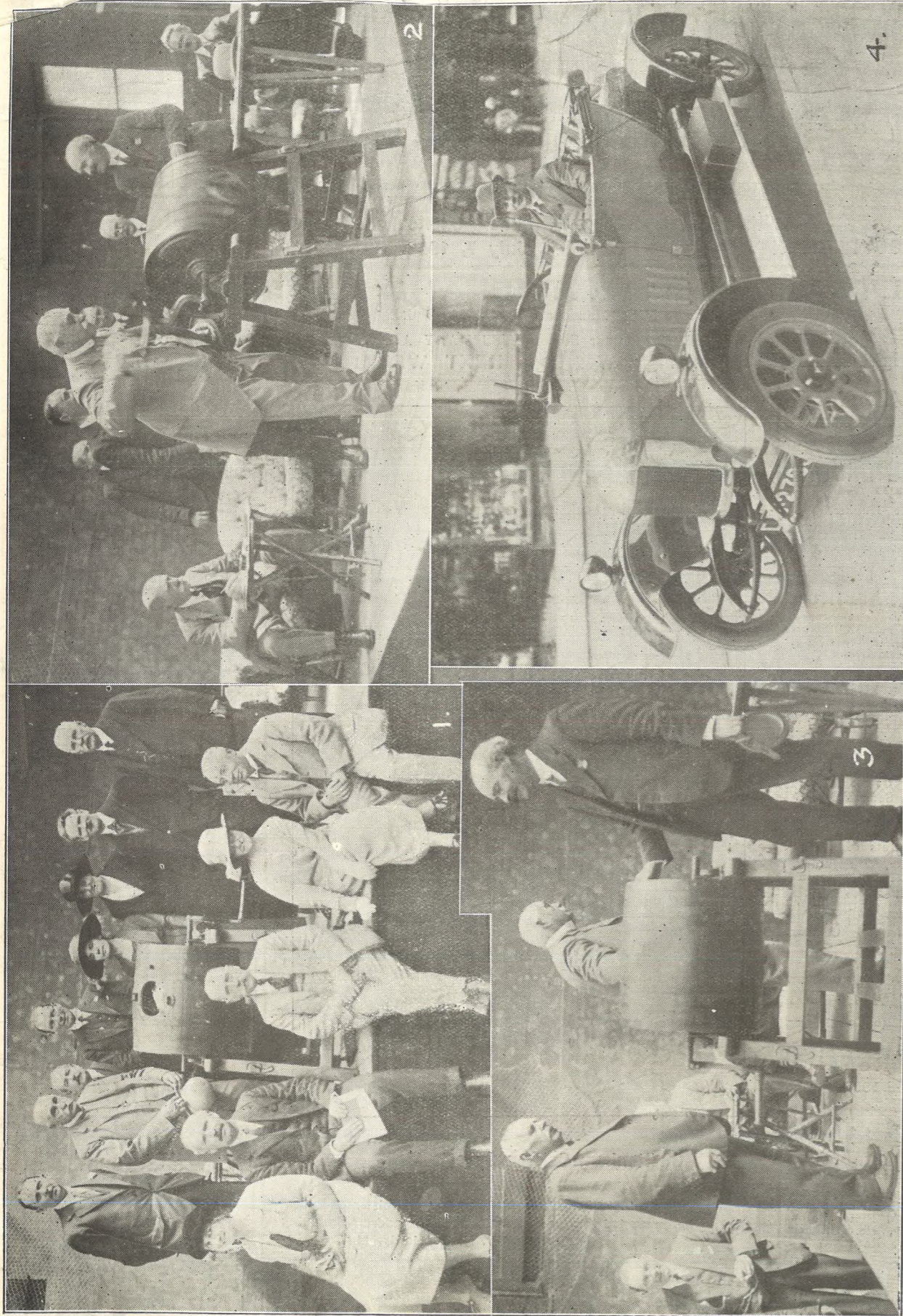

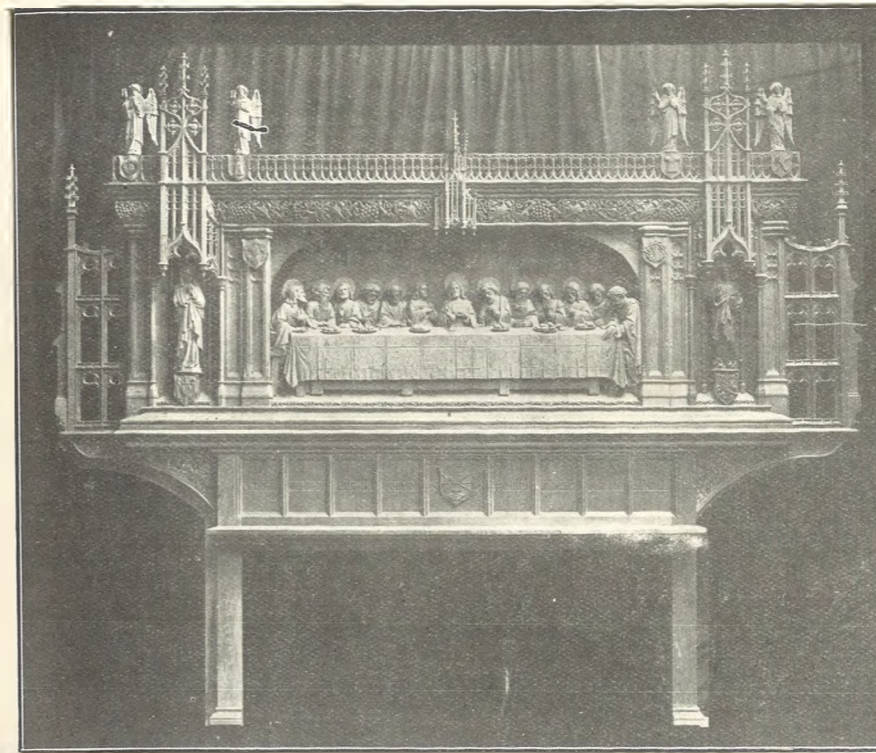

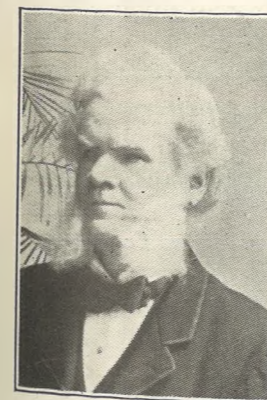


ARLE COURT HARRIERS' PUPPY SHOW.

