A BEAUTIFUL WAR MEMORIAL.

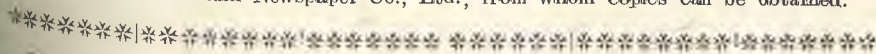

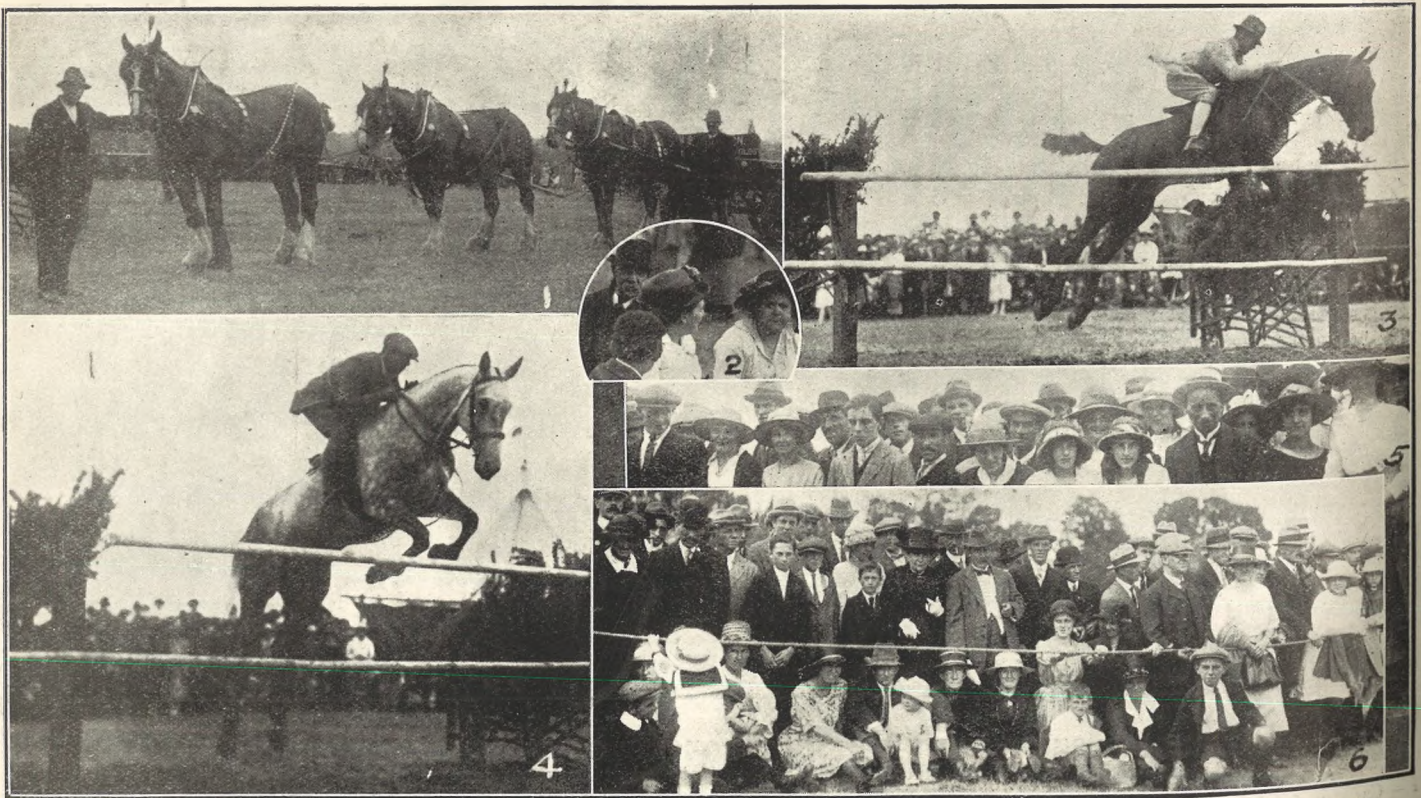

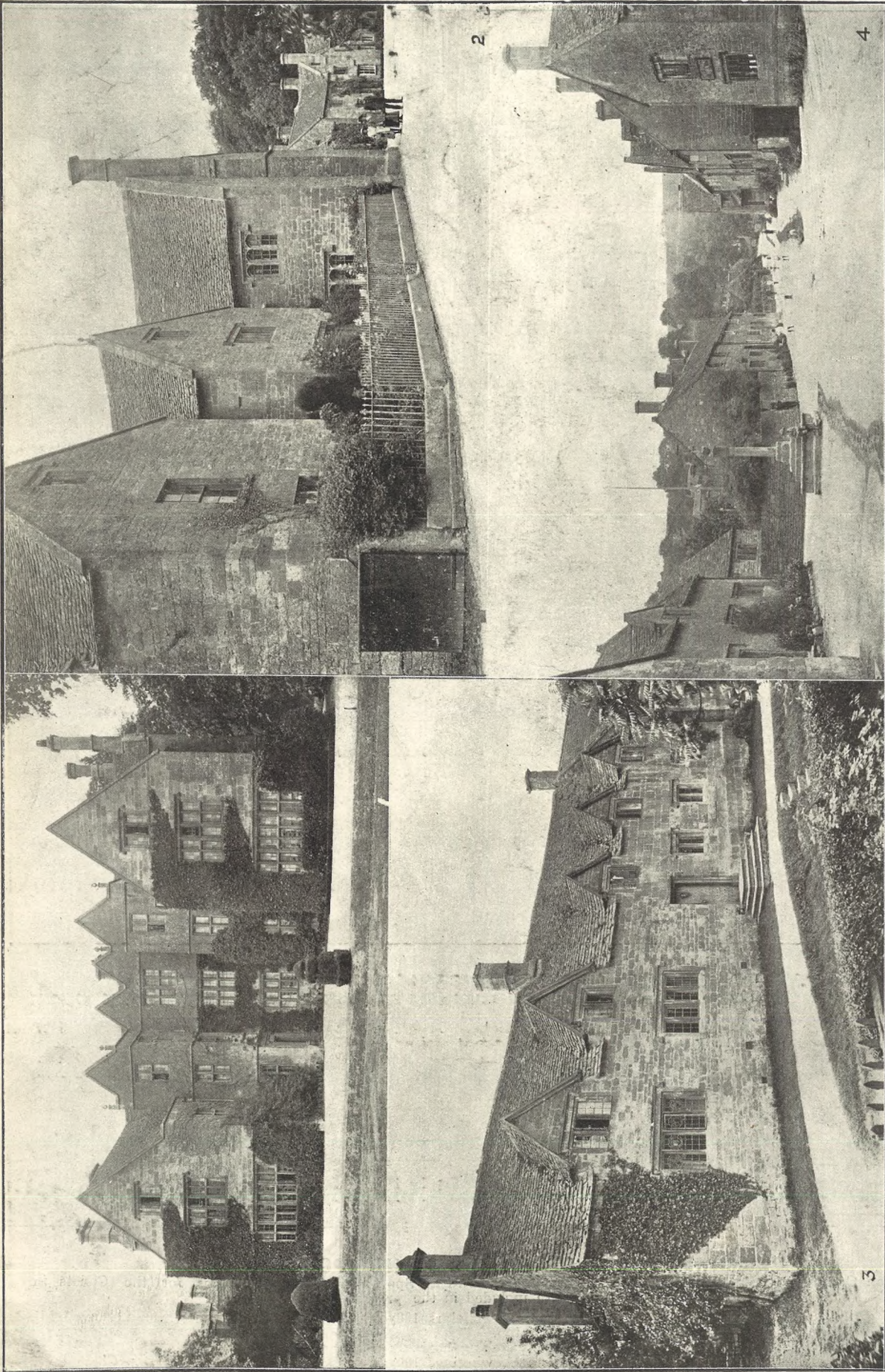

Stanton is a beautiful Cotswold village lying about a mile to the east of the main road from Winchcombe to Broadway. Sir Philip Stott, who owns the greater portion, has installed electric light and a public swimming bath among other improvements, and in all repairs to the houses has kept exactly to the original Cotswold style, so that it is almost a model village, and a very ancient one, too.

