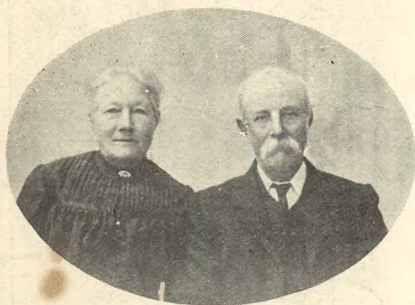

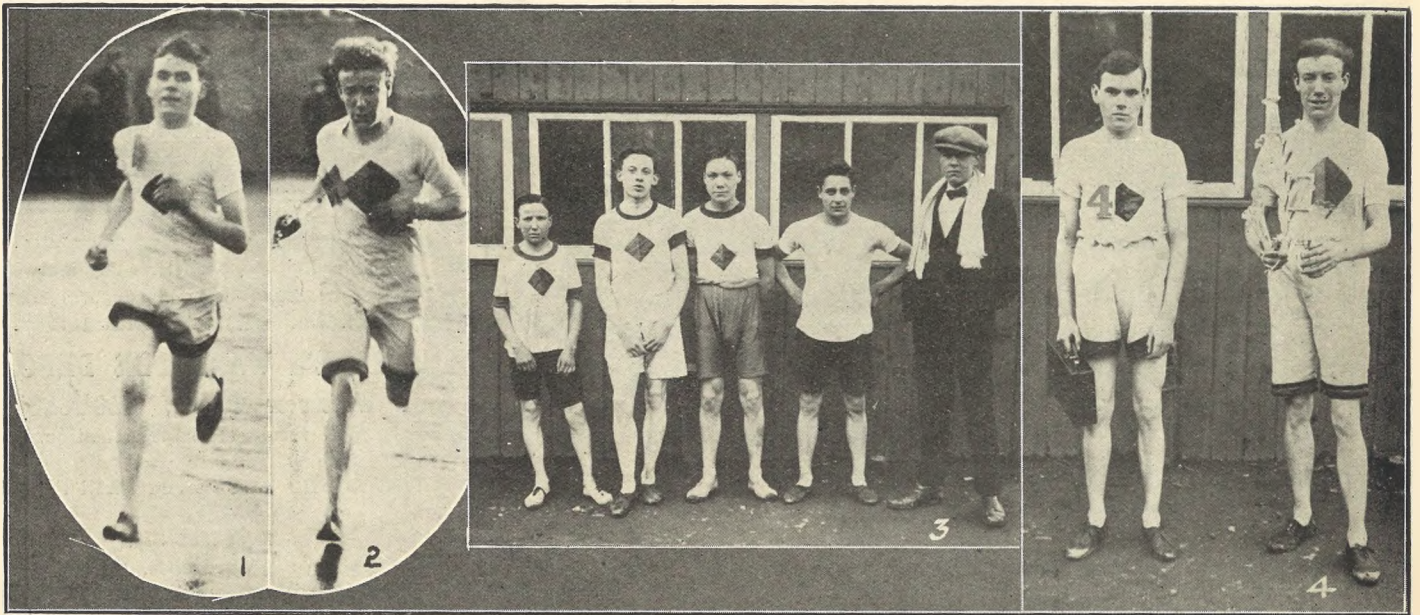

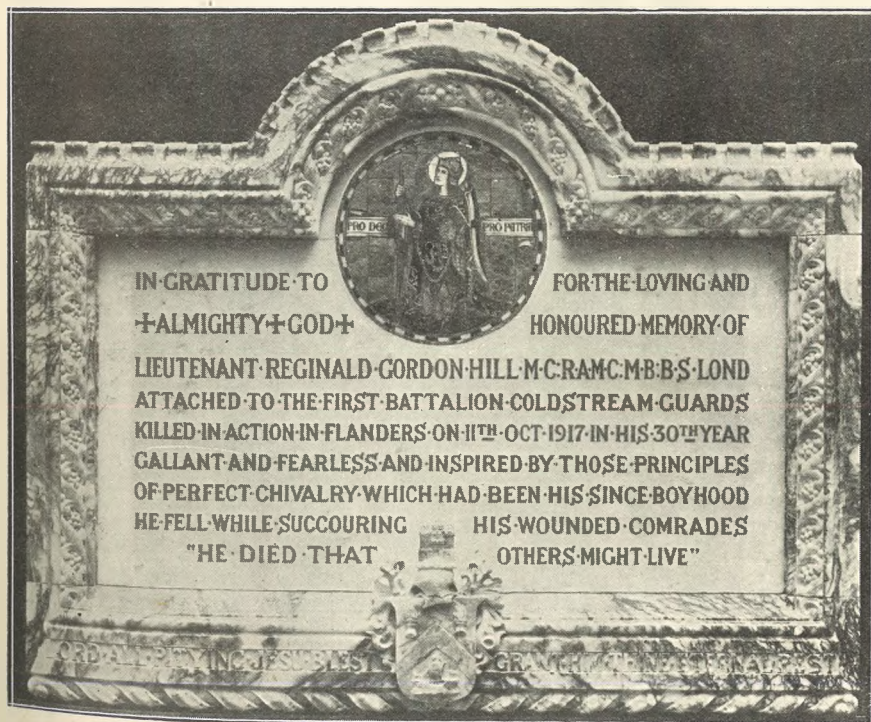




