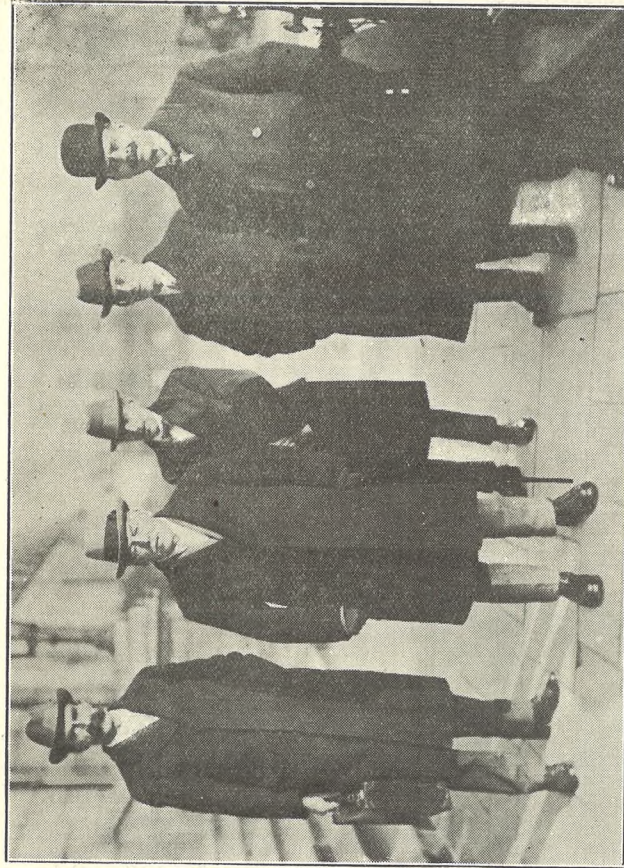



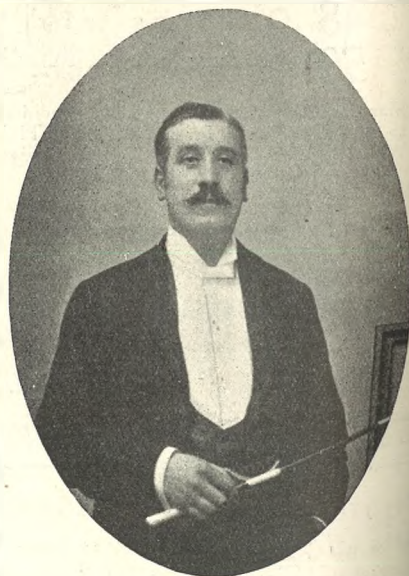

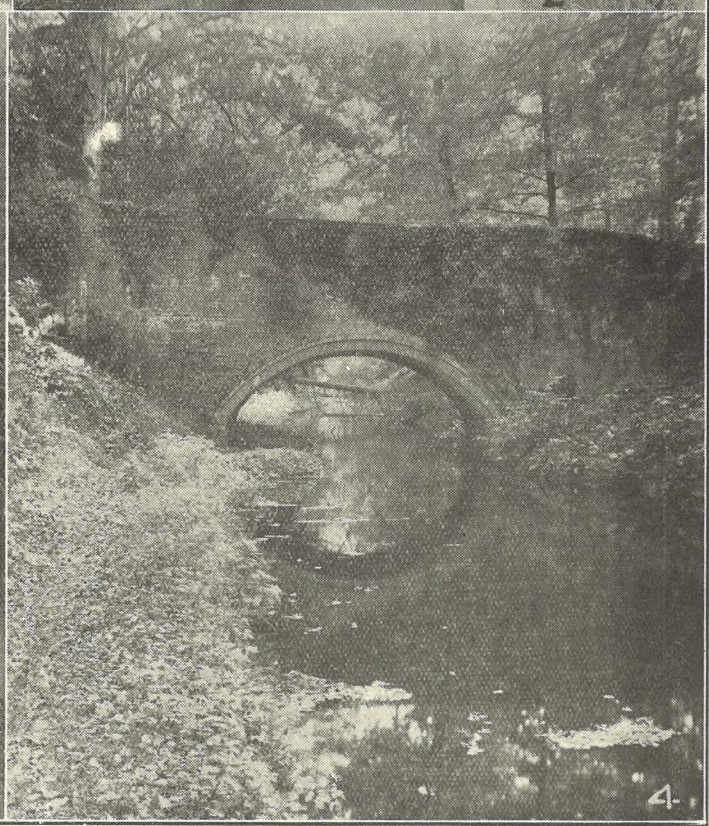

PICTURESQUE GLOUCESTERSHIRE.—DYMOCK.

