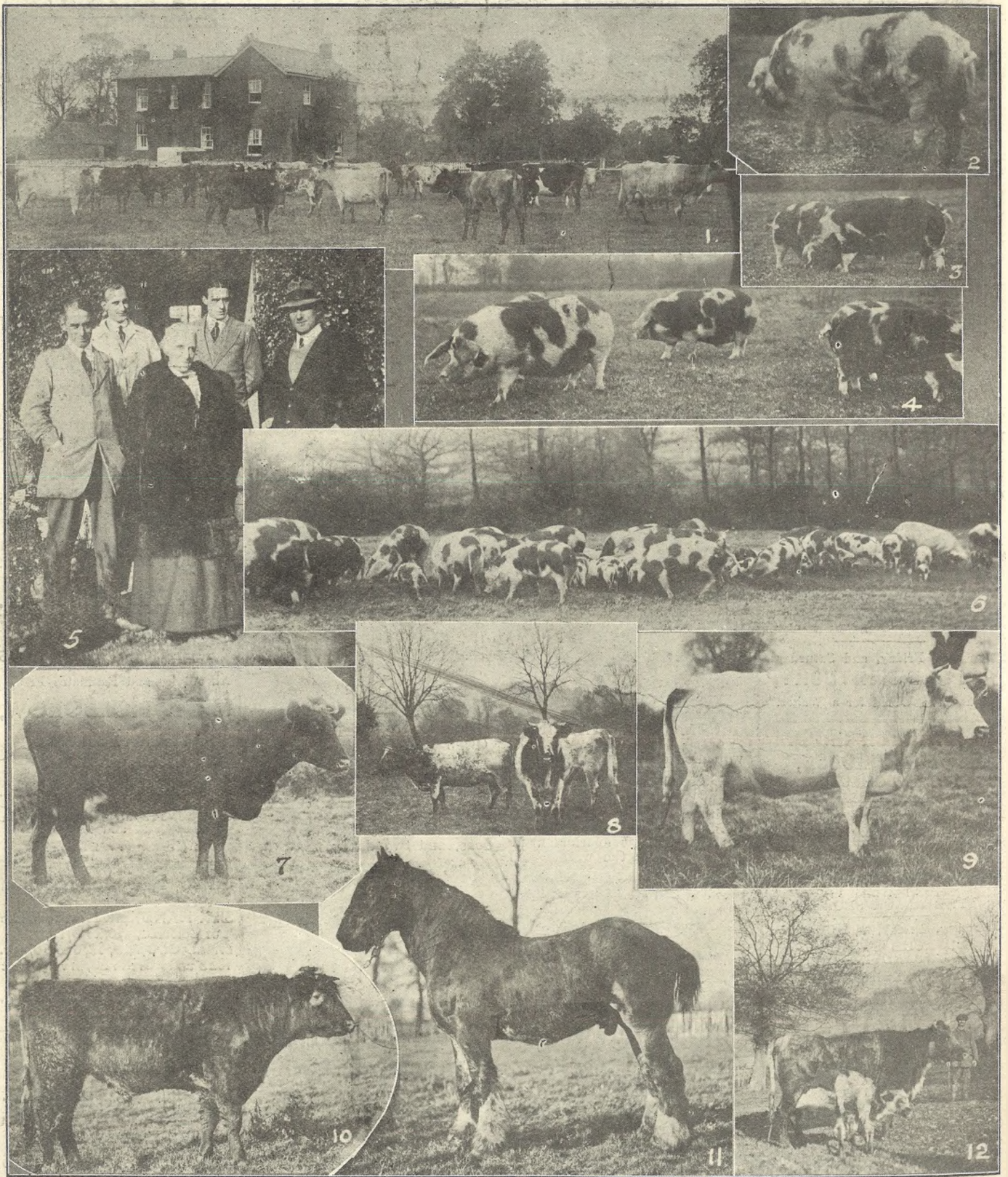

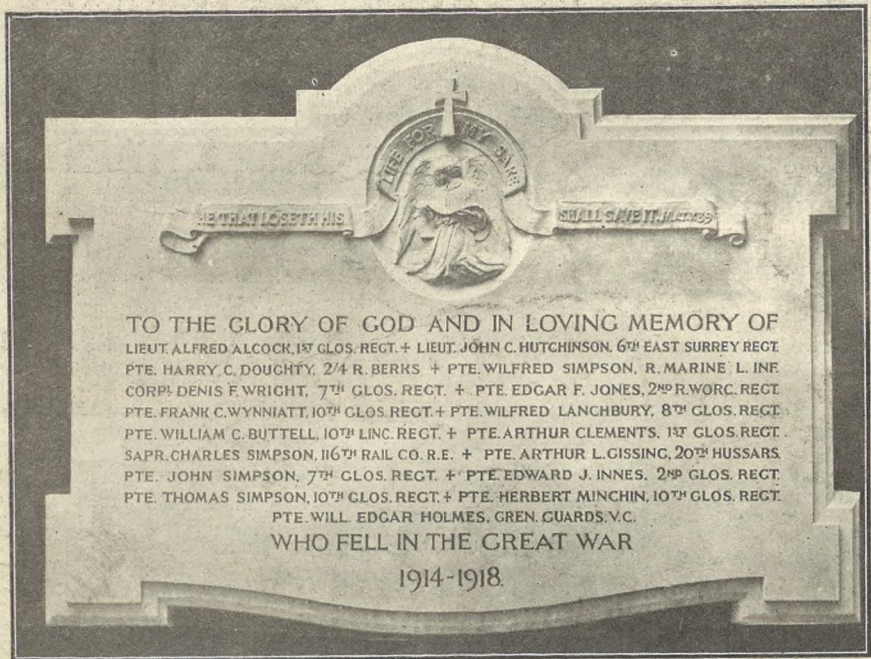

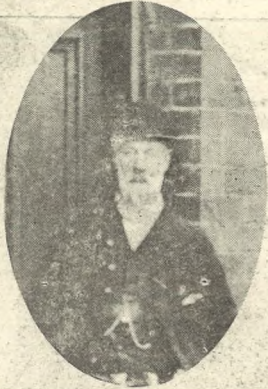


"IOLANTHE" IN CHELTENHAM.