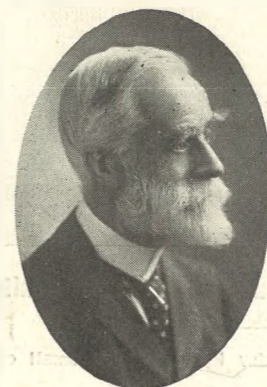

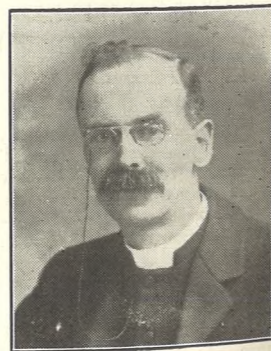

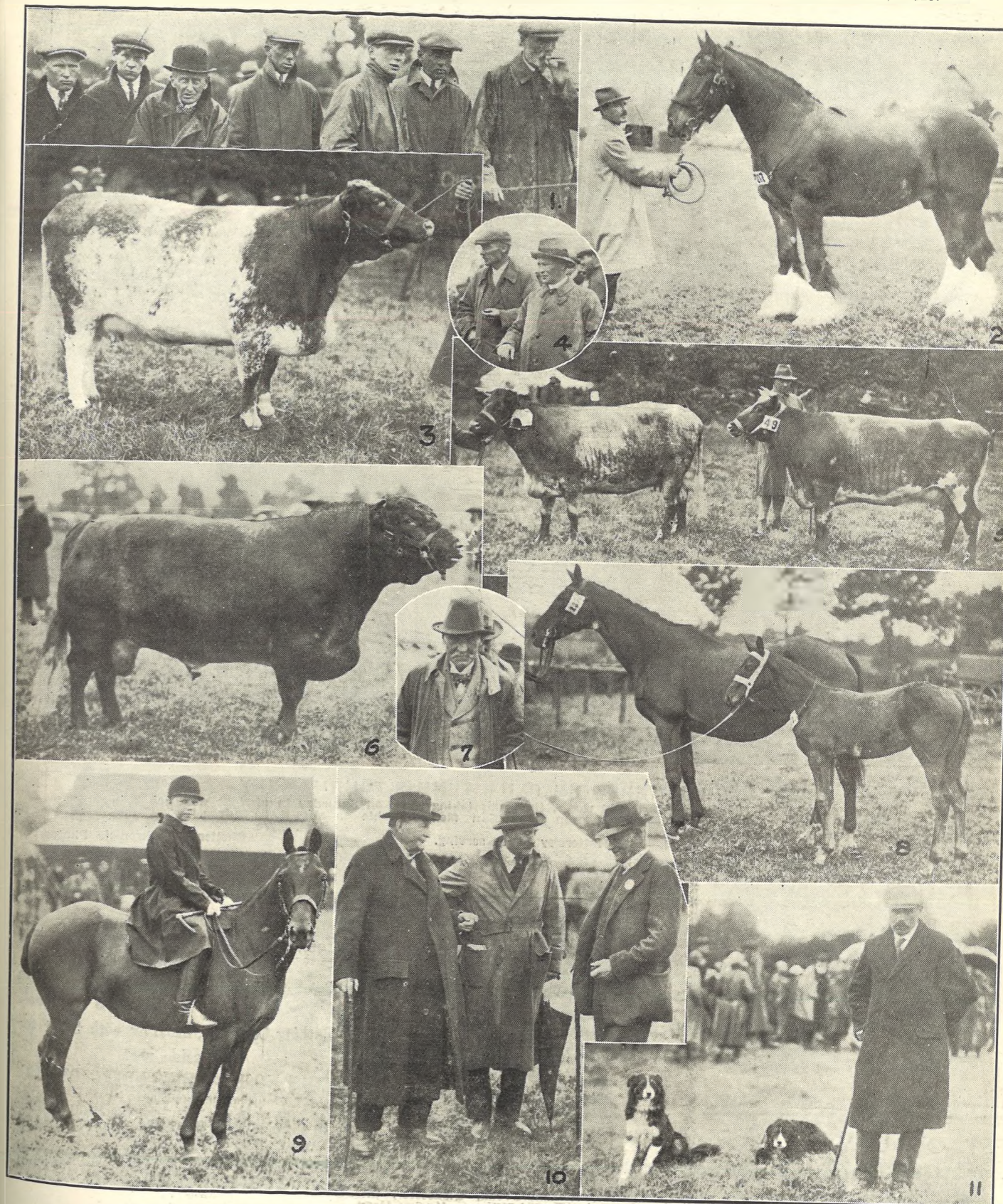


UNVEILING ELMSTONE HARDWICKE AND UCKINGTON WAR MEMORIAL.

