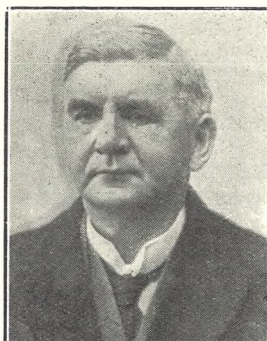

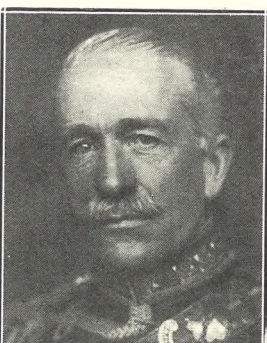

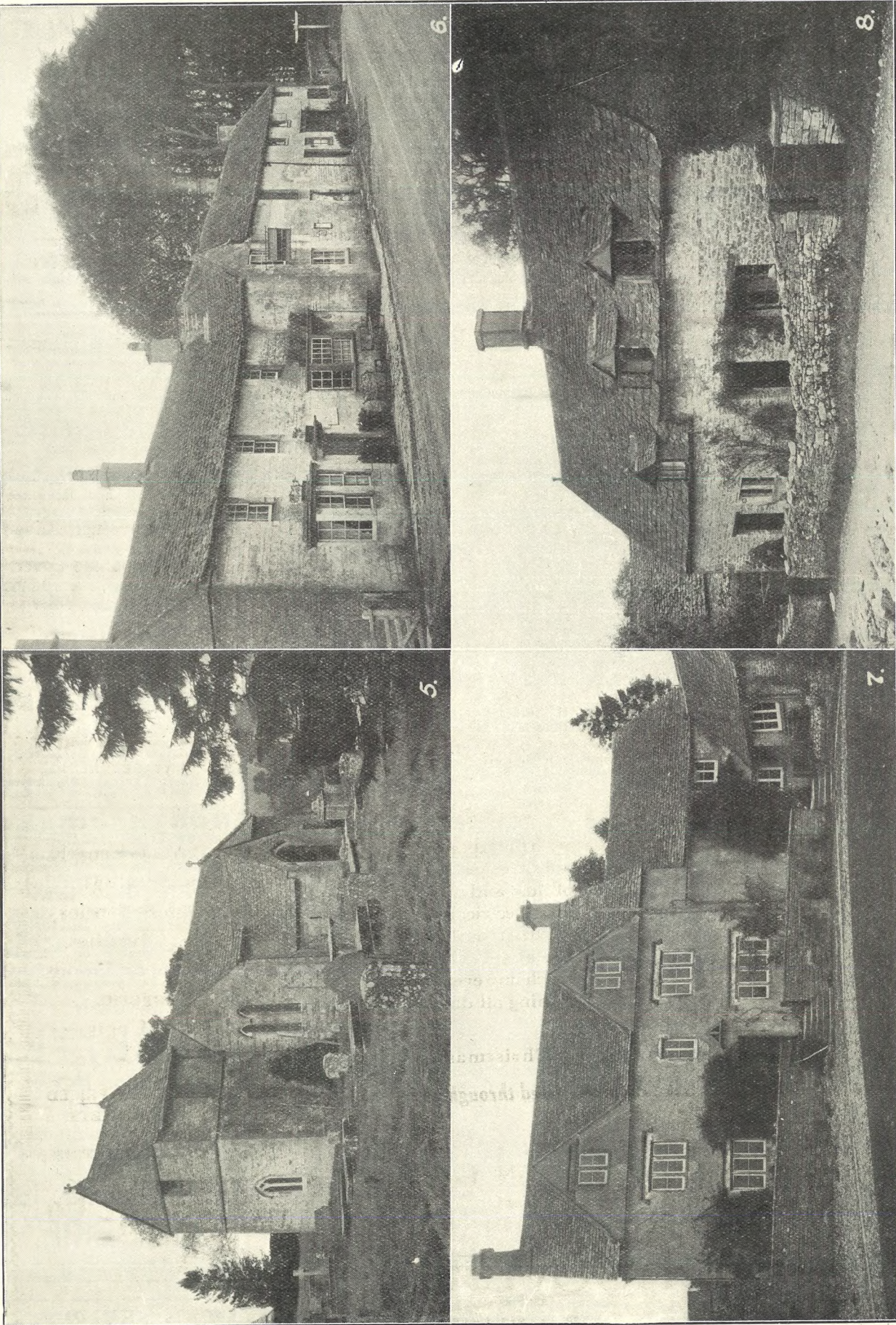

8.—Old Cottages near the Church; very typical of the Cotswolds.

