This sure-footed donkey, with two basket panniers almost as big as himself, loaded with loaves, climbs the woodland paths, and the sturdy boy delivers the bread. 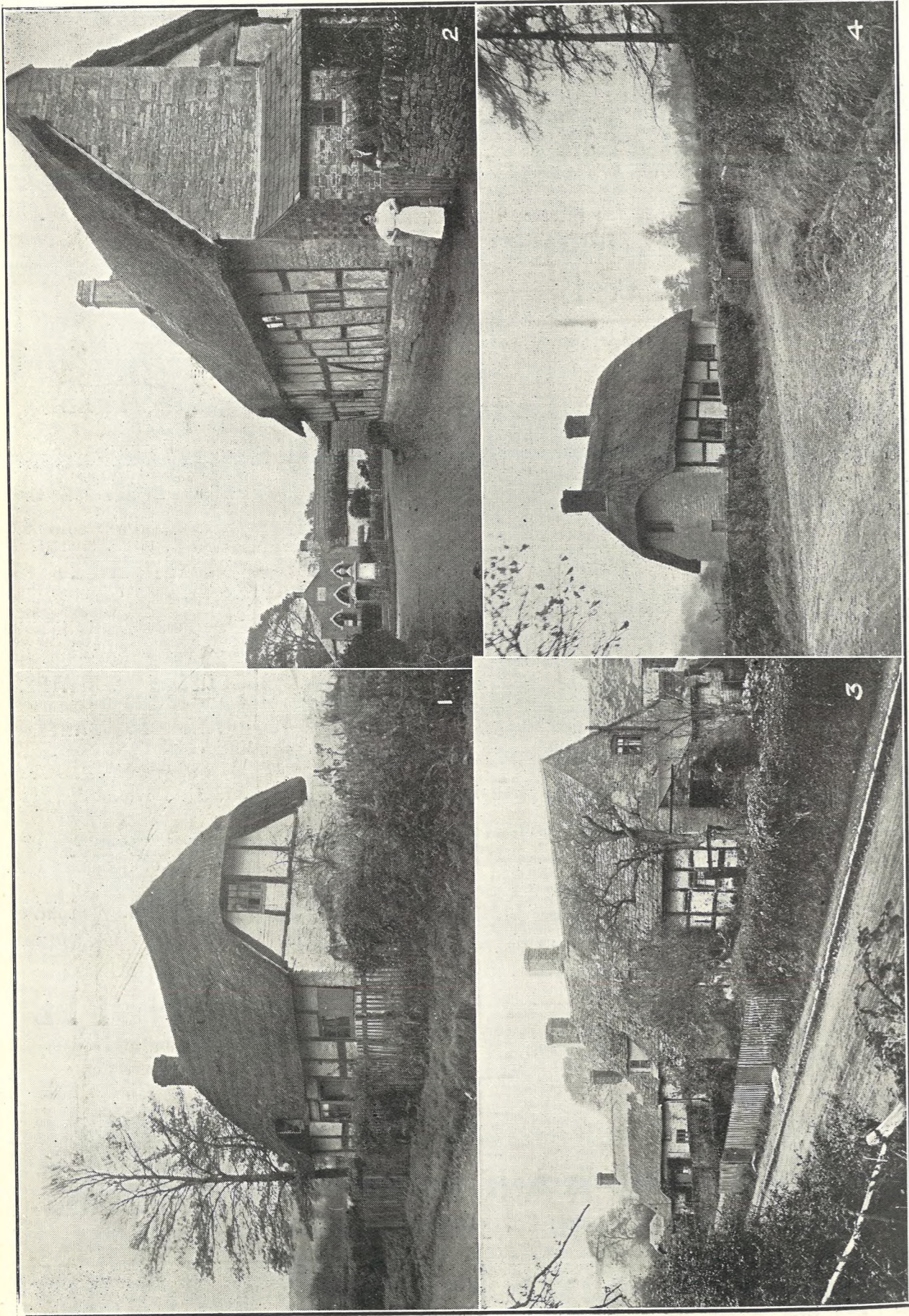

PICTURESQUE GLOUCESTERSHIRE.—GOTHERINGTON.