Dymock, a large village four miles beyond Newent, on the Gloucester-Ledbury road, has lately been celebrating the 800th anniversary of the consecration of its Church, which is contemporaneous with Tewkesbury Abbey. The disused Ledbury-Gloucester Canal, whose banks are now overgrown with fine timber, is a most picturesque spot, and forms part of the pleasure grounds on the estate of Mr. G. O. Deane.

PICTURESQUE GLOUCESTERSHIRE: CHEDWORTH.

Chedworth is one of the most picturesque and interesting villages of the Cotswolds. It has a station on the Cheltenham and Cirencester Section of the M. and S.W.J. Railway, now absorbed by the G.W.R., and is situated in a secluded valley on the sides of which its quaint old stone houses are built. The Church is a handsome one, and well worth a visit. It was built about 1485. It has a Norman tower and a beautiful Perpendicular nave. An interesting feature is the original Medieval paving to the South door from the Churchyard Gate. A disused staircase to the rood loft huilt outside the wall is an unusual feature.

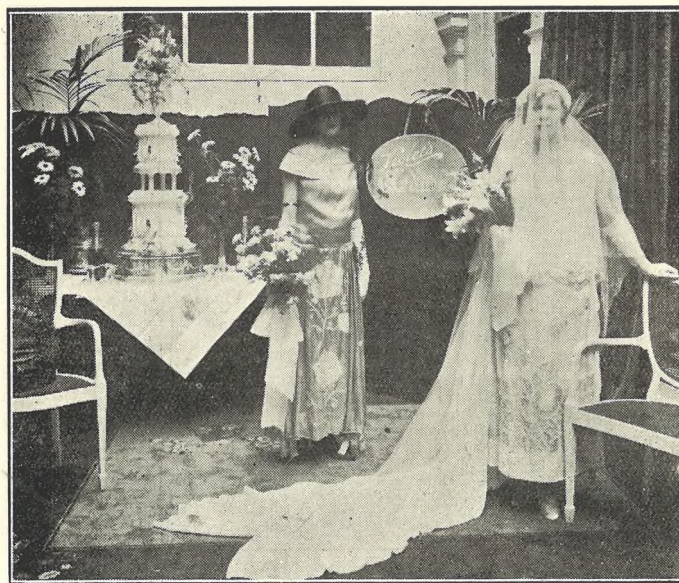

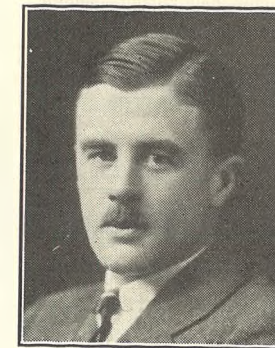

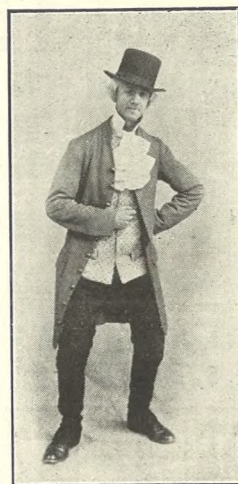

LAYING A TRAIL OF PENNIES IN CHELTENHAM FOR THE UNEMPLOYED.

On Saturday morning last, in aid of the Christmas Fund for Cheltenham Unemployed, a trail of pennies was laid in the main streets of the town. In the absence of the Mayor, through indisposition, Alderman C. H. Margrett started things going at the corner of the Colonnade and High Street. Owing to the bad weather, the attempt to make a mile of them was not successful, only about £44 being raised.

