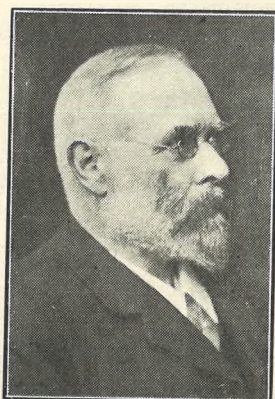

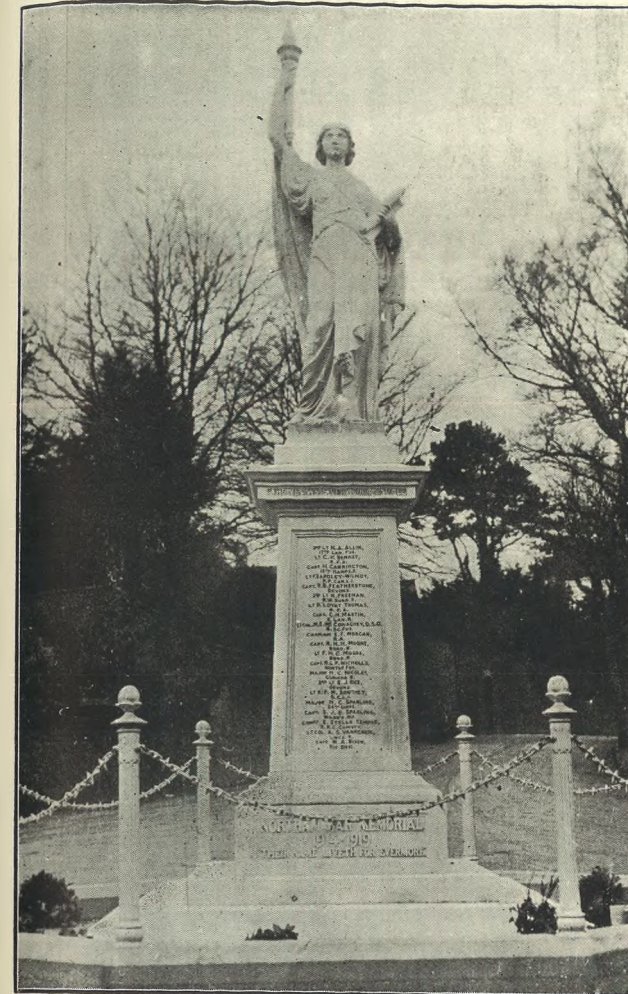

WESTERN TEMPERANCE LEAGUE CONFERENCE IN GLOUCESTER.

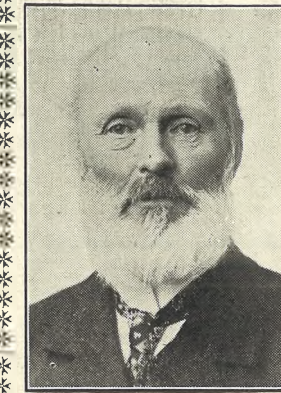

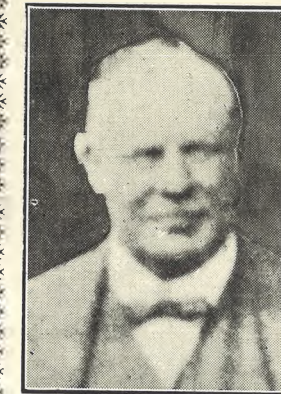


Northam War Memorial.

