A very beautiful Memorial to the memory of the 44 Moreton and Batsford men who gave their lives in the Great War was unveiled by Lord Redesdale on Saturday last. It was designed by Mr. E. 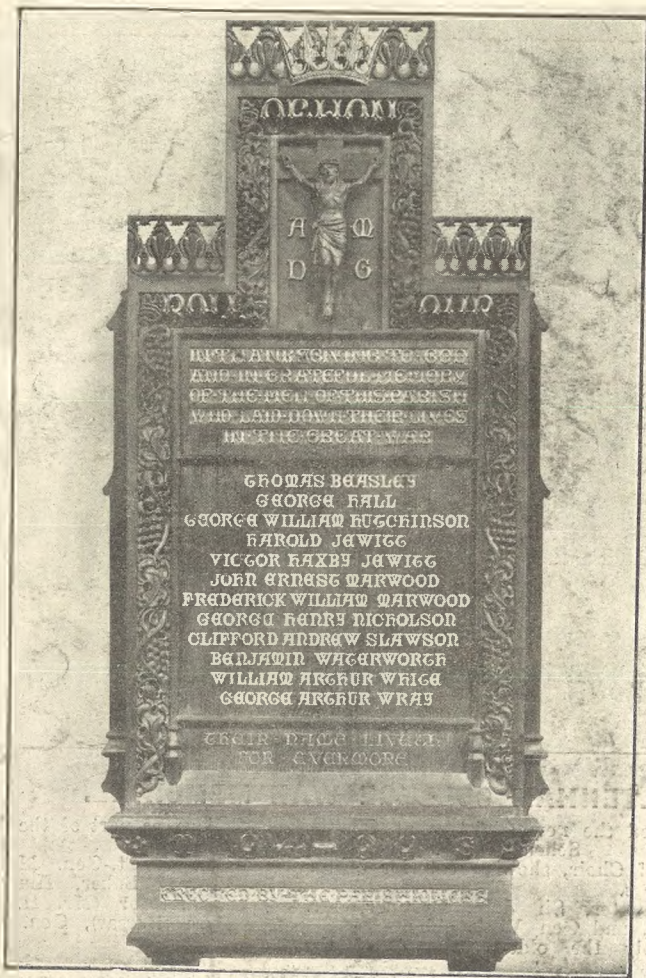
MR. EDWARD HOLLAND.

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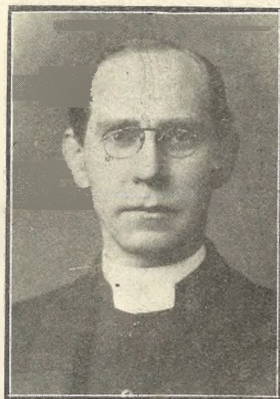