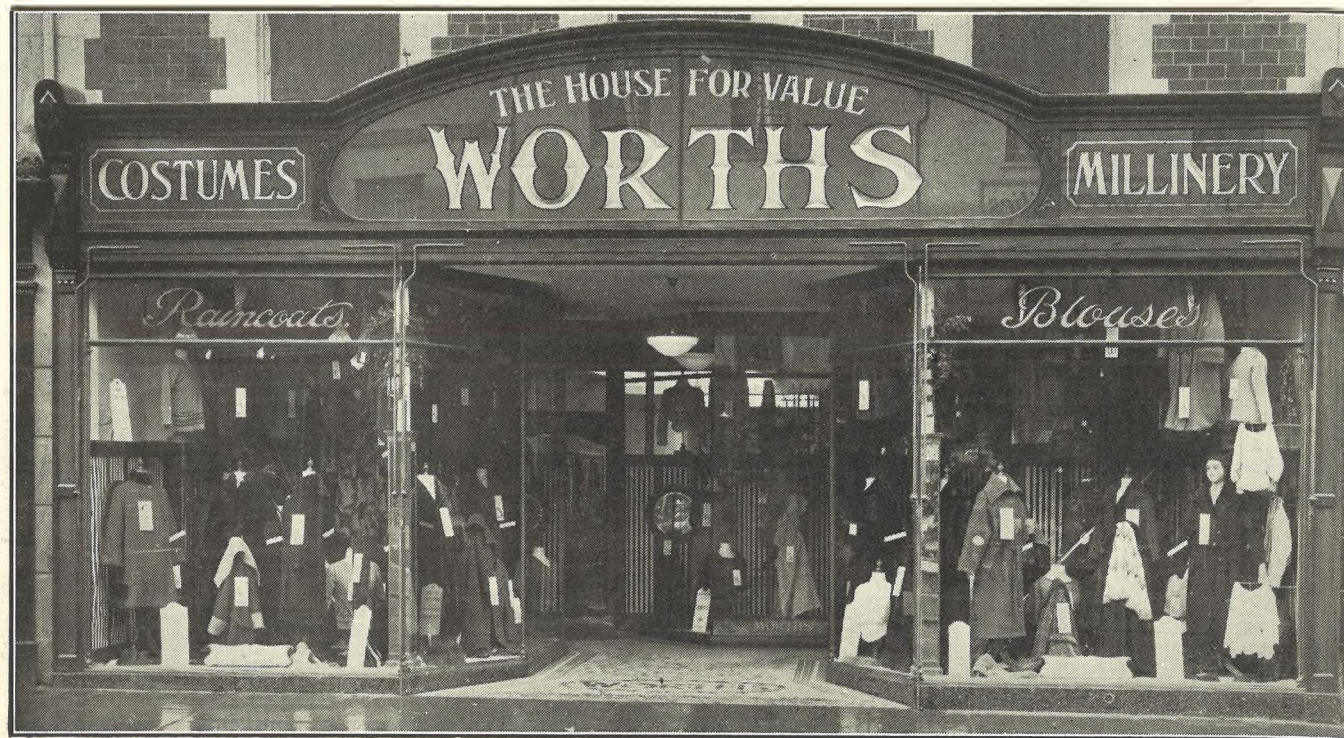

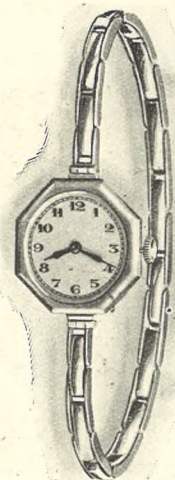


PICTURESQUE GLOUCESTERSHIRE.—ALSTONE.

