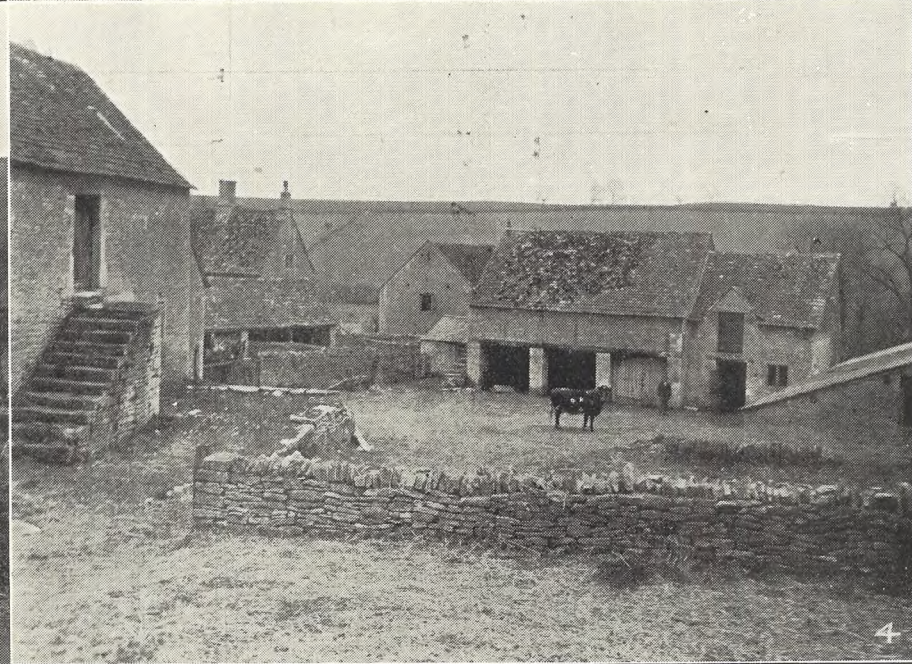

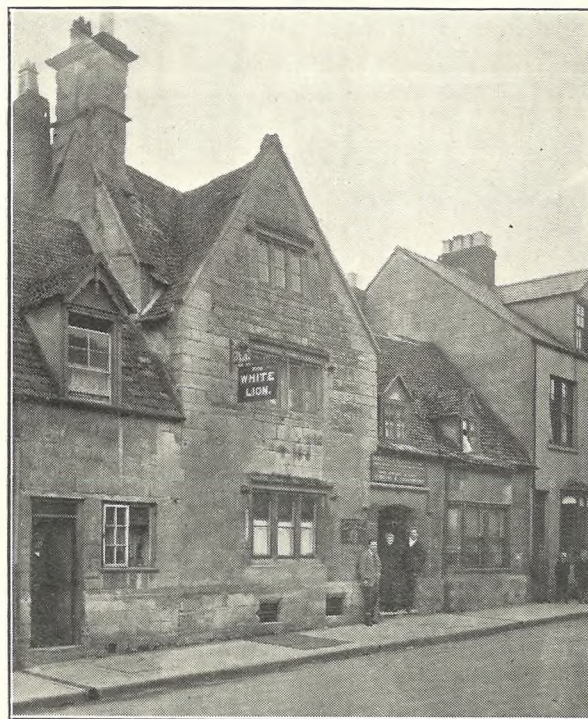

**THE GREAT THUNDER STORM ON MONDAY.**

On Monday afternoon last, this district was visited by a thunderstorm, during which a phenomenal rainfall occurred, something like two inches falling in less than an hour. Cheltenham and Gloucester and the district between were flooded out. We give some views of the effects of the rainfall.

1.—The Flood at the Boundary, Wotton, Gloucester. This is the main road to Barnwood.

2.—The road at Shurdington. For a couple of hours (5 to 7 p.m.) the whole of Shurdington-road through the village was submerged.

