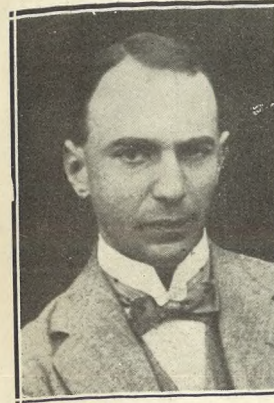

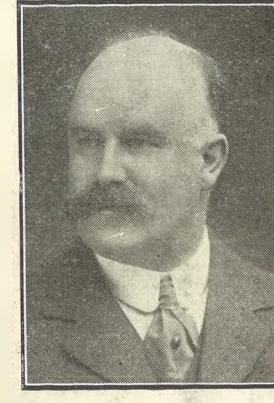

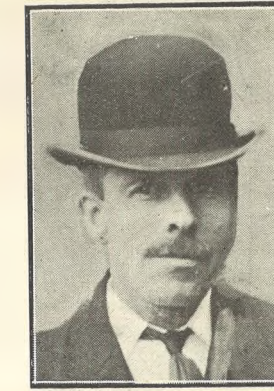
MR. WALTER BAXENDALE,

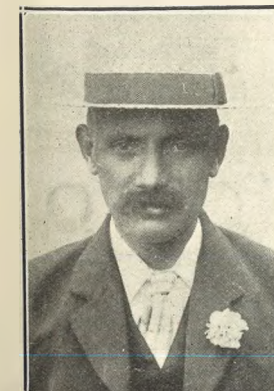
MR. A. O. BUTLER,

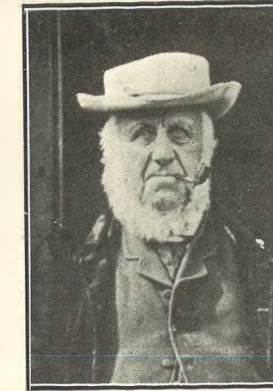
MR. ROLAND BARTLETT,

Of Northleach, who died on Dec. 22nd, aged 81 years. He was a Cotswold worthy of the old school, a shepherd, who worked to within six months of his death.