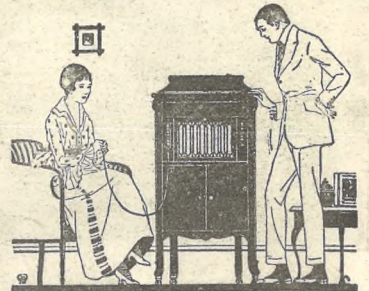

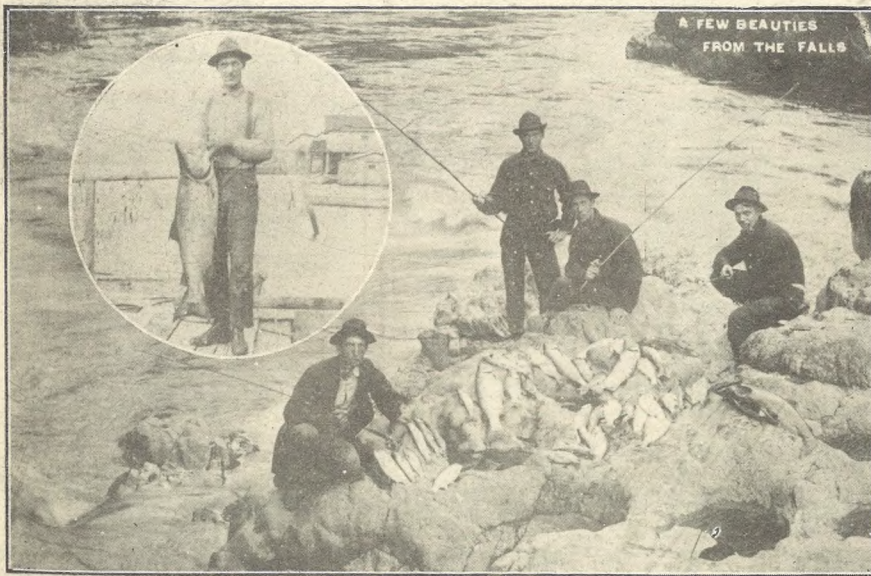

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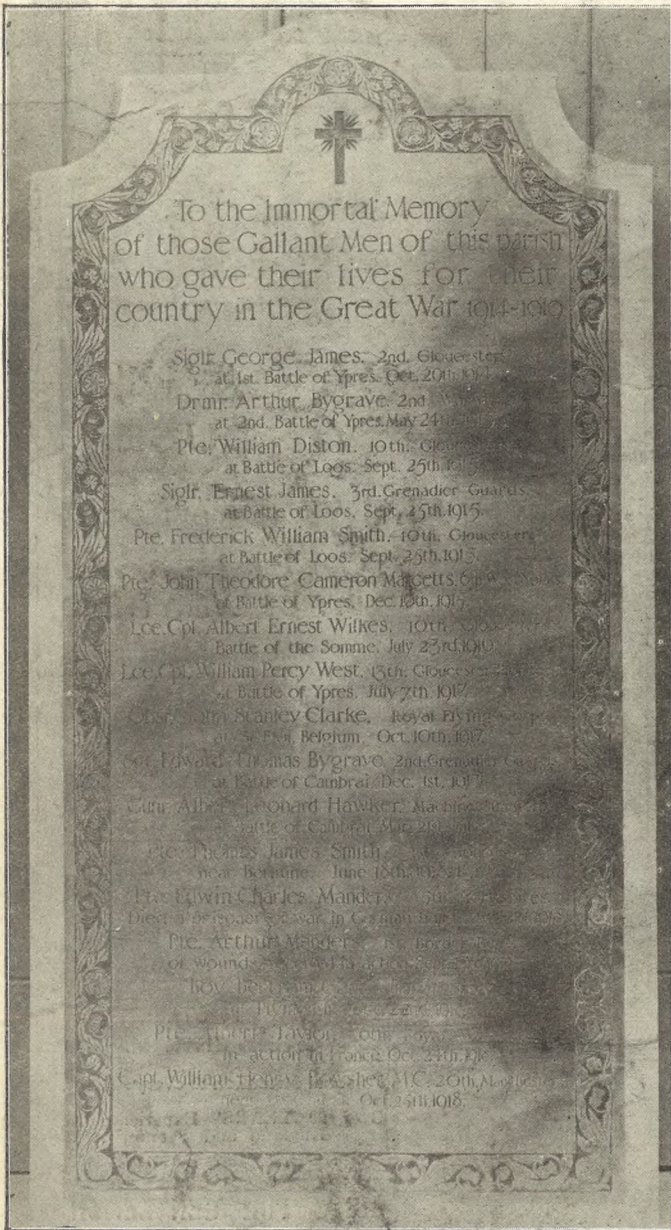

