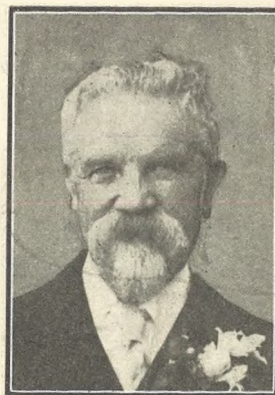

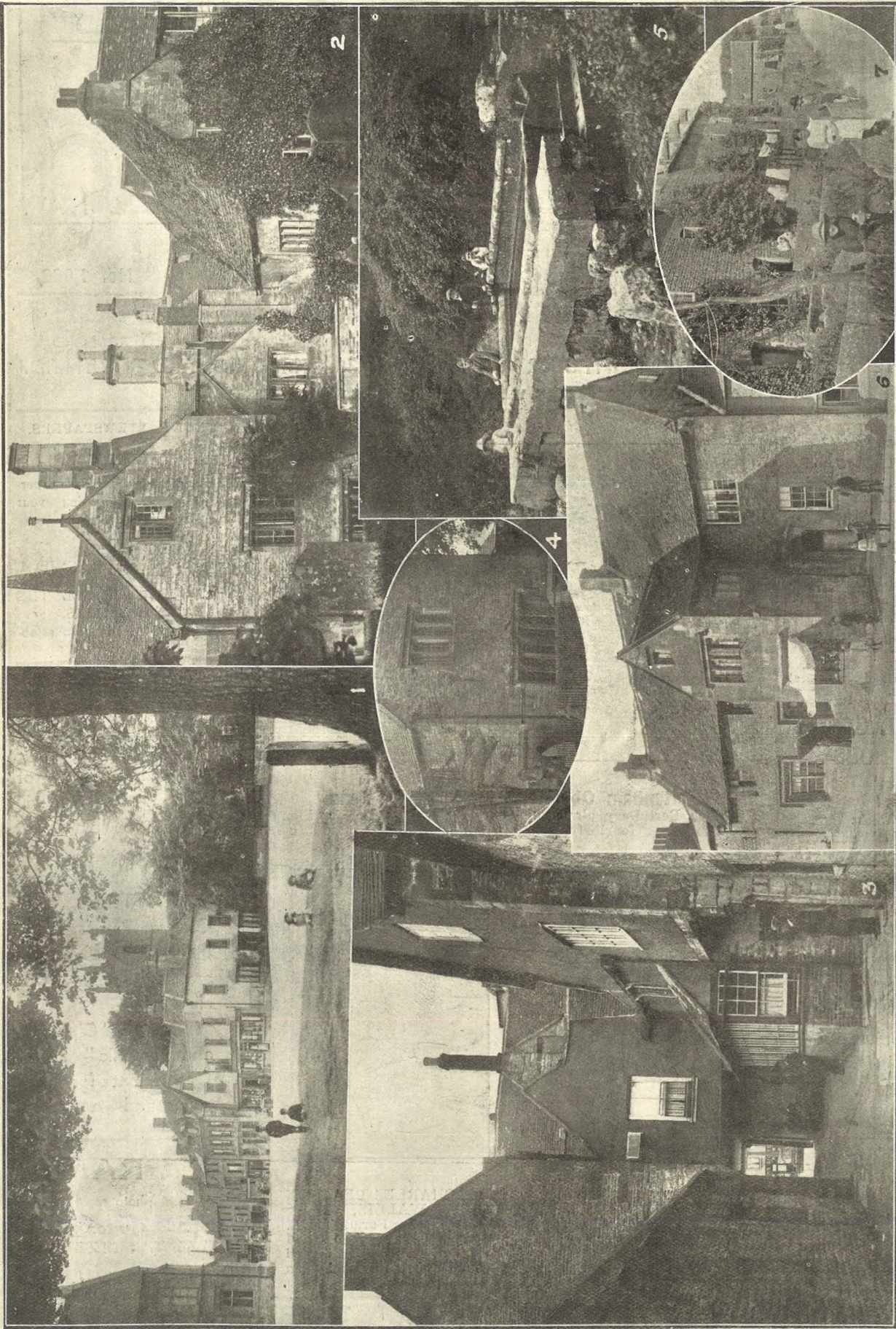

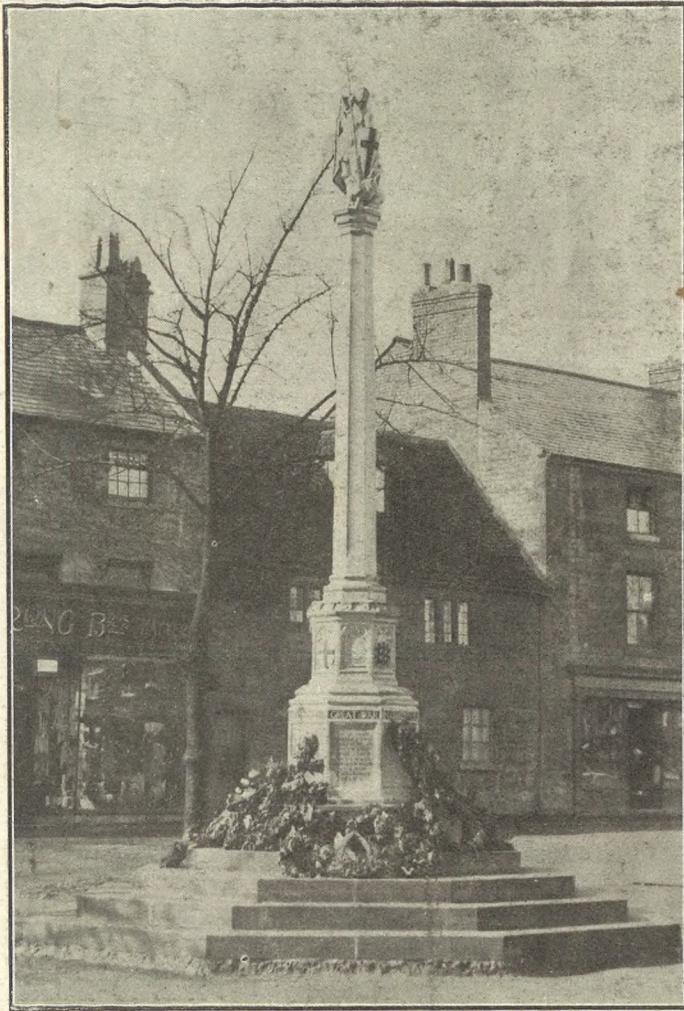

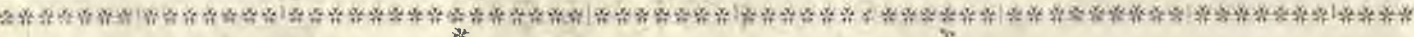
FATHERS PLAY THEIR SONS AT CRICKET

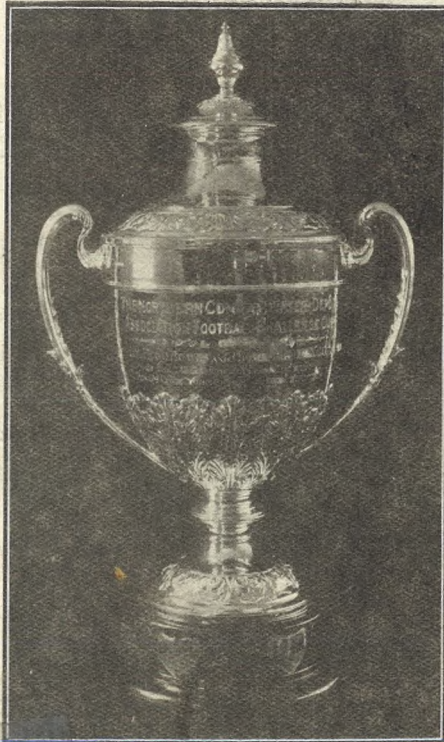

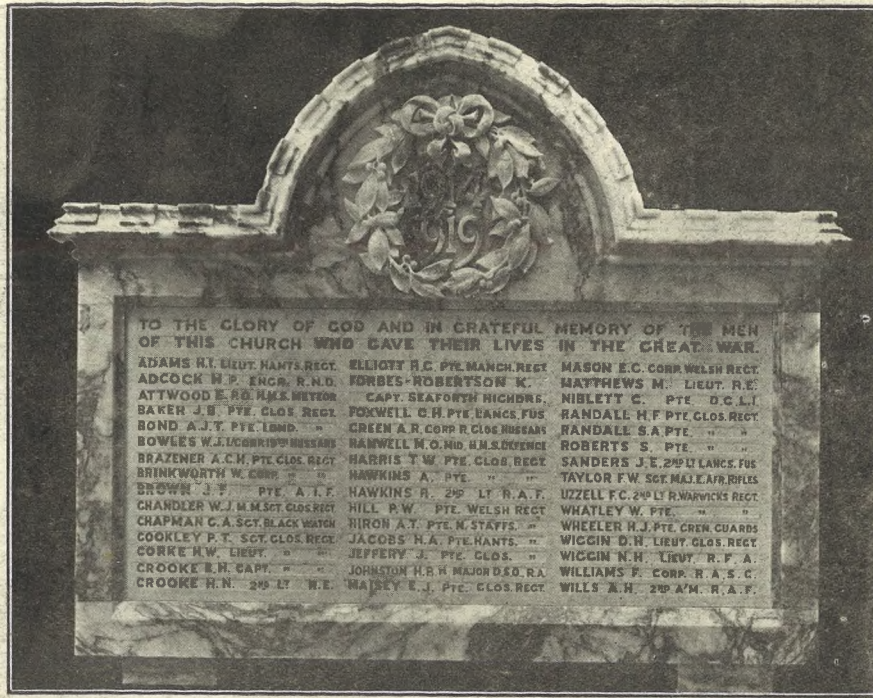

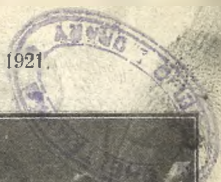

