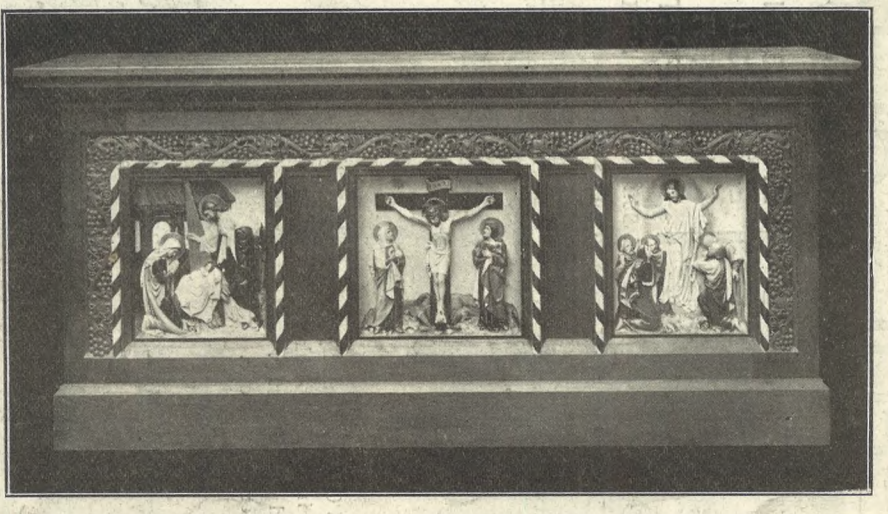

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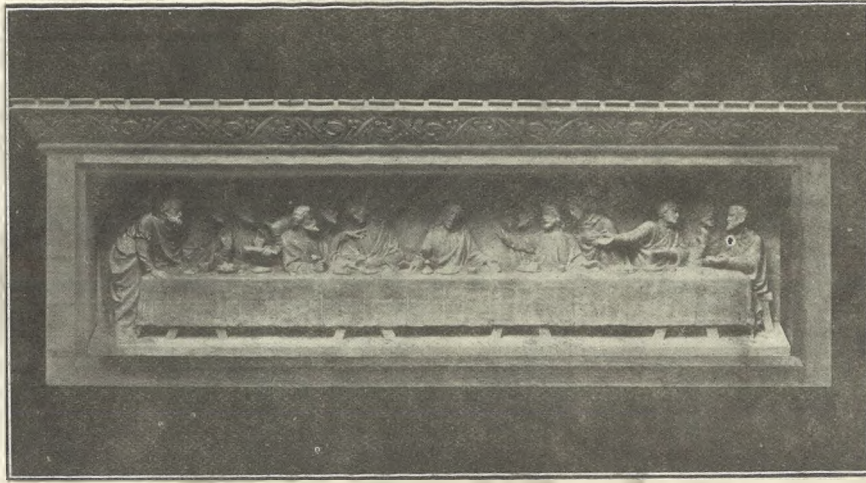