Beckford War Memorial.

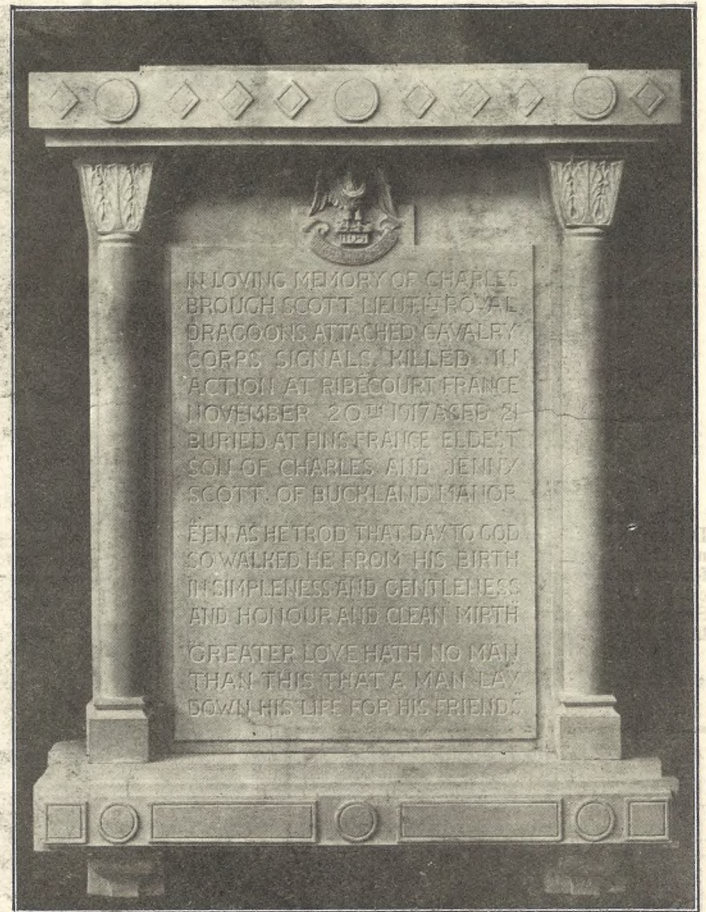

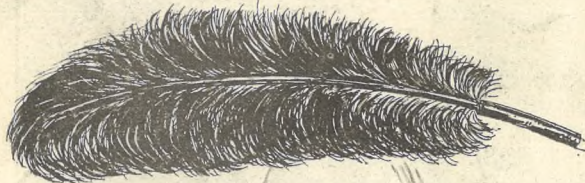
UNVEILING BOURTON-ON-THE-WATER WAR MEMORIAL CROSS.