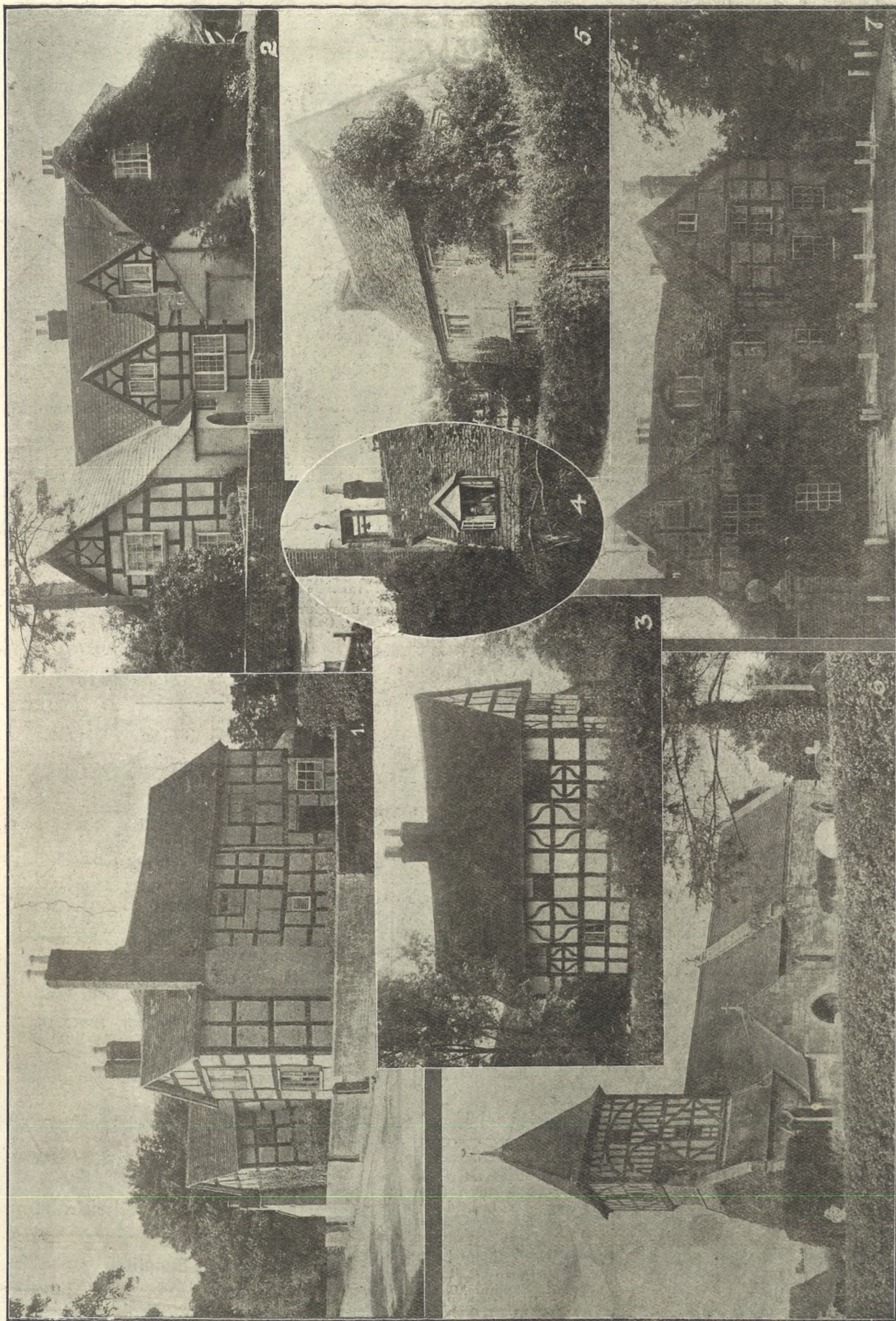

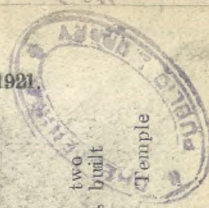

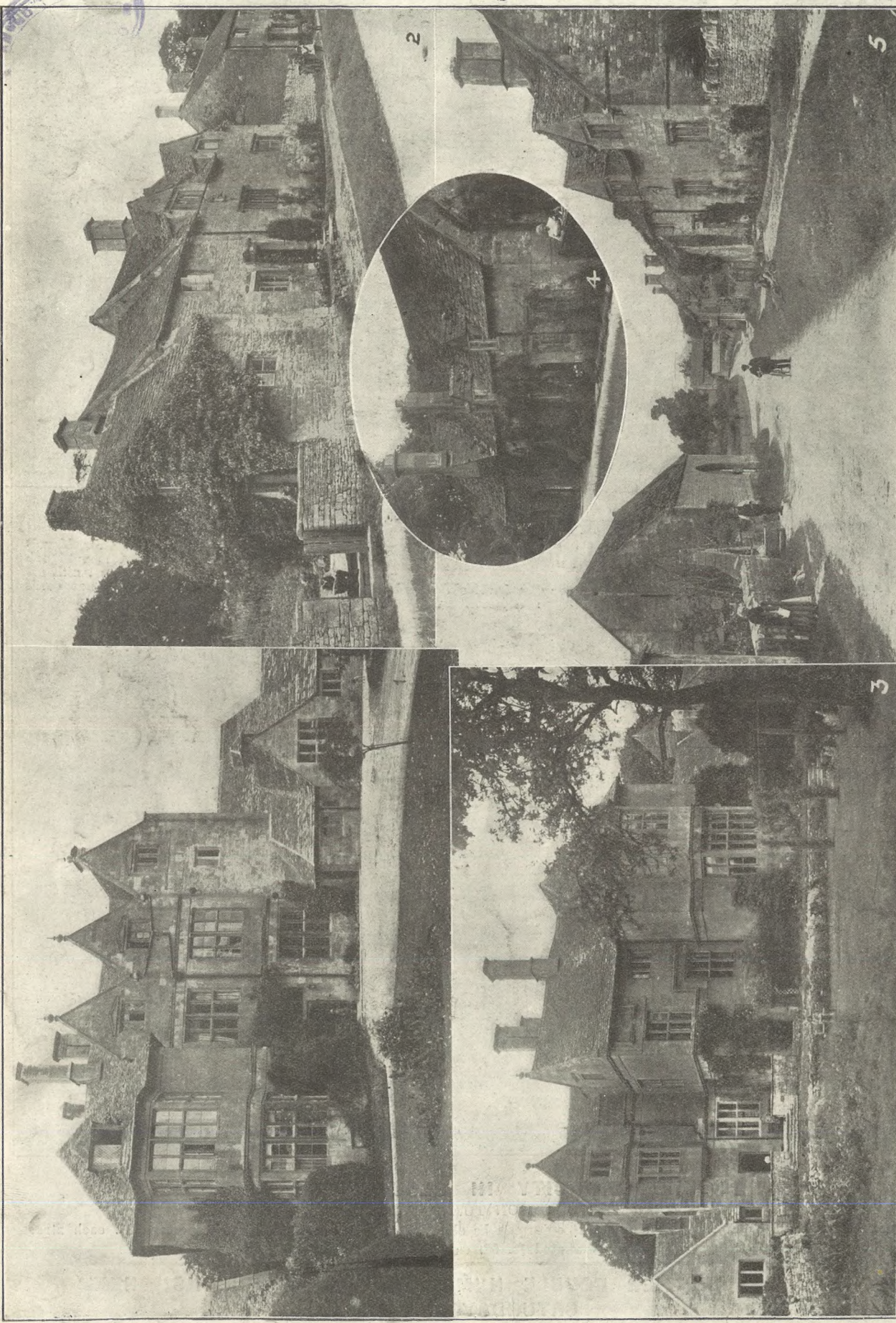

PICTURESQUE GLOUCESTERSHIRE: WHITTINGTON.

This charming little Cotswold village lies just off the main road from Cheltenham to Andoversford, and is really the eastern boundary