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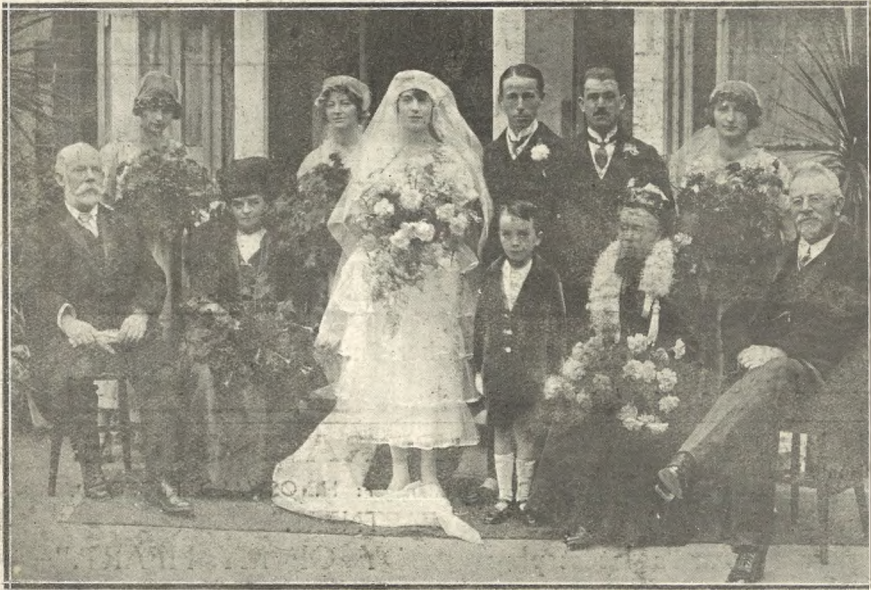
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INTERESTING CHELTENHAM WEDDING.

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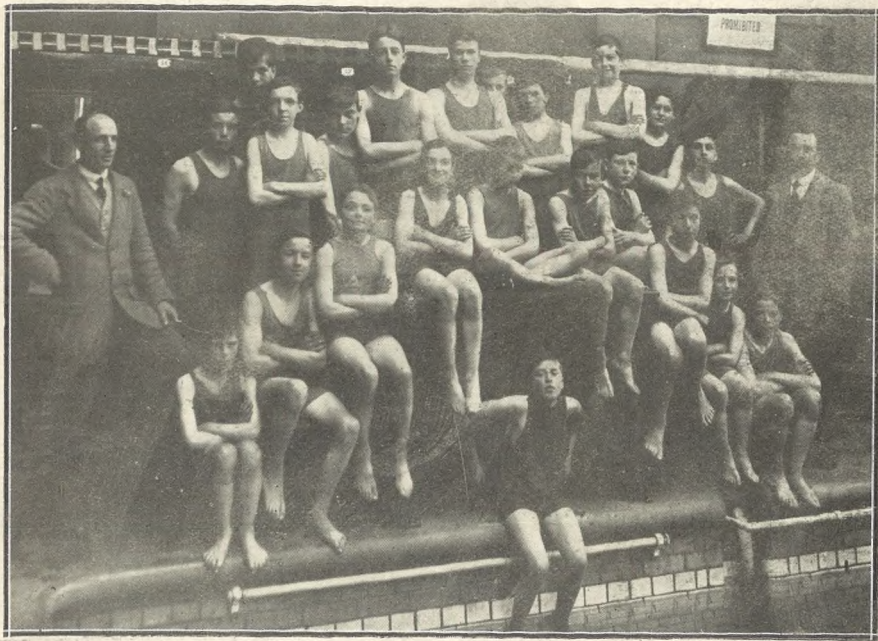