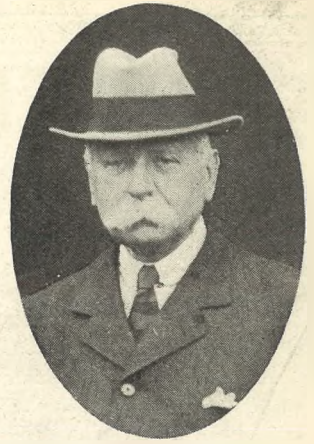
CHELTENHAM PARISH CHURCH BOYS' SCHOOL WAR MEMORIAL.

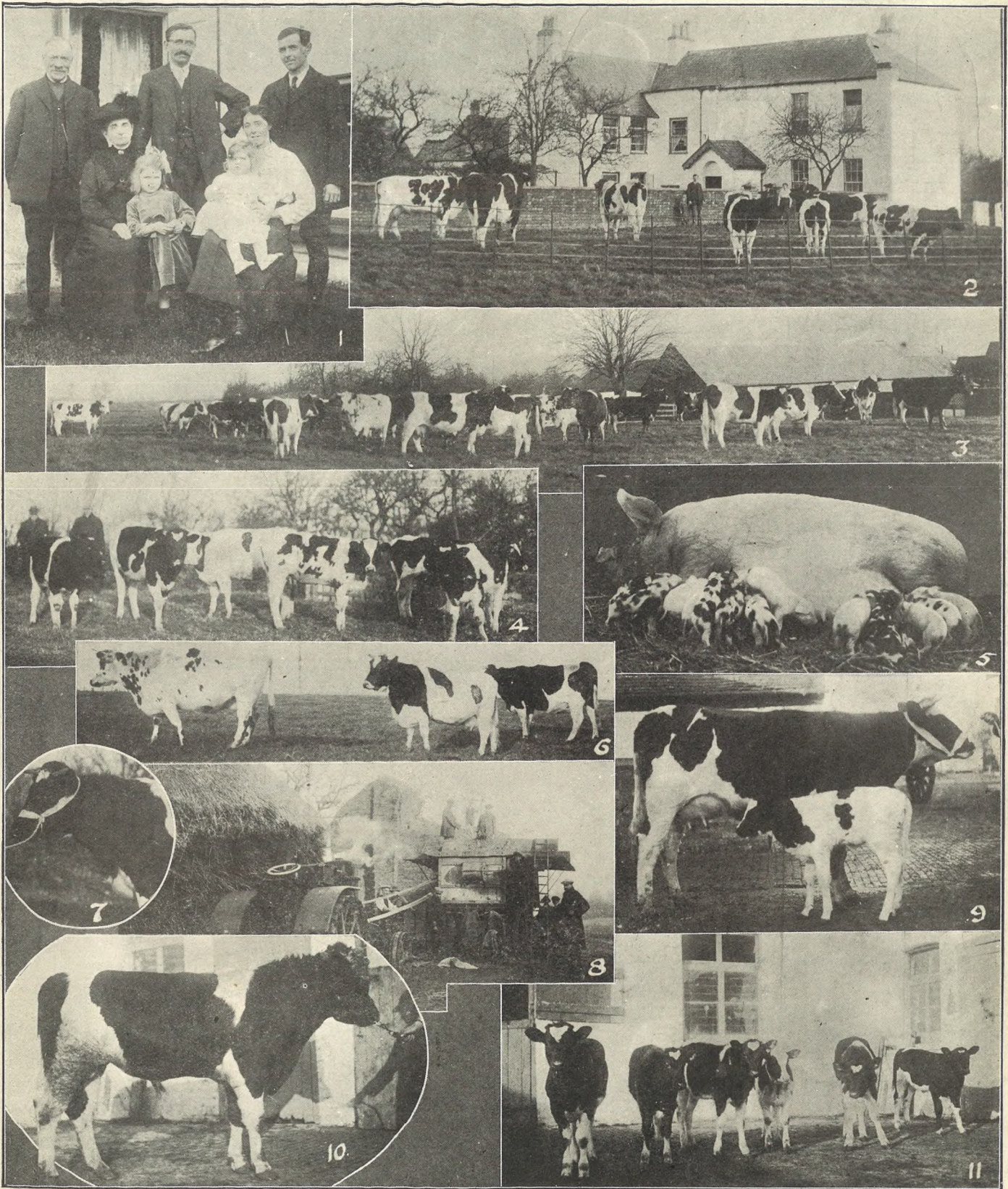

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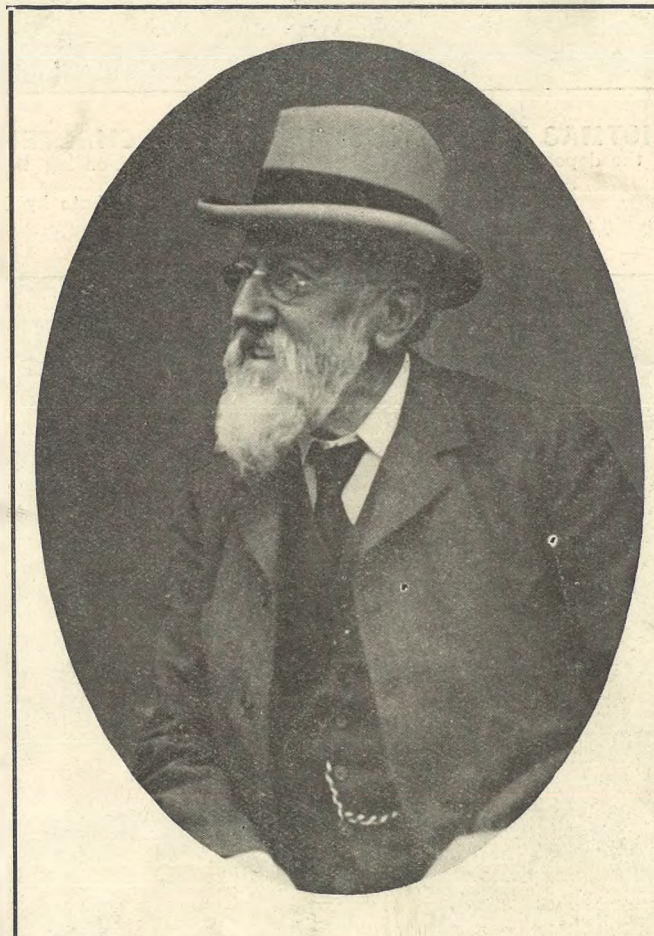