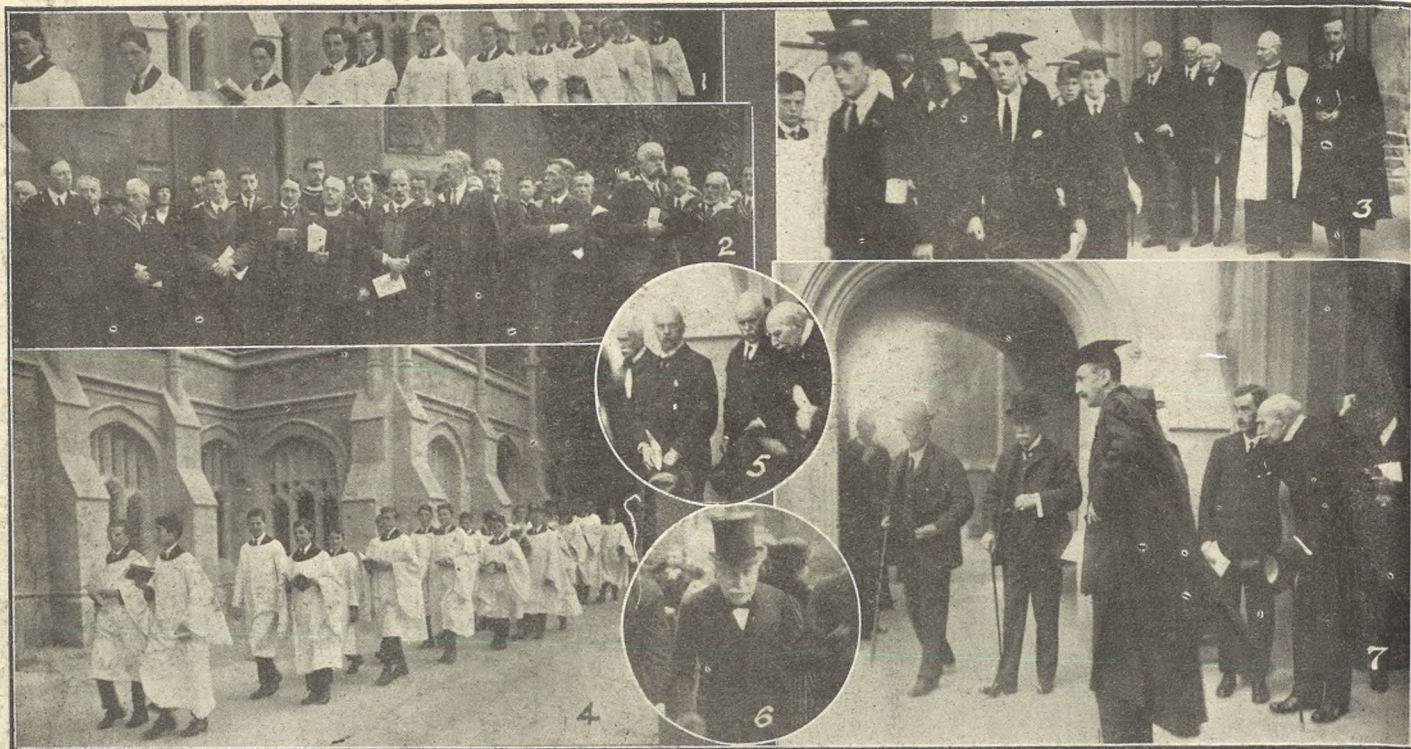

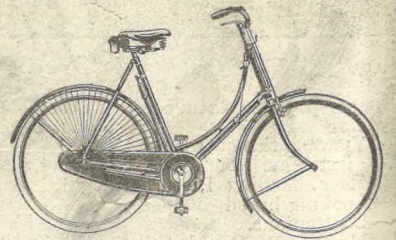
UNEMPLOYED DEMONSTRATION IN CHELTENHAM.