3.—Upton-lane Bridge, near Gloucester, damaged by the tremendous rush of water.

4.—The Cheltenham to Churchdown and Gloucester 'Bus stranded under the Hatherley-road railway bridge for an hour, until the water subsided. Passengers had to grin and bear it. Water got into the works.

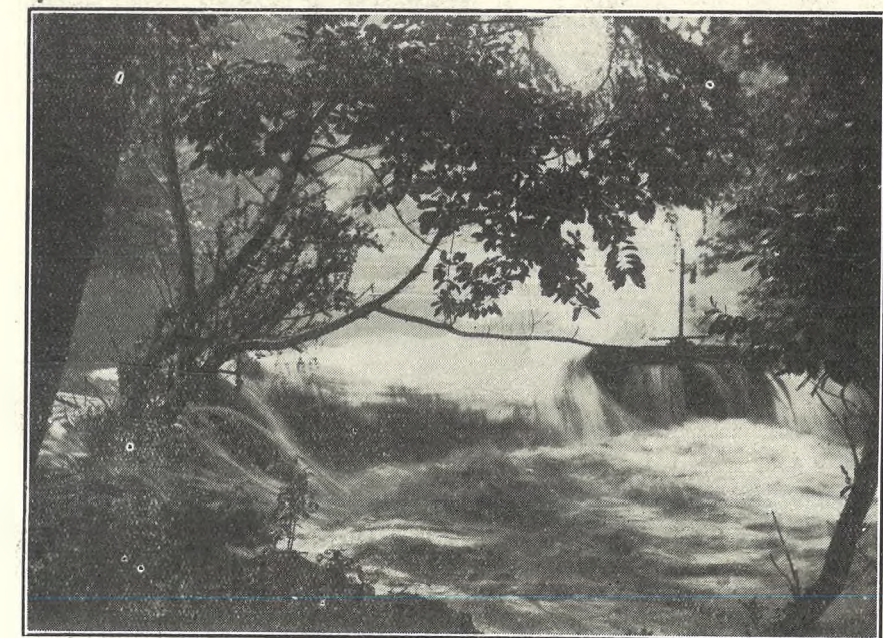

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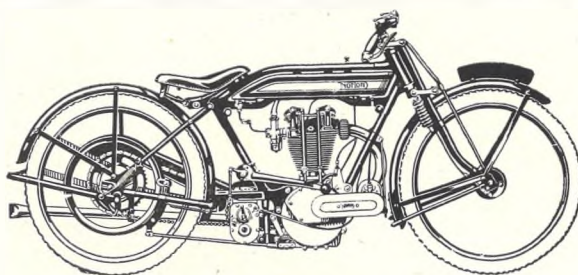
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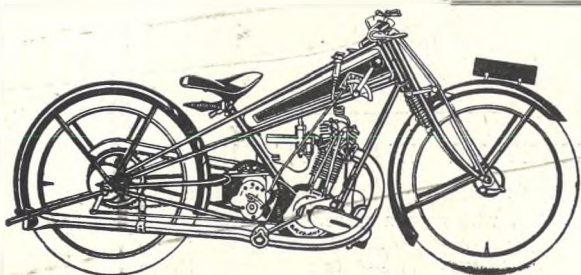