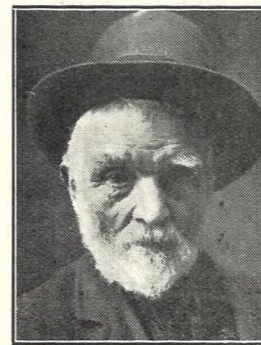

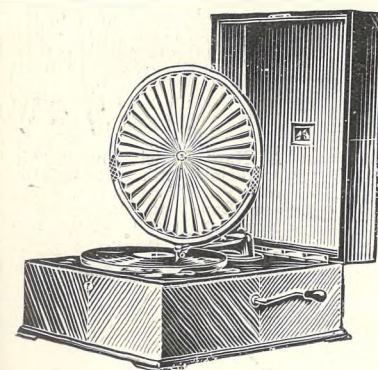

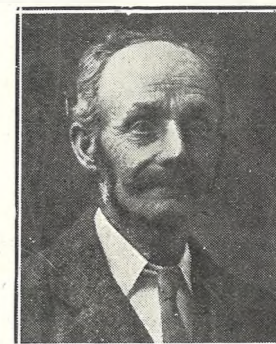

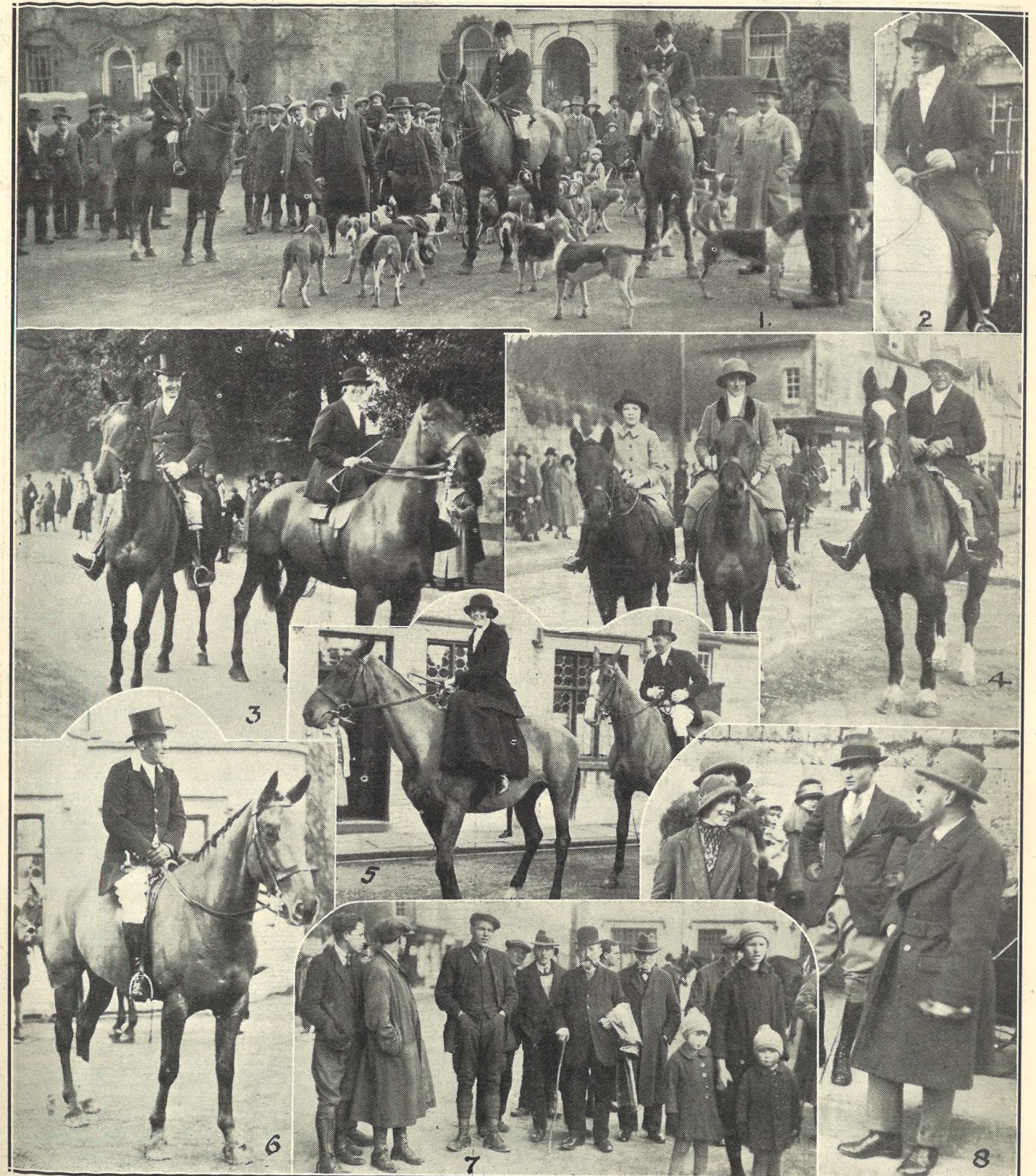

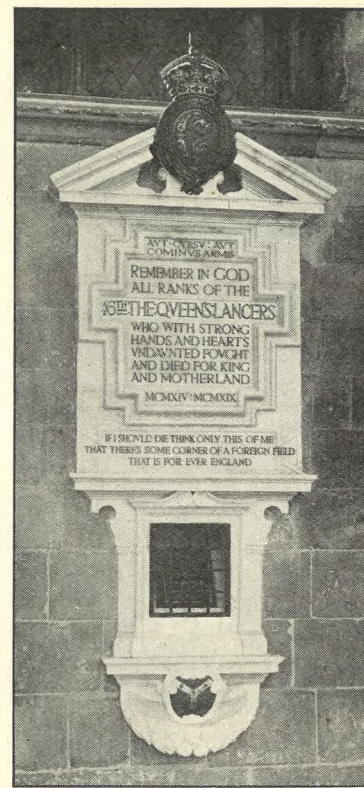

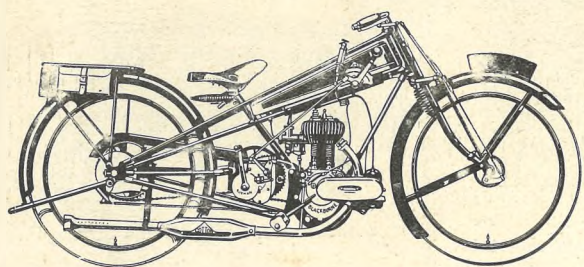
