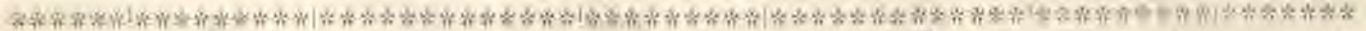

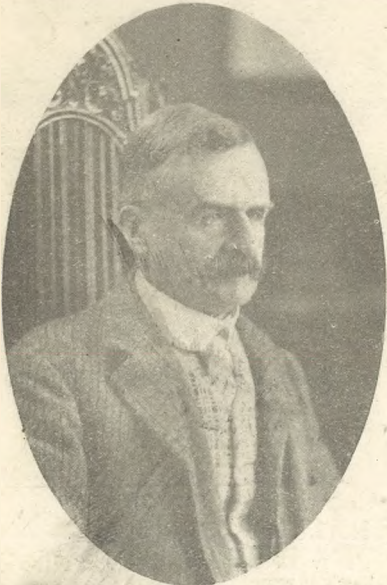

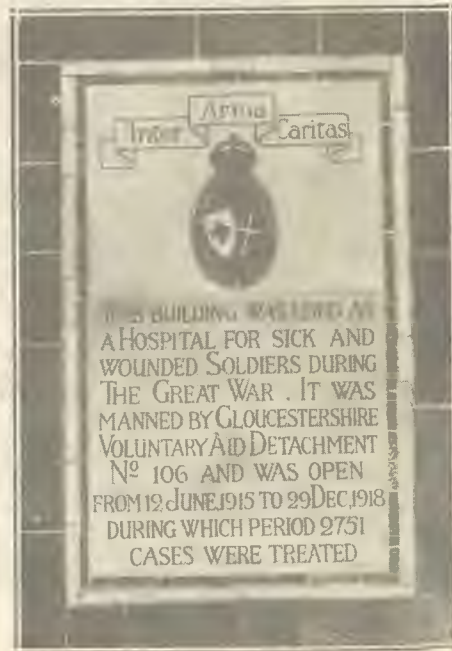
Mr. Geo. L. Foster Harter, J.P.,

The Committee have adopted the above design by Messrs. R. L. Boulton and Sons, Bath-road, Cheltenham, the well-known firm of sculptors, for the Town War Memorial. It will be erected in the band-stand space in front of the Municipal Offices, Promenade, and will be carried out in local stone, the cenotaph itself being in red Scottish granite, with the names of the local heroes incised on its four sides. A hidden light will illuminate the crown of gold. The cost is roughly estimated at £3,500.

CHELTENHAM V. GLOUCESTER FOOTBALL MATCH.

