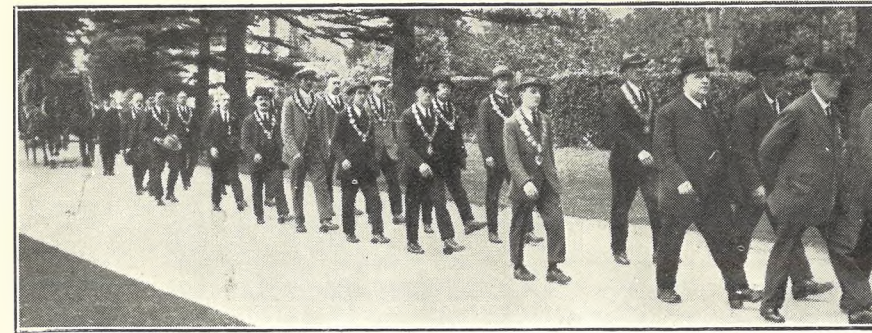


SIR THOMAS RICH'S SCHOOL SPORTS.

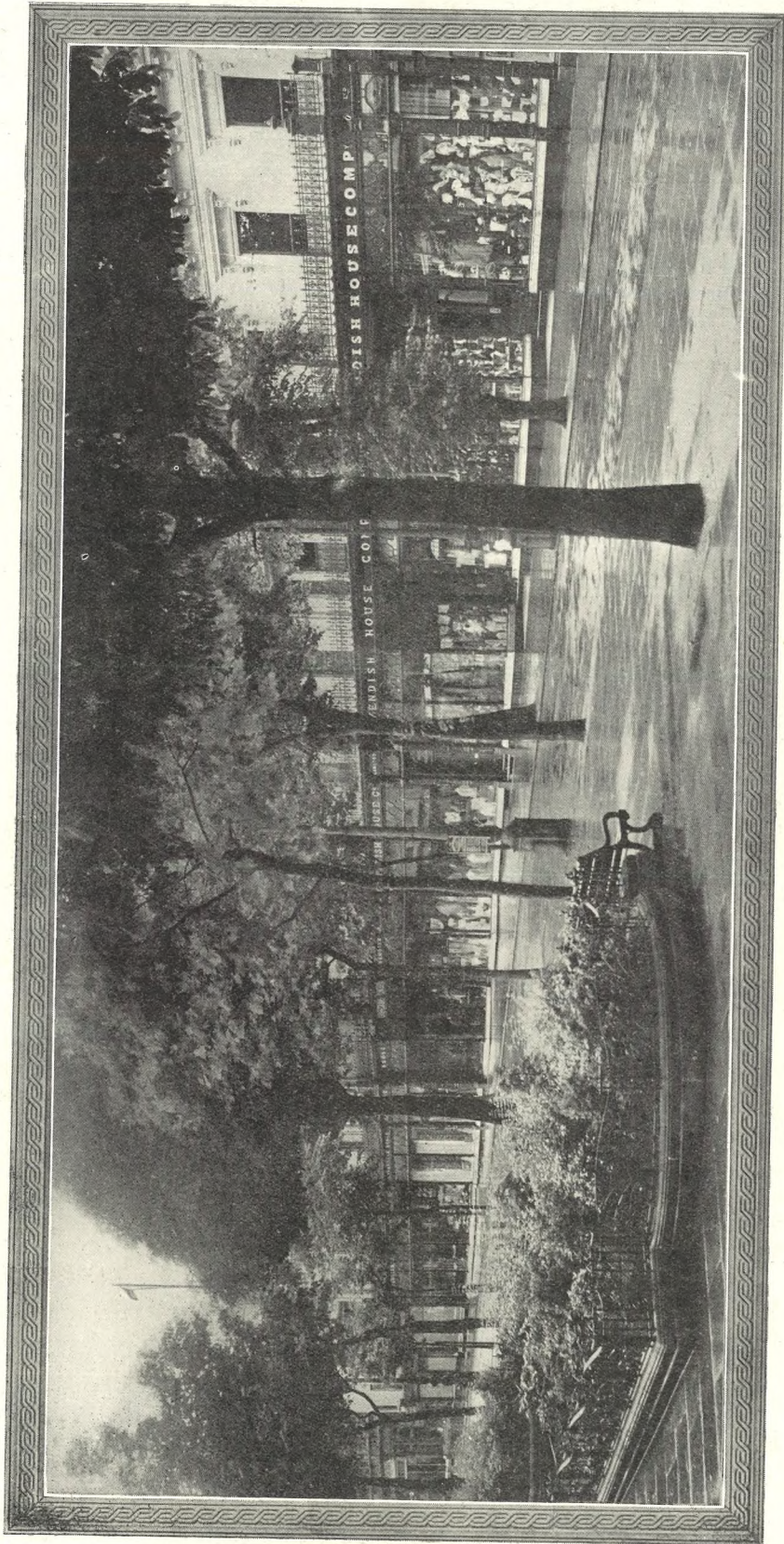

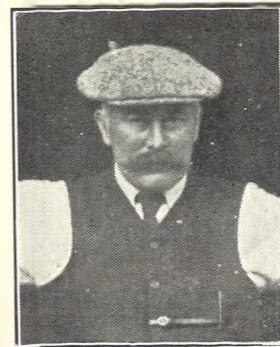


STANLEY PARK HOSPITAL FETE.