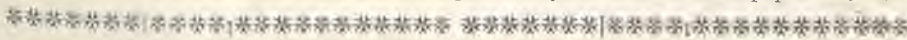

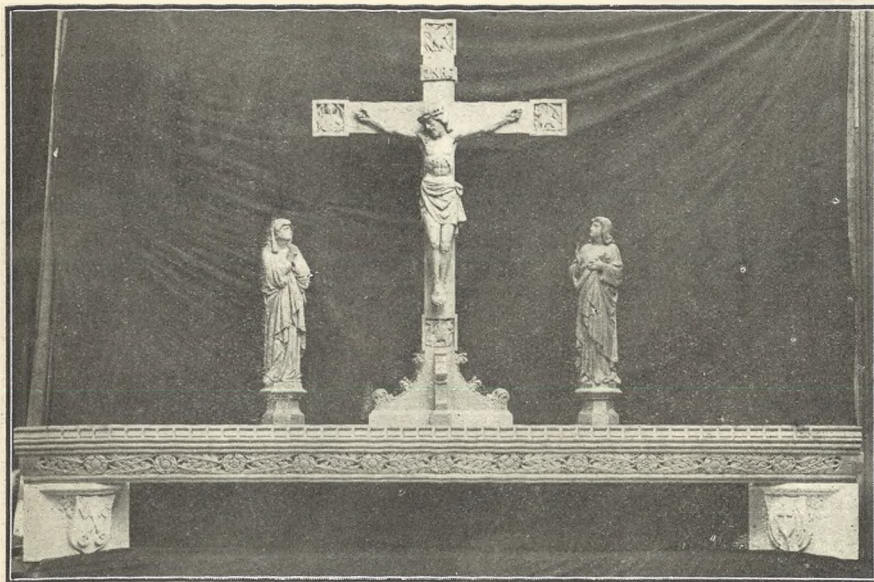

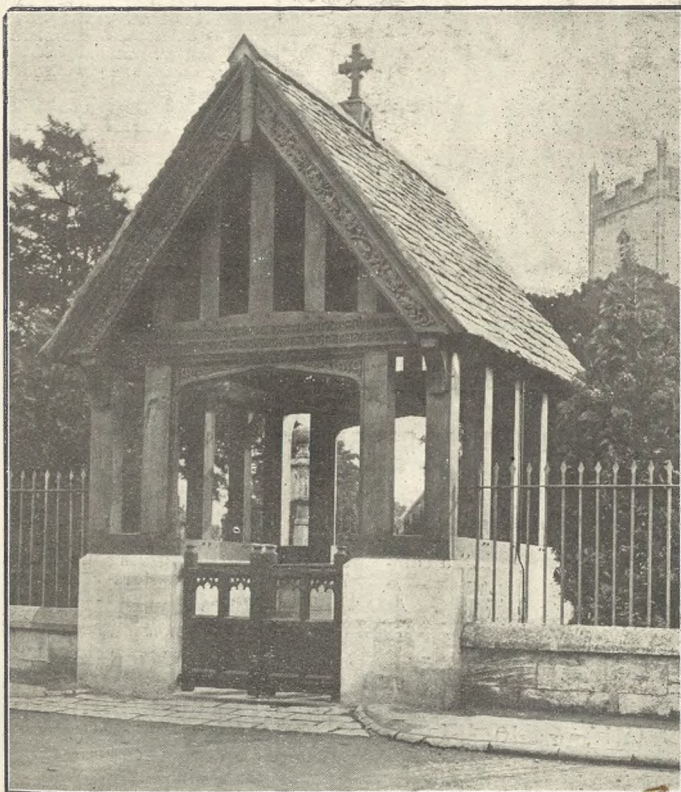
Mr. W. A. Bellamy,

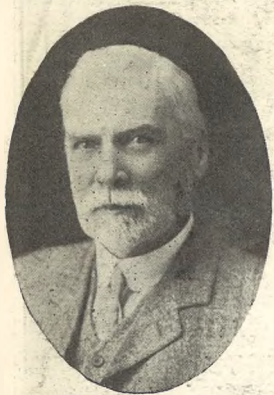

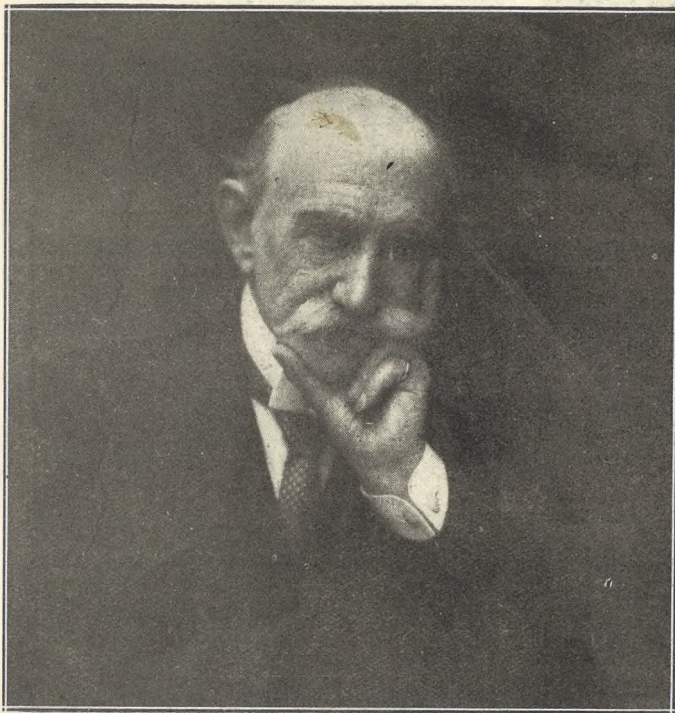


A BEAUTIFUL "BLACK AND WHITE" FARM.