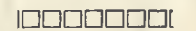


MR. WILLIAM F. WEBB,

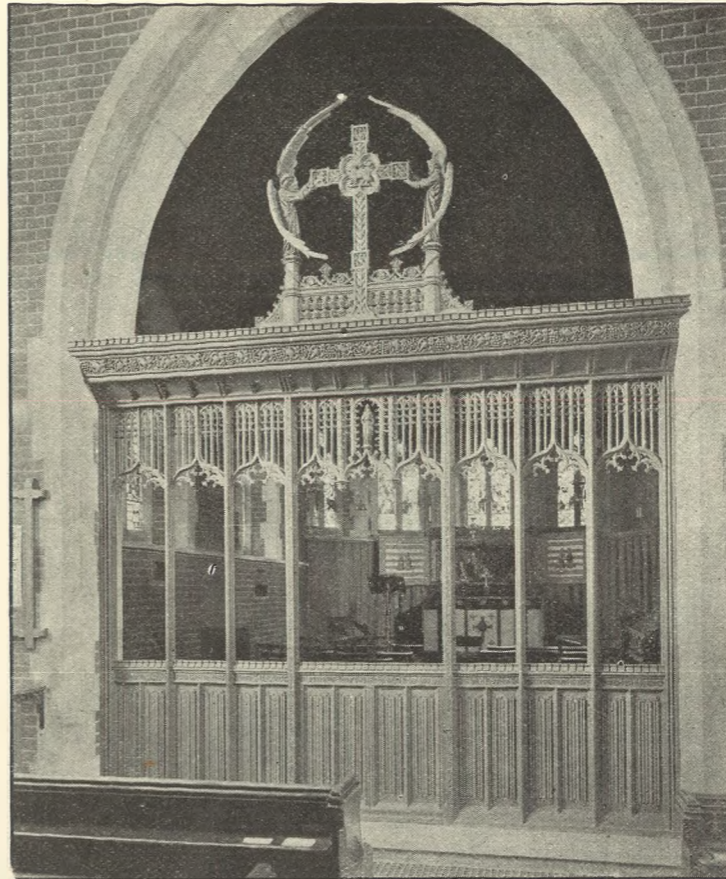

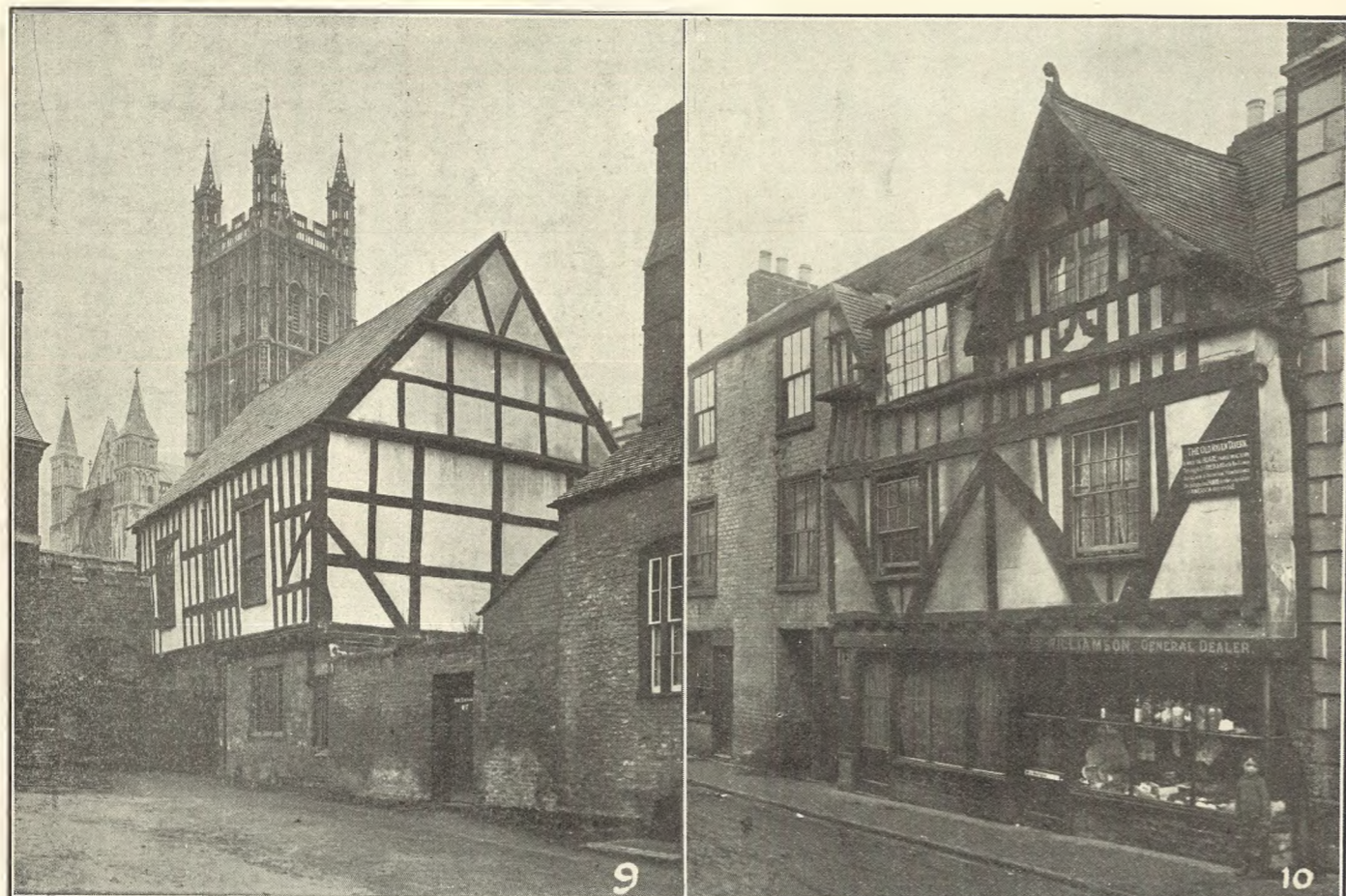

Eight pictures of ancient and picturesque "bits" of Gloucester were published in our issue of Dec. 10th. We give a further series of nine quaint spots in the city. The whole set forms a most interesting souvenir of the County Town.