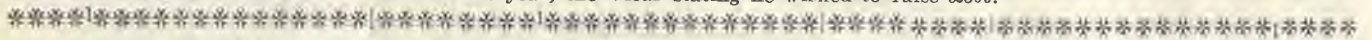

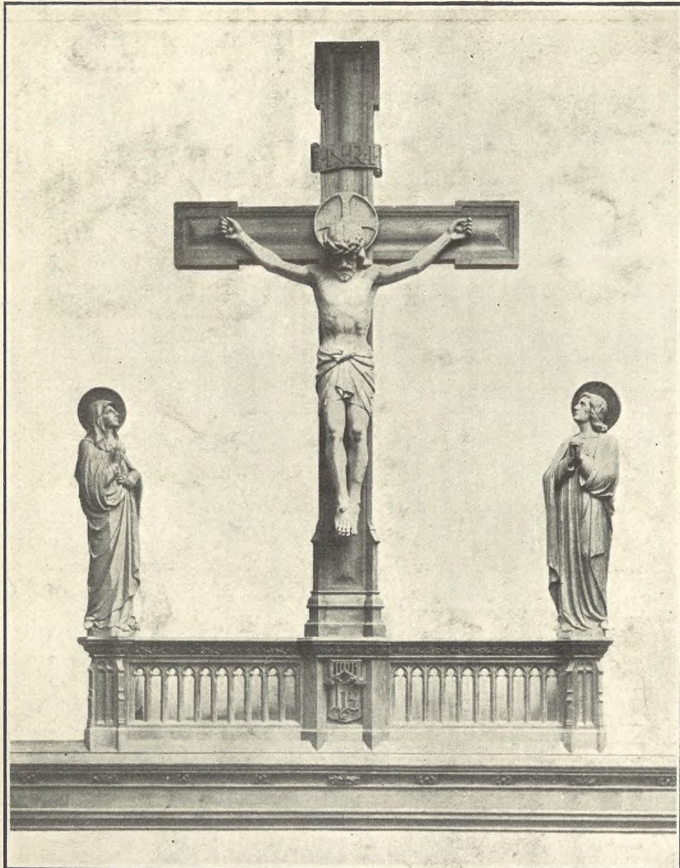

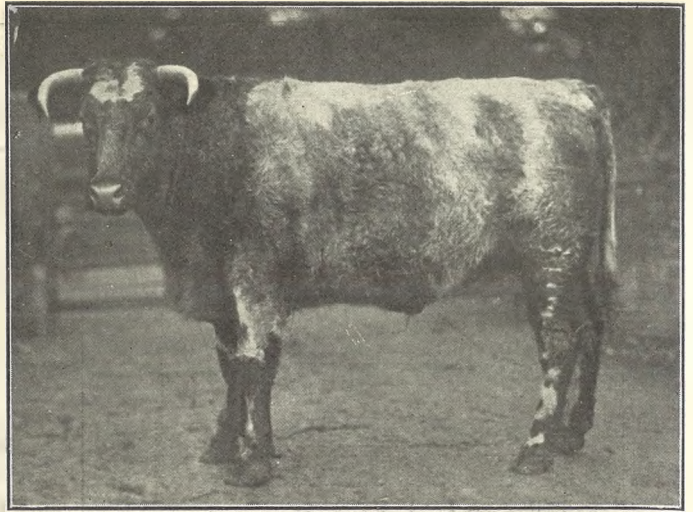

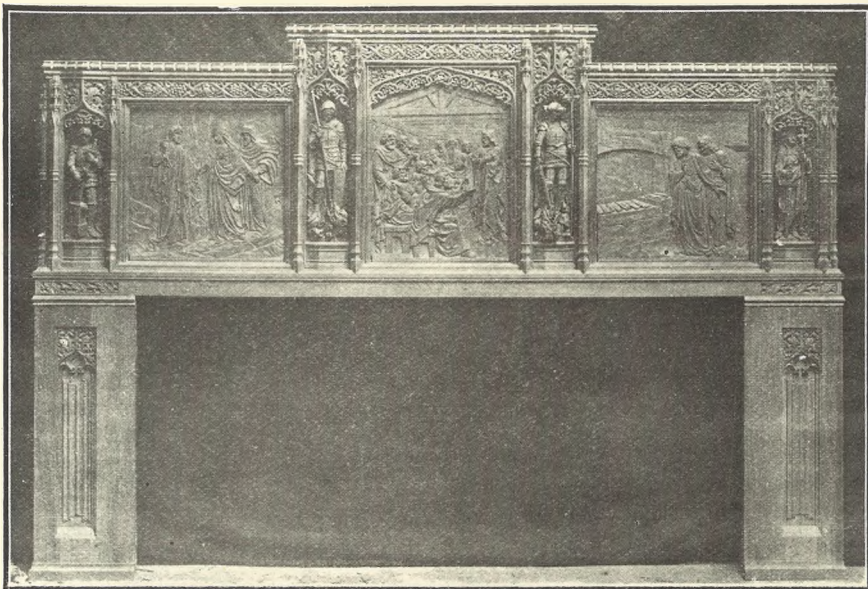
CHRISTMAS GIFTS TO GLOUCESTER UNEMPLOYED.