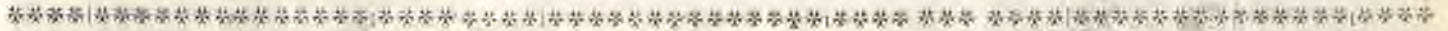

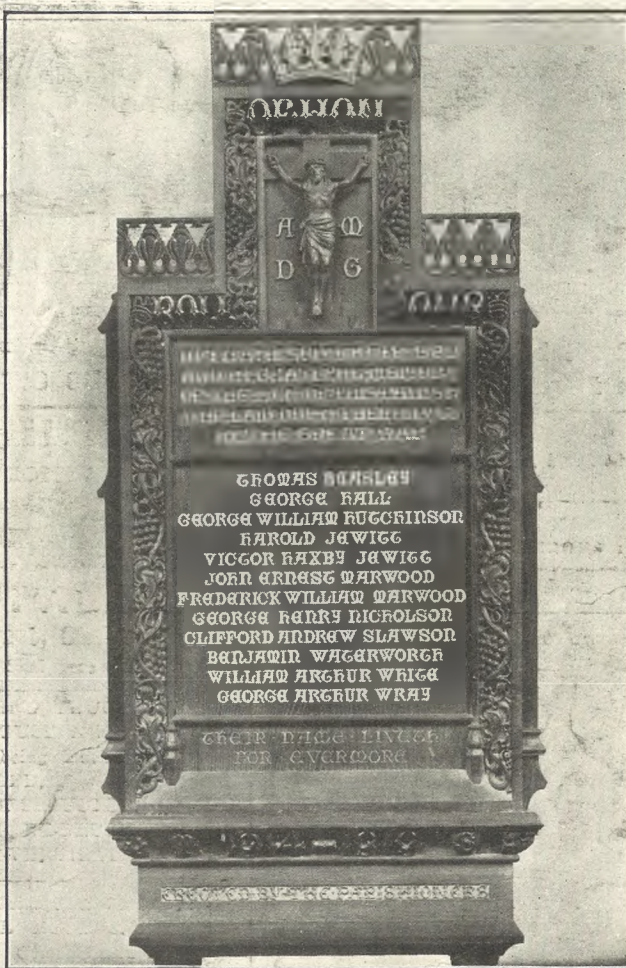

