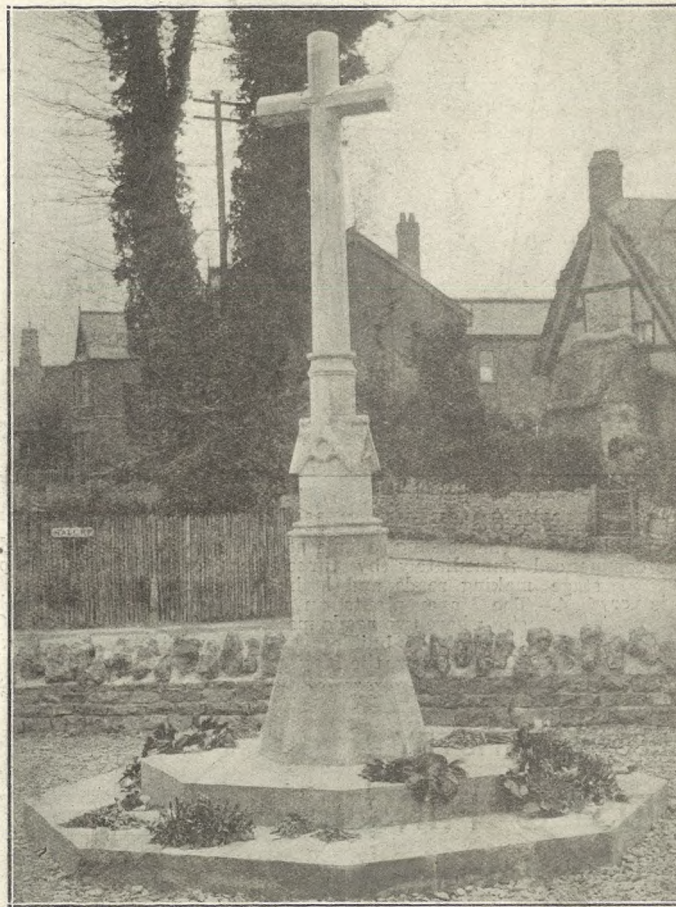

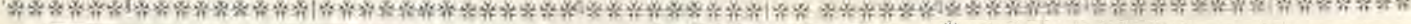
CHELTENHAM HOUSING SCHEME.—THE MAYOR CUTS THE FIRST SOD.