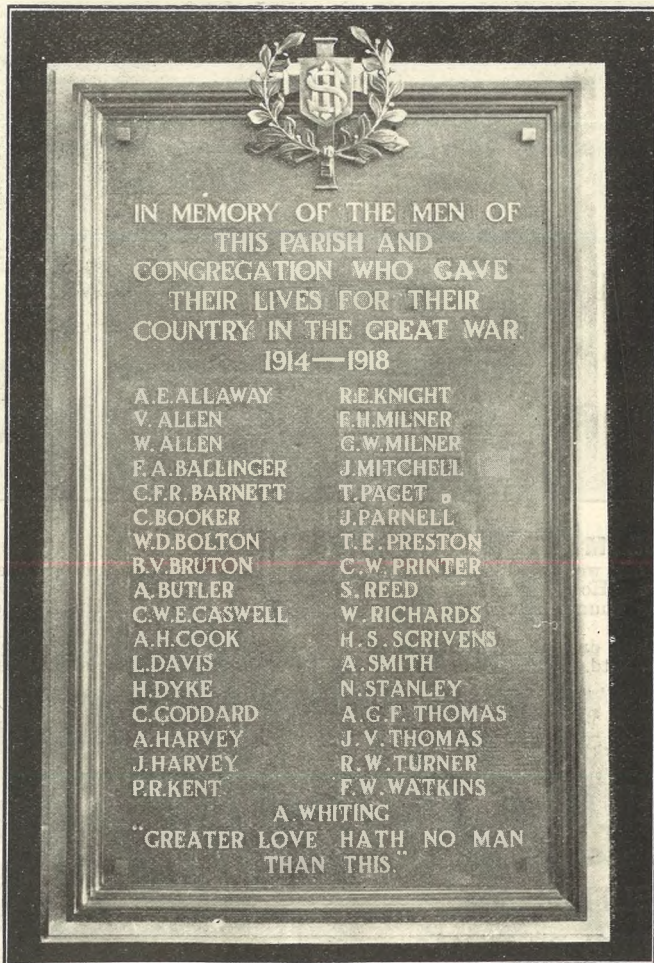

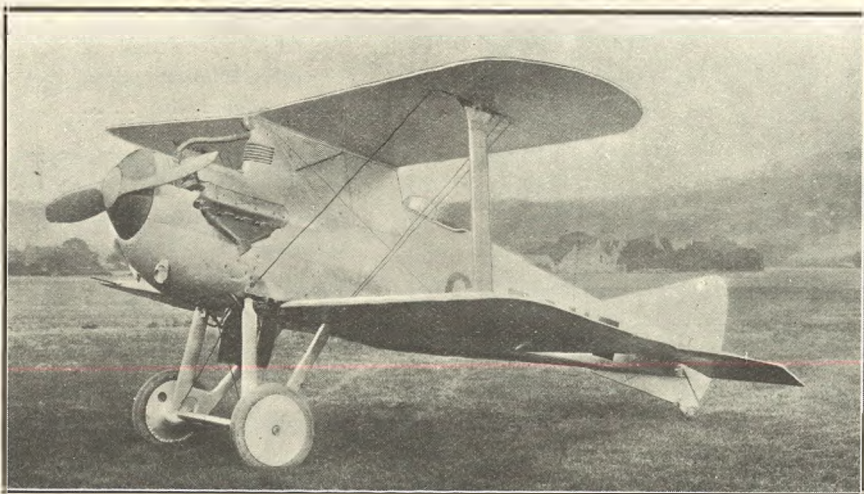

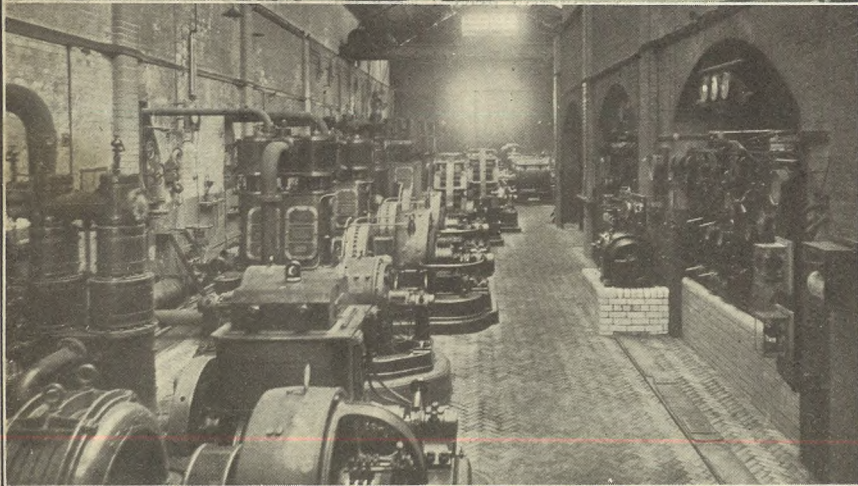