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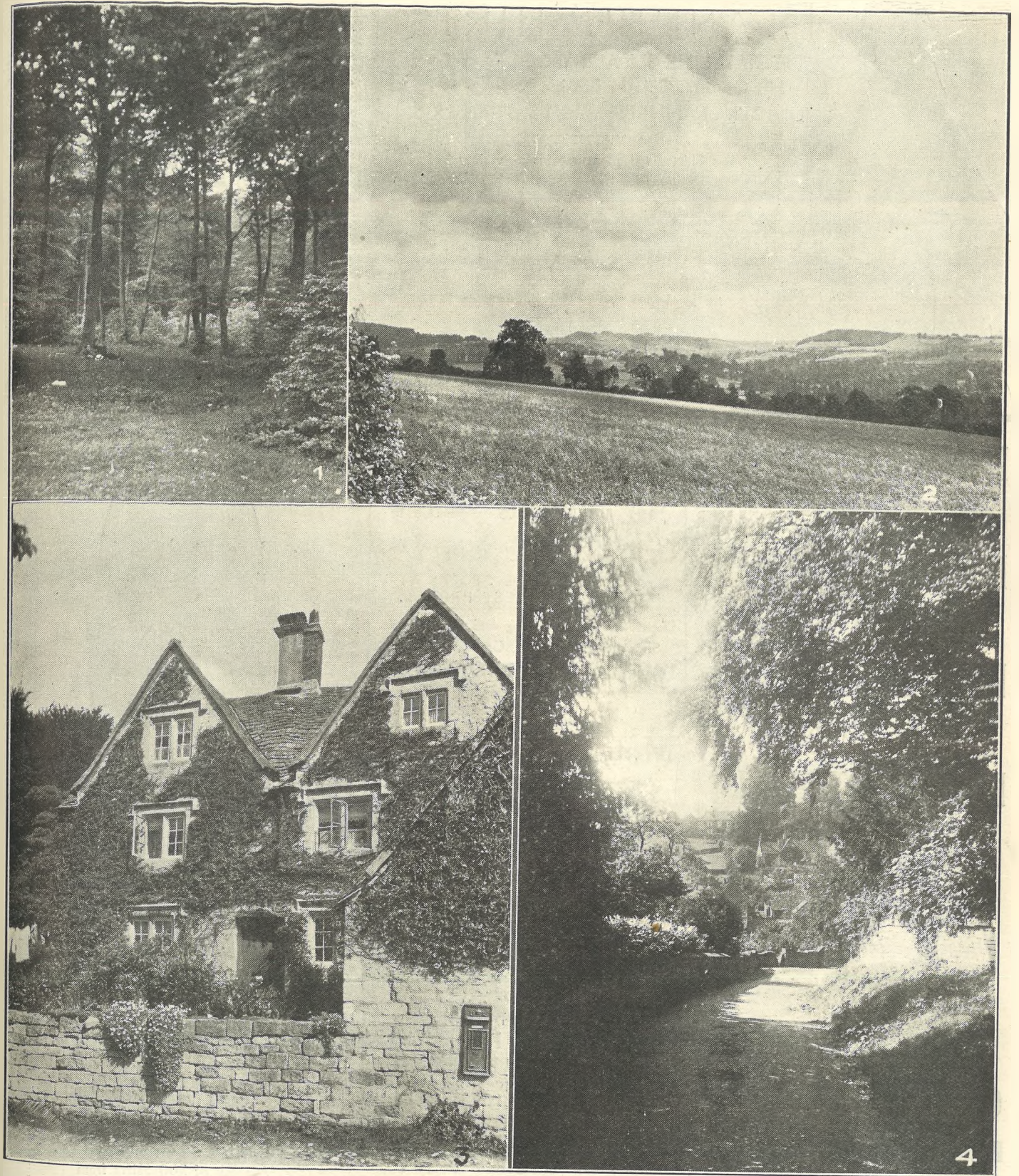