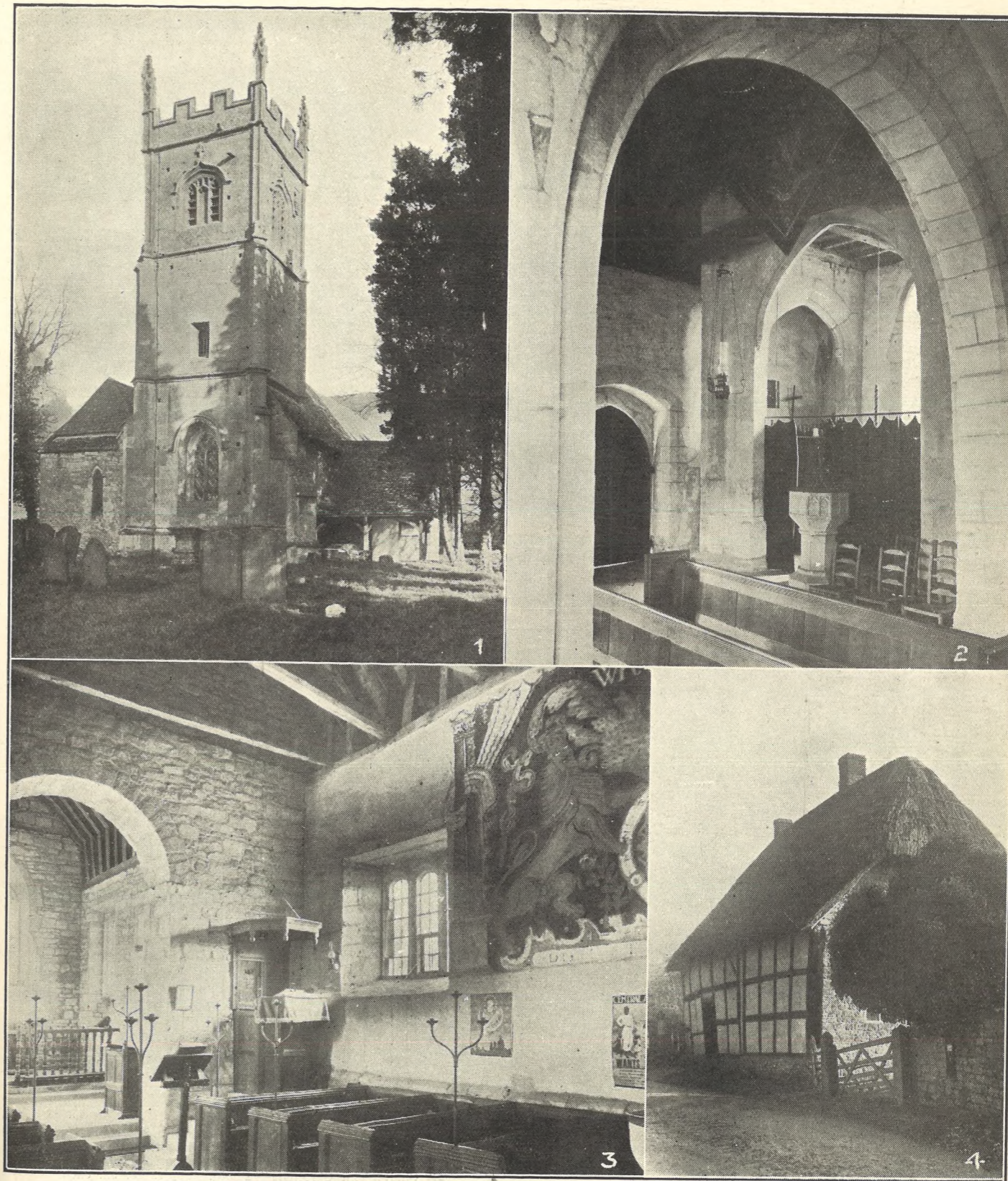

PICTURESQUE GLOUCESTERSHIRE.—OXENTON AND WOOLSTONE.

Oxenton, Woolstone, and Teddington are small villages lying close together, about seven miles from Cheltenham, on the Evesham Road, Teddington being slightly over the border in a projecting arm of Worcestershire. The church at Oxenton is intensely interesting, built in Early English style with many quaint features.