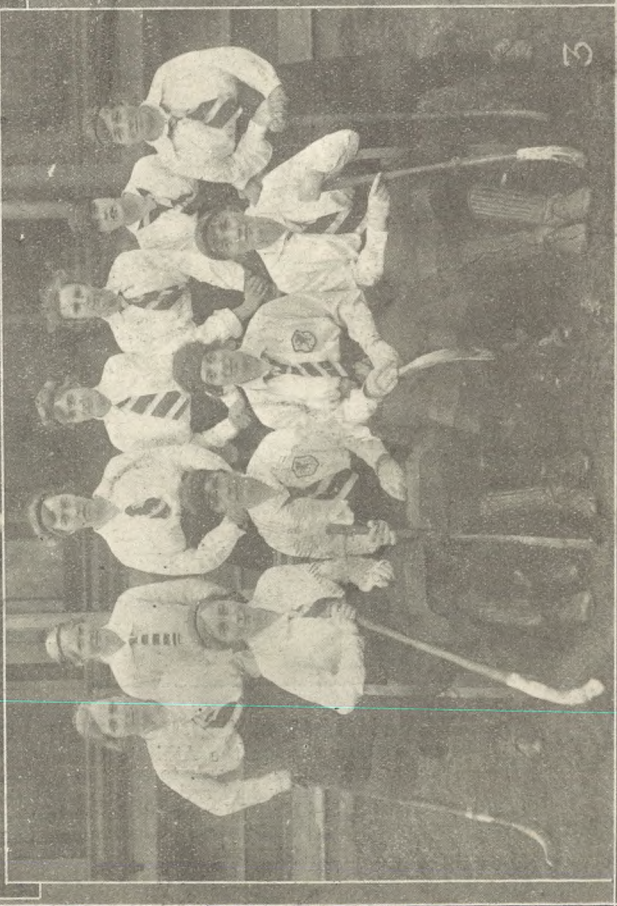
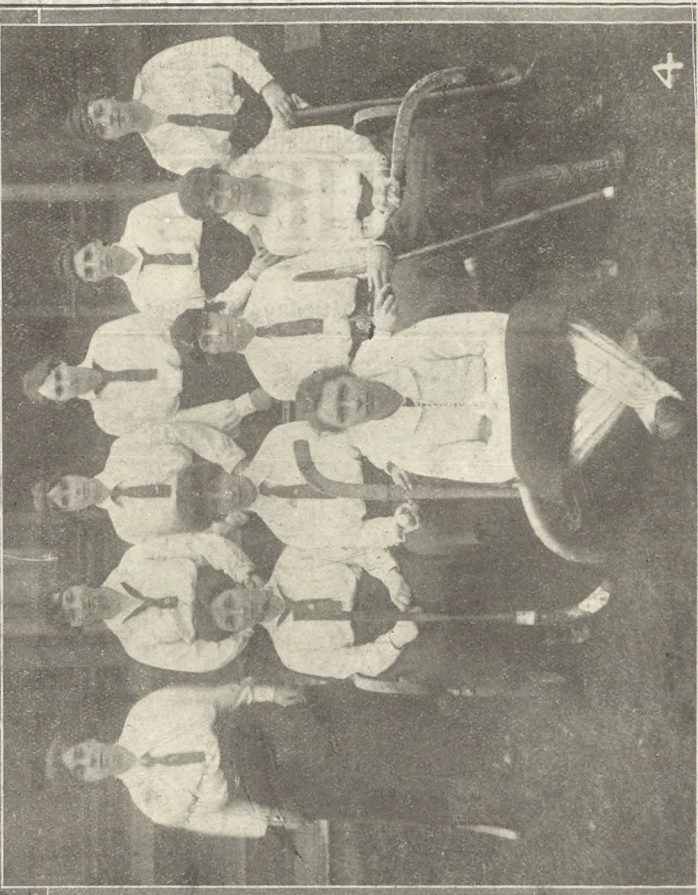