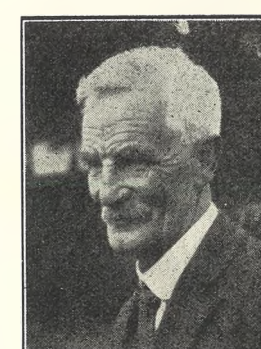
MR. H. J. HARMAN,

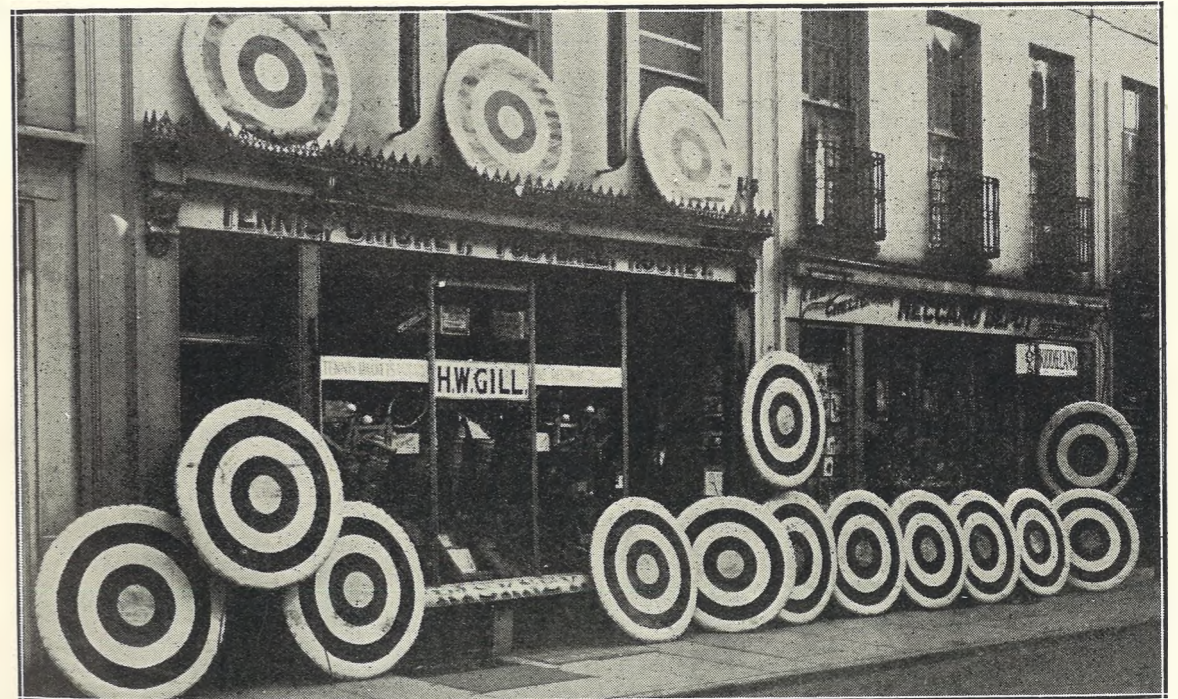

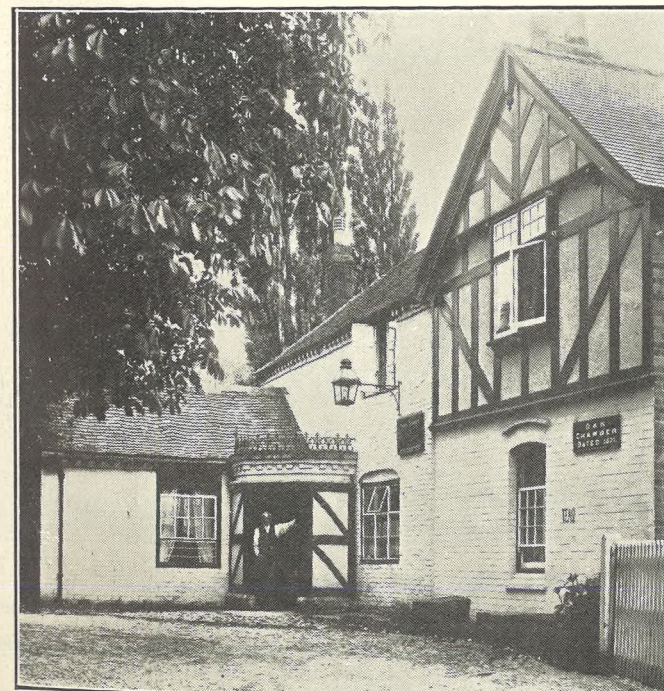

This interesting old mediæval Hotel stands in a most picturesque village, four miles from Ledbury. Prince Rupert stayed at the Crown Inn on his way to the Battle of Worcester. The glory of the Hotel is the old oak room. This room was part of a house occupied by the Steward of the Manor, Richard Harford, in the reign of Queen Elizabeth. The date, 1571, will be observed in the