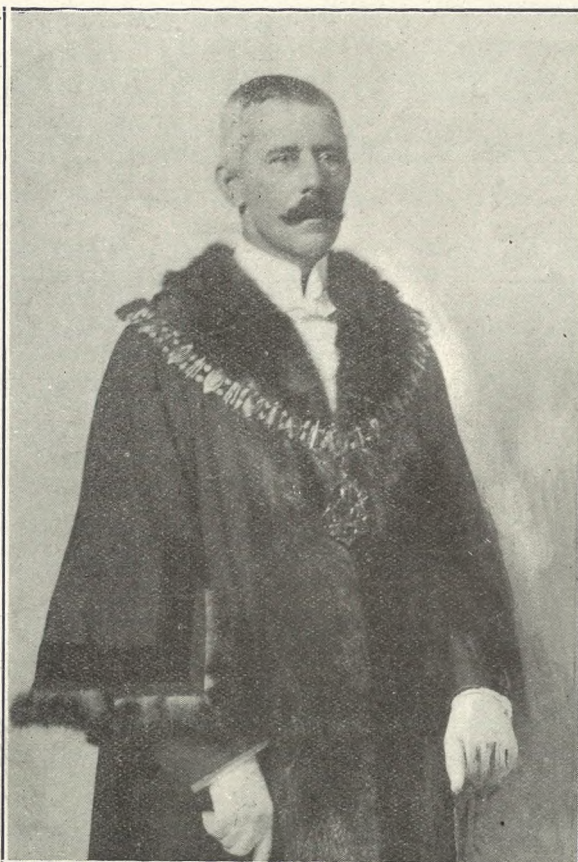

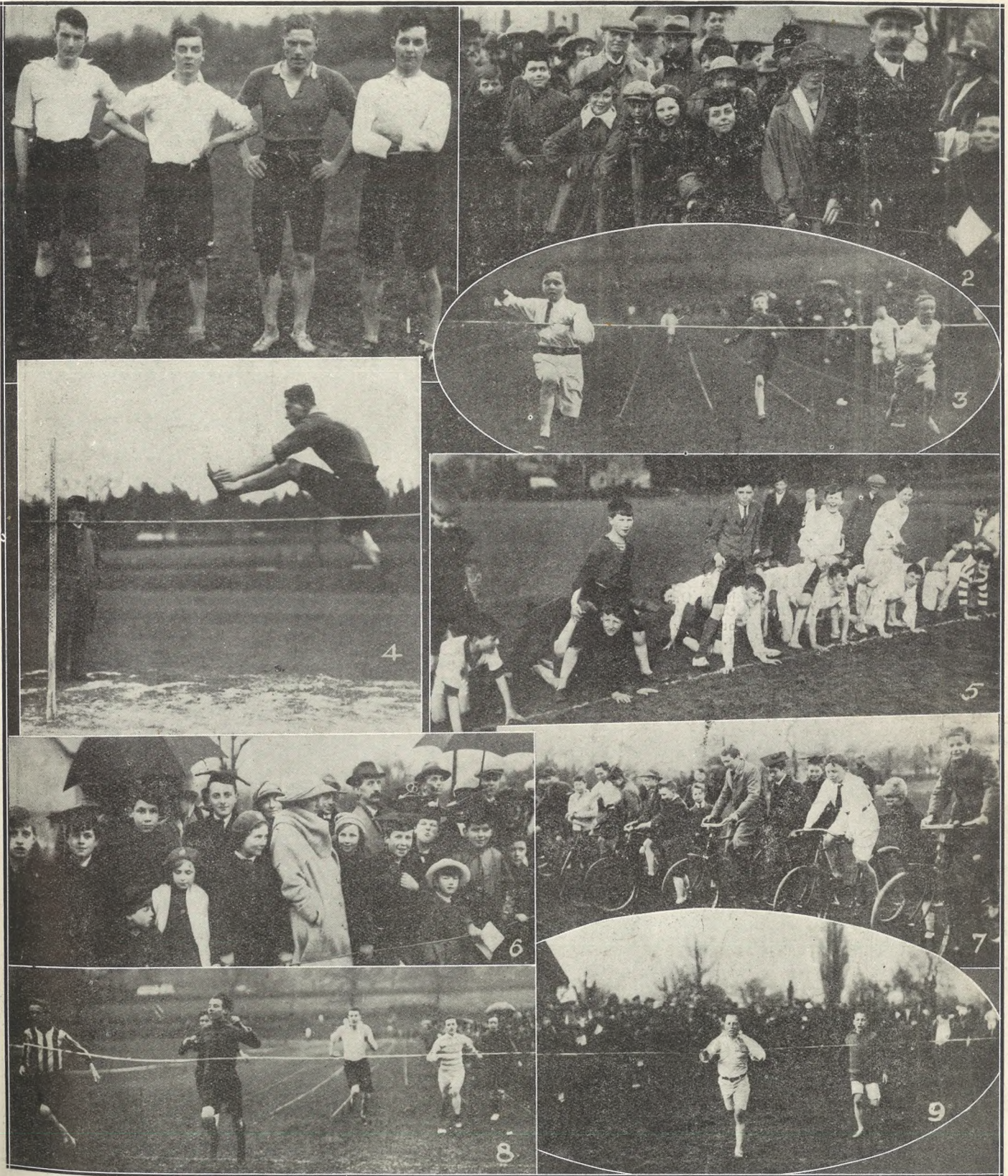
### COTSWOLD HUNT POINT-TO-POINT RACES.