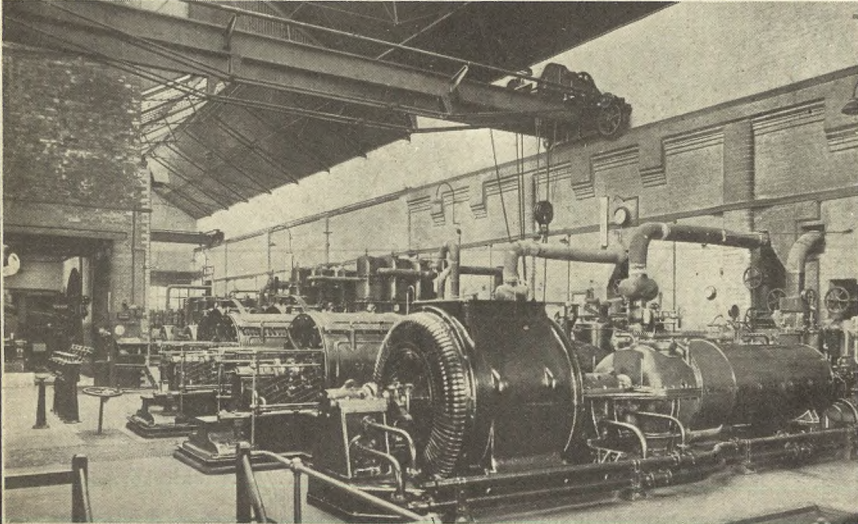
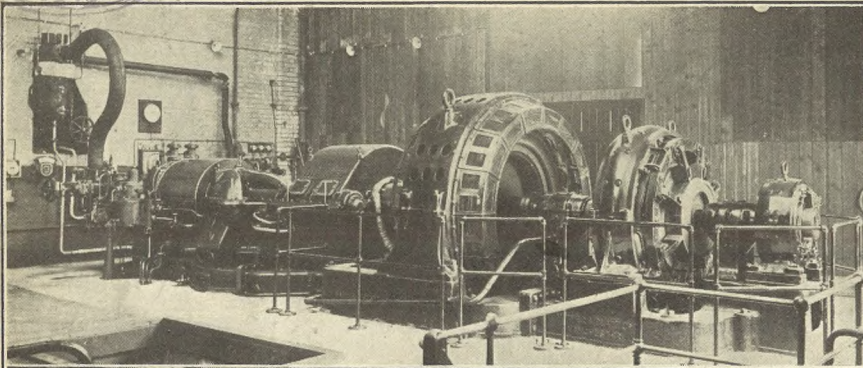


Mr. Fred. R. Dicks,

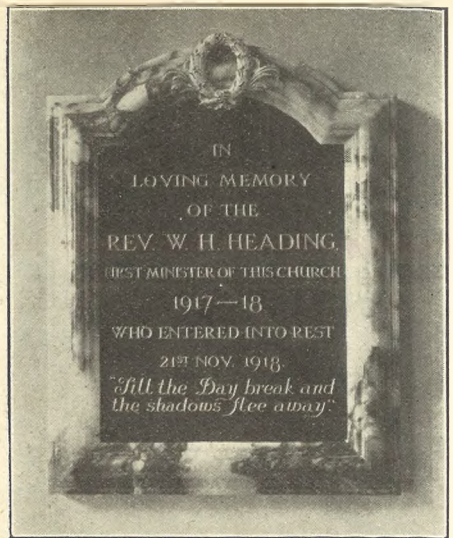
