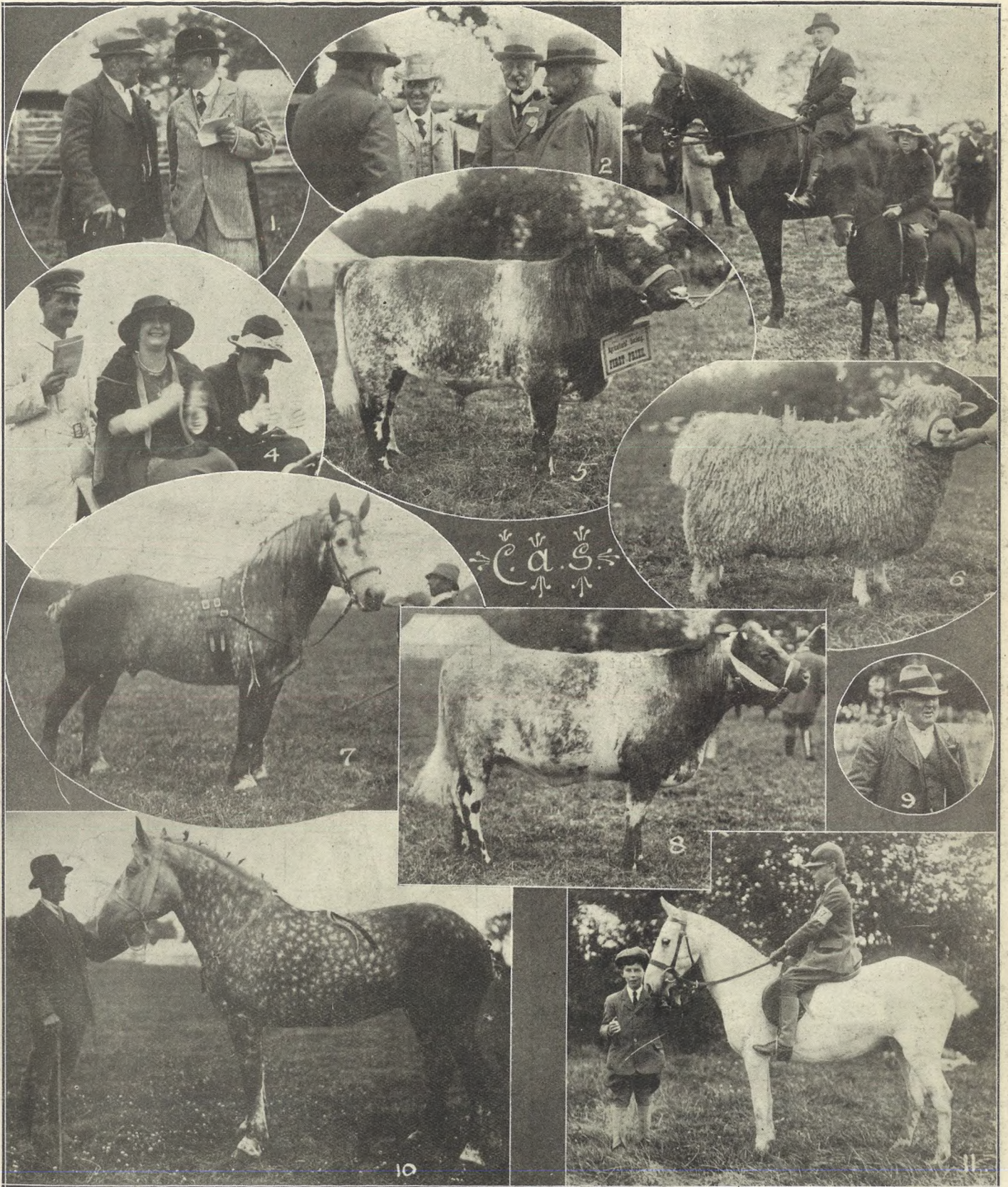


**GAS WORKS STRIKE IN CHELTENHAM.**

Last Saturday the workmen at the town Gas Works struck work suddenly, the men refusing to go in in the early morning. The townspeople were quite unaware a strike was impending, and with only about three hours' notice (given by the "Echo") thousands were suddenly deprived of their light and means of cooking. A meeting of the men was held on Saturday afternoon on their sports ground, at which a decision to keep the fires in until Monday was come to. The meeting we illustrate above. At the present time the end of the dispute (which simply concerns the payment of the national award, and which the Gas Company say they cannot afford to pay) seems as far off as ever.