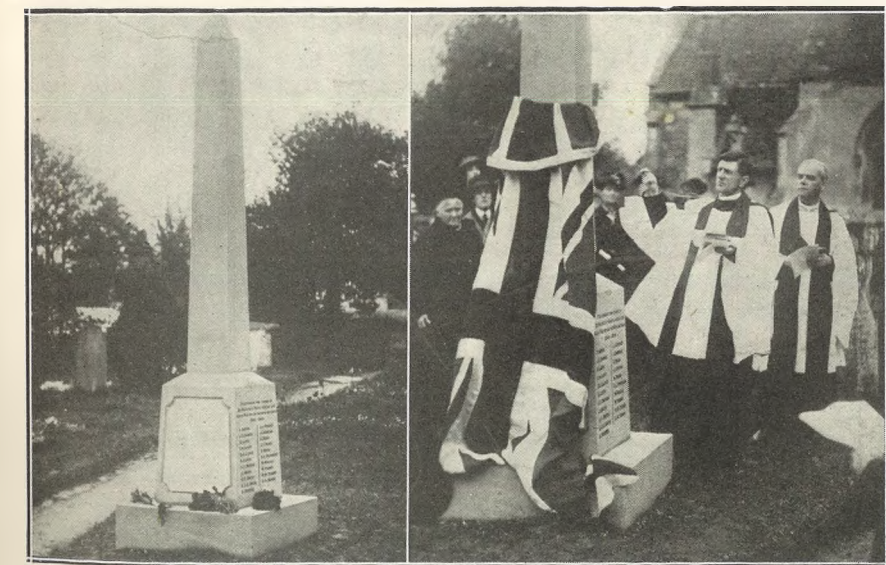

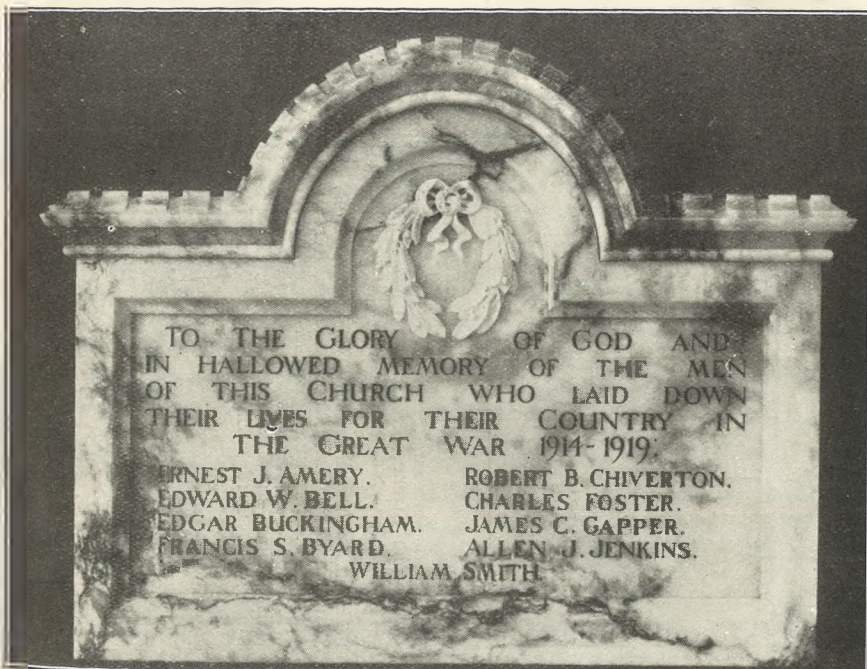

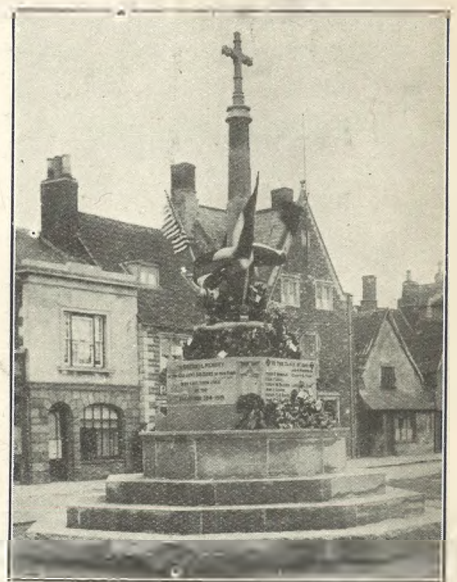