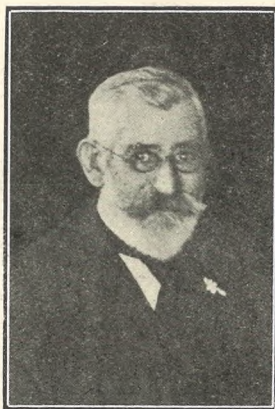

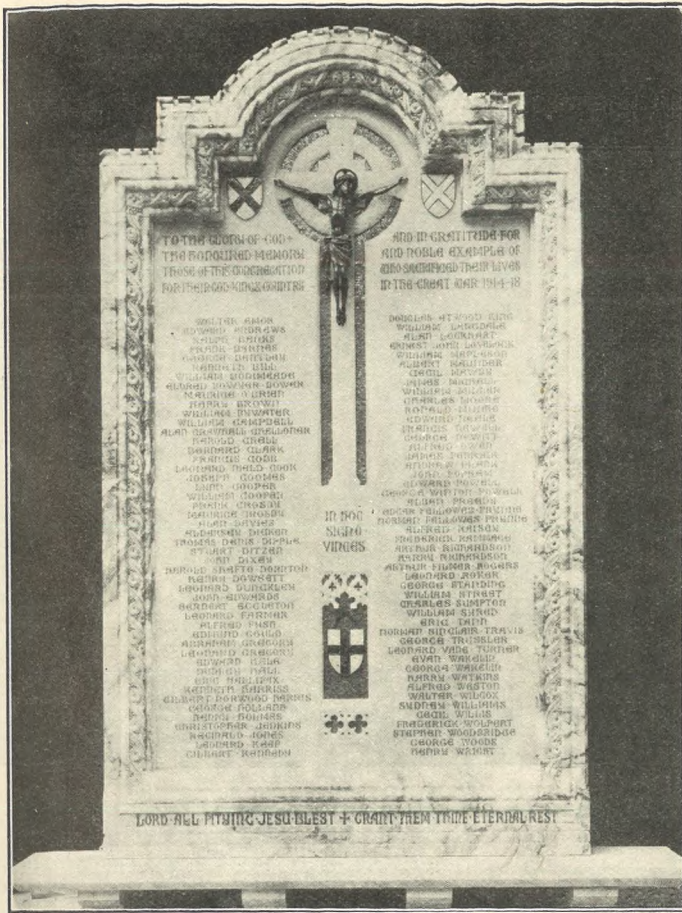

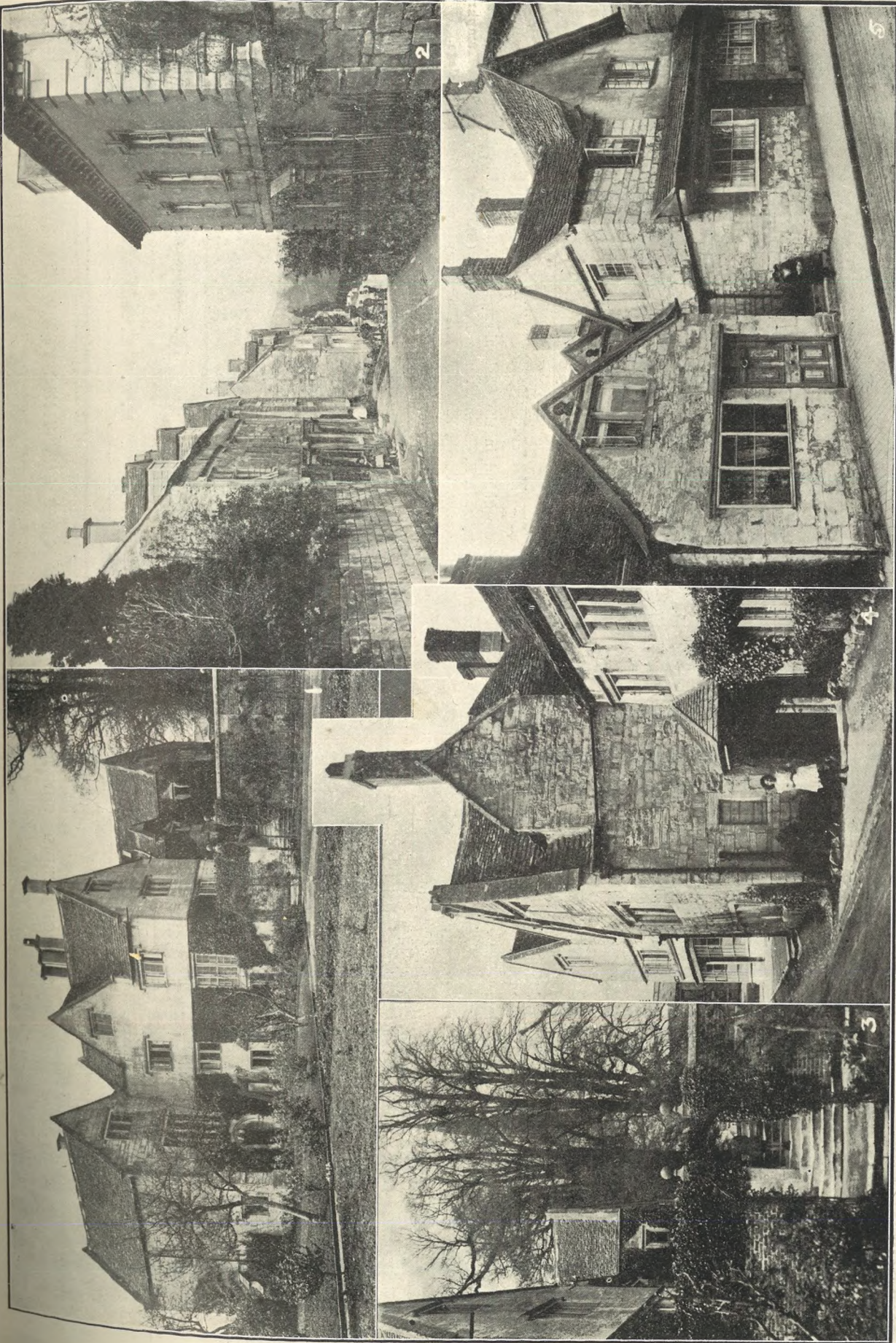

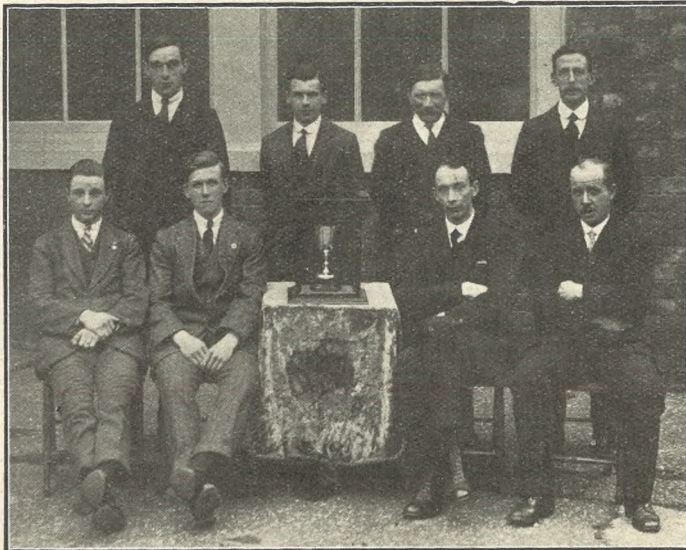