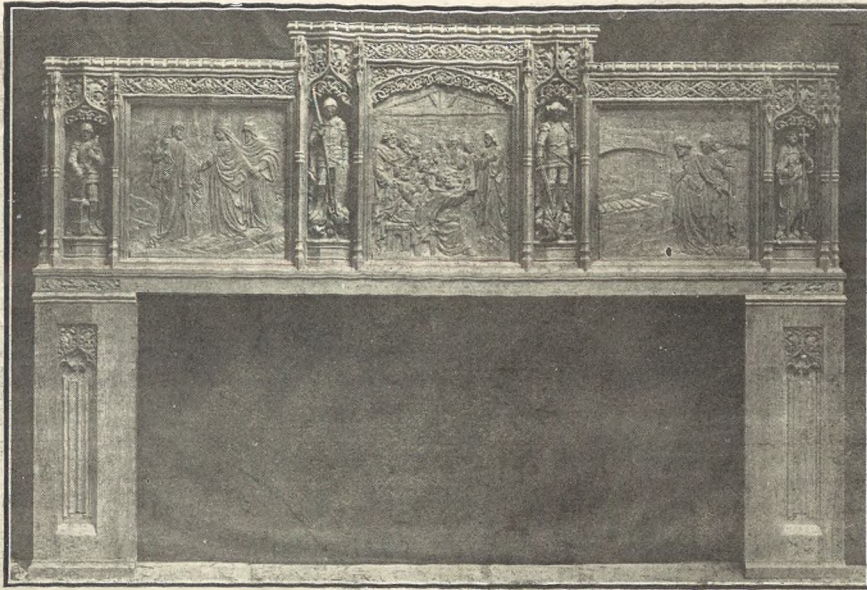

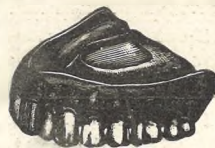

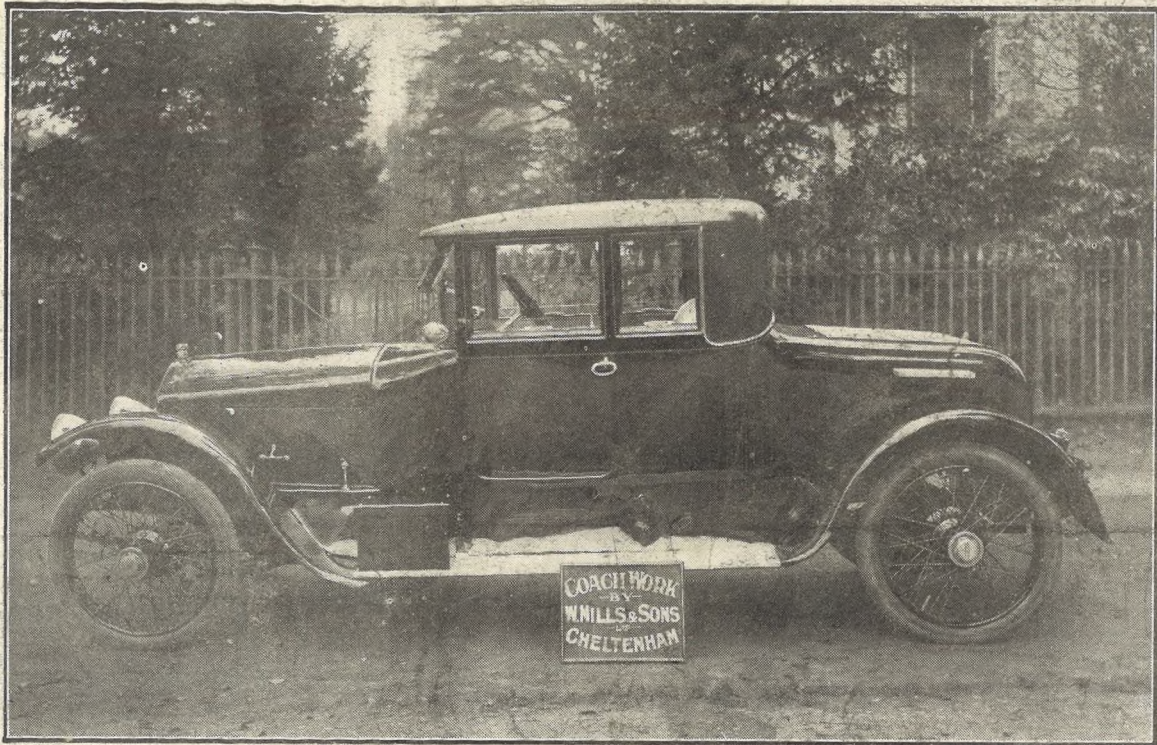