1, 2, 5, and 6.—Groups of strikers at meeting. 3.—The Strike Committee. 4 and 7.—Not at all perturbed at being out of work.

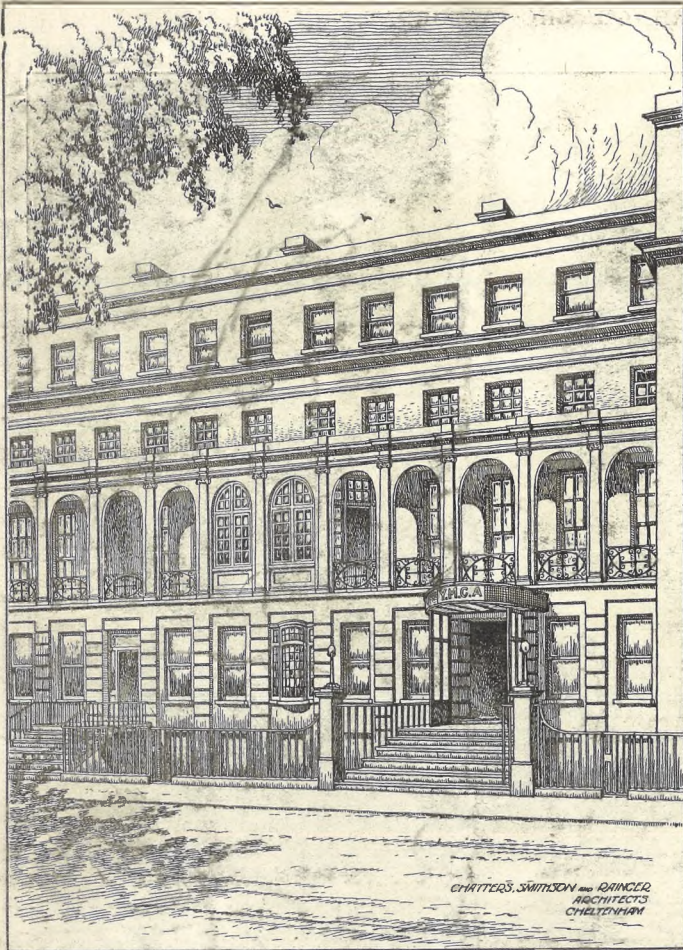

