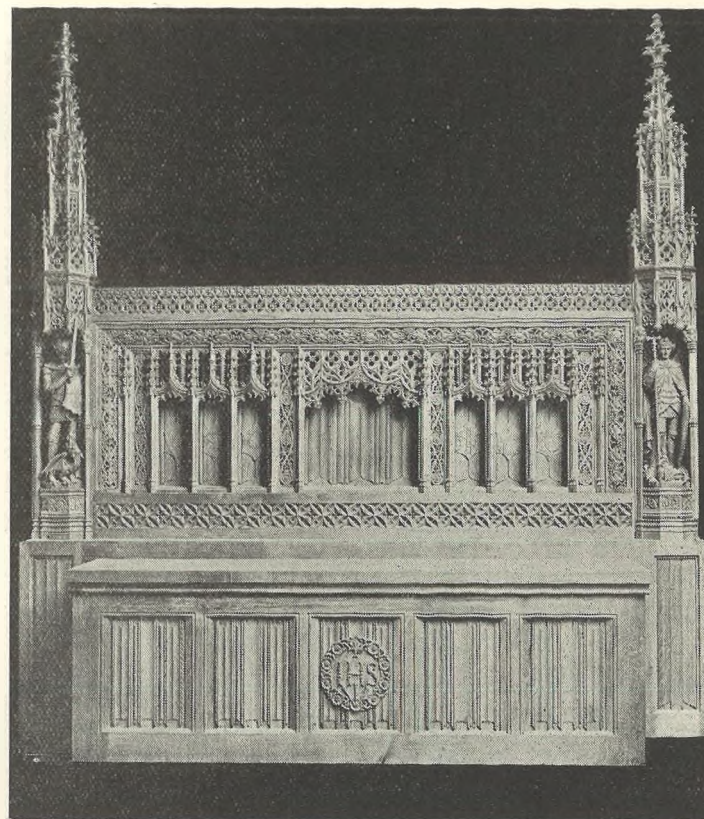

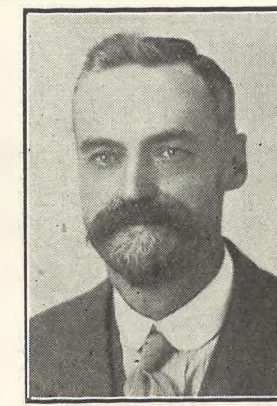
A FINE REREDOS.

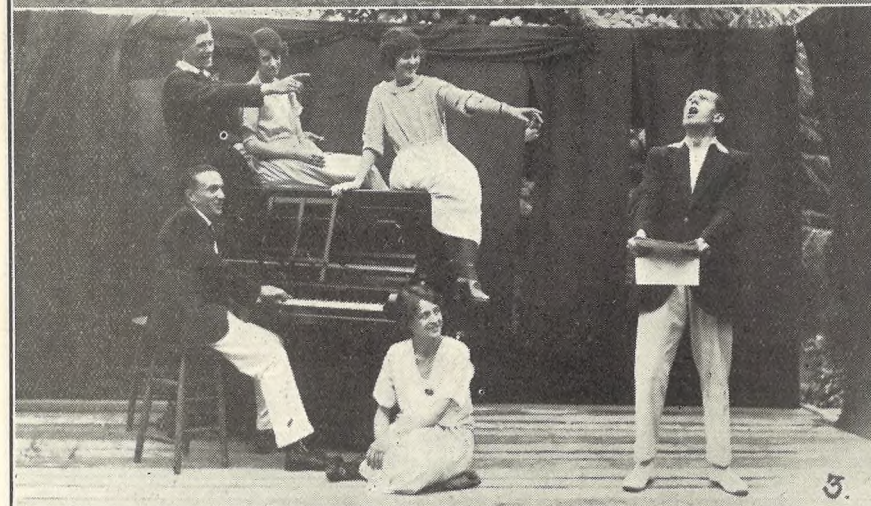


CHELTHENHAM COLLEGE SPEECH DAY.

