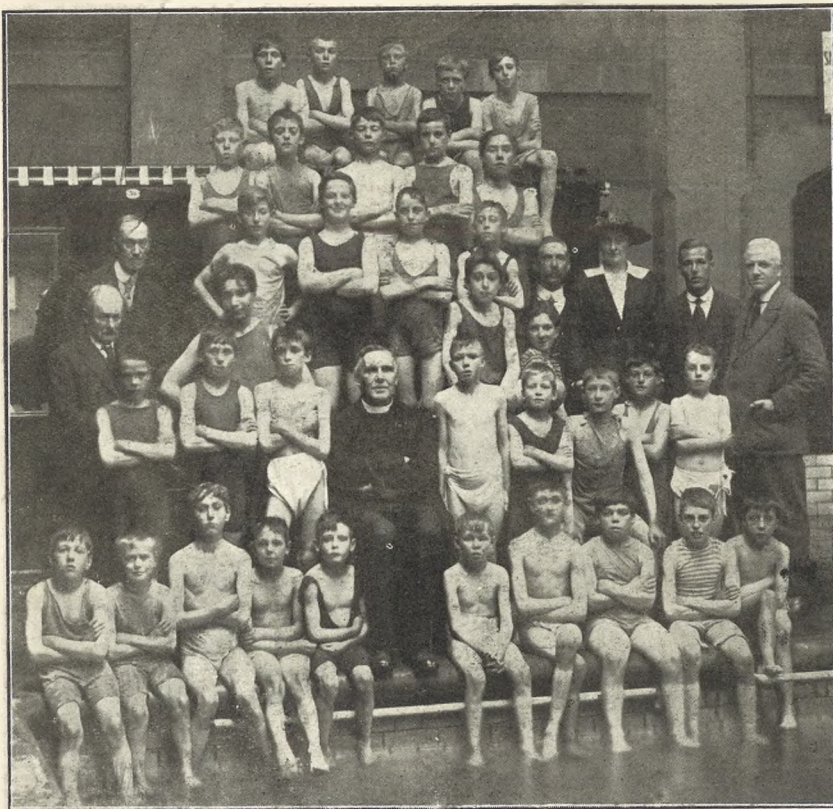


GARDEN FETE AND SALE AT STONEHOUSE.