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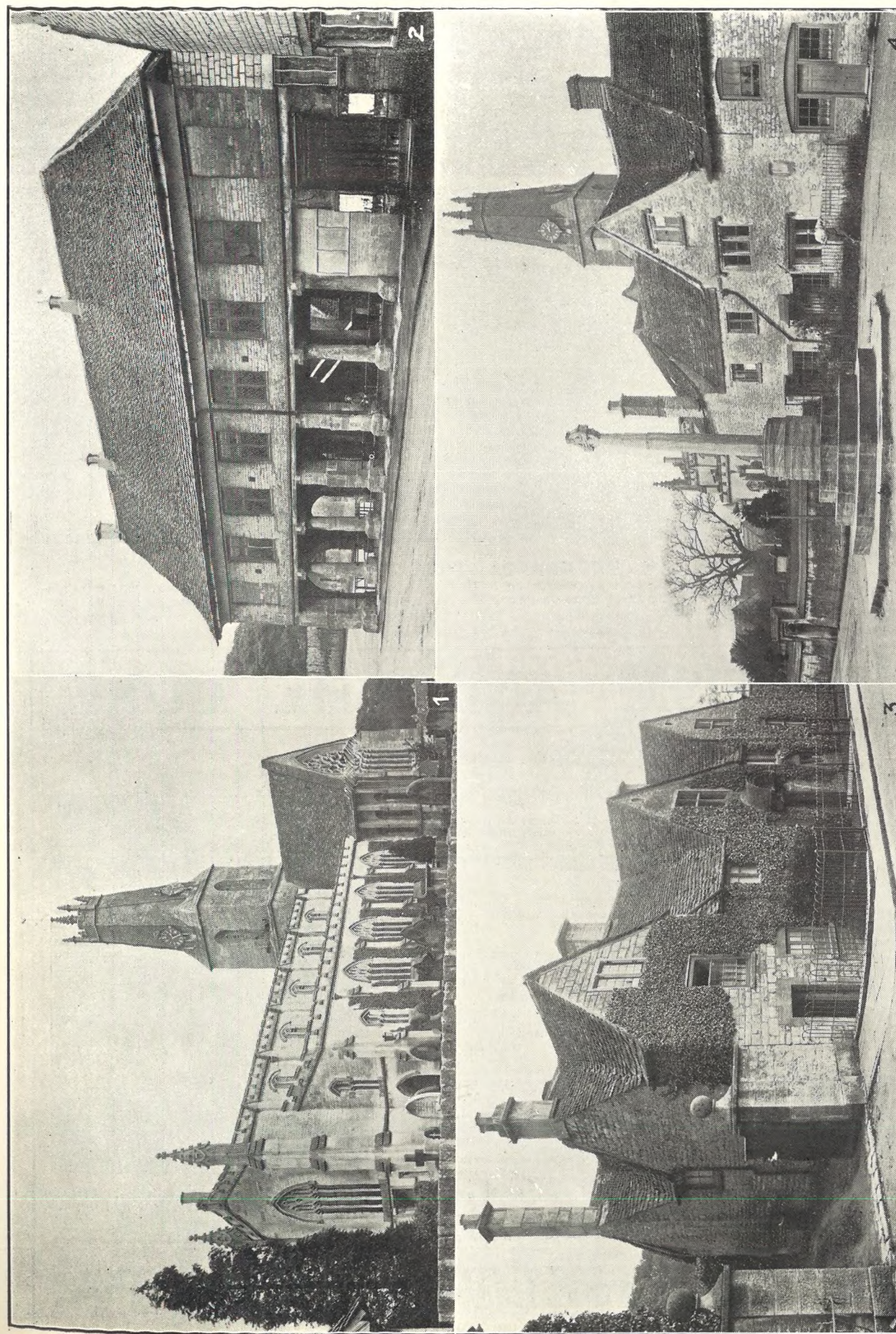


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**PICTURESQUE GLOUCESTERSHIRE.—MINCHINHAMPTON.**

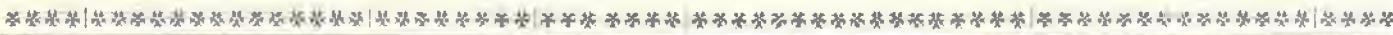
Minchinhampton is a small market town of great antiquity, four miles from Stroud, and situated on the breezy heights adjoining Minchinhampton Common and Rodborough Common. The Common which bears its name is gloriously situated, with extensive views, and was given to the town by Dame Alice Hampton in the reign of Henry VIII.
