





### THE BLACK BEAR, TEWKESBURY

Probably one of the oldest, if not actually the oldest licensed house in England. It is known to date from 1308. and was then a resort of Pilgrims to the Abbey of Tewkesbury. On the ceiling of the bar is a Tudor Rose supposed to commemorate the battle of Tewkesbury, and other curious plaster work can be inspected. Situate at the entrance of the ancient town from the west, King John Bridge the connecting link, it was the natural resort of those journeying to and from Malvern Chase and the mountainous Welsh country. From its windows could have been seen Barons and Knights with their Squires and Retainers, Forest Guards, mendicant Friars, Minstrels, scurvy knaves and plug-uglies, all intent on their business or pleasure in equal need of the Abbey and of the Inn.

### THE BERKELEY ARMS, TEWKESBURY.

A superb example of early English civic architecture. Full of beautiful old timbers and beams, quaint rooms and curious windows.