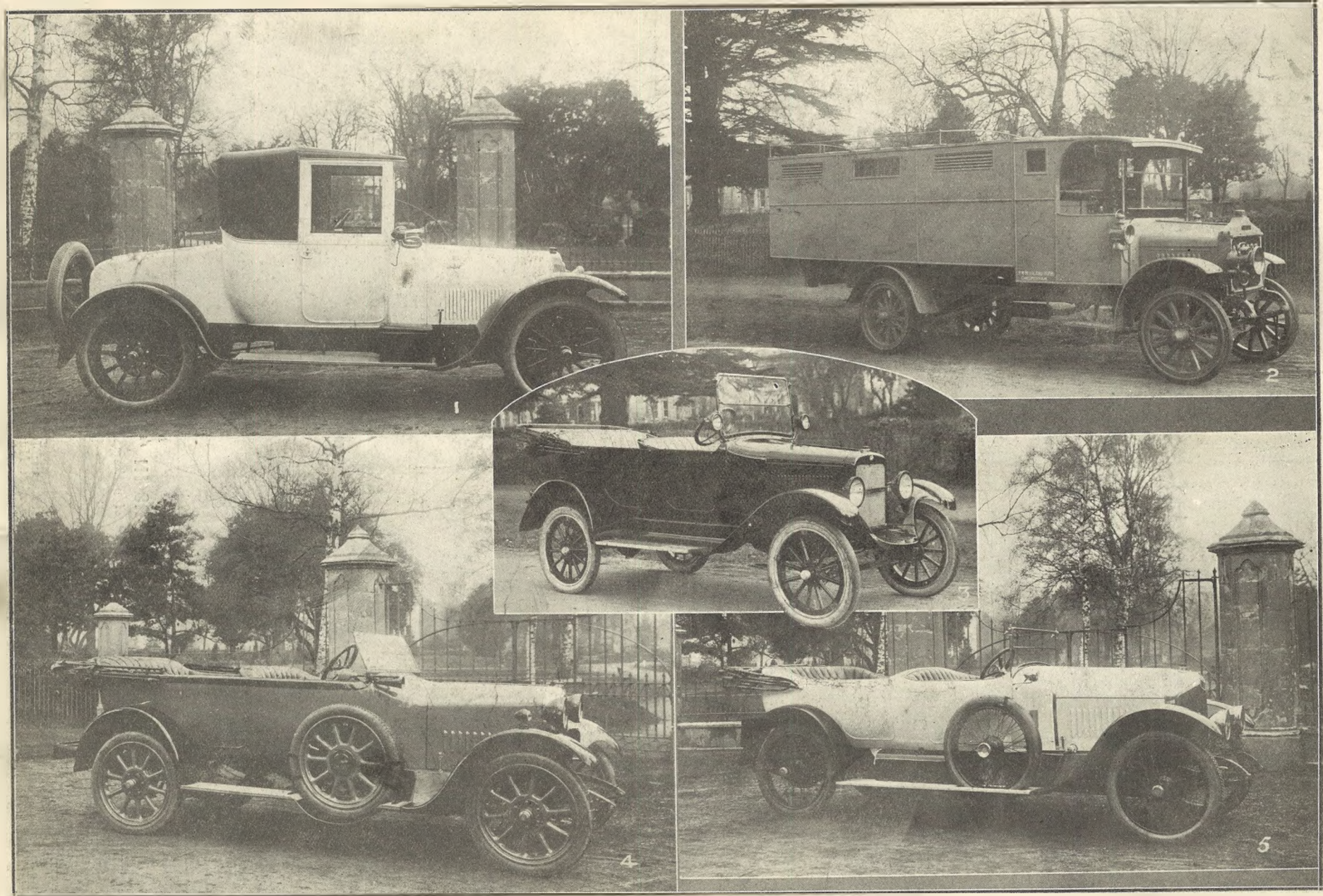

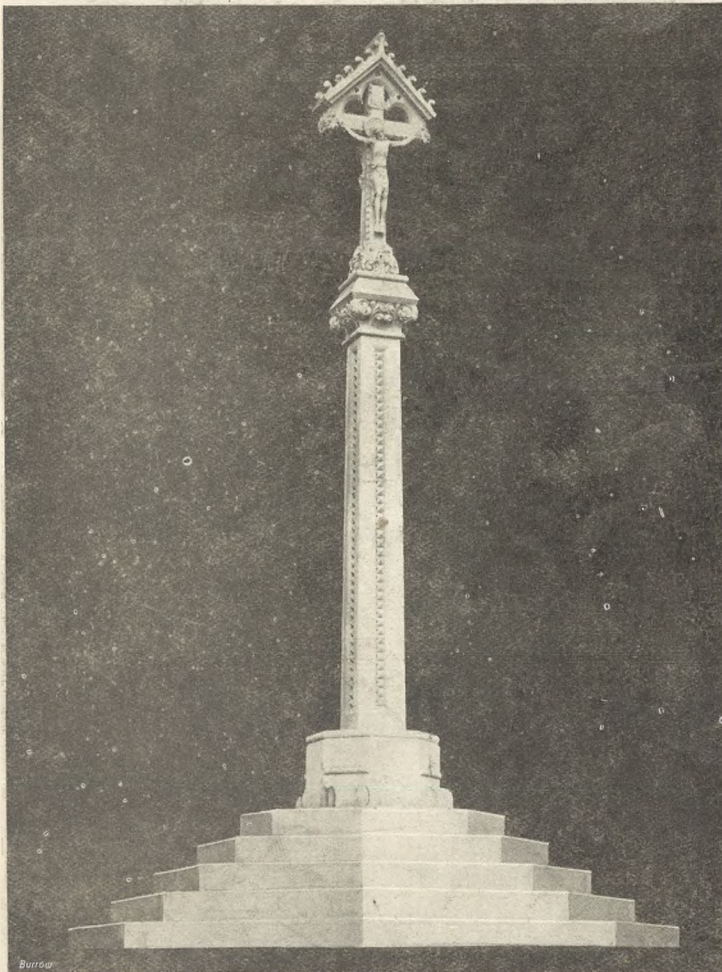

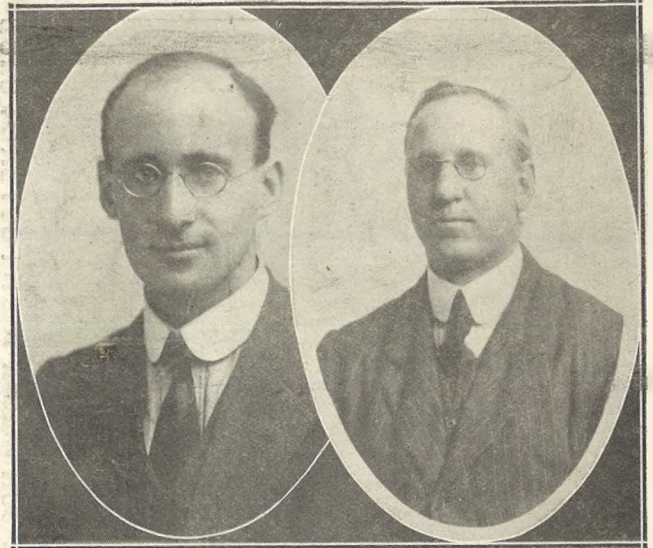