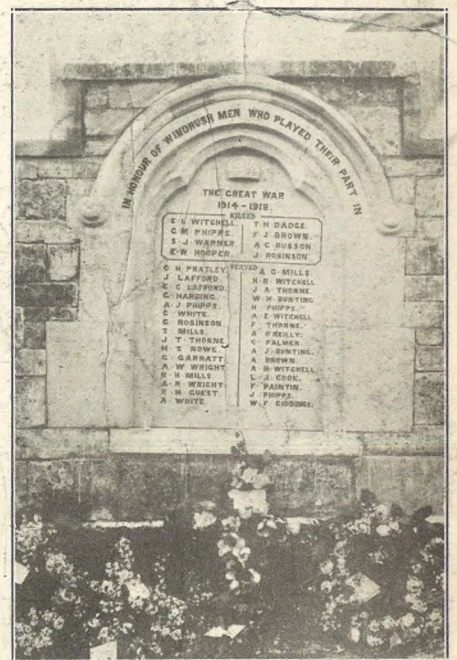

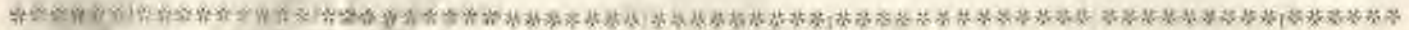

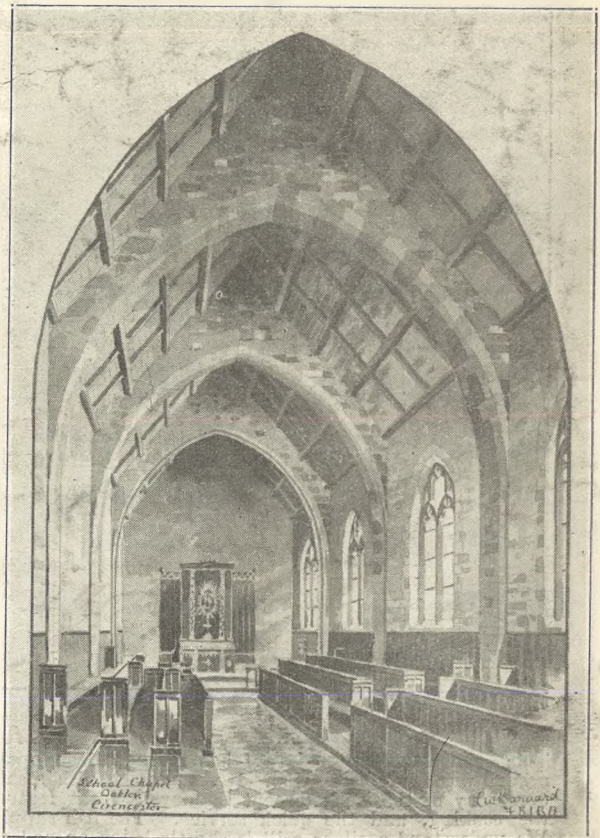

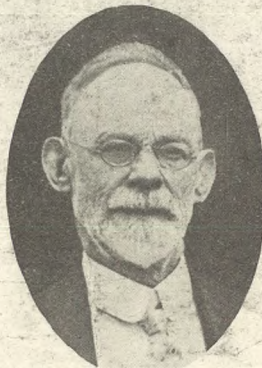

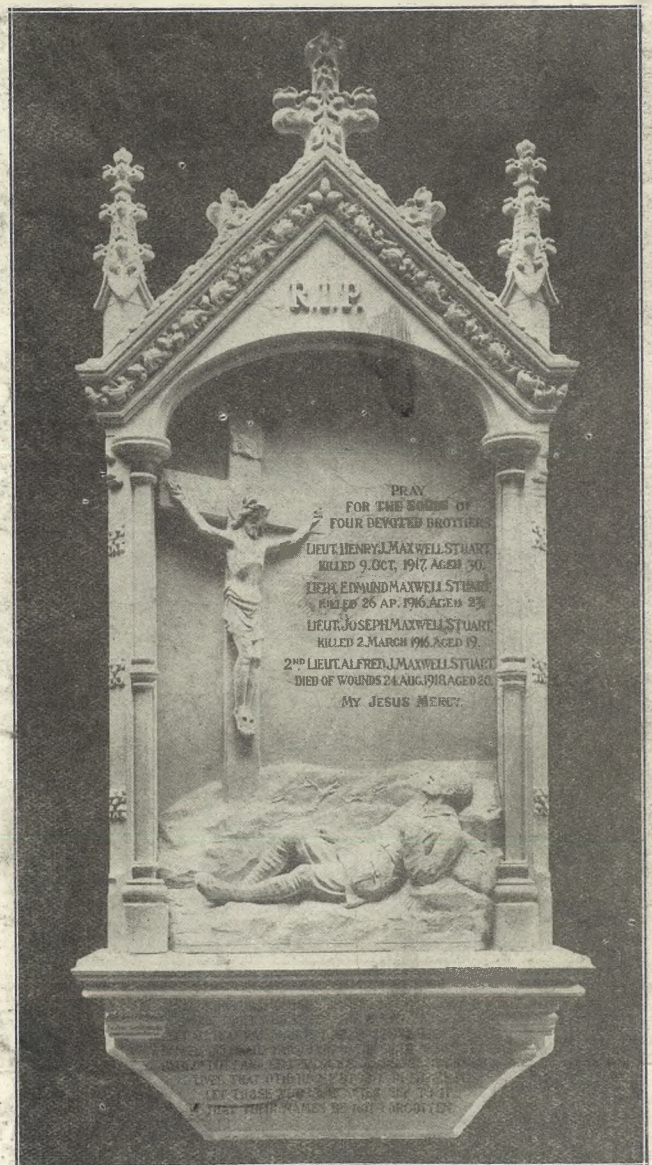

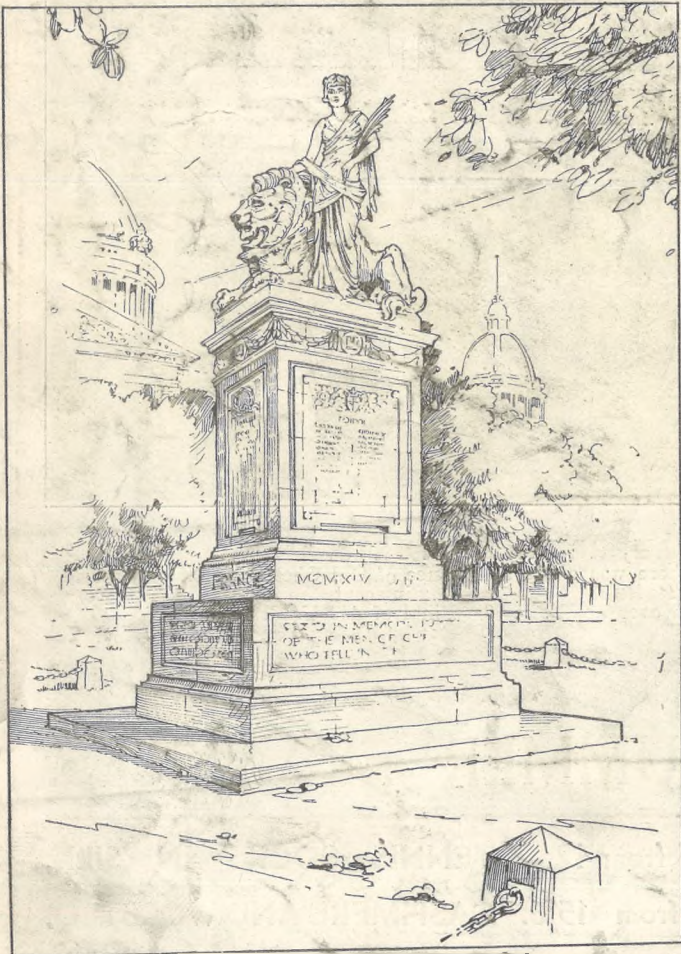


SUNNINGEND SPORTS AT THE CHELTENHAM ATHLETIC GROUND.