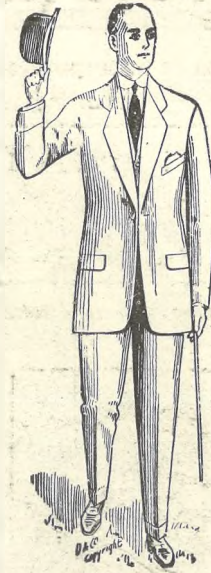

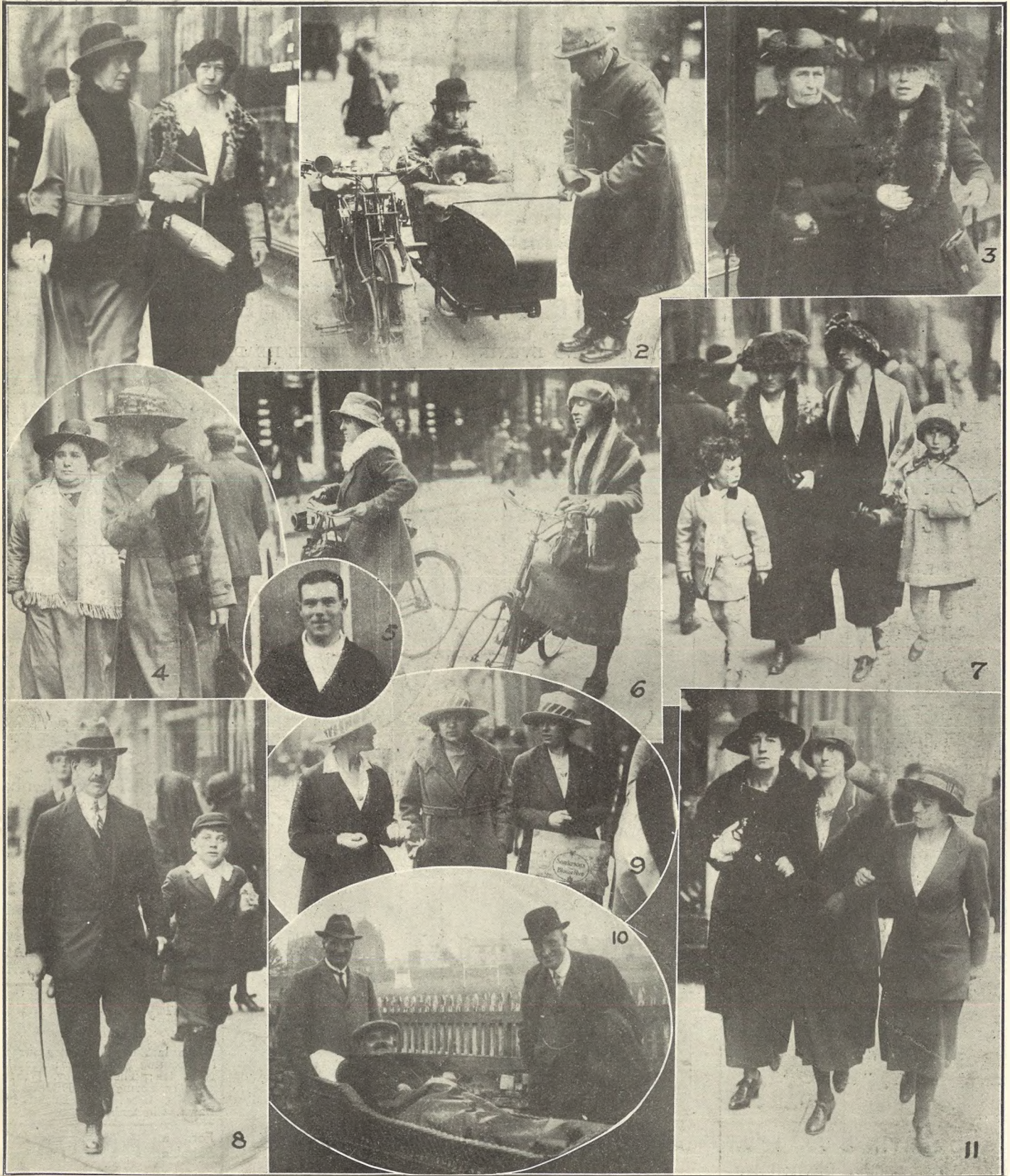