**FATHER TIME WELCOMES THE NEW YEAR.**

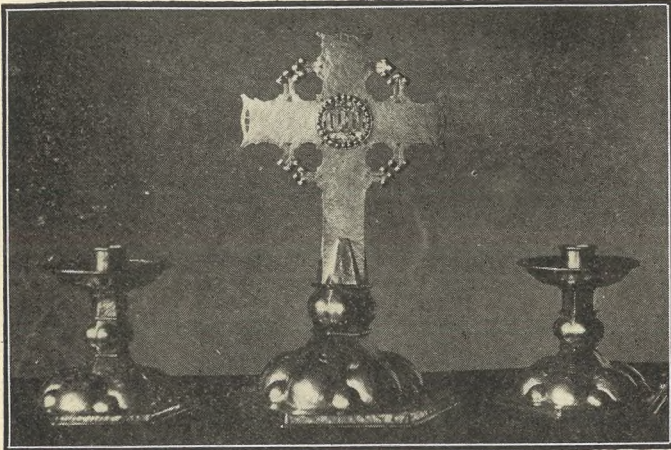

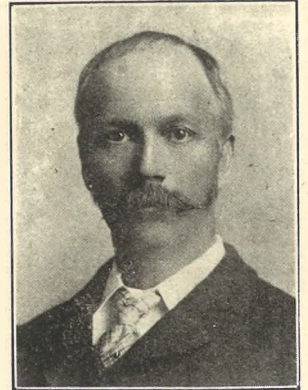

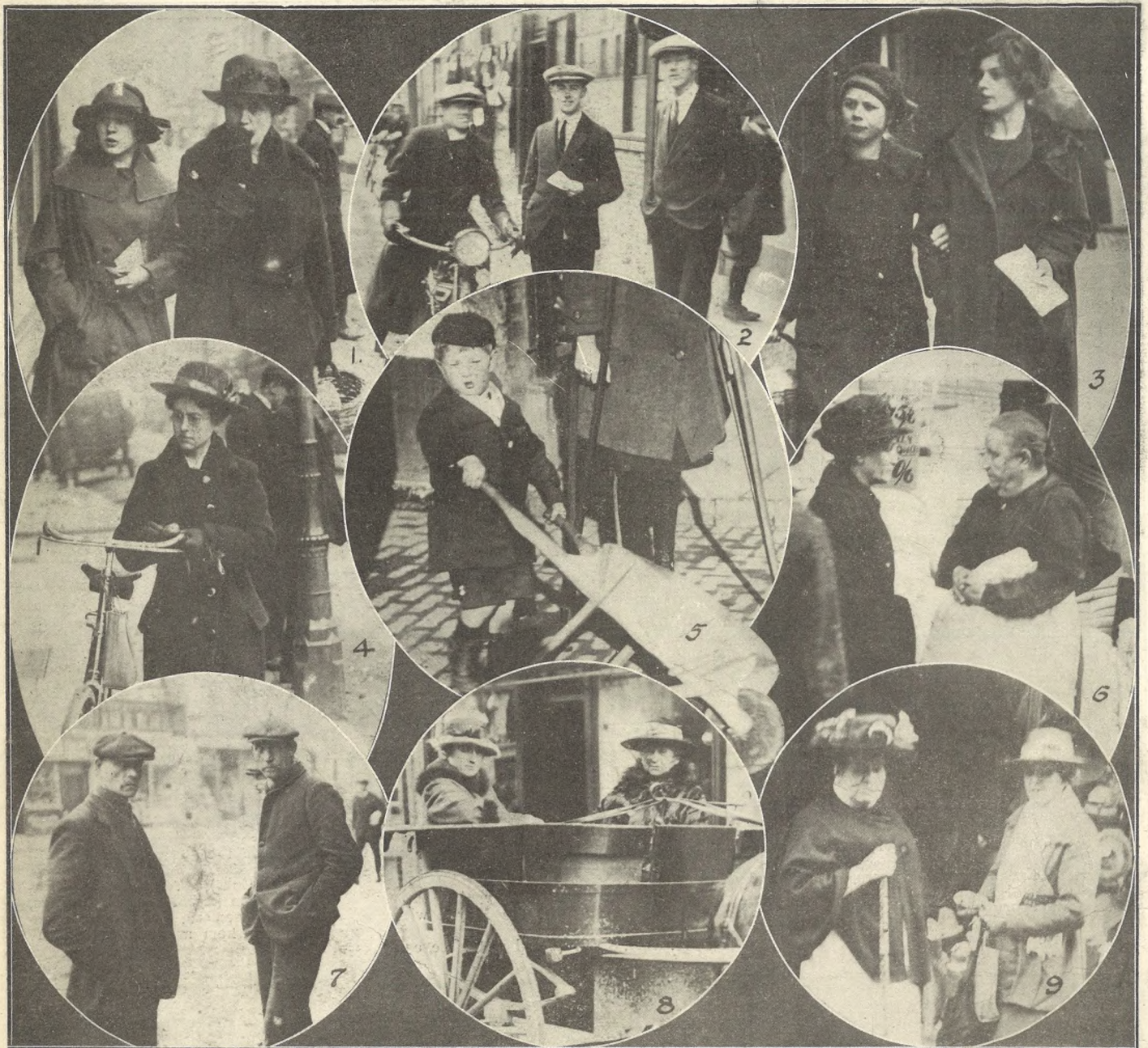