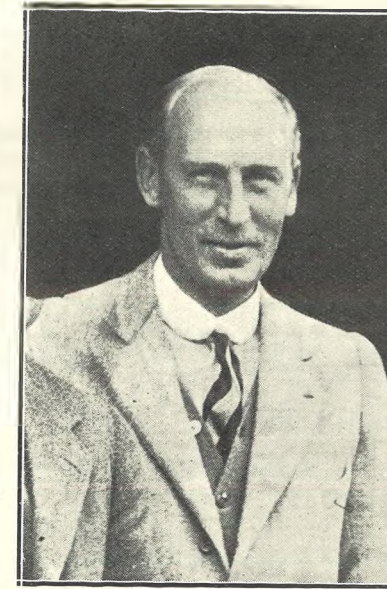

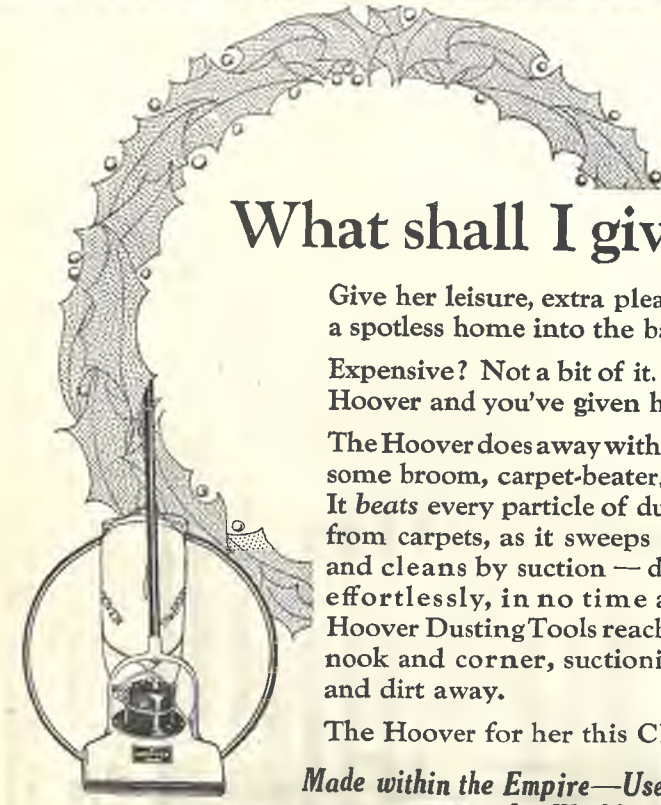

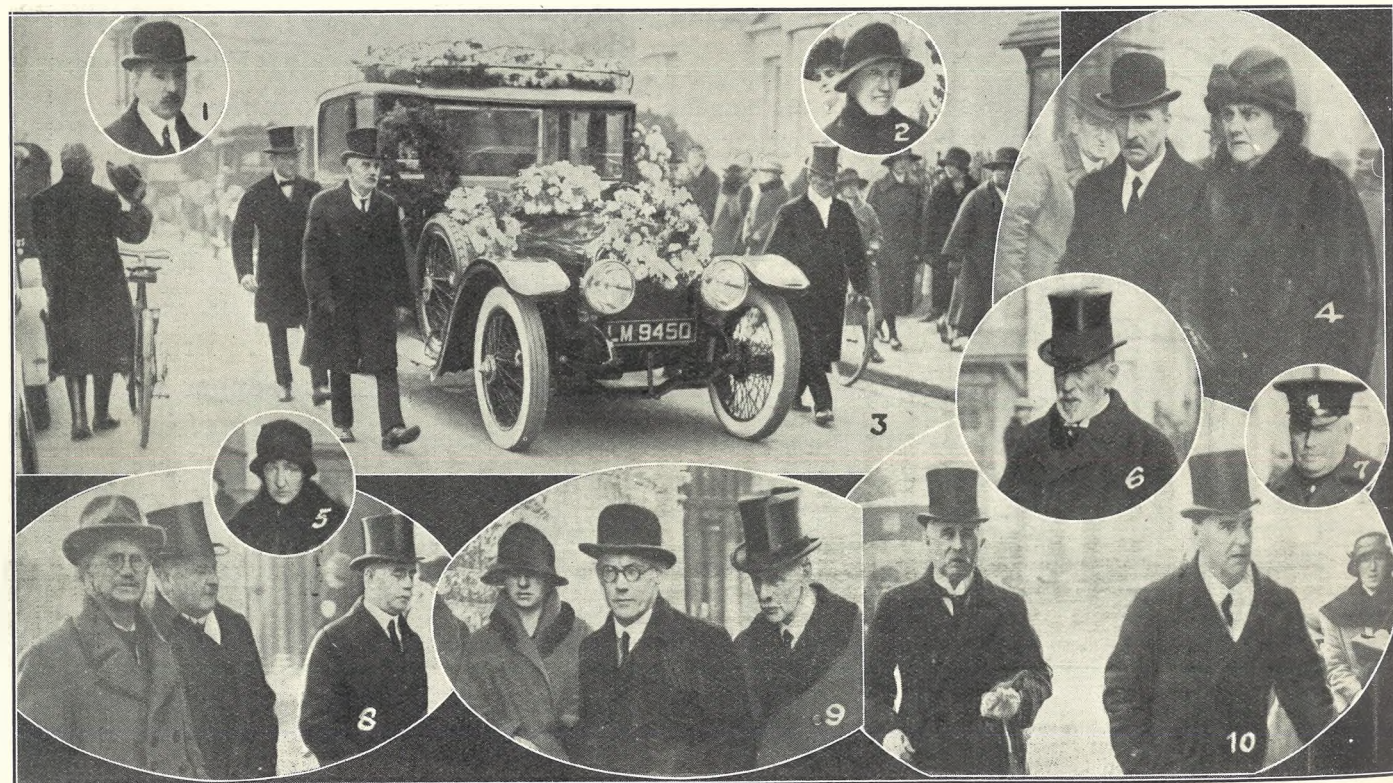


QUEEN ALEXANDRA MEMORIAL SERVICE IN CHELTENHAM.

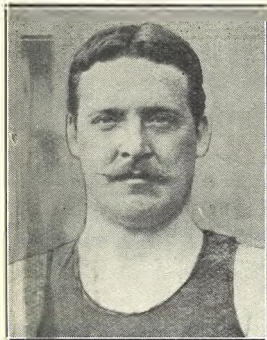


A BIG "FROST."

ALDERMAN ABEL J. EVANS, J.P., OF 31 MIDLAND ROAD, GLOUCESTER.

Who died on Wednesday last, Dec. 9, aged 64 years. He was for many years a prominent Gloucesterian, fighting many battles for the betterment of the conditions of Labour, although he never joined the official Labour Party. He was a member of the City Council from 1896, and was elected Alderman in 1918. He became a member of the Education Committee in 1903, when the Act came into force, and remained in it until his death. He was previously on the old School Board from 1894, and was for some years chairman. He was district secretary of the Transport and General Workers' Union until January, 1925.