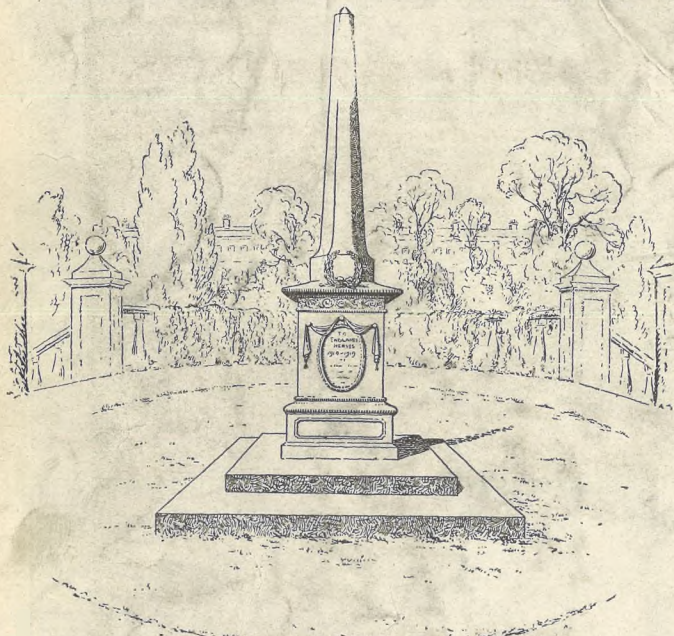

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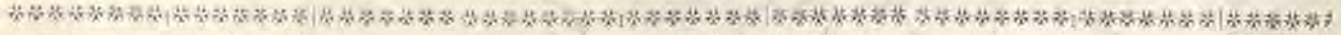

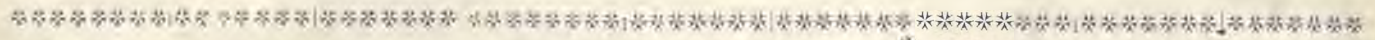