of Cleve Hill. It has preserved its simple and ancient beauty in a remarkable degree considering its proximity to a great main road and a large town. In 1700, it is recorded by Rudder, there were 32 houses in the parish—about its present number.

1 and 3.—The North and South Fronts of Whittington Court, a lovely old Elizabethan manor house, at present the residence of Mrs. Evans Lawrence. In No. 3, at right, can be seen the wooden spire of the old church, which building nestles up against the walls of the Court. It is stated, with authenticity, that Queen Elizabeth dined at the Court with John Cotton, the then owner.

2 and 4.—Picturesque old Cotswold Houses in the main street. In No. 2 can be seen an old sundial on the wall.

5.—A view down the Village Street. A feature of the village are the flowers growing against the walls of the houses.

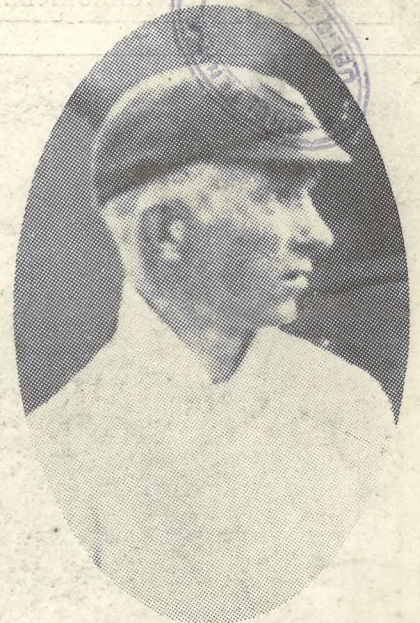

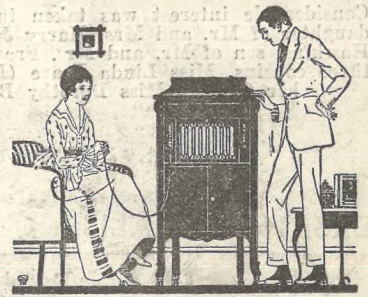
