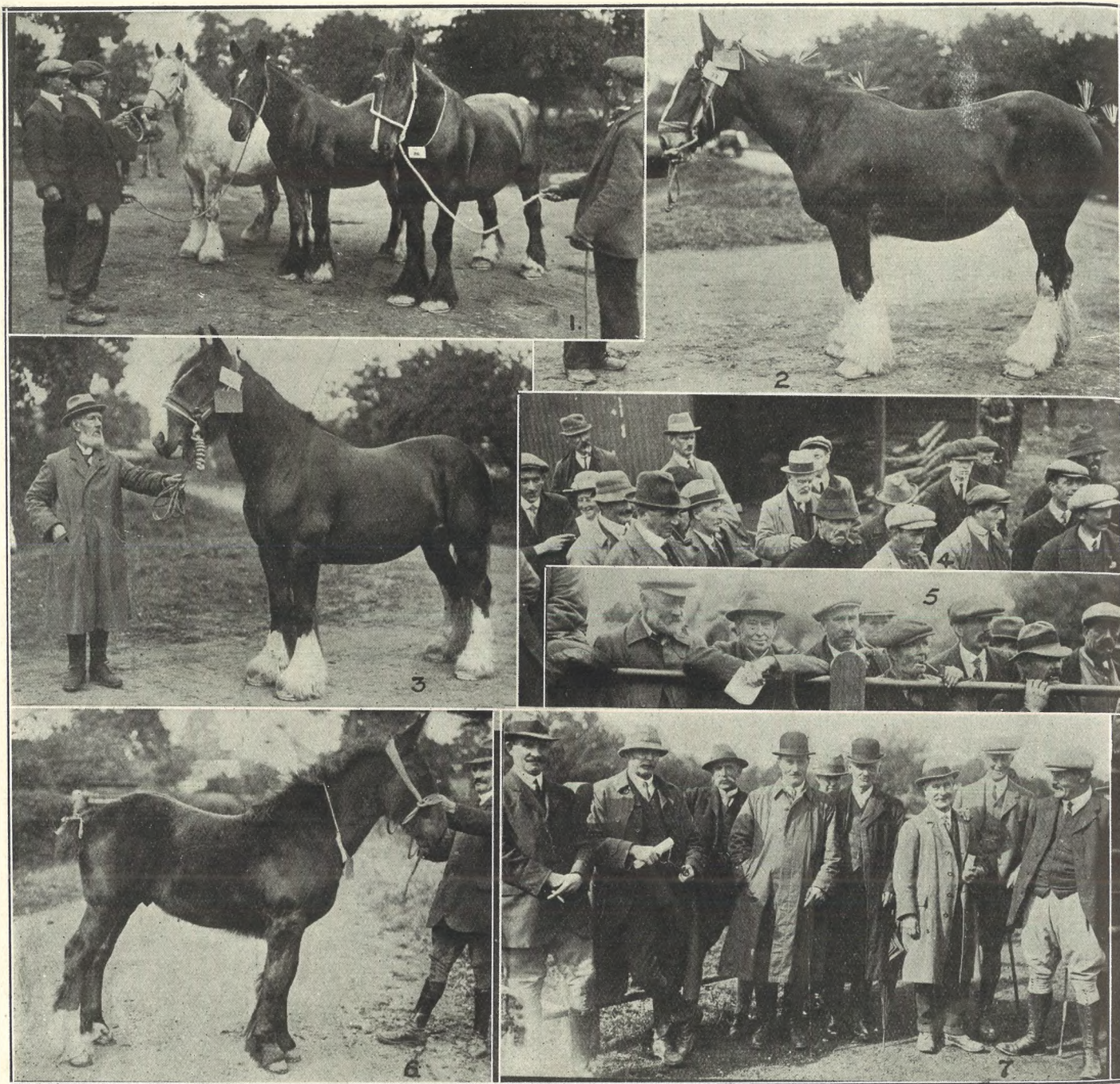