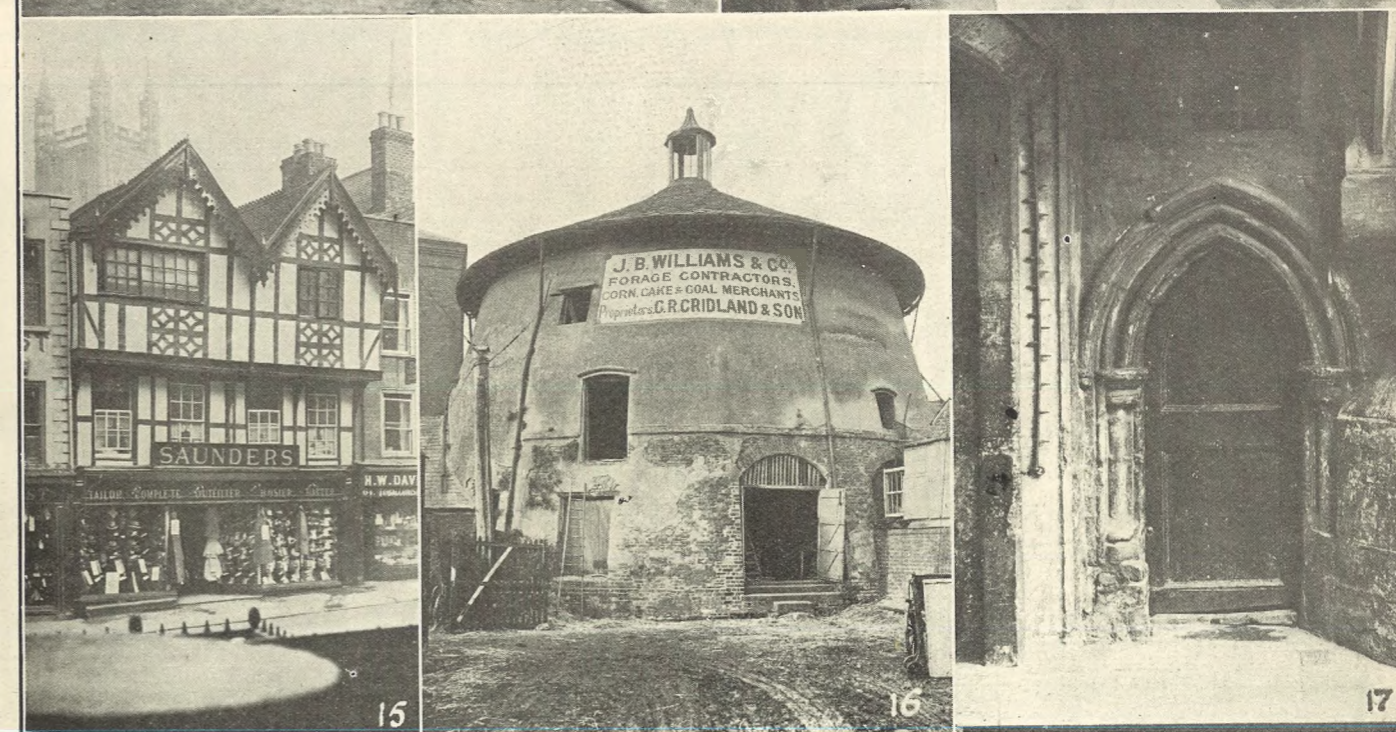
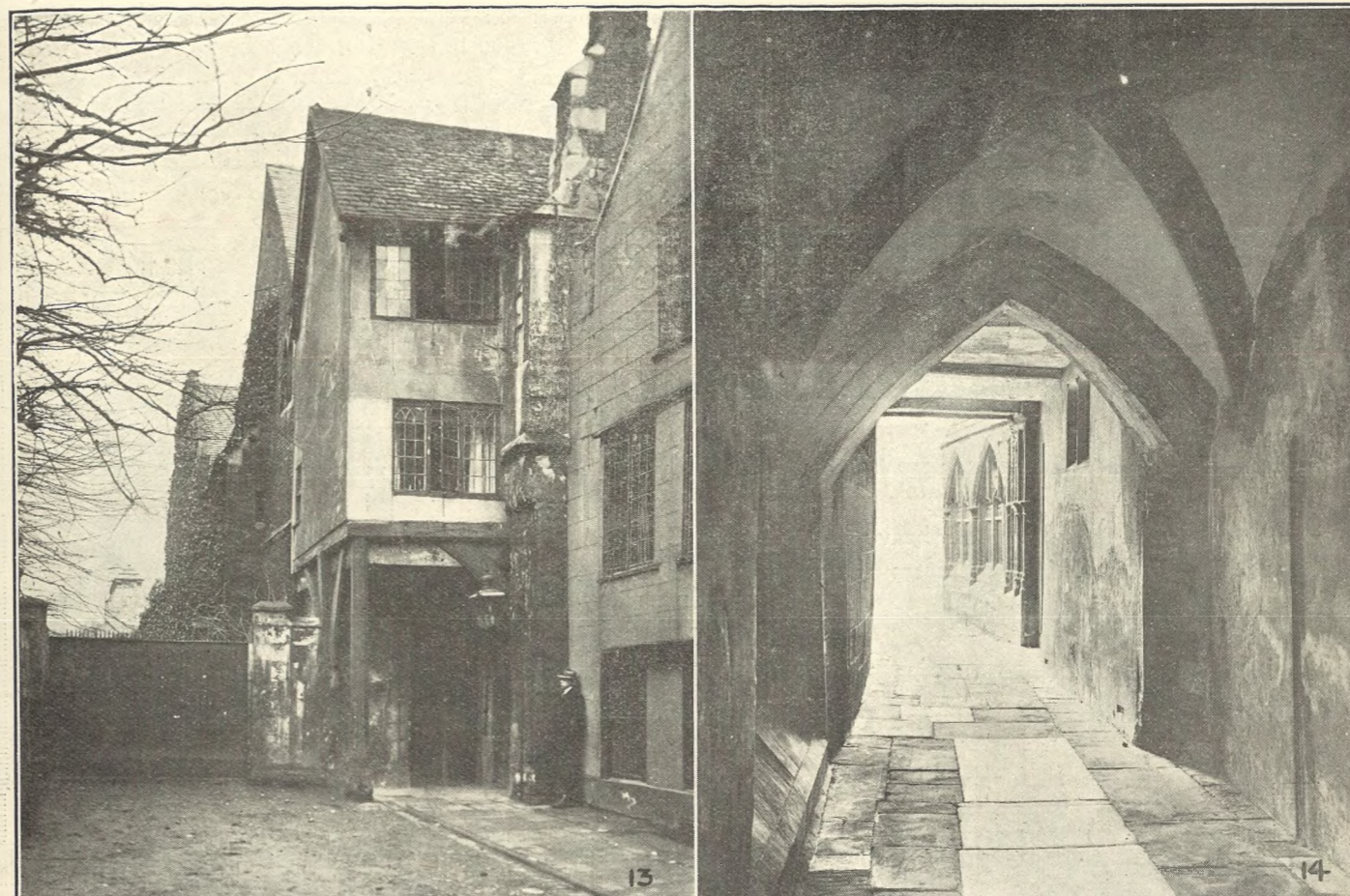
9.—The old Parliament House and the tower of the Cathedral from Palace Yard. in the Mayflower to America, and a tablet on the house announces the fact.