centre, over the fireplace, with the initials "R.H." and "M.H." on either side.

On the massive chimney-piece were originally four shields, but one is missing, those remaining are:—

- 1.—Arms of the Wrottesley Family.
- 2.—Crest and Arms of Scrope, Earl of Wiltshire.
- 3.—Arms of Fox, of Bromfield.

Three Bosses remain in the ceiling:—

- 1.—Arms of Bishop Skipp.
- 2.—The Scrope Arms.
- 3.—Arms of the First Marquis of Winchester.

On the table stands an old stone Saxon Font.

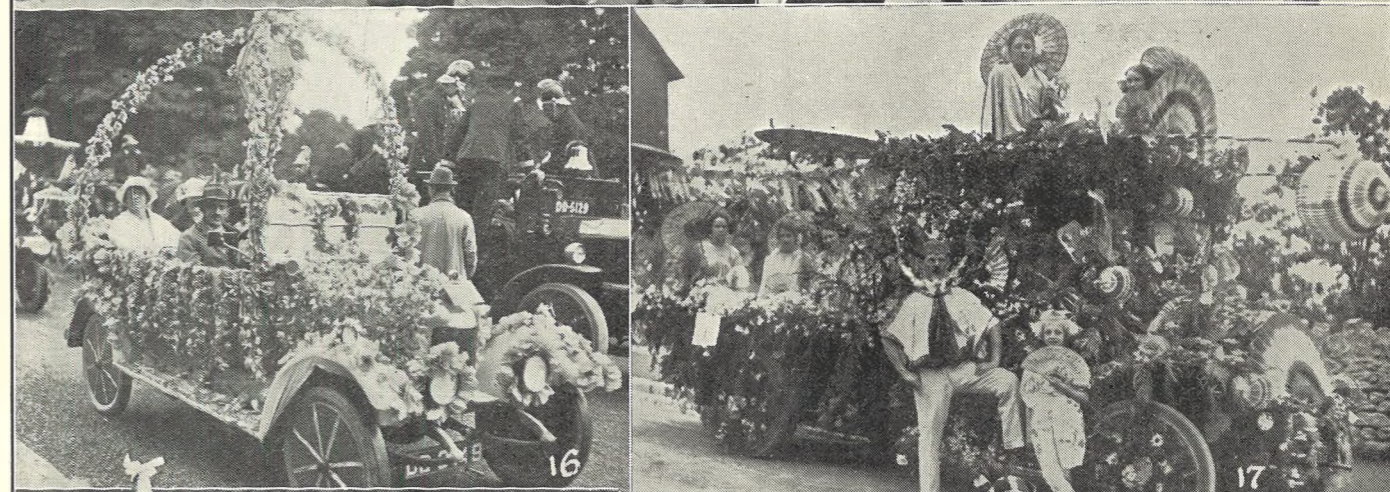