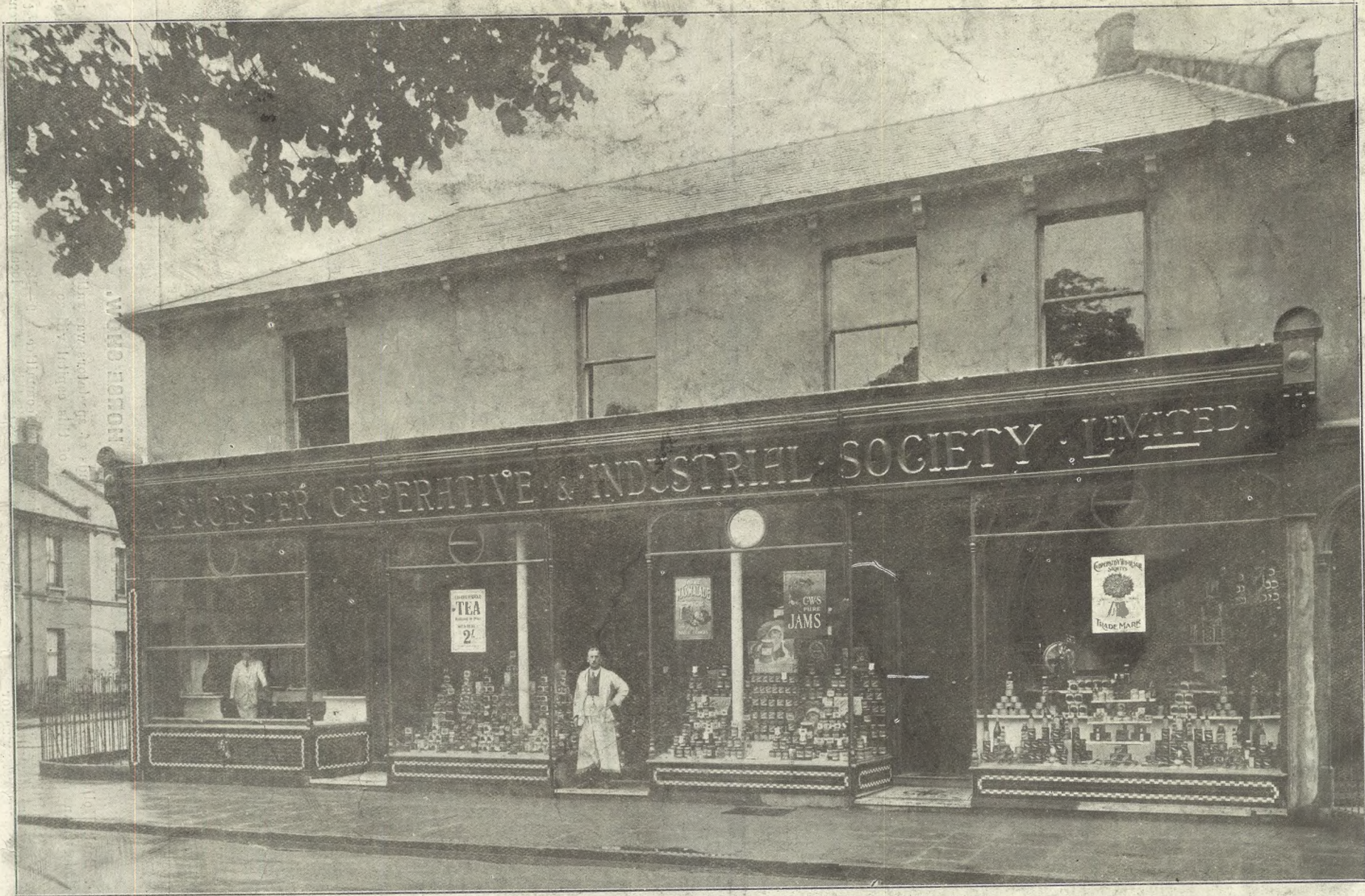

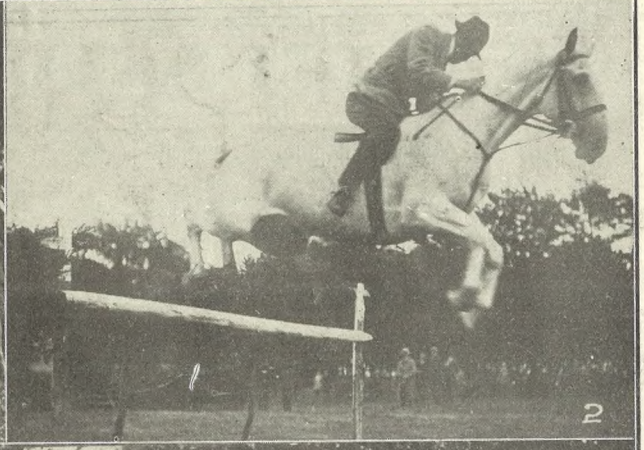

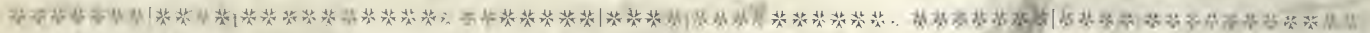

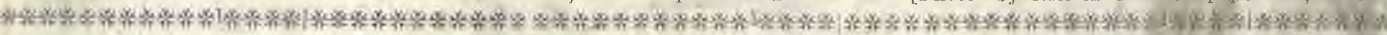