10.—The old Raven Tavern, Park-street. From this house members of the Hoare family sailed with the Pilgrim Fathers.

11.—The old house and arch opposite Bishop Hooper's monument. From these windows spectators watched him burn in 1555.

12.—The first Sunday School in England—old houses in Park-street, where Robert Raikes first taught scholars on a Sunday.

13.—The Little Cloisters, an ancient house adjoining the Cathedral Cloisters, now occupied by Mrs. Loxley. It is a wonderfully interesting old place, and contains a finely panelled room. Some years ago a subterranean passage leading from the kitchen towards the Cathedral was discovered and partially excavated and explored.

14.—The groined passage under the Little Cloisters, which gives it its name.

15.—Bits of three ages of Gloucester, taken from the Shire-hall steps. In the foreground the circular object is the top of one of the old Roman bases of columns discovered in the city, opposite is a fine old half-timbered house, and behind is a peep of the Cathedral Tower.

16.—The old round house on the Quay.

17.—A fine old doorway in the Little Cloisters.

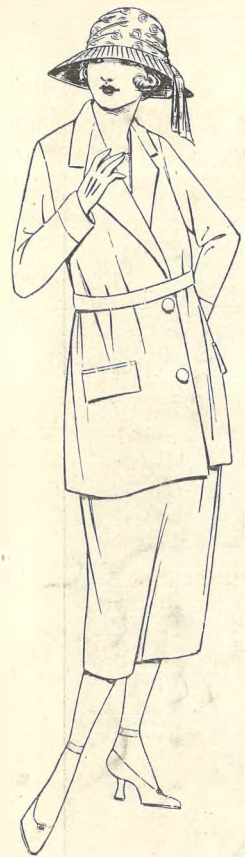

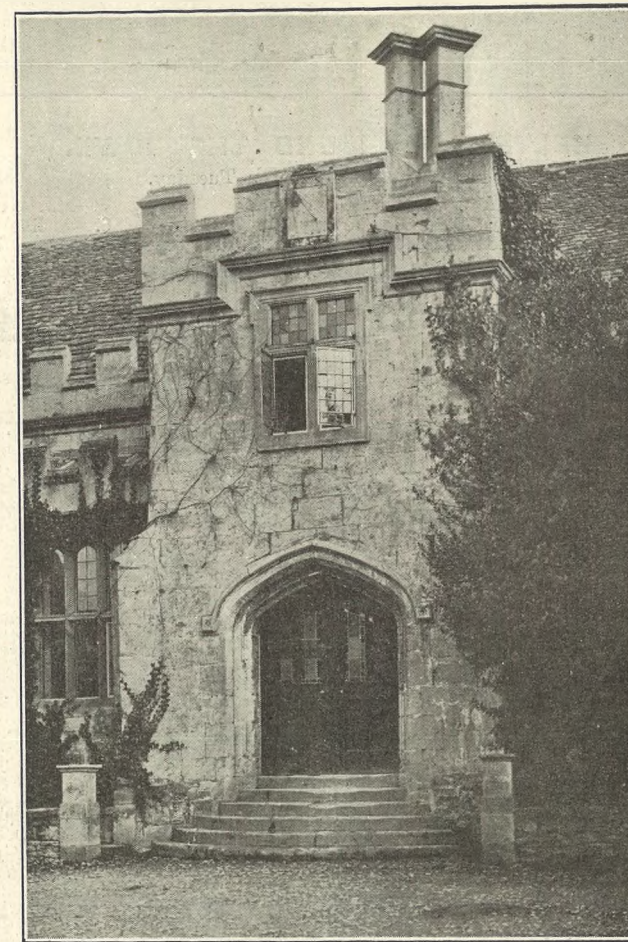

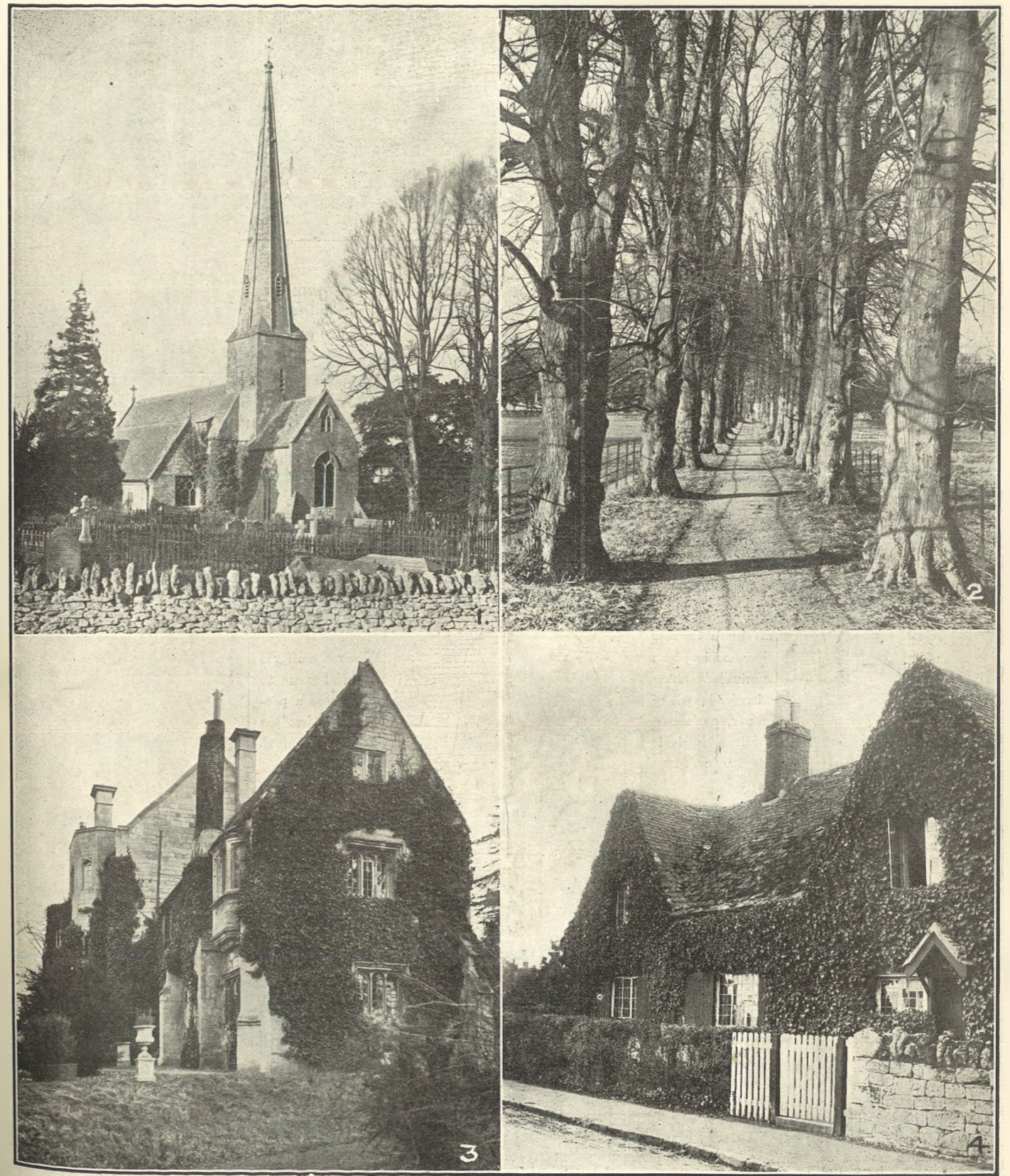

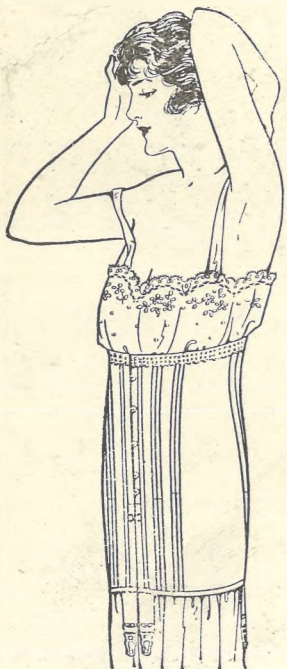

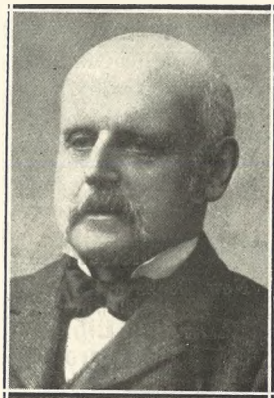

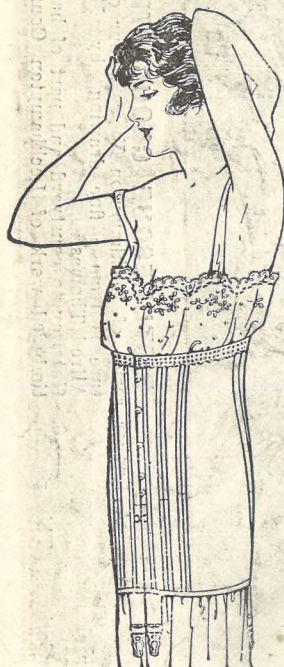

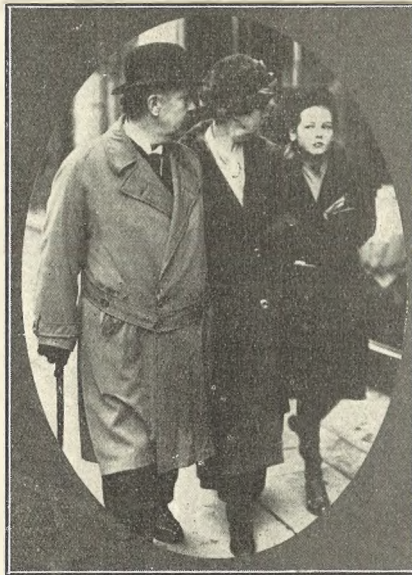