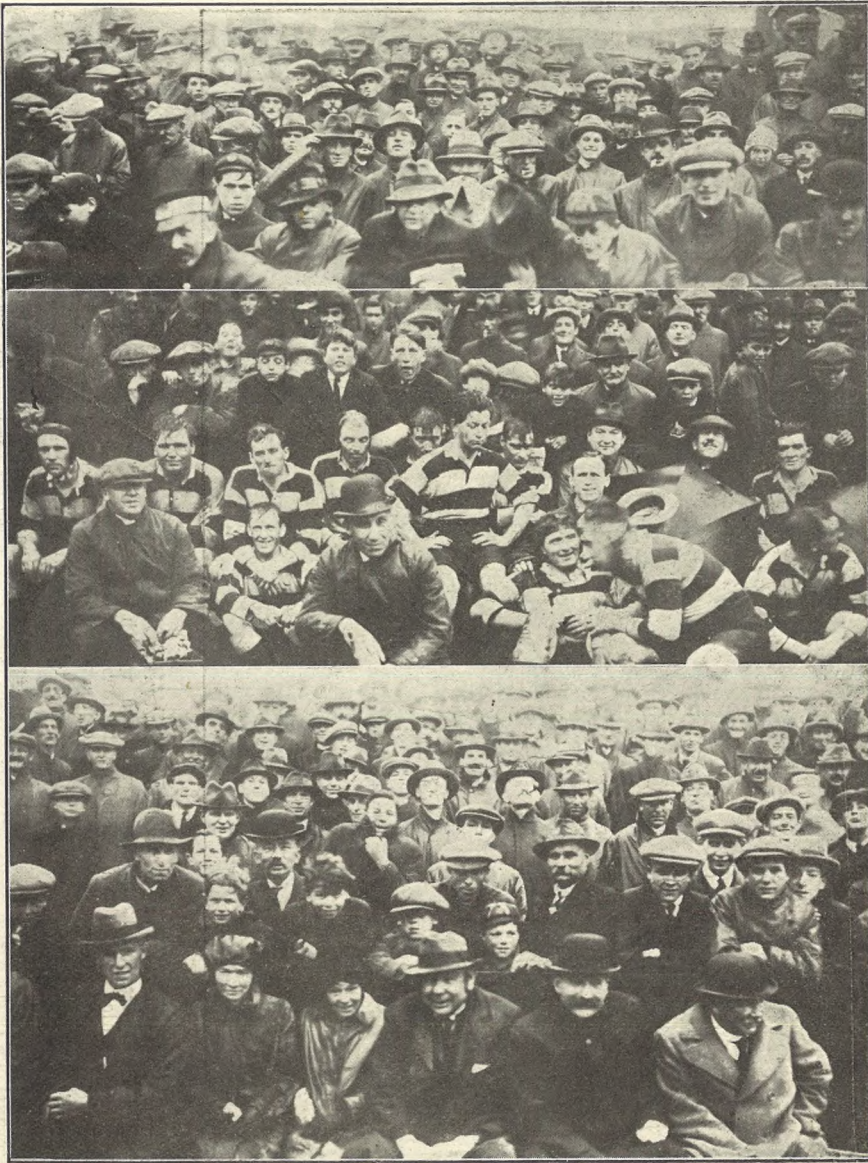

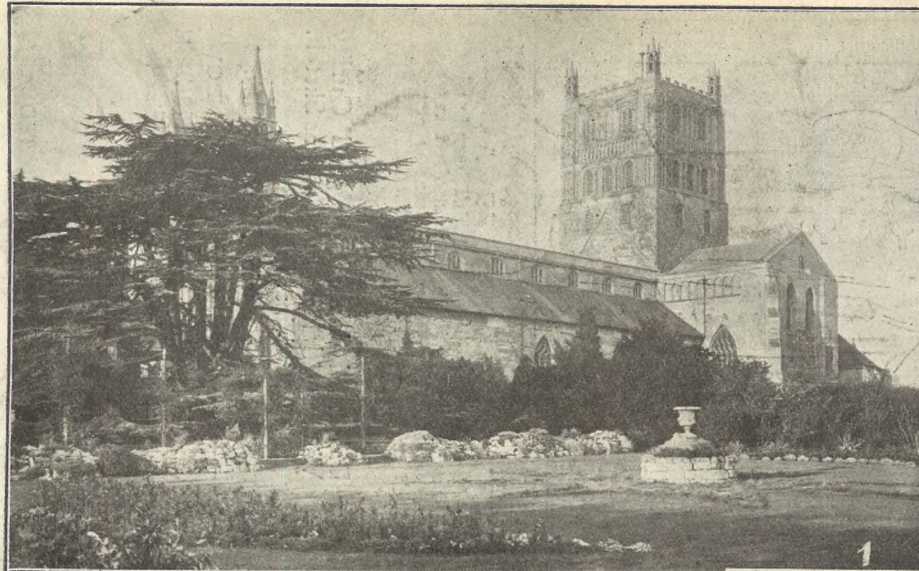