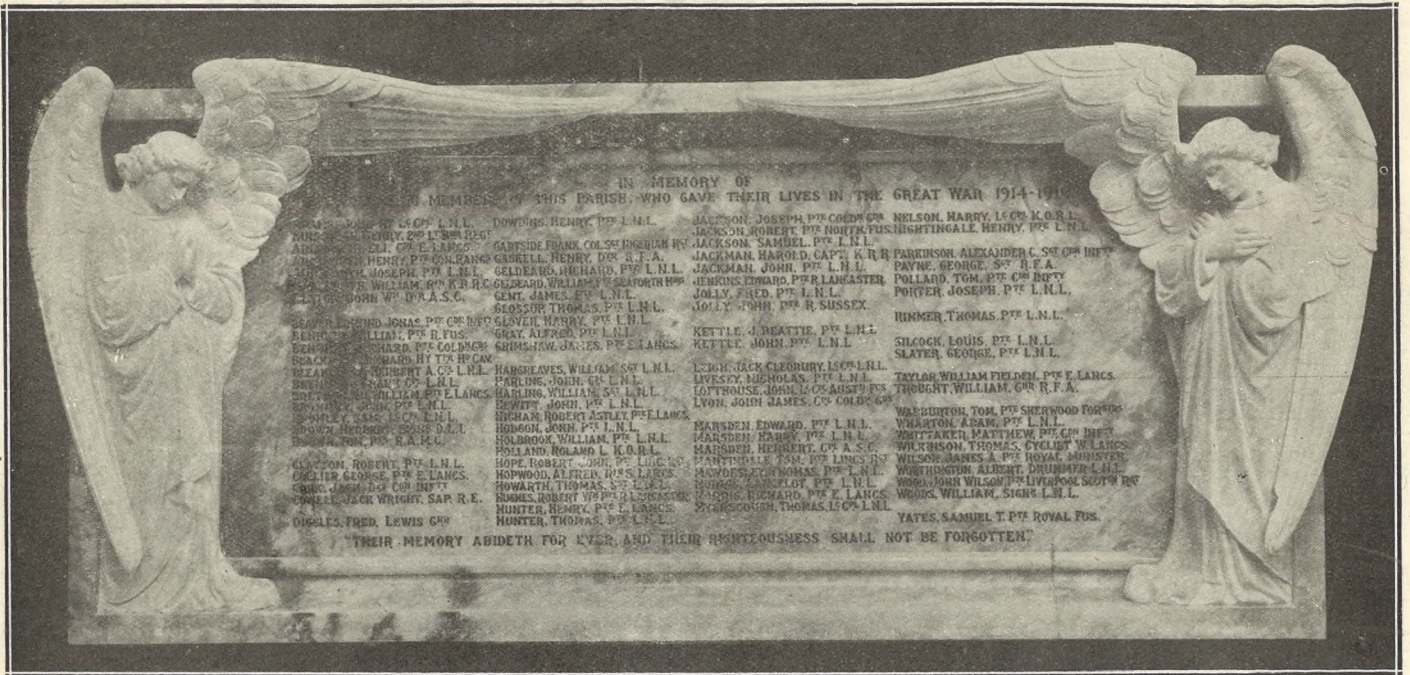

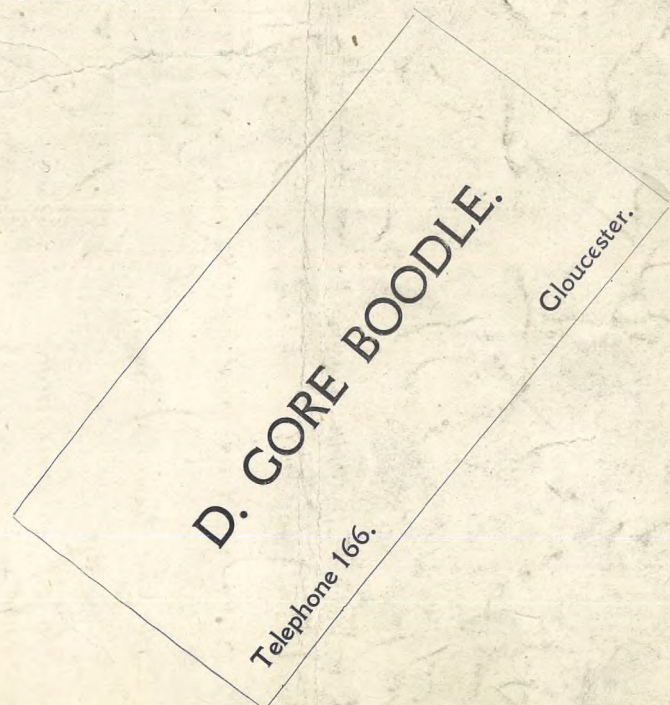