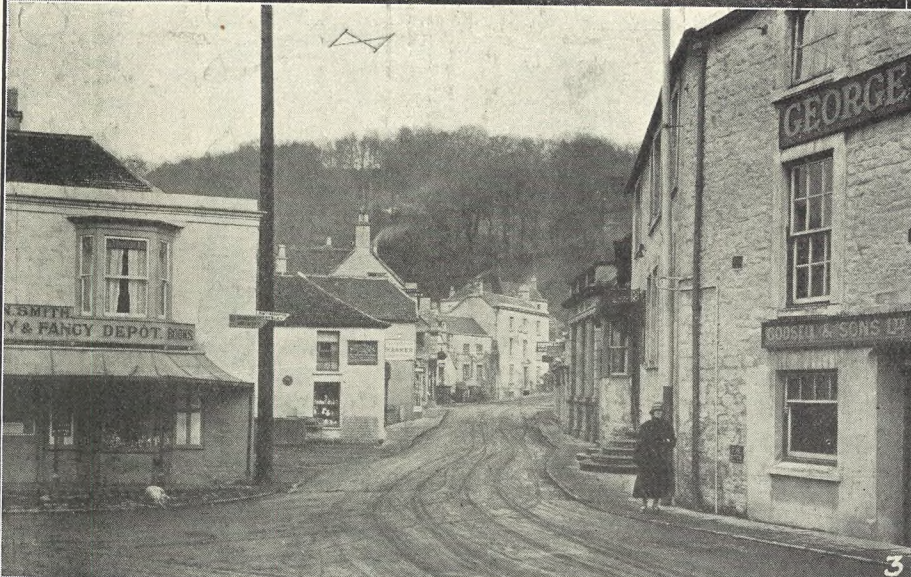


GLOUCESTER v. CHELTENHAM AT RUGBY FOOTBALL.

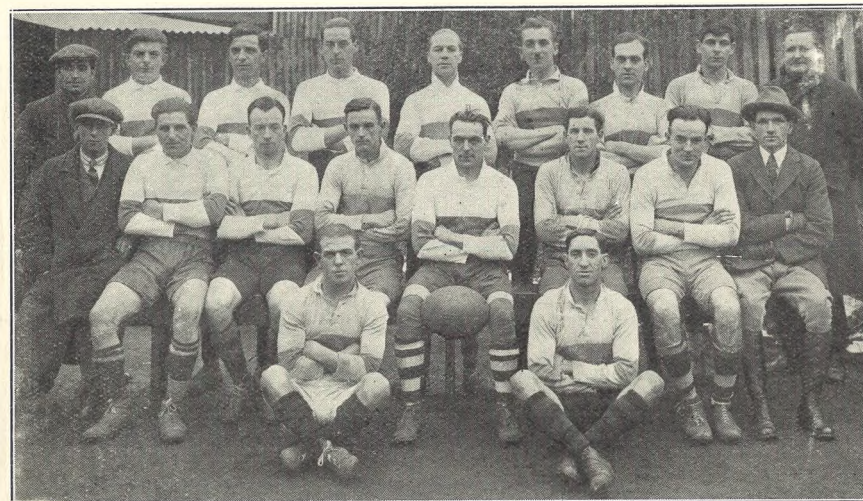


CHELTENHAM POLICE v. ST. GREGORY'S.