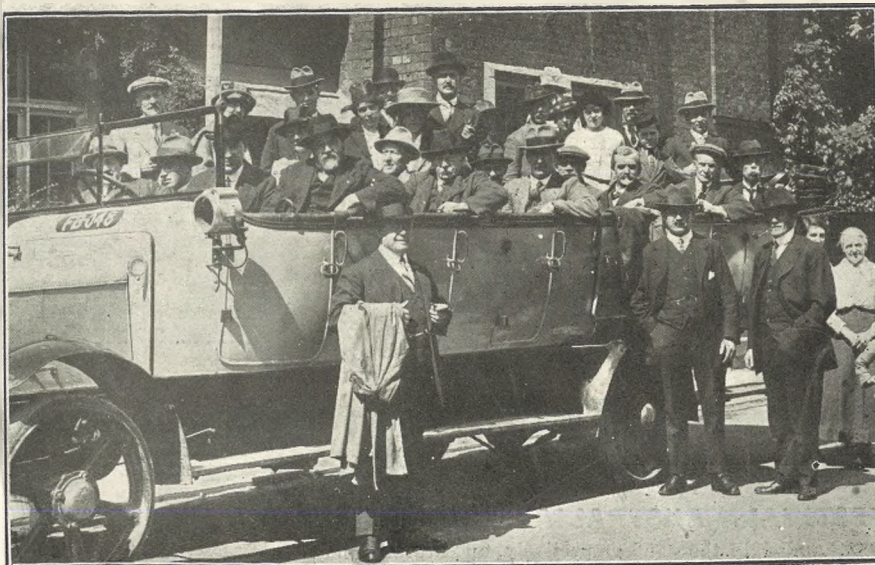

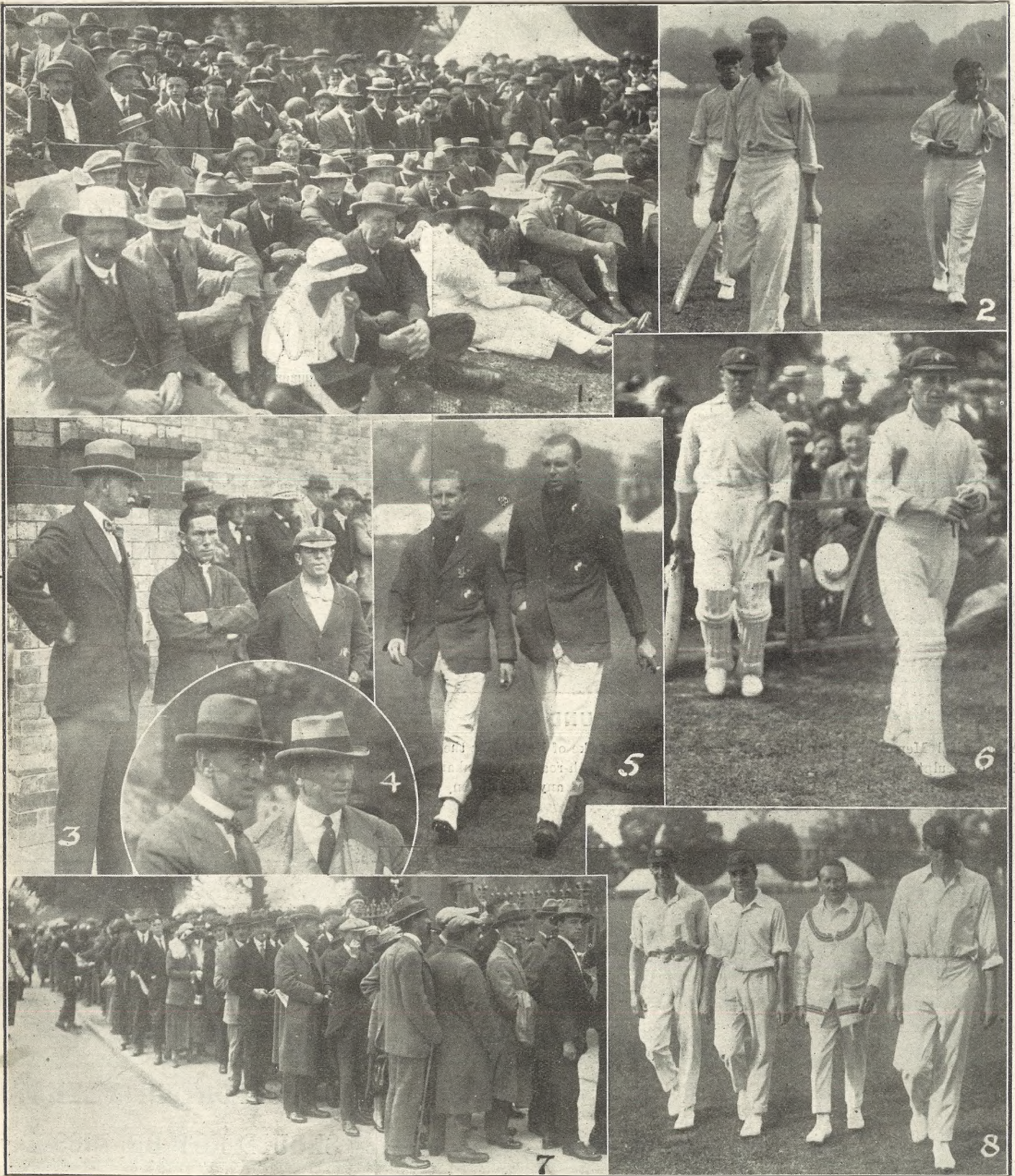

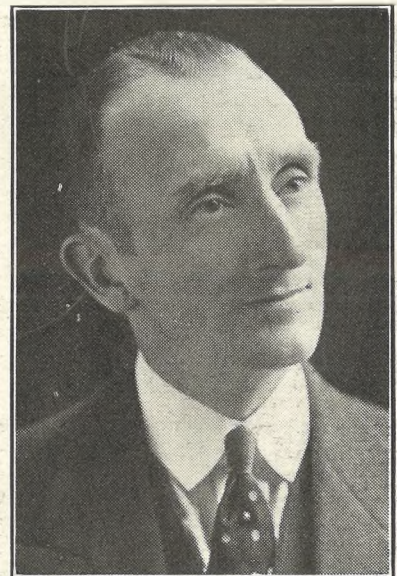