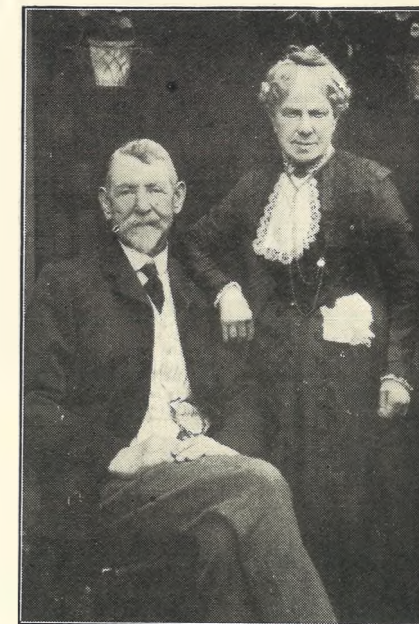

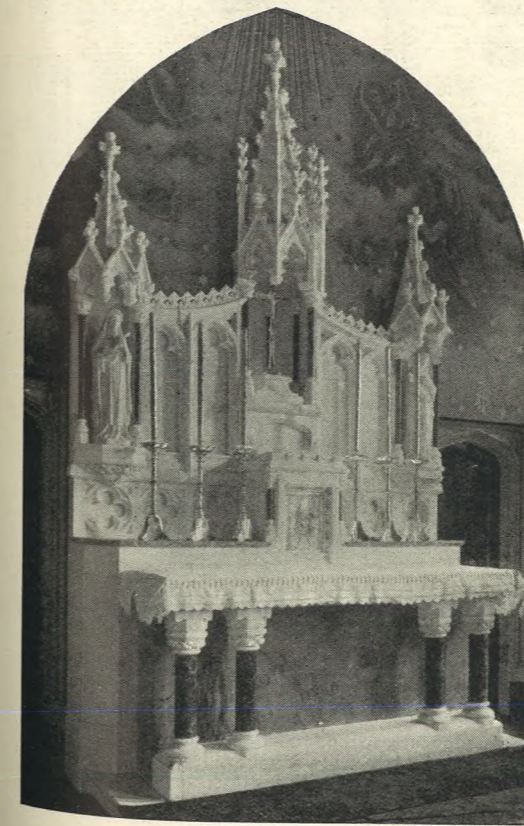

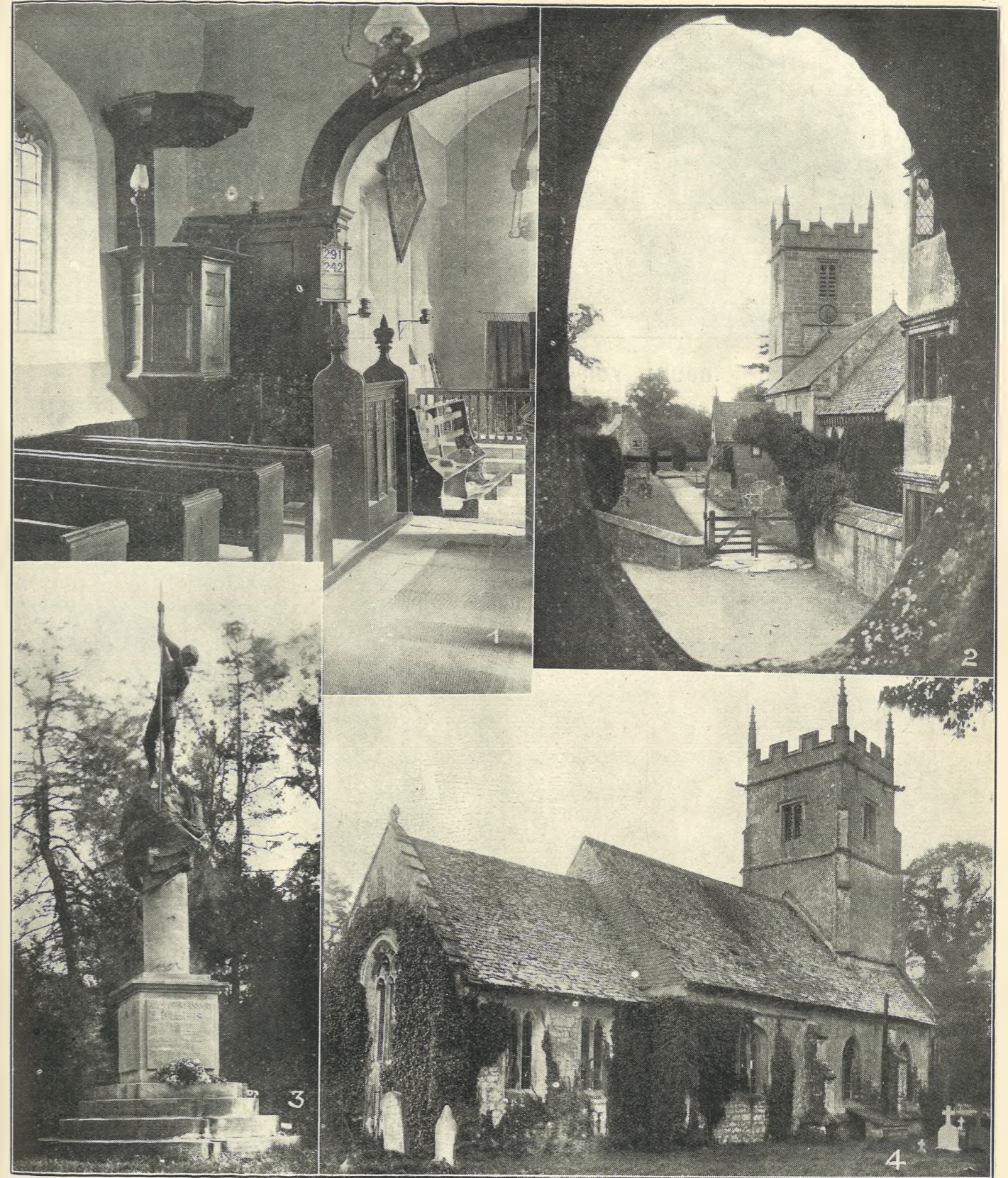


CHEL TENHAM ROUND THE TOWN.