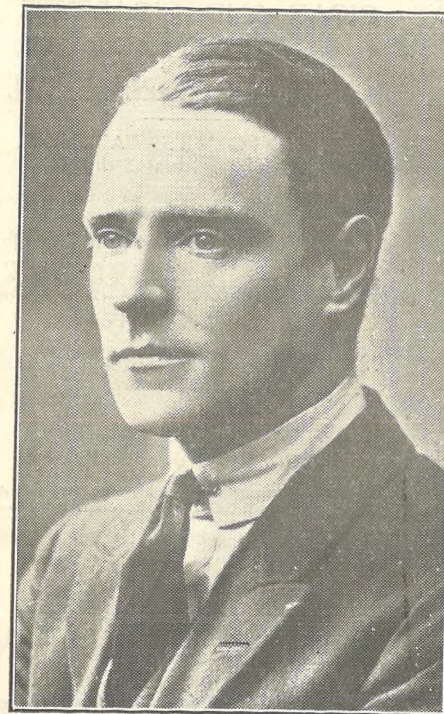

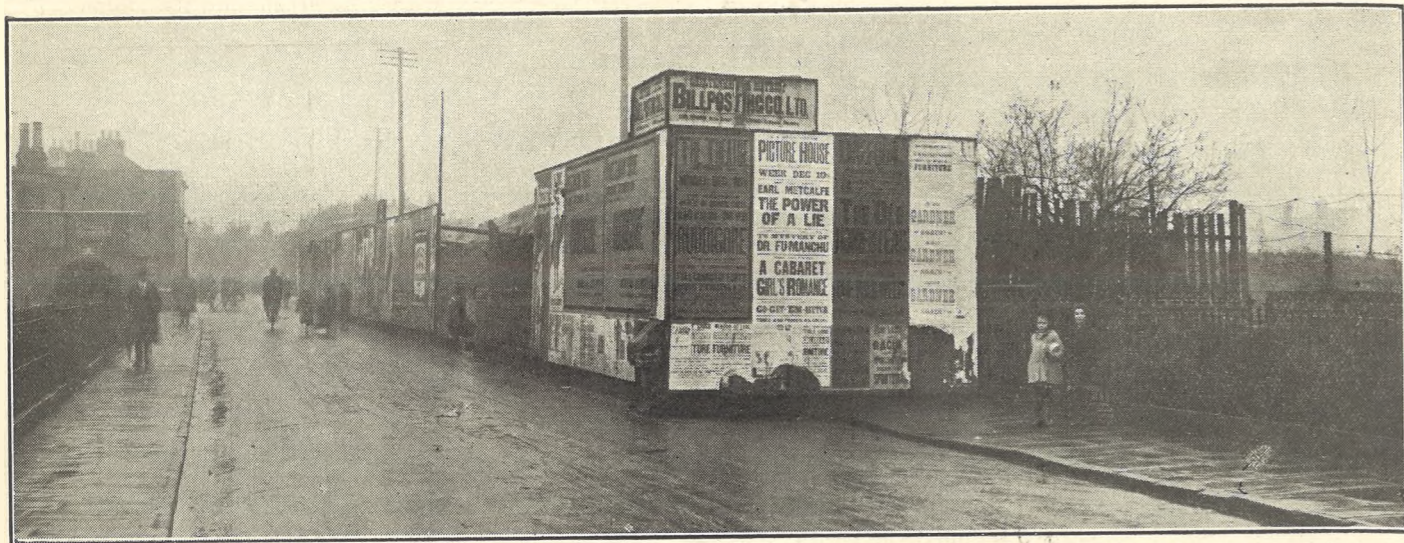

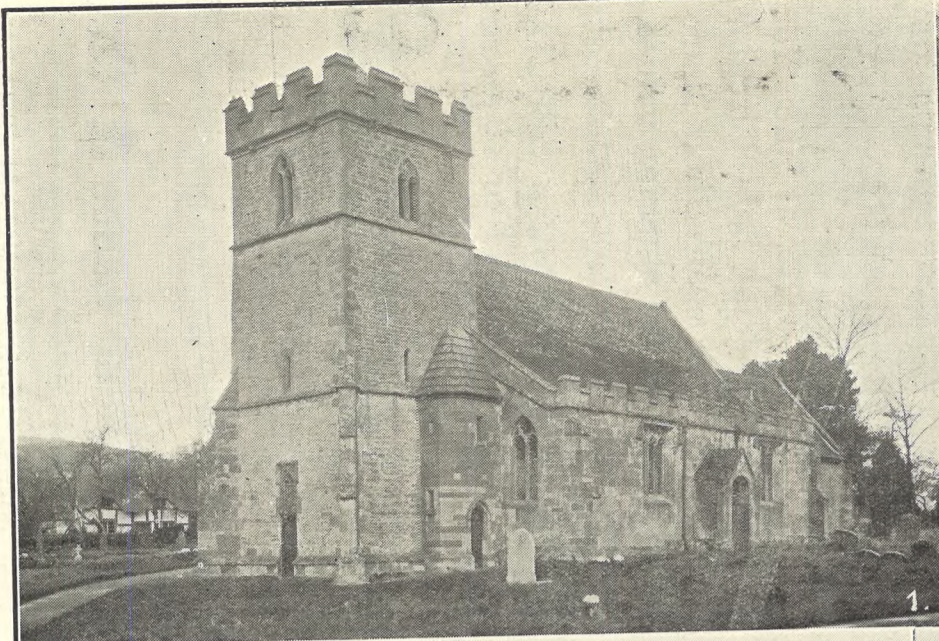

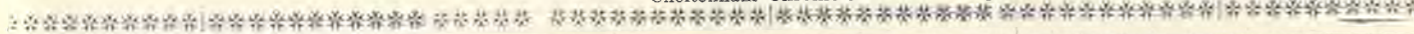

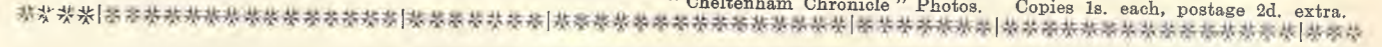