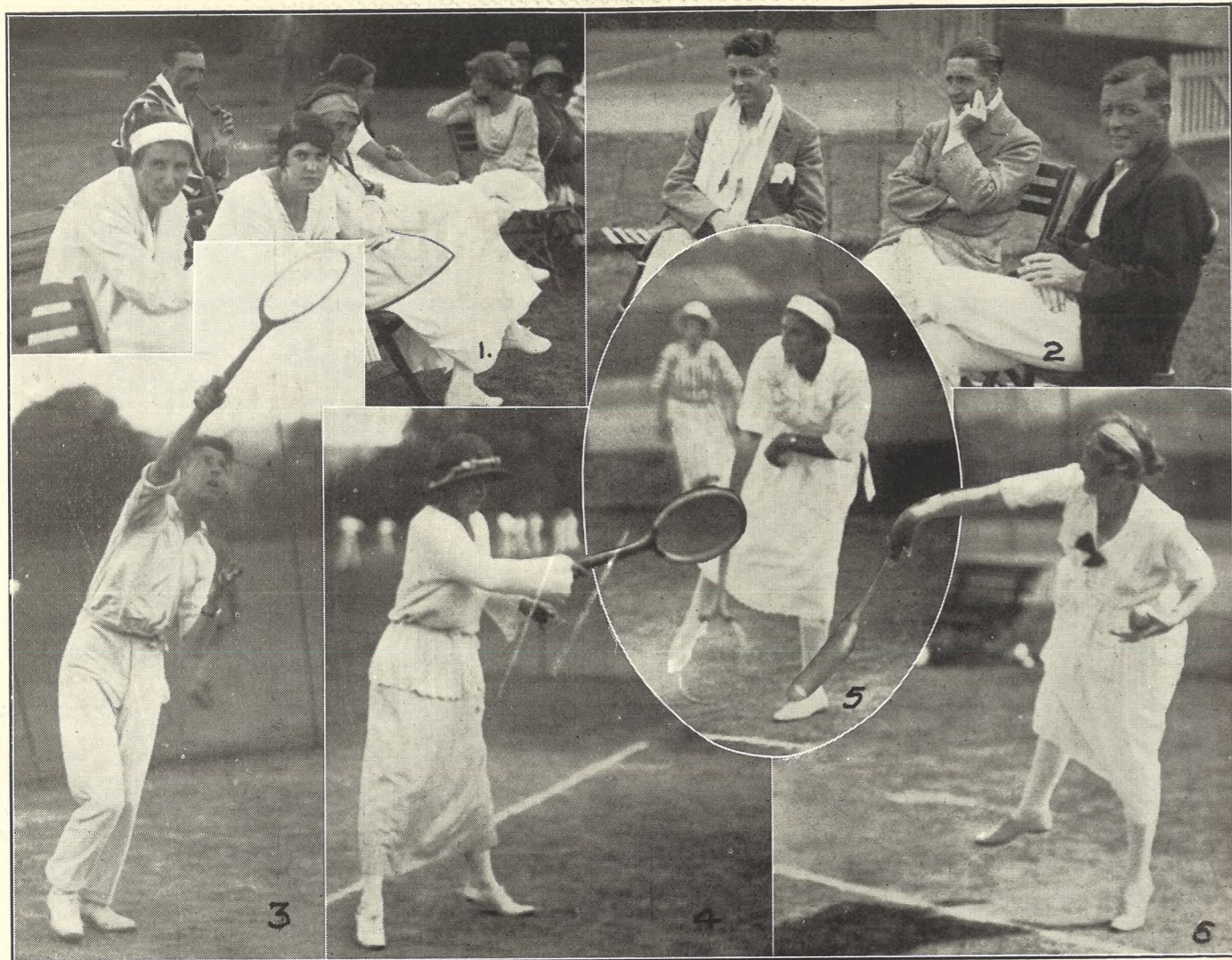

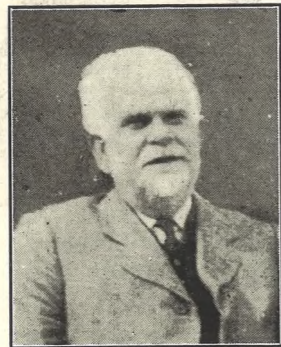