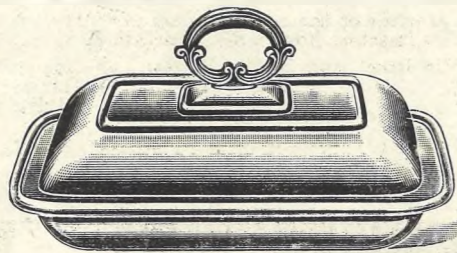

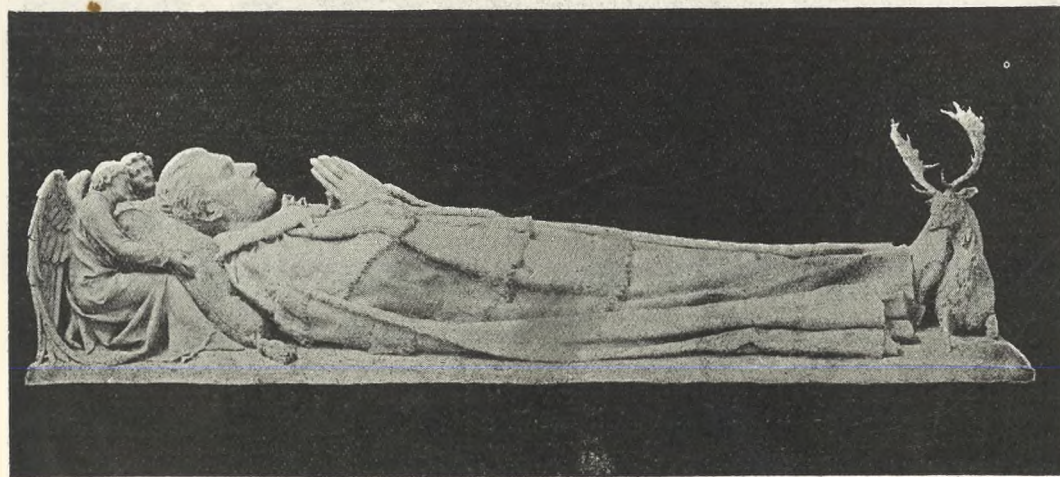

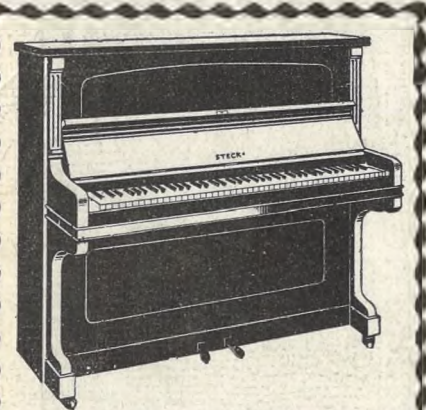

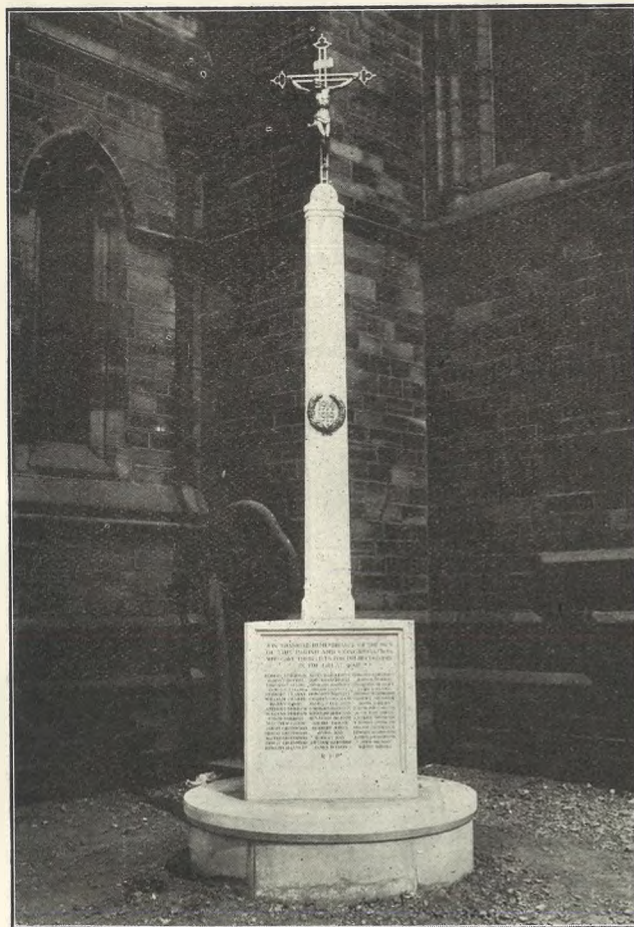

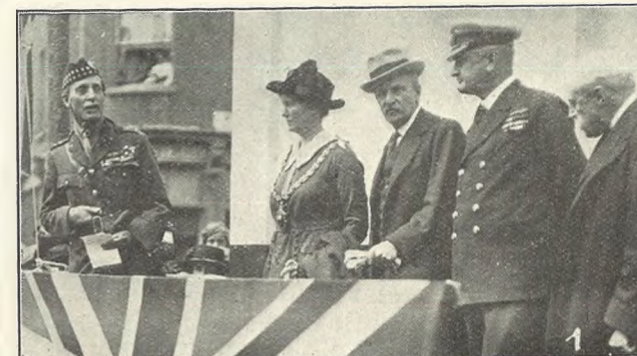

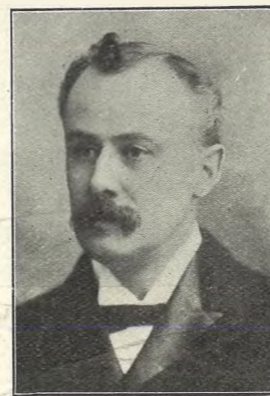