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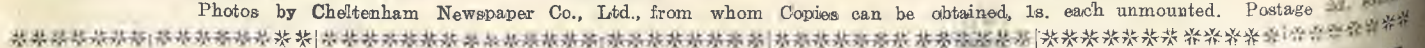

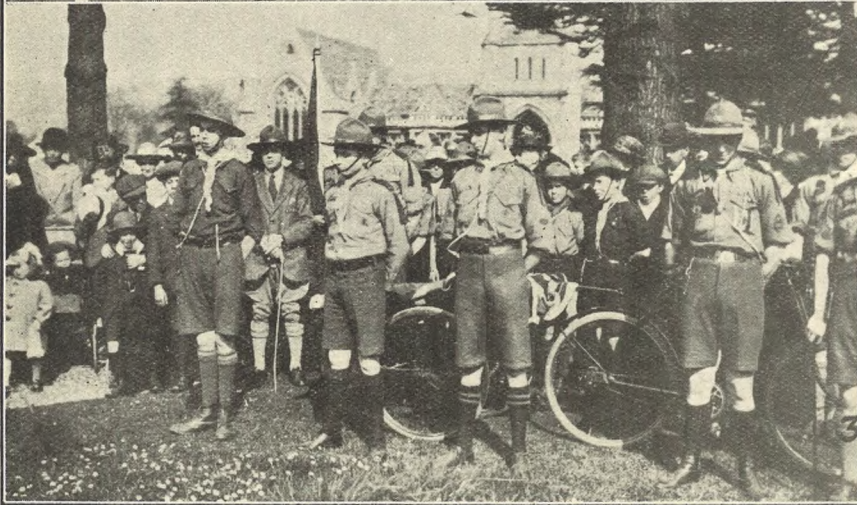