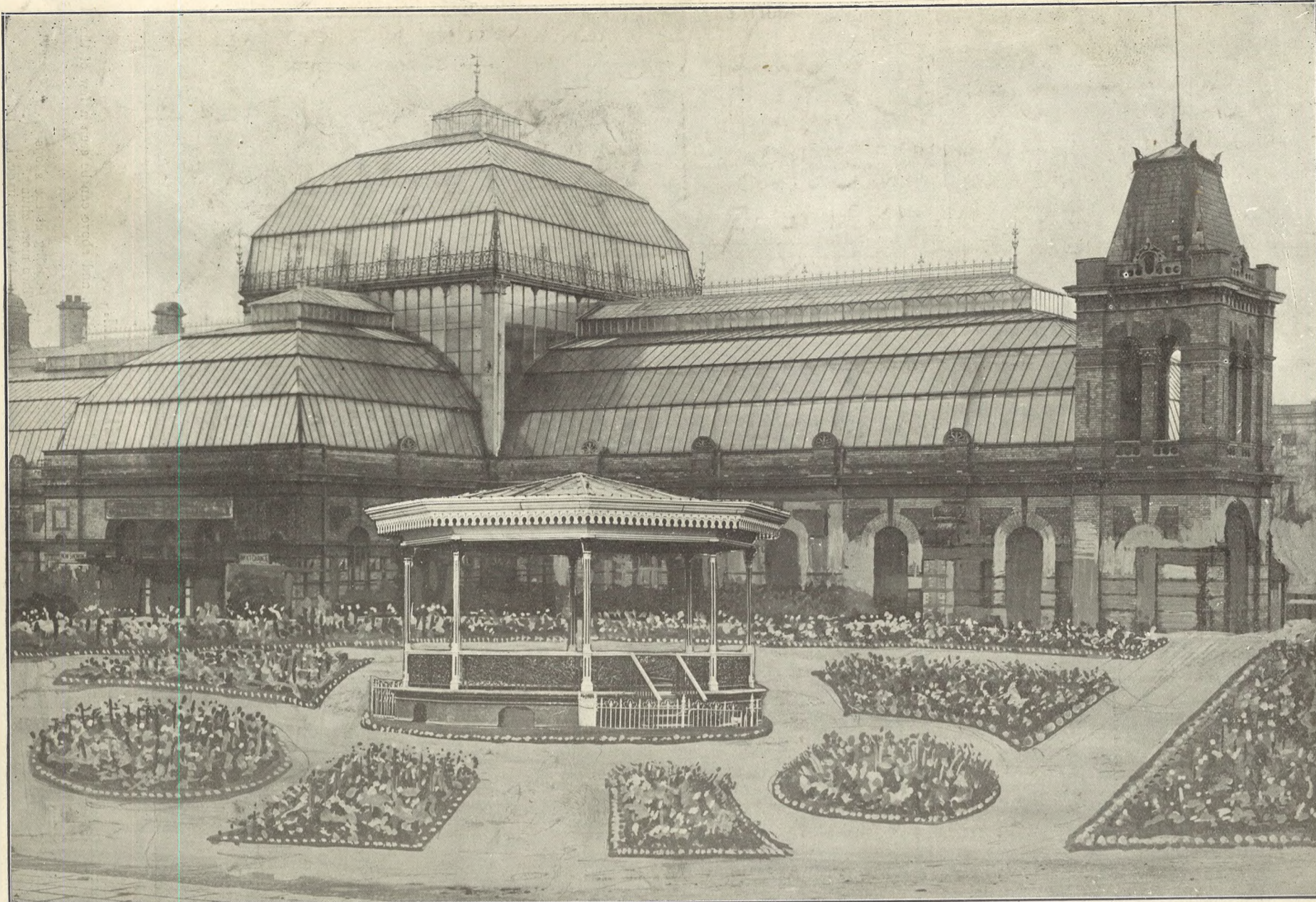

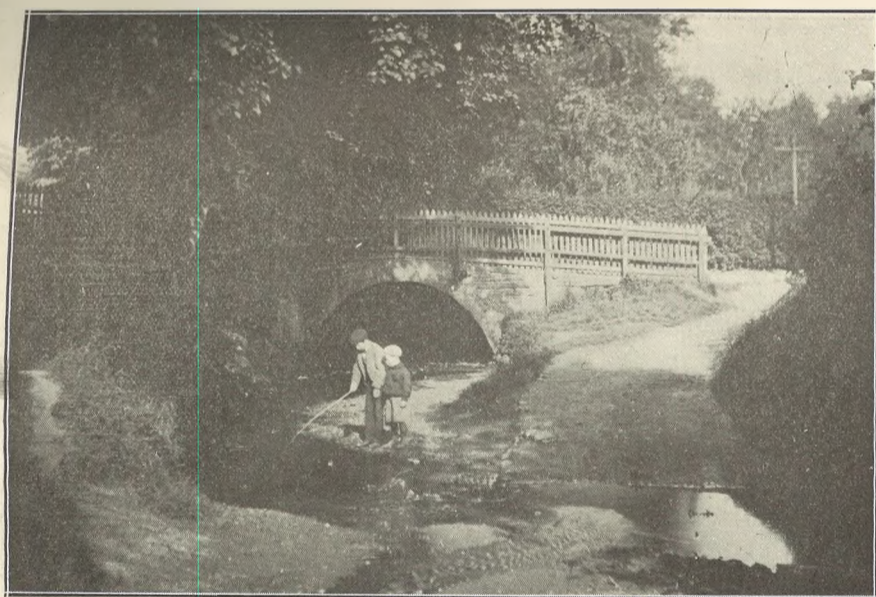

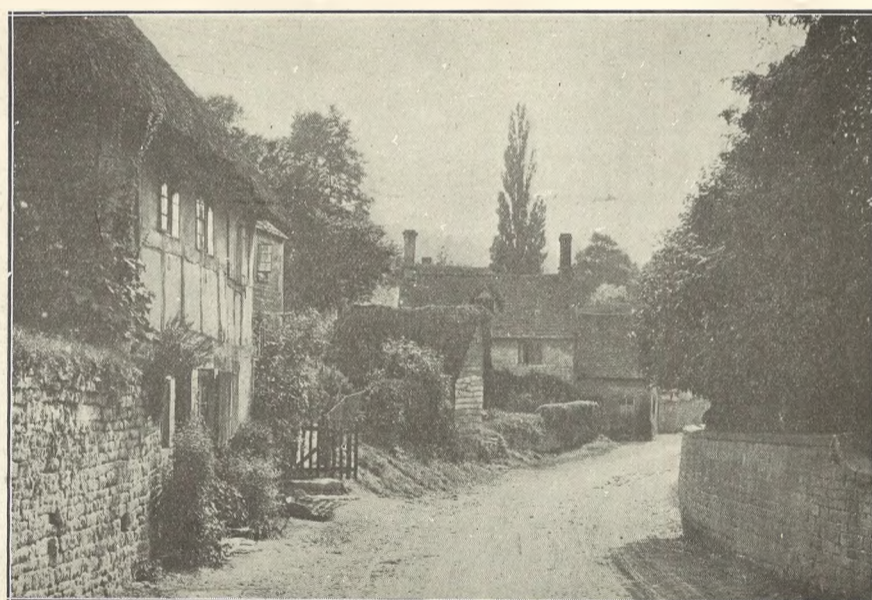
CHELTENHAM WINTER GARDEN WITH THE RAILINGS REMOVED.

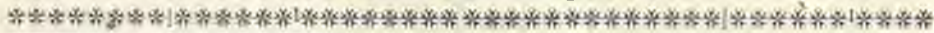