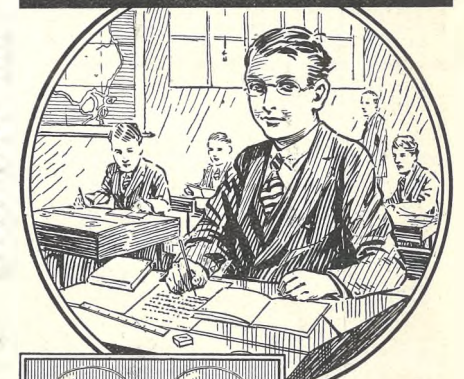

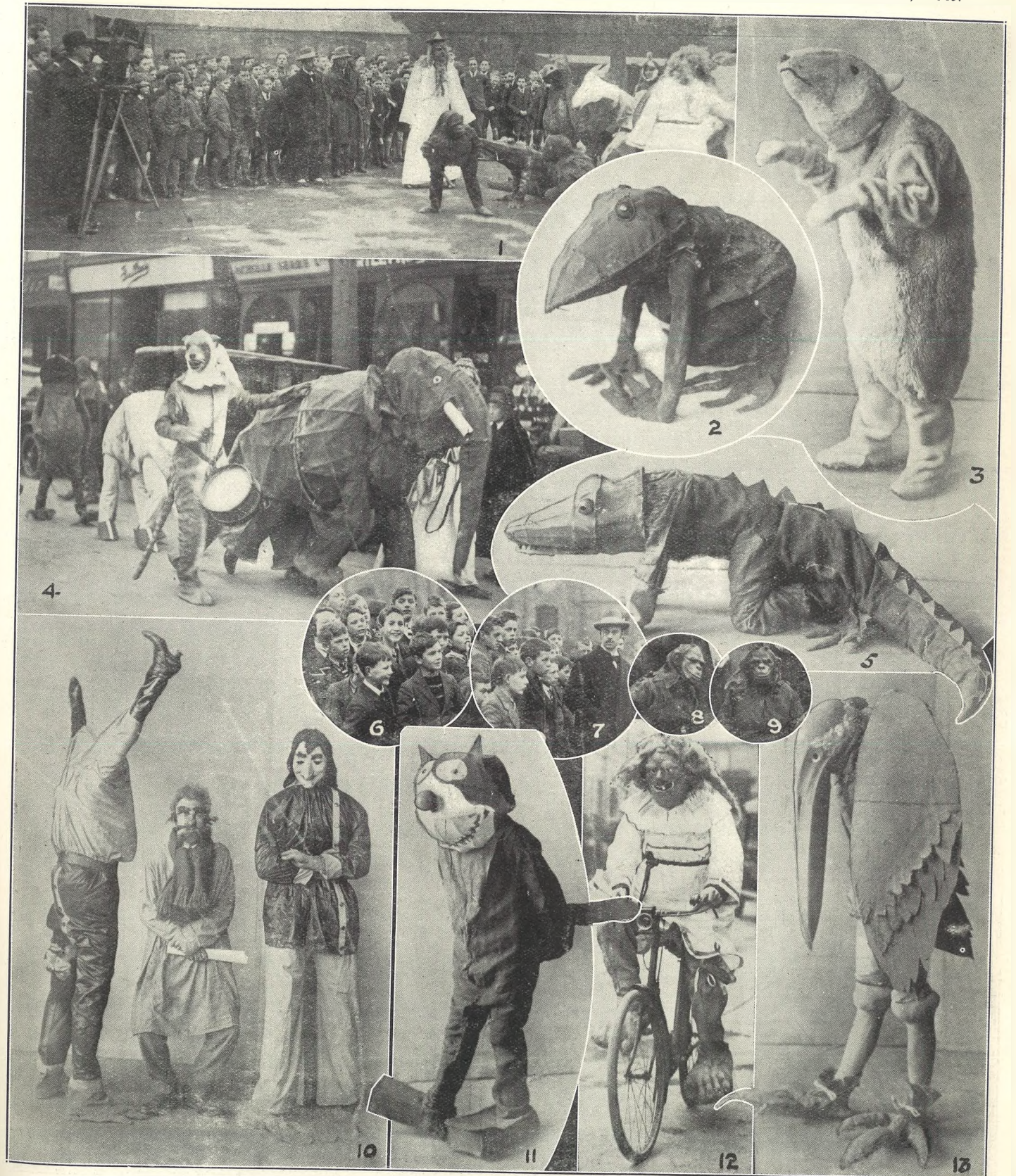

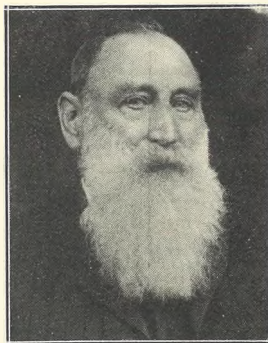
